

Good Life eludes many Filipinos

MANILA — At his vegetable stand on a busy street in the Philippine capital, Lamberto Tagarro is surrounded by gleaming, modern skyscrapers, between which a river of luxury vehicles flows.

"The Philippines is the rising tiger economy of Asia," Mr. Tagarro said. "But only the rich people are going up and up. I'm not feeling it."

Mr. Tagarro earns the equivalent of about \$5 a day working before dawn and after dark, battling petty corruption to maintain his improvised sidewalk stand and dealing with rising wholesale prices for the onions and tomatoes he sells.

The Philippines, with a 7.8 percent expansion of gross domestic product in the first quarter of 2013, has the fastest-growing economy in East Asia, surpassing even China's. The country has a red-hot stock market, a strong currency and a steady stream of accolades and upgrades from international ratings agencies.

Paquito Diaz

Villain to the Stars



Francisco Bustillos Diaz (May 28, 1937 - March 3, 2011[1]), better known by his screen name Paquito Diaz, was a veteran Filipino actor and movie director. He specialized in action and comedy.

Diaz was born in Pampanga, Philippines. He was famous for his villain roles, either as the main, supporting or comic relief and he was one of the most popular actors in film industry, although he also had the ability to portray protagonist roles, mostly supporting, or comic relief (with his longtime friend, the late Fernando Poe Jr.. In fact, he had also portrayed a non-villain role in "Walang Matigas Na Tinapay sa Mainit na Kape" and "Ang Dalubhasa" (with his unmoustache) It was his late younger brother, Romy who played as the main villain of the film. Other non-villain appearances include Eagle Squad, where he plays as a dedicated and good police officer as opposed to his other corrupt police roles alongside Robin Padilla, Current Senator Jinggoy Estrada, Edu Manzano, and Jaime Fabregas as the main antagonist, Bayadra (a parody of Viagra) Brothers alongside Jimmy Santos and the late Berting Labra, Estudyante Blues as the father of the character of his son Joko, and Pera O Bayong as Don Juanito Starring Willie Revillame, John Estrada and Randy Santiago with Mark Gil as the right hand man of his character and the main antagonist of that film.

He also appeared in villain roles in comedy films as the main antagonist and also in supporting/non-villain roles that stars mostly Dolphy, Vic Sotto, Joey De Leon, Jimmy Santos, and the late actors Babalu, Panchito and Rene Requiestas.

He suffered from hemorrhagic stroke in 2002 and died March 3, 2011 due to pneumonia complications.

His father was an American citizen of Mexican descent. His brother, Romy Diaz, his wife Nena Diaz with children Joko and Cheska are also actors. Before he became an actor, he was a basketball player with his brother Romy Diaz suited up with the FEU Tamaraws in the early 1960s.

After suffering from hypertension and stroke, which at one time left him comatose, he had to sell the family house and lot including his car. His vision was impaired for the same health reasons. He was diagnosed with pneumonia and infection due to sepsis.

Hong Kong residents warned vs. insulting 'Yolanda' victims

Hong Kong (HK) residents will break the law if they post abusive or derogatory remarks online against Typhoon Yolanda survivors.

Hong Kong's Equal Opportunities Commission (EOC) cited their race discrimination ordinance, which makes it unlawful for any person to publicly incite hatred or severely ridicule another person on the ground of their race.

EOC Chairperson Dr. York Chow said, the negative sentiments of Hong Kong residents towards the Philippine government in connection with its handling of the Manila bus hostage incident three years ago should not be

extended to the victims of Yolanda.

Last month, Yolanda, considered the strongest recorded cyclone in the world in 2013, ripped through the Visayas region.

Hong Kong lawmakers earlier said they are planning to impose economic sanctions against the Philippines in connection with the hostage crisis, which left eight Hong Kong tourists dead following a bungled rescue operation.

Schools in New Zealand raise 750K for Aid

At Ponsonby Primary School they had a pyjama day, raising hundreds for the Philippines.

Lovi Poe would much rather keep whatever she did for the typhoon victims low-key. She said as long as she did something, that's alright for her. There's no need to publicize her small way of helping.

She was then asked what she was feeling about the criticisms being hurled against the Aquino administration because of its snail-like pace in delivering the relief.

Lovi said it's hard to judge anyone because she is sure everyone wants to help in their own way. The only problem is that it is also hard to find sincere people who do not have an ulterior motive.

She only hopes it will not go to a point where officials will engage in finger pointing already. She prays that everybody in the relief operations is out there to really help the victims of the typhoon.

Asked how her father, the late Fernando Poe Jr., would have handled a situation like Yolanda, Lovi said she is confident her father would do a lot of things for the victims.

It's not that she's against the current government, the actress clarified. She just believes her father would be effective in his role as President if he was given the chance.

Meanwhile, Lovi explained why she has always been quiet when it comes to her relationships. She said that she doesn't actually denies anything, but she just doesn't want to comment to give respect to her partner.

"It's not about denying things, it's about keeping things private. Kumbaga, I know na I'm a public figure, pero siyempre, there are things that I wanna keep din for myself."

