TB on the Rise in PHL

Crowded living conditions contribute to rise of TB cases

MANILA, Philippines—A large proportion of tuberculosis patients in the US are Asians, most of them Filipinos, a San-Francisco based medical expert has disclosed.

Dr. L. Masae Kawamura, former president of the North American Region of the International Union against Tuberculosis and Lung Disease, told reporters last week about the rising statistics of Filipino patients suffering from TB who are migrating to the United States.

She said in a press forum that TB is an "outcome of poor public health." She appealed to the local government and health offices to prioritize early TB screening and bolster treatment in the country.

"The Philippines exports more tuberculosis patients than import at this point... TB is a disease of poverty and migration, and urbanization [because] people are moving from the rural

Aquino now wants Pork Abolished

Aquino misleading when he says "Time to Abolish PDAF" - BAYAN

MANILA, Philippines – "Panahon na po para i-abolish ang PDAF."


President Aquino made this statement on Friday, August 23, in a speech aired live nationwide from Malacañang, weeks after the systematic siphoning of lawmakers' pork barrel by dubious NGOs was exposed in media reports and later confirmed in a special government audit.

But, really, what he was saying: an overhauled pork barrel system – supposedly designed to be more transparent – will only replace the now much-maligned PDAF.

"Sisiguruhin kong bawat mamamayan at sektor ay makakakuha ng patas na bahagi ng pambansang budget para sa serbisyong pangkalusugan, scholarship, proyektong lumilikha ng kabuhayan, at lokal na imprastruktura," the President said, before enumerating budgetary reforms.

Days ago, the President stood firm on keeping the Priority Assistance

Automated voting 99.97% accurate

Machine and People will never be the same

MANILA -The automated counting of votes in the May 13 elections proved 99.9747 percent accurate, according to results of a random manual audit (RMA) of votes in more than 200 precincts nationwide.

The 99.9747 percent accuracy rate is slightly higher than the percentage reported in the 2010 elections, but still falls short of the 99.995 percent rate set by the Commission on Elections, which the RMA Chair says is understandable

as machine and human appreciation will never be the same.

In the 2010 presidential election, RMA results registered an accuracy rate of 99.6 percent.

"Machine and people will never be the same. You cannot ever bed the AES (automated election system) and the manual count and come up with the perfect match because there is always the human factor to consider when the manual system...is concerned," said Ambassador Henrietta De Villa, the Chair of the RMA Committee.

De Villa is also the chair of the Parish Pastoral Council for Responsible Voting (PPCRV), one of the election commission's citizens' arms.

"It's not perfect but it is definitely accurate, very accurate," says Comelec Chairman Sixto Brillantes Jr. who agrees

For Senator Francis "Chiz" Escudero, the community tax certificate has long lost its significance and value in the modern days.

In fact, Escudero is convinced the government should abolish the use of cedula as a form of identification in Senate Bill No. 1082.

"The cedula now proves to be an unnecessary burden imposed on our people who are required to present it when doing public transactions," Escudero said.

"It was deemed useless by our forebears during the colonial times, it is more so today," he added.

A cedula is required when a person acknowledges a document before a notary public, takes an oath of office or

Lo-waist Gang

Fernando Poe, Jr. was barely 17 years old when he starred in the first of a series of highly successful "Lo' Waist Gang" in July 1956. It jumpstarted his career after a below par showing of his first movie, "Anak ni Palaris" in

The public tended to see Lo-Waist Gang as a real-life gang that Ronnie, like any other members of the gang, often found themselves provoked and set upon by kanto boys wanting to test them out. Actually, says Ronnie, Lo' Waist was a gang only onscreen; Zaldy Zshornack had his own barkada, and so did Boy Sta. Romana; and the only members that Ronnie moved around with after working hours were Berting Labra (because Labra worked for Poe senior) and Boy Francisco (because Boy and Ronnie were both courting Corazon Rivas at that time). "I didn't become really close to Zaldy until after Lo' Waist," says Ronnie.