After tense meeting with Aquino, Tacloban businessman back in Business

TACLOBAN CITY, Philippines – "Ok lang, buhay ka pa naman (It's ok, you're still alive anyway)."

This was what President Benigno Aquino III supposedly told local businessman Kenneth Uy in a tense briefing where he reportedly walked out after another businessman, Jeff Manibay, recommended the imposition of martial law in typhoon-affected areas.

It was November 10, just two days after Typhoon Yolanda (Haiyan) devastated Tacloban City and the rest of Leyte province, and relief had not reached the surviving residents. Local officials and businesmen discussed their urgent needs with Aquino, recalling one instance when Uy was fired at by looters in downtown Tacloban.

Uy vividly remembered the day Yolanda battered his city. "The day after the typhoon, I didn't want to wake up, I didn't want to stand up, because when I looked out of the window, I saw that it was true – that we've been really hit by a typhoon, that it is really going to change our life," Uy said.

Uy has recovered since then. By the time the President returned to the province on Monday, November 18, Uy was back in business. He has shaved his head to show that he has moved on and is ready to embark on a new beginning.

Businessman's nightmare

Yolanda has become every businessman's nightmare, even worse than bankruptcy, Uy told Rappler in a conversation in front of his hotel along Zamora Street.

It is now one of the safest streets in Tacloban City. Uy's hotel, the Asia Stars Hotel, served as the nerve center of the augmentation team sent by the Philippine National Police (PNP) to help restore peace and security in the city. Police generals, media,

and international aid groups are staying there. A room costs about P2,500 a night.

Across the street from the hotel were remnants of panic and disorder: destroyed stores and restaurants. Broken bottles of medicines littered the front of a pharmacy.

A few blocks away, the grocery that Uy's family owned – one of the oldest in the city – was ransacked. It survived cutthroat competition from Gaisano and Robinsons malls but not the hunger and desperation of the typhoon victims.

'Crazy' businessman

"You have to be a little bit crazy if you want to start a business now. I think I'm crazy enough, and I think I can find a few more crazy people around to join me," he said.

He did. On Sunday, November 17, he started selling prepaid call cards that came from Cebu. On Wednesday, November 20, he will open a tiangge (flea market) with some local traders he invited.

The store will sell food, water, toiletries, fuel, and gas – scarce commodities that are badly needed in the affected areas.

Water is locally sourced. Canned goods, toiletries, and fuel will come from Cebu. Suppliers from Samar will bring in vegetables beginning Friday, November 22.

UnionBank and Banco de Oro will also have desks at the store to receive deposits and service withdrawals.

The two banks, together with governmentowned Land Bank of the Philippines and the Development Bank of the Philippines, will open ahead of other banks, which will reportedly resume operations on Friday yet.

"We have to put the infrastructure for people to buy so that those who can afford will not line up for the relief goods. The people who really need help should get the relief goods," Uy said.

In a press briefing on November 20, National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) executive director Eduardo del Rosario said "we are happy that there is now economic activity" in



the region.

Last businessmen standing

Almost 80% of the local businessmen have left Tacloban City, according to Uy. He decided to stay, just as he did back in college when he had the option to leave and study in Manila or abroad.

"I told myself, if you go somewhere else, then I don't think Tacloban deserves that. She has been good to us. She has been good to our parents, to Lolo and Lola (to Grandpa and Grandma)," Uy said.

Uy's grandparents, traders from China, arrived in Tacloban in the 1930s. His grandfather, Uytingkoc, started a bakery that expanded into businesses that include a grocery, an ice plant, and a rice mill.

His Australia-based brother is coming home to help him rebuild their business.

Others may have left, but it doesn't mean they are not coming back, Uy said.

"They're eager to start again, to start their businesses, but there are questions that they (government) have to answer first," he said.

Security is top on the business sector's list. They were not only traumatized by the typhoon but also terrified by the looting incidents. Electricity and banking are other important concerns.

'We will die here'

"They (businessmen) really blame the government. They move too slow. Puro salita lang. Nakikita naman, 'di ba (They're all talk. Isn't it obvious)?" Uy's cousin, Jojo Uy, told Rappler on his way to Manila.

Jojo temporarily left Tacloban to bring his wife and her family to Manila. They felt helpless when they saw their goods and those from other stores being looted. They no longer feel safe in the city.

Jojo said he will return to Tacloban after a week or two, depending on how the security situation in the city will improve.

Other businessmen also want to go back to restore commerce and help "their people" in need.

"We have no choice. We live there," he said. He echoed what his cousin, Kenneth Uy, said back home: "I don't think you can move San Juanico Bridge. I don't think you can move the Sto. Niño Shrine. Those are the things that we have grown old with. And hopefully, we will die here."

Canada to quadruple emergency aid to PHL

TORONTO - In a crowded church basement, surrounded by boxes of emergency supplies donated and packed by parishioners, Prime Minister Stephen Harper announced a quadrupling of Canada's aid to the typhoon stricken Philippines.

Canada's commitment to emergency aid and rebuilding following Typhoon Haiyan goes from \$5 million to \$20 million, plus a program of matching grants that will double Canadian donations to registered charities for typhoon relief between Nov. 9 and Dec. 9.