Lo' Waist Gang was the big break, but Ronnie's smile is rather sad as he reels off the once-famous gang's names: Zaldy, Labra, Sta. Romana, Bobby Gonzales, Tony Cruz, Mario Antonio, Butch Bautista, Boy Francisco..."Let me see, have I forgotten anybody?" And melancholy does resound in the litany as one thinks of Boy Sta. Romana, violently dead; or of Zaldy, who soared and slipped and came back; or of the others for the moment of glory was as brief as youth, though the '50s are forever young in their faces.

For Lo' Waist not only summed up a generation, the barkada youth of the 1950s; it was also a landmark in Philippine movies, as may be seen in Ronnie's transformation. From the escapist unreality of the costume pictures he had been doing, he shifted, in Lo' Waist, along with the Philippine cinema, to the contemporary world and became topical, wearing the look of the '50s, speaking the idiom of the '50s. It was the Santiagos who made Philippine cinema of our times.

Lo' Waist Gang was such a huge box-office success and prompted the production of sequels all totaling 8 more (from 1956 to 1960).lt also started a fashion fad then: low-waist pants.

PH extends visa-free stay for 151 countries

MANILA - The Philippines is extending a warmer welcome to citizens of 151 countries by allowing them to stay in the country visa-free

Starting Aug. 1, 2013, nationals from countries with visa-free privilege may stay for 30 days in the Philippines, SAID the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA). The visa-free stay is an extension of the previous period of only 21 days.

The new policy is in line with government goals of boosting tourism and attracting more foreign investments in various areas in the Philippines.

Under the new scheme, qualified foreign nationals only need to present a passport valid for at least six months beyond their planned stay and an outbound ticket.

"This move will hopefully encourage more tourists and investors to visit and stay in the Philippines by removing the need for them to report to immigration offices for a stay of up to a month," Assistant Secretary of Consular Affairs Jaime Victor Ledda said.

"It will also give them more flexibility in planning and managing their schedules," he added.

Meanwhile, Brazil and Israel nationals may still stay in the country 59-day visa-free given bilateral agreements with the Philippines.

Princess sold alcohol at cockfights



PORTLAND, Oregon — Investigators say a Romanian princess sold food and alcohol during cockfighting derbies that she and her husband are accused of running at their Oregon ranch.

In an application for a search warrant unsealed last month, investigators say two informants secretly recorded the cockfights for a year.

Authorities say the videos show Irina Walker, daughter of the last king of Romania, selling alcohol and food to spectators.

Walker and her husband, former deputy sheriff John Walker, have pleaded not guilty to charges of running an illegal gambling operation and conspiring to violate the Animal Welfare Act.

Investigators say they seized cash, financial records, cellphones, firearms and fighting implements. They also took needles, medications and a substance they suspect is methamphetamine.

Authorities say roosters are often given drugs to improve their performance.

Filipinos ignoring calls for repatriation from Egypt

MANILA, Philippines—The Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) said Filipinos in Egypt were coming to the Philippine Embassy in Cairo in trickles to sign up for repatriation after the violence in that Middle East

country worsened.

The same lukewarm response from Filipinos was seen by the DFA during past evacuations of Philippine citizens from other crisis-stricken countries in Africa and the Middle East.

DFA spokesman Assistant Secretary Raul Hernandez (PHOTO) called again on Filipinos in Egypt to heed the call of their government and leave the Arab country where protests against the sacking of President Mohammed Morsi have grown increasingly large and violent.

"We are urging our citizens to register with the embassy as soon as possible," said Hernandez. He said the Philippine Embassy in Cairo had mobilized Filipino community leaders to assist

in the repatriation by reaching out to the estimated 6,000 Filipinos all over Egypt.

"We have been advising our people to take extra precautions and to seek help from our embassy. We believe it is for their safety that they be repatriated," Hernandez said in a press briefing on Thursday.

Hernandez said previous mandatory repatriations conducted by the DFA in other troubled countries were also initially met with indifference by Filipino expatriates.


"That's always the challenge that we face with regard to mandatory repatriation. We experienced this in Libya, Syria and also in Yemen," he said.

"What is important is that we continue to encourage them and make resources available to them so that when they finally decide to go home for their safety, we can help them," Hernandez said.

The government has released \$240,000, or about P10 million, to cover the repatriation effort, including the airfare of returning Filipinos.

So far only five Filipinos—three from Cairo and two from Alexandria—had taken up the government offer of a free ride home, arriving in Manila on Wednesday afternoon.

Currently the DFA is also conducting a mandatory repatriation of Filipinos from Syria where civil war has broken out between rebel forces and the military of President Bashir al-Assad. Since 2011, the Philippine government has flown 4,510 Filipinos home, leaving some 3,000 still in Syria.

US, Phl vow freedom of navigation amid Asia sea spat

MANILA - The United States and the Philippines have vowed to maintain freedom of navigation in a Southeast Asia increasingly beset by maritime territorial rows, the two military allies said.

The military chiefs of the two countries made the pledge in the United States as their governments held talks on expanding the American military presence in the Philippines, a joint statement said.

"We share a common interest in maintaining freedom of navigation, unimpeded lawful commerce, and transit of people and goods across the seas," said Philippine military chief General Emmanuel Bautista and General Martin Dempsey, chairman of the US Joint Chiefs of Staff.

"We resolve to... strengthen the Southeast Asia security environment in a manner that protects the interests of all who value unimpeded commerce transiting through the maritime domain, while deterring those who would restrict it or act in a manner that might place it at risk."

The Philippines has been looking to the United States for military and political support as part of efforts to protect its claims to South China Sea waters from an increasingly assertive China.

Both generals called for a "rules-based approach in resolving competing claims in maritime areas by peaceful means -- within the framework of international law".

Though the statement did not mention China, the Philippines has accused Beijing of endangering Asian peace and maritime commerce through its claims over most of the South China Sea, including areas close to the coast of the Philippines.

While the United States has insisted

it does not take sides in the dispute, it has been seeking to rebuild its military footprint in the Philippines, a military ally since 1951, as part of President Barack Obama's strategic "pivot" to Asia.

"We expect a robust, balanced and responsive security partnership... (through) mutually beneficial bilateral military training, exercises and operations, provided by an increased rotational and temporary presence of US military forces operating from Armed Forces of the Philippines-controlled facilities," the statement said.

The Philippines had hosted tens of thousands of US soldiers at two bases near Manila, but they were forced to leave in 1992 after the Philippine Senate voted to end their lease contracts amid strong anti-American sentiment.

A new agreement in 1999 allowed US troops to return to the Philippines for joint military exercises every year.

US special forces have also been rotating through the southern Philippines since 2002 to help local soldiers who are fighting Islamic militants.

Tougher Penalties for Graft

+ Plant a tree for every newborn



MANILA - Senate Blue Ribbon committee chief Sen. Teofisto "TG" Guingona III is pushing passage of a bill that seeks to increase the penalty for those found guilty of graft and corruption.

In filing Senate Bill No. 1086, Guingona said he wants to amend Section 9 of Republic Act No. 3019, the Anti-Graft and Corrupt Practices Act, by increasing the penalties of unlawful acts or omissions enumerated under Sections 3, 4, 5 and 6 of the law. "The reason for the increase of penalty for said offenses is to ensure that the penalties imposed by law are commensurate with the crime committed," Guingona said.

According to Guingona, the bill is a result of the investigation conducted by the Committee on Accountability of Public Officers & Investigations also known as the Blue Ribbon panel on the Philippine National Police (PNP) helicopters deal which was linked to former First Gentleman Jose Miguel "Mike" Arroyo during the 15th Congress.