The prime minister made the announcement at Our Lady of Assumption church, the official Filipino parish in Toronto, while parishioners gathered upstairs for a special Mass for victims of the storm.

In a statement, Harper said: "Our government has taken decisive action to address the ravages of the typhoon by working closely with the Filipino-Canadian community, relief agencies and the government of the Philippines to provide ongoing support to those who need it most."

Canada's official aid to the Philippines started with a \$30,000 contribution to the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent societies Nov. 8. Another \$5 million was pledged to humanitarian organizations and for emergency relief on Nov. 9. The \$15 million announced Nov. 18 will go to the United Nations agencies

engaged in emergency relief, the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement and other NGOs.

The Canadian military has sent its Disaster Assistance Response Team, DART, to the Philippines provinces of Iloilo and Capiz to provide clean water and medical assistance.

Ottawa has helped a 12-person Canadian Red Cross medical team get its field hospital
on the ground
in the disaster
zone and sent an
interdepartmental
team of federal
civil servants to
Manila to consult
with the Filipino
government.

At Masses everywhere in the Archdiocese of Toronto, 224 parishes have prayed for the Philippines.

"There is a solidarity of love and prayer," Cardinal Thomas Collins told parishioners of Our Lady of the Assumption at a Nov. 15 Mass for

typhoon victims.

Collins emphasized the communion all Christians share with the suffering through Christ.

As the day began Friday Nov. 15, the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace had already collected \$255,000, all of which will be matched by the federal government.



PNP Arrests Beauty Gonzales For Obstruction Of Justice

China hospital ship heads for typhoon-hit Samar



ZHOUSHAN - A Chinese hospital ship set sail for the typhoon-ravaged Philippines, with foreign media given unprecedented access to a navy base as Beijing seeks to promote its aid effort nearly two weeks after the disaster.

The Peace Ark, a 300-bed floating navy medical facility, sounded its horn as it set off from a People's Liberation Army base on Zhoushan island, off the eastern province of Zheijang.

It is expected to take three or four days to reach the Philippines, which is embroiled in a territorial row with China.

"With our efforts, we will make great contributions to the relationship between the Chinese people and the Philippine people," Shen Hao, deputy chief of staff of the East China Sea Fleet and commander of the mission, told reporters allowed on board the vessel before it left.

"We will do our utmost to make contributions to the Philippine side."

The deployment of the ship, which was featured on the front page of China's state-run Global Times newspaper, comes as the world's second-largest economy seeks to counter international criticism of its relief effort.

After an initial outlay of only \$100,000, the Chinese government has gradually upped its aid over the past two weeks, contributing \$1.6 million worth of tents, blankets and other supplies. Other Chinese organisations are also contributing, and a first crew of relief workers left for the Philippines, China's foreign ministry said.

By contrast, Japan has contributed \$30 million to the Philippines, and the US has donated \$20 million. Even the Swedish furniture group Ikea's charitable foundation surpassed China's initial outlay with a \$2.7 million contribution to the UN children's agency UNICEF.

There is no sign outside the navy base announcing its identity, and officials said it was the first time foreign journalists had been allowed inside.

Rows of uniformed navy officers and sailors lined the quayside alongside the white hospital ship, which was flanked by naval warships in the dock.

Medical personnel in blue camouflage

uniforms waved from the Peace Ark's deck as it pulled away from port.

One sailor's wife clutched a Chinese flag and said: "I'm proud of my husband. It's OK for the ship to go to the Philippines despite the state of relations."

Shen said the ship had just returned from another humanitarian mission in October, and commanders had cut short a one-month maintenance period to send it to the disaster zone. The Peace Ark will initially be stationed in Samar province, but how long it remains in the Philippines will depend on the situation, officials said.

Sun Tao, head of the ship's hospital, said it had more than 100 doctors and nurses on board, and can handle eight surgeries simultaneously.

Doctors expect to handle disease caused by insanitary conditions and paediatric cases, he added. Another batch of emergency medical rescuers left for the Philippines later. A 50-strong team left from the city of Hangzhou in Zhejiang province, the report said, adding many of them had taken part in rescue work after the Sichuan earthquake in 2008.

They will establish a field hospital to offer medical services for typhoon survivors and work on disease prevention and control.

Leyte inmates return after mass escape during Yolanda

PALO — Nearly half of the detainees who escaped from a flooded jail at the height of Super Typhoon Yolanda have returned, many after helping their families deal with the storm's aftermath.

There were nearly 600 detainees at the Leyte Provincial Jail when the typhoon, one of the strongest ever to make landfall, flattened dozens of towns across the islands of Leyte and Samar on November 8.

The winds ripped off the roof of the prison, which houses detainees who are on trial, while gushing water from the mountains sent flash floods into the isolated complex near the ruined coastal town of Palo.

Prison guard Fidencio Abrea told AFP all of the detainees escaped as head-high water forced them to clamber up the prison grills and then over into stormy freedom, with no roof to contain them.