Guingona, who was also chairman of the committee in the last Congress, acted on the resolution filed by then Senator Panfilo Lacson on the PNP's purchase of P105-million "pre-owned" helicopters in 2009 for its elite Special Action Force

(SAF) unit

The senator said the measure also seeks to lengthen the prescriptive period of offenses under Republic Act No. 3019.

It also seeks to ensure that the right of the State to recover properties acquired through the commission of the acts enumerated under Republic Act No. 3019 shall not be barred by prescription, laches or estoppel. Guingona recommended that from six to 15 years, the penalty for graft and corruption should be made 12 to 20 years.

This is aside from perpetual disqualification from public office, and confiscation or forfeiture in favor of the government of any prohibited interest and unexplained wealth manifestly out of proportion to his salary and other lawful income.

A tree for every newborn

MANILA - To engage Filipino families in the government's reforestation program, a first-time lawmaker proposes mandatory planting of two trees for every child born to them.

House Bill 261 or the proposed "Family Tree Planting Act of 2013," Parañaque City Rep. Eric Olivarez said his measure is an "appropriate solution

to the widespread flash floods" which the country keeps on experiencing because the forests are denuded.

Citing a statistics from the National Statistics Office and Human Development Report, he said that it will assure at least four million trees yearly with the country's two million birth rate per year.

The bill provides that each couple, whether legally married or not, residing in the country, shall be required to plant two trees for every child born to them. These trees shall be planted within the premises of their family home.

If this is not possible, the trees shall be planted in the areas to be designated by the concerned Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Office (PENRO) or Community Environment and Natural Resources Office (CENRO) where they reside

Then, the ownership of the planted tress shall pertain to the parents or to the child for whom these were planted. These include those planted in public lands or along highways, it added. If the measure will be passed, an affidavit by both parents or by the solo parent exercising parental authority over the child attesting they have planted two trees will be a "prerequisite" for the release of the Certificate of Live Birth of the child.

"The number of trees to be planted as a result of this proposal will be very significant and will effectively supplement the 1.5 billion trees to be planted by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) through its National Greening Program (NGP), taking into account the thousands of babies who are born in the Philippines every day," Olivarez said.

According to the report of National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC), the rains and floods brought by 'Maring and southwest monsoon this week damaged a total of 94 hectares of trees in Laguna that were planted under DENR's National Greening Program.

countryside to the big cities like Manila," said Kawamura.

Ranking second in Asia, the Philippines recorded high TB mortality rate next to Cambodia based on the World Health Organization (WHO) tuberculosis report. Among tuberculosis-afflicted persons, 59 percent came from Asia, the report said.

Kawamura said that tuberculosis can be latent, a condition where the infected does not experience any symptoms.

"To minimize the spread of tuberculosis and an outbreak risk, the government should work on providing a screening for people in congregate settings such as dialysis units, schools, hospitals, jails, prisons, homeless shelters and nursing



homes," she said.

The medical expert claimed that Filipinos living in crowded places, especially those in shanty communities, are more likely to develop and transmit TB.

"Having latent TB even though no one's

Dr. L. Masae Kawamura, former president of the North American Region of the International Union against Tuberculosis and Lung Disease, told reporters in press forum on Aug. 15, 2013, about the rising statistics of Filipino patients suffering from TB who are migrating to the United States. She said large proportion of tuberculosis patients in the US are Asians, most of them Filipinos.

at fault carries a lot of stigma especially among Filipinos. The Philippines has a lot of people coming in from other parts of Asia that have high rates of TB as well," she said.

According to Kawamura, the Philippine government detects only the full-blown TB cases rather than the latent ones.

"It easily evades our immune system and you may carry it as a child but be diagnosed with the disease 50 years later," she said.

She added that accurate identification of latent TB bacteria is required since these persist in our body for years and decades; they are only inactive.

Kawamura also stressed that contributors could increase an individual's chance of getting TB.

"Because it affects most of the children, just dealing with malnutrition will help beat tuberculosis. Preventing HIV and diabetes will help reduce TB cases as well. This is how it all interacts," she said.

The TB control advocate also claimed that "because we breathe, we are all susceptible. Tuberculosis is an equal-opportunity disease. We can all get infected."



PDAF Abolition news is Misleading

Development Fund (PDAF) of senators and lawmakers.

The announcement for pork barrel "reforms" came 3 days before the antipork barrel rallies planned by various sectors in Metro Manila and key cities across the country. The rallies would be the first major demonstration during this administration that has been anchored on an anti-corruption slogan.

Before this, some sectors had already called for an official audit of the PDAF that would include years under the Aquino administration, as the special state audit recently publicized covered only the last 3 years of the previous administration.

Suggestions have been made about checking how the President has utilized his own discretionary fund, which is far bigger than the lawmakers' pork barrel, as well as how Aquino utilized his own pork barrel when he was congressman and senator for 12 years.

The President made the announcement in the presence of the leaders of both chambers of Congress – Senate President Franklin Drilon and House Speaker Feliciano Belmonte Jr, who both earlier dismissed calls for a congressional probe into the scam.

The President ordered the creation of an Inter-Agency, Anti-Graft Coordinating Council (IAAGCC), which will investigate alleged misuse of pork barrel.

The council will focus on speeding up the investigation and prosecution of cases of alleged pork barrel misuse, and the President called on all government

officials to give their full cooperation to the council.

Aquino said the pork barrel system will undergo a major overhaul, which he said will prevent public funds from going toward shady, questionable transactions.

He said there will be a limited menu that will be allowed government funding, and project details will be required before funds are released.

Aquino said budget insertions will be stopped, and instead lawmakers should propose the projects upfront and should be approved. These projects, he said, will be included as line items in the budget.

Other measures that the government will undertake, according to Aquino, are:

Consumable soft projects – such as medicines, fertilizers, and training materials, to name a few – will not be approved unless it will be proven that people

will benefit.

Quick infrastructure projects, such as dredging and asphalt overlays, are out.

Non-governmental organizations and select government-owned and -controlled corporations (GOCCs) will no longer be allowed to be used as fund channels.

Lawmakers can only fund projects for their district or sector.

Government bidding processes and budgets will be publicized.

"Hihimayin ang bawat linya, bawat piso, bawat proyekto, gaya ng lahat ng iba pang mga programa ng inyong pamahalaan," he said.

Aside from overhauling the pork barrel system, Aquino also vowed to prosecute those found guilty of misusing their







UK Advisory to Avoid PHL Ferries

LONDON - The UK Foreign Office has issued a strong warning to its citizens against the use of ferries in the Philippines following the latest maritime disaster in the country. In a statement on its website, British visitors to the Philippines have been advised to



"avoid travel on ferries if possible" in light of "major accidents" with "large loss of life."

It stated: "Ferries are often overloaded, lack necessary lifesaving equipment, are not adequately maintained and have incomplete passenger manifests. Storms can develop quickly."

The most recent incident, a collision between a passenger ship and a cargo vessel near Cebu, has been widely reported in the British and international press, putting a spotlight on the country's tainted

record on maritime safety.

The Telegraph, a UK-based broadsheet and news website, pointed out the recurring nature of the issue by listing previous ferry accidents in the country, including "one of the world's worst shipping disasters," the Doña Paz incident in 1987 which killed 4,300 people near Mindoro

Chit Afuang from the Philippine Department of Tourism in London said the British travel warning may have some effects on tourism in the archipelago "but not to a greater extent."

"Most of our tourists travel via air. Only Cebu and Bohol, Manila-Puerto Galera and Iloilo-Guimaras, less popular destinations, need ferry travel," she explained.





Pinay Nanny can't find Job

MANILA – A Filipina nanny, who was treated like a modern-day slave by her



employers in Vancouver, is "embarrassed" by the attention her case has created.