Abrea said the guards were themselves sheltering from the howling wind and powerful rains, so did not notice the mass escape. But he said 251 prisoners had come back, and were now being housed in a section of the complex that suffered minor damage.

Returnees interviewed by AFP said their immediate concern after escaping was to check on or help loved ones, and that they came back because they did not want to ruin their chances of being exonerated at trial.

"I returned because I want my freedom to be legal," said Renato Comora, 47, who is on trial for murder.

Comora said he initially went to his wife and six children in the town of Dulag about 30 kilometers (18 miles) away. "My family is OK, there are no casualties but my house is totally destroyed," he said. "I just wanted to make sure that my family was safe. After that, I returned on my own because I don't want to live the life of a fugitive."

Oldarico Raquel, 36, who is on trial for attempted murder, said he also escaped because he wanted to see his family.

His house was destroyed and he helped put up makeshift shelters for his family and relatives before returning to the jail, where he and 17 other inmates were packed in one cell.

Return to prove innocence

Danilo Tejones, 51, who is on trial for rape, said he returned because he was innocent of the charge. "After escaping, I helped my family harvest rice for three days before I returned," he said. "I could have stayed away but I decided to come back because I am innocent of the charge. I want my case to be finished so that I can get free legally."

Thirty-two-year-old Jessie Abalos said he escaped so that he could go and help his 60-year-old mother rebuild their home in the town of Tolosa. "Our house has been blown away. So I helped my mother put up a temporary shelter, then I returned," said Abalos, who is on trial for drugs charges.

Asked why he had returned, he said he was afraid of living a life as a fugitive.

Jail officials said prisoners are returning directly to the compound or just presenting themselves to a prison van that drives around the disaster zones looking for the detainees.

Palo and the nearby provincial capital of Tacloban remain scenes of near complete chaos, two weeks after the storm that has left nearly 7,000 people dead or missing.

Prison guard Abrea said returnees would have the court hearings of their cases speeded up, giving the innocent a chance to be set free more quickly.

But those who did not return by a certain date would be formally declared as "escapees".

"Once they are declared as escapees, they will be hunted down," he said.

Life after Yolanda Lessons from Indonesia and Haiti

It has been difficult to process the destruction of Typhoon Haiyan (Yolanda), which flattened villages across 36 provinces in the Philippines. The United Nations now estimates that 2.5 million people are in need of food aid and close to 600,000 have been displaced.

The tragic images that have begun to reach the outside world are flashbacks to the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami. The scale of the devastation is colossal, and survivors traumatised from the disaster and the loss of their loved ones, homes and livelihoods are desperate for food, water, shelter and medical assistance. Aid workers struggling to reach survivors face severe access challenges due to damaged infrastructure, insecurity and the remoteness of many affected areas. Many survivors remain cut off from assistance. While the full scale of the destruction is not yet known, it is clear that we are facing a massive and complex humanitarian crisis that will require a massive relief and recovery operation.

Saving lives, rebuilding homes and sustaining livelihoods is extremely challenging, especially in large-scale disasters. The international community struggled to rebuild Haiti after the 2010 earthquake and hundreds of thousands are living in camps to this day. In Aceh and Nias, houses and infrastructure were successfully rebuilt after the tsunami, but insufficient support was provided for sustainable livelihood recovery.

These past experiences of large-scale disaster responses can offer the Philippines, and those responding to the crisis, some lessons to best support the millions who have lost loved ones, homes and livelihoods.

Leadership is needed on the ground, with the people

The most critical element of any post-disaster relief and recovery operation is leadership – and that leadership must be as close to the ground as possible. This means that, while international assistance is urgently needed, the response must be firmly under the leadership of the Government of the Philippines, and it must involve the people affected by the typhoon.



Strong government leadership and coordination, combined with community-driven recovery, was key to the Aceh-Nias reconstruction process; the lack of both was among the biggest obstacles to post-earthquake recovery in Haiti. Instead,

the country was overrun by international aid agencies, many of whom had little understanding of the country's social, political and cultural context. So while the focus now is on responding as quickly as possible to urgent humanitarian needs, we must recognise from the start that, without local leadership, both from the government and the communities, the response will not be sustainable, effective or beneficial for those affected by the crisis.

Don't let humanitarian response dominate recovery

After immediate needs subside, people will want to rebuild their homes and livelihoods as quickly as possible, and should be helped to do so. Failure to do this played out in the worst possible way in Haiti after the earthquake. Shelter was an incredible challenge - with nearly 300,000 houses damaged or destroyed, over a million and a half people ended up living in tented camps, many of them for years. Land rights in the country were complex and challenging, but the majority of aid agencies opted to provide their own solutions and locate people in camps, or provide expensive prefabricated 'transitional' shelters - that were not permanent homes by nature - rather than a more concerted effort supporting people to return quickly to their neighbourhoods and rebuild their homes themselves. To this day, hundreds of thousands of Haitians are still living in camps.

In Aceh, the government ensured that any agency working on shelter for those affected by the tsunami was obliged to construct homes – permanent solutions for those rendered homeless. However, while many homes were built or rebuilt, aid agencies were overwhelmed by the amount of building contracts they had to manage, which took time and capacity from other areas of response. There were also few options for supporting people to rebuild their homes themselves, either through grants or

loans, which would have ultimately been a more sustainable and cost-effective way to provide people with the homes most appropriate for their needs.