T h e C a n a d i a n Press reported that Leticia

Sarmiento, in a victim impact statement read in court, has lost trust in people and has had difficulty finding employment.

"I'm a good mother, a good daughter. I never do bad things. I help people and I expect the same back," Sarmiento was quoted as saying.

Her employer Franco Yiu Kwan Orr was found guilty in June of human trafficking, having brought Sarmiento from Hong Kong illegally.

Sarmiento started working for Orr's family in Hong Kong in 2007. In 2008, Orr brought her to Canada to work for the family on a visitor's vsia.

Sarmiento claimed she was working 16 hours a day, 7 days a week, for only \$500 a month and her passport taken away.

The Filipina nanny, a mother of 3, said she has not seen her children since 2007, when she left the Philippines. She had believed she would be able to bring her children to Canada.

"In 2010 I stopped having income to send home, so my kids stopped going to school," she said.

The media attention surrounding her case has also made it hard for Sarmiento to find another job.

Ping Lacson:

'Pork' scam include Sex



MANILA, Philippines - Sex for "pork"? Former senator Panfilo Lacson said sex was used as a bargaining chip to obtain Priority Development Assistance Fund (PDAF) or pork barrel from lawmakers.

Lacson claimed big businessmen used sex in a carrot-and-stick approach to corner huge funds for their "projects," and businesswoman Janet Lim-Napoles was just a "poster person" for the modus operandi.

Lacson said operators would either offer sex or send attractive women to Congress to get approval for millions of pesos worth of "projects" from congressmen.

"Pag pumayag, kasama pati mga babae kasama na (If they agree to a project), the girls are included," he said.

Lacson, a former Philippine National Police chief, is being tapped by President Aquino to head a special investigation team to look into the alleged misuse of pork barrel.

He said he is willing to lead the probe but would like to be given a free hand on the job.

The former senator said he would know about the scope of his job as he cited the need for a law enforcement component that would work under the Ombudsman to effectively fight corruption.

"The pork barrel should never go through non-government organizations and that legislators should be held accountable for how their funds are spent," Lacson told ANC.

In an earlier interview with GMA News, Lacson said the alleged misuse of P10 billion in PDAF shows the evil of the pork barrel system and suggested that Congress go one year without the controversial fund.

He said in many cases, lawmakers could attend to the needs of their constituents by giving them donated items like wheelchairs and reading glasses.

Cagayan town eyed as naval base for US troops

TUGUEGARAO, Philippines – The coastal town of Sta. Ana in Cagayan is being considered as an ideal naval base for American troops to help counter China's assertiveness in the West Philippine Sea.

Sta. Ana Mayor Darwin Tobias said he has no objection to host visiting American soldiers in his town, adding it is strategically located near the disputed sea.

"We need the support of allied countries that could help us preserve our sovereignty and security amid the bullying from powerful countries," Tobias said.

He said the temporary deployment of US troops in Sta. Ana could provide livelihood as well as business opportunities for its residents.

Sta. Ana, previously known as Barrio Palawig, used to be a part of Gonzaga town, which was cited in history as the location of Japanese forces on Dec. 10, 1941.

After the war on Oct. 21, 1949, then President Elpidio Quirino issued an executive order creating the town of Sta. Ana.





Chiz to Gov't:

Stop renting office spaces

MANILA - Senator Francis 'Chiz' Escudero, chairman of the finance committee, expressed his belief that the national government may be able to save millions of funds if it stops renting office spaces and buildings and just acquires real properties for the use of various government agencies. "By way of policy, the government should make a shift in three years and should not be renting office spaces anymore" said This, he said, is due to the fact that the government spends billions annually just to maintain existing government offices for lease and rental expenses.

The senator said he sees this as a waste of much-needed resources vis-a-vis long-term investments and other needed capitalization.