Recovery efforts in Indonesia were also dominated by a focus on housing and infrastructure, but livelihoods recovery received inadequate support. After the reconstruction operation, many people had new homes, but had not regained their sources of income. Livelihoods and job creation are essential elements of recovery and are ways to kick-start economies hard hit by disasters. But livelihood recovery takes quite a lot of time and, partly because of tight funding time-frames and donor pressure to spend funds quickly, livelihood programmes tended to be short-term after the tunnami

As we saw in Indonesia after the tsunami, such crises inevitably leave deep and indelible marks on the lives of the survivors, and future generations to come. This can be positive or negative; Typhoon Haiyan can be remembered as a devastating tragedy that many communities were never able to recover from – or one that was overcome by supporting the people and government of the Philippines to rebuild lives and livelihoods, reflecting the needs, priorities and concerns of those affected by the disaster.

Forget what Happened by Basketball

They found the hoop in the ruins of their obliterated neighbourhood. They propped up the backboard with broken wood beams and rusty nails scavenged from vast mounds of storm-blasted homes.

A crowd gathered. And on one of the few stretches of road that wasn't overflowing with debris, they played basketball.

I didn't know what to think when I stumbled upon six teenagers shooting hoops over the weekend in a wrecked neighbourhood of Tacloban, a city that Typhoon Haiyan reduced to rubble, bodies and uprooted trees when it slammed into the Philippines on Nov. 8.

In the middle of a horrendous disaster zone, I didn't expect to see people having a good time. I was even more stunned when I learned the basketball goal was one of the first things this neighbourhood rebuilt.

It took a moment for me to realize that it made all the sense in the world.

The kids wanted to play so they could take their minds off what happened, said Elanie Saranillo, one of the spectators. "And we want to watch so we, too, can forget."

Saranillo, 22, now lives in a church. Her home was levelled by the storm.

Countless families lost loved ones to the typhoon, which killed more than 4,000 people. Hundreds of thousands of survivors have endured hunger, thirst, makeshift shelter, little if any medical care, and a desperate wait for aid to arrive. Tacloban was filled with hopeless, fearfilled faces. Even now, blackened bodies

with peeling skin still lay by the roads, or are trapped under the rubble.

But as the crisis eases and aid begins to flow, hope is flickering. People smile, if only briefly, and joke, if only in passing. It does not mean, by any stretch, that people are happy in the face of tragedy. But for some, there is a new-found enthusiasm for life that comes from having just escaped death.

In Saranillo's neighbourhood, I saw four giggling children jumping up and down on two soiled mattresses. Two women stood on a hilltop high above, dancing.

A few metres away, a 21-year-old named Mark Cuayzon strummed a guitar. He, too, was smiling. "I'm sad about Tacloban," he said. "But I'm happy because I'm still alive. I survived. I lost my house, but I didn't lose my family."

Elizabeth Protacio de Castro, an associate professor of psychology at the University of Philippines in Manila, said her nation has grown accustomed to catastrophe. Some 20 typhoons barrel across the country every year. Add to that earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, armed insurgencies and political upheaval.

"Dealing with disaster has become an art," de Castro said. "Rather than screaming or staring at the wall in a psychiatric ward, you do everything you can. You do your best, then let it go," said de Castro.

Paulo revealed that he is dating KC Concepcion, whom he has worked with in the drama anthology "MMK" two years ago.


"Yes, we are dating. (But) I just want to keep things private," Paulo said. He assures everyone that he still keeps in touch with his son by LJ.



Good Life eludes Many Filipinos

But Mr. Tagarro's experience — of being left behind by the country's newfound prosperity — mirrors that of many Filipinos, according to the latest government poverty and employment data

An estimated seven million Filipinos, about 17 percent of the work force, have gone overseas in search of jobs, according to the Asian Development Bank (ADB). For those who stay home, options are few.

Despite the rapidly expanding economy, the country's unemployment rate increased to 7.5 percent in April, from 6.9 percent at the same time a year earlier. About three million Filipinos who want to work are unemployed.

"Higher rates of economic growth over recent years have not made a serious dent in the employment problem in the Philippines," the ADB reported.

President Benigno S. Aquino III ran on a platform of clamping down on corruption, improving the business environment in the country and addressing widespread poverty. In his first three years in office, Mr. Aquino removed high-level government officials accused of corruption, cracked down on tax evaders and aggressively courted foreign investment.

Though his efforts to improve the economy have received accolades, he has had less success in addressing the country's persistent, widespread poverty.

Mr. Aquino's political opponents argued before recent legislative elections that his actions had further enriched the wealthy and left the poor behind.

The Philippines still has a strong service sector. In 2011, it overtook India as a top provider of offshore call centers. But the country lacks the manufacturing base that has lifted millions of people out of poverty in other Asian countries.

In countries like China, the rural poor increased their income by finding jobs in factories. That is rarely an option in the Philippines, and few poor people from the countryside are qualified to work in a call center.