"Renting spaces at a cost is like throwing money down the drain," he said.

PHL assures Public

MANILA - After several bombing attacks in Mindanao, Malacanang urged the public to be more careful in believing reports about planned bombing missions by Muslim rebels in Metro Manila.

"Let's make sure that it comes from the correct sources because as it is, we don't want to be spreading incorrect information," deputy presidential spokesperson Abigail Valte said. She was referring to rumors that a group of young members of the Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters are in Metro Manila to carry out test bombing missions.

Valte nonetheless assured the public that measures are in place to thwart any other planned explosions and to probe the blasts, which occurred amid a U.S.-issued global terror alert.

"Gumagalaw lahat ng kawani ng pamahalaan para siguraduhin na matigil ang mga ganitong pangyayari katulad ng sinabi ng Pangulo noong nakaraang araw," Valte said.

"I'm back!" she said in the accompanying caption of a photo showing her striking goofy poses at the MYX studio.



No Proof of Sex for Flight

MANILA, Philippines—Not finding any evidence of a sex-for-repatriation racket, the labor official in Riyadh who was the subject of recent complaints from distressed overseas women workers will face charges of "simple negligence" for other work-related matters, Labor Secretary Rosalinda Baldoz said.

Baldoz said two other labor officials implicated in the sex-for-repatriation controversy will also face unrelated charges "for apparently not performing their duties well."

Baldoz has approved the filing of administrative charges against Riyadh Labor Attache Adam Musa for gross negligence; Jordan officer in charge Labor Attaché Mario Antonio for grave misconduct; and Riyadh Assistant Labor Attaché Antonio Villafuerte for simple negligence.

In a statement, Baldoz said the fact-finding team tasked to look into the controversy has found prima facie evidence against the officials, not for the sex-for-repatriation allegations but for other infractions, including their "failure to do their duties well."

She clarified that the team did not find the involvement of any of the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) organic personnel in any "sex-for-fly" or "sex-for-hire" activities. The investigation report said some distressed workers had apparently been recruited into a prostitution ring, but it did not involve their personnel.

In addition to the charge of simple negligence against Villafuerte, Baldoz also approved the fact-finding team's recommendation to refer the complaints for sexual harassment against the Riyadh official to the DOLE Committee on Decorum and Investigation.

Nicon Fameronag, DOLE spokesperson, said in an interview that Villafuerte's case of "simple negligence" will be endorsed to the DOLE Legal Service for a formal hearing.

"A case of simple negligence will be treated as a regular case so it was referred to the legal department," Fameronag said, explaining that the charge stemmed from Villafuerte's apparently "failing to take care of overseas Filipino workers (OFWs)" in his jurisdiction.

is appointed to a government position among others.

But Escudero argued that other proof of identifications such as passport, driver's license, and other government-issued IDs practically render cedulas "useless."

The veteran lawmaker's bill also seeks to repeal some provisions in the Local Government Code of 1991, which gave authority to local government units (LGUs) to impose residence tax.

"Abolishing the cedula practice is also like scrapping a relic of our colonial past. Yes, we must always look back at our past to know where we are going," Escudero explained.

"But the cedula is a thing of the past that should already be buried for its obsolescence" he noted.

Books about Philippine history said cedulas were implemented to reform the tax system in the country during the Spanish Colonial Period.

In 1896, national hero Andress Bonifacio led other katipuneros in tearing up their cedulas as a symbol of their defiance against the Spanish rule in Balintawak.

After the tribute system or head tax to Spain was abolished, the cedula was issued to all Filipinos upon payment of a residence tax.



What's Hot on the dating Scene? Good Credit

Tall. Brunette. Active. Likes running, tennis, traveling, and sipping tea in front of a roaring fire. Great credit score.

Wait a minute. Wha? Great credit score?

Yes, good credit is an attribute that has become worth shouting about on dating websites. That, anyway, is the theory behind creditscoredating. com and datemycreditscore.com, matchmaker websites addressing the concerns of the fiscally prudent lovelorn.