The country's latest poverty data, released in April, shows almost no improvement in the last six years. About 10 percent of Filipinos live in extreme poverty, unable to meet their most basic food needs. This is the same figure as in 2006 and 2009, the previous years when poverty data was gathered, according to

the National Statistical Coordination Board. The board also estimated that 22.3 percent of families were living in poverty in the first four months of 2012, compared with 22.9 percent in 2009 and 23.4 percent in 2006.

According to government estimates, more than nine million extremely poor Filipino households are not able to earn the 5,460 pesos, or \$135, needed each month to eat. That amount is about the same as the price of a back-row upper-level ticket to the recent Aerosmith concert in Manila, where many of the country's wealthy could be found holding parties into the night. Other reports confirm the government's findings that poverty has persisted.

In a survey by the independent Manila polling group Social Weather Stations, the number of Filipino families reporting that they periodically go hungry has increased in recent months.

The survey found that 19.2 percent of survey respondents, about 3.9 million families, reported going hungry. This is up from 16.3 percent in December 2012, when a similar survey was done.

Meanwhile, the Philippines has slipped on the U.N. Human Development Index, ranking 114th of 187 countries in 2012 in categories like health, education and infant mortality. The country had a ranking of 105 in 2007.

Poverty is particularly acute in rural areas, where growth has been sluggish in recent years even as the national economy and urban areas have expanded rapidly. The hardest hit has been the fishing sector, which has contracted. Farmers and fishermen are consistently ranked as two of the poorest groups in the country.

That is no revelation to Joel Cesista, a 26-year-old fisherman who supports his wife and infant son. A resident of Bataan Province, a poor rural area west of Manila, he cannot find factory work and has no land to farm, so he embarks on a dangerous, marginally profitable effort to find fish in the ocean about twice a month.

"There is no permanent work here," said Mr. Cesista. "All we have is fishing."

Mr. Cesista and four other men take a 33-foot boat nearly 200 miles, or about 320 kilometers, into the South China Sea for a week at a time to fish for tuna.

On a good trip, he can earn about \$200. He often earns less than that and sometimes, when expenses for fuel, bait and boat rental exceed the catch, he is paid nothing at all. Other times, he is just glad to make it home alive.

"We have almost sunk in storms," he said. "We have no radio and no one to rescue us, except the other fishermen."

The Philippine government is trying to address poverty in the country through general economic development, but also through direct intervention.

Since 2008, with the support of international organizations, the country has had a conditional cash-transfer program that gives money to the country's poorest people in return for actions like keeping their children in school.

The program, which is assisting nearly four million families, has received positive reviews from international organizations, but it has also been besieged by allegations of corruption in the distribution of payments. Though the program is not showing an effect on national poverty figures, the government continues to support it.

"Without the conditional cash transfers, the poverty numbers that we are seeing here could have been higher," Planning Secretary Arsenio Balisacan said after the release of the new poverty data

Julita Cabading, 56, a Manila resident with a college degree in accounting, had hoped to benefit from one of the government's antipoverty programs. She said she had not been able to find work as an accountant because employers preferred to hire younger people, and she could not afford training to improve her job skills.

So Mrs. Cabading earns the equivalent of about \$3 a day selling newspapers, pens and gum along the sidewalk in Manila. When she applied for government assistance, she was told that she would need to wait at home as long as two months for a government representative to interview her.

She was unable do this because she had to work at her small stand to pay her rent. She has since borrowed from a local lender and now she is in a common poverty trap in the Philippines: She is working at subsistence wages, without government help, to survive and pay off her loans.

"The Philippines is improving," she said while waiting for the next customer at her small stand. "But it hasn't reached me yet."

Freddie Aguilar Marries 16-Year-Old GF In Muslim Ceremony



So what's up with the 60-year-old folk singer who has been getting the flak from public opinion due to his controversial love affair? The last we heard from him was a few weeks ago when a concerned citizen named Fernando Perito filed a charge of Qualified Seduction against him before the Office of the Prosecutor in Quezon City.

Qualified Seduction is also known as Article 337 of the Revised Penal Code of the Philippine Constitution. It serves as a shield for minors, especially women, against much older men who could be presumed to be taking advantage of their age in making sexual and emotional advances.

Freddie has remained firm on his decision to stand by his decision to keep the relationship. He has previously declared that he would fight for his love. At the same time, he dismissed suggestions that he wait for two more years before he officially makes his relationship formal through marrying the girl.

For Freddie's wife, the 16-year old Jovie Gatdula Albao, their Muslim wedding was a way of proving their love for each other amid criticisms aimed at them since the musician announced their relationship in October.

She briefly spoke during the round of media interviews shortly after the Islamic rites held in a restaurant in Buluan Maguindanao, saying she is happy with her decision to marry the 60-year-old "Anak" hitmaker.

"Syempre masaya ko, kasi hindi naman nabubuhay para sa ibang tao," she said. "Nabubuhay kami para sa sarali namin. 'Yung ginagawa namin [ay] dahil gusto namin 'to, mahal namin ang isa't-isa at pinapatunayan lang namin ang pagmamahal namin."

The singer said that among the reasons they decided to wed -- the couple initially planned to settle down when she turns 18 -- was to stop being the target of criticisms.

"Sana tumigil na 'yung mga detractors namin. Kasi kaya nga kami nagpakasal kasi ayaw ngang tumigil 'yung mga paninira sa aming dalawa," he said. "So naisipan naming dalawa na kung magpapakasal na kami ay titigil na lahat, hindi na nila iisipin na kasalanan 'yung ginagawa namin."

With his candid admission of the relationship on the sidelines of a music awards show in October, Aguilar stirred controversy and drew flak for being a supposed "cradle-snatcher" and a "dirty old man" — terms the singer himself brought up and readily addressed.

Aguilar repeatedly mentioned having the approval of his girlfriend's parents, who are based in Naujan, Oriental Mindoro.

His partner stressed in a number of interviews that she genuinely loves Aguilar and dismissed speculations that she is only interested in his wealth and popularity.

Short of mentioning Catholic practices, Aguilar on Friday said, "Hindi po namin mahintay ang dalawang taon para pahintulutan kami ng tinatawag nating sistema na umiiral dito sa atin."

Israeli defense forces say Thank you to Yolanda survivors

MANILA - The Israeli Defense Forces (IDF) and Israel Ambassador Menashe Bar On reported that they have treated 2,000 patients and saved many lives but in the end, they are the ones who want to thank the Filipino people.

Two weeks ago, the government of Israel sent a 148-strong contingent complete with an elite rescue team.

They set up a field hospital in Bogo City, Cebu and treated a never-ending stream of patients.

They chose Bogo City even if it's not in the news.

"You can see the damage over there is quite similar to the damage in Tacloban. We decided to go to the places not on TV. We decided to go to the people and to help people, this is our main goal," said Col. Shai Bruvender, Israeli military attache to the Philippines.

Ambassador Bar On said the Israeli contingent will stay until Christmas.

"After that, professionals will come to continue programs for the long term. We have program for short term, midterm and long term," he said.

Bar On added they will leave their equipment so that others can take over.

They also donated \$500 million worth of medicine to the governor of Cebu to be distributed to public hospitals.

Meanwhile, IDF Surgeon General Yitzhak Kreiss praised the Filipinos.

"We are privileged to be here. I have to say something more. We've seen people in disasters unfortunately during the last decade. I have to say that the Philippine people behave gently, delicately, out of respect to each other and out of respect to the ones who come to help. This is something to be appreciated. Us Israelis can appreciate that. I wish the Philippines to overcome this disaster n move forward to a better future."

World offers more Aid to PHL

World leaders have offered to help in the reconstruction of communities in the central Philippines destroyed by Supertyphoon "Yolanda," Malacañang said.

She said Aquino had also talked with Jim Yong Kim, president of the World Bank, which has nearly doubled the amount of aid the Philippines can tap for the reconstruction effort.

"All of them (world leaders) always end (the call) by saying that if there's

anything else we can do to help you, just say the word, we will be happy to (help)," Valte said.

She said Aquino was "very thankful." Kim said he mobilized the World Bank's staff to facilitate quick delivery of the \$500-million emergency budget support, with teams working around the clock, due to the urgency of the situation in the Philippines.


He also talked with Bea's mother to apologize for what happened.

Goldberg earlier said he would help the victims of Yolanda, which tore through the Visayas and Southern Luzon last Nov. 8 and left more than 5,000 dead.

The unselfie was an idea of an ad agency trying to mobilize support for Yolanda victims by having people post an unselfie - a photo of themselves holding a piece of paper seeking support.

"Called #Unselfie, the idea simply calls on people to write a simple donation call to action such assupportunicef. org/Philippines or redcross.org.ph/



donatenow on a sheet of paper - with the hashtag #unselfie - and take a selfie (picture of themselves) while holding it," said BBDO Guerrero, which launched the idea.

They are then asked to post the selfie photo on their profile page on social networking sites like Facebook or Twitter.

BBDO Guerrero said the unselfie campaign "is a response to the call for relief aid here in the Philippines."

Meanwhile, even Filipino-American Jessica Cox, the world's first armless pilot, was not spared from the tragedy brought by Yolanda.

The plan is to do a fundraising dinner monthly for as long as possible as the people back home will still need help long after the global media attention has moved on. We hope to feature a different guest chef each month as we already have interest from so many great chefs in the city. We will select someone different in the community who we can help directly. If you know of anyone who could use assistance for their family please let us know."





typhoon "Yolanda" after being auctioned off. The amount was announced by Curtis during the telecast of "It's Showtime," which she co-hosts, as

she personally thanked the buyer of her "impromptu artwork."

The painting, which reads "Bangong Pilipinas, Kaya Natin 'To" and signed by Curtis, was bought by Angelit Perez.

"From the bottom of our hearts, and on behalf of all the survivors po na matutulungan ninyo, maraming, maraming salamat po," Curtis told Perez, who visited the "It's Showtime" studio. "May God continue to bless your family even more."

Meanwhile, Curtis' co-host on the noontime program, Vice Ganda, also announced the amount raised from their two-night show held at Laffline comedy bar in Quezon City early this week.

He said the show, which featured performances from the other "It's Showtime" hosts, as well as comedians, Chokoleit, Pokwang and Pooh, raised P1.5 million.

In total, the fundraising initiatives of the noontime show, which also includes a donation from Star Mobile and Euro Towers, produced some P2.1 million, according to Vice Ganda.

Pacquiao wins over Rios

MACAU, China - Filipino boxing legend Manny Pacquiao beat American fighter Brandon Rios in a 12-round title bout at the Venetian resort hotel in Macau, China, stopping his younger challenger in a unanimous decision.

With precision punching, Pacquiao landed three or four times the number of punches that his opponent did, punishing him with a flurry of 3- and 4-punch combinations.

Pacquiao demonstrated his mastery in Round 9 with a seven-punch combination as Rios' punches seemed to lose power.

In Round 6, Pacquiao landed a hard right that opened a cut above Rio's right eye, which became swollen in the following rounds. With his victory, the 34-year-old boxer won the WBO international welterweight title and revived a flagging career after two consecutive losses

Sunday's bout was the Filipino boxer's first after his shocking sixth-round knockout at the hands of Juan Manuel Marquez in December 2012.

Going into the fight, the eight-division world champion Pacquiao (54-5-2, 38 KOs) was an overwhelming favorite to win over Rios (31-1-1, 22 KOs).

He dedicated the fight to the victims of typhoon Yolanda, which devastated provinces in the Visayas earlier this month.

"I'm doing my best to give a good fight and to win the fight, especially with what happened to my countrymen and what happened to the Philippines with the typhoon," said Pacquiao. "To all the people and families affected by this storm, this fight is for you."

Although Pacquiao was unable to knock out his opponent, he won convincingly, with one judge giving him all 12 rounds.

After the bout, Pacquiao walked to the opposing corner and shook hands with everyone, including Rios' strength and conditioning manager, who had an altercation with his trainer Freddie Roach.

He also gave credit to Rios for taking his most powerful punches, and said he was ready for even stronger opponents.

She was never my girlfriend



kipping breakfast and overeating in the evening have been shown to play a significant role in weight gain and obesity. A study in the journal Obesity found that consuming the heaviest meal of the day at breakfast and the lightest at dinner can lead to significant weight loss.

From June to October 2012, researchers at Tel Aviv University in Israel recruited 93 overweight and obese women to participate in a three-month, 1,400-calorie-a-day diet, an amount recommended in some weight-loss diets. The women were in their mid-40s and had metabolic syndrome, the term for a cluster of health conditions associated with Type 2 diabetes. Half the women were assigned to



a breakfast group (BF) that consumed 50% of the allotted daily calories at breakfast, 36% at lunch and 14% at dinner. A dinner group (D) did the opposite, eating 14% of calories at breakfast, 36% at midday and 50% at dinner. Participants were measured

for various body and metabolic markers every two weeks.

The BF subjects lost an average 19.1 pounds over 12 weeks, while the D group shed 7.9 pounds.

Levels of glucose, insulin and ghrelin, an appetite hormone, decreased significantly in both groups but to a greater extent in BF subjects. The BF group also had significantly lower glucose and insulin responses in post-lunch blood tests, suggesting that eating a relatively high-calorie breakfast helped to maintain stable insulin levels after the second meal of the day, researchers said.

Caveat: The study was too short to determine the long-term health benefits of high-energy intake at breakfast, they said.

MANILA -- Pokwang on Sunday admitted on "Buzz ng Bayan" that she has a long-standing crush with her "Call Center Girl" co-star Jestoni Alarcon.

The comedienne, who is currently promoting the upcoming comedy film, confessed that even before she entered the world of showbiz, she used to swoon over Alarcon's "angelic face."



Tacloban Journalists out of a Job

TACLOBAN CITY, Philippines— Journalists here have temporarily lost their livelihood after Supertyphoon "Yolanda" destroyed their offices. Some have found ways to earn a living—by working as stringers.

One of them, Jazmine Bonifacio, was connected with radio station dyDW or Radio Diwa, which is managed by the Society of Divine Word (SVD) with dyRF in Cebu as its main station.

For the past six days now, Bonifacio has been working with Nathan Lane, an American journalist based in Japan who is working for Reuters.

Bonifacio works as a buddy/stringer for Reuters and earns P2,000 daily, which she receives at the end of the day's work that starts at 7 a.m. and ends before 6 p.m.

"This is a good relief, a good opportunity for me. I have no job right now as our station remains inoperational due to Yolanda," Bonifacio said. The station was badly battered and its equipment was destroyed by the supertyphoon, she said.

Bonifacio said she has no idea when the station would resume operations.

"But one thing is sure, it would take some months before the station could start airing again," Bonifacio said.

Lane said he was lucky to have Bonifacio as a buddy-stringer.

"She (Bonifacio) has helped me a lot. I'm an American and I don't know anything about this place (Tacloban). He, however, could not say how long he would stay in Tacloban to cover events related to Yolanda that practically leveled Tacloban.