Never mind that these sites don't appear to be attracting a lot of traffic. They wouldn't exist at all if not for a burgeoning trend where mate seekers

long for a peek under your balance anything else. This who may bring tens of thousands of dollars of student debt to a relationship. That is such a turn-off.

The New York Times interviewed more than 50 daters under 40 from around the country and found



that many of them regarded a good credit score as a prerequisite for a good date. As the Times reported:

"Credit scores are like the dating equivalent of a sexually transmitted disease test,' said Manisha Thakor, the founder and chief executive of MoneyZen Wealth Management, a financial advisory firm. 'It's a shorthand way to get a sense of someone's financial past the same way an S.T.D. test gives some information about a person's sexual past."

Is this taking the beau-vetting process too far? I don't think so. Landlords and lenders may look at your credit score to help determine if you are worth taking a chance on. Even employers may do a credit check on you. Why not a prospective mate? How you handle money says a lot about your ability to be organized and responsible. Why would anyone with options risk falling for someone likely to bring heavy debt and poor spending and saving habits to a union?

Your credit score is a complex calculation based on your debts and payment history. A low score can keep a bank from lending you money for a house or car, or be the basis for charging a higher interest rate. Any score below 660 is a red flag; anything above 800 is considered stellar. In general, you're fine with anything at or above 750.

If your credit is poor, there are steps you can take to fix the problem. One irony is that you must use credit to build a decent credit score. A simple but critical part of this process is using a credit card—but never charging more than 30% of your card limit—and then paying down or paying off the balance in a timely way. That's not just a smart practice; on today's dating scene, it's downright sexy.

with De Villa that the "deficiencies are in human frailty."

Elections Commissioner Christian Robert Lim, who is in-charge of the RMA, has another take. "Pag namatch namin ang 99.995 or naka 100 percent kami, niluto na namin yan (If we were able to match 99,995 or 100 percent, then we already rigged the results)."


The accuracy rating was highest for senatorial votes at 99.9775 percent, followed by votes for mayor at 99.9748 percent and district representatives at 99.9719 percent.

De Villa said the recorded variances are mainly due to "clerical" and "mathematical" errors by the RMA team, whose members may have been erred due to drowsiness, fatigue and hunger.

The report RMAC released on covers only 212 out of 234 clustered precincts. Results from 22 precincts were not included for the following reasons: 11 have been elevated to the Technical Evaluation Committee (TEC) for further analysis since the validation team could not explain the variances. 4 are under election protests. One has a probable case of tampering, 3 have incomplete election results, 3 ballot boxes have incomplete ballots

De Villa said the 11 ballot boxes with the TEC will be included in a later report.

RA 9369 or the Automations Law requires a random manual audit of at least one clustered precinct for every legislative district. The RMA is a way to verify whether the PCOS machines correctly counted the votes in the May 13 elections.

Priority Development Assistance Fund (PDAF) more commonly known as pork barrel.

Bagong Alyansang Makabayan (Bayan) slammed Aquino for "misleading" the nation that the PDAF will be abolished saying "pork by any name is still pork," Bayan Secretary General Renato Reyes Jr.

"Aquino misled the nation with promises of reform while retaining the very corrupt system of patronage politics that pork represents," he said.

A Commission on Audit (COA) special audit report released recently found that billions of pesos from the PDAF of lawmakers ended up in the hands of Janet



Lim-Napoles, alleged mastermind of the pork barrel scam, through bogus nongovernment organizations.

"Aquino expectedly did not move to abolish presidential pork which is much larger than the PDAF, at least P450 billion by some estimates," Reves said. At least 15 senators have called for the abolition of the pork barrel including minority leader Juan Ponce Enrile, who wanted it to be totally removed from all government agencies.

"The protests must push through to call for the abolition of all congressional and presidential pork and for accountability not just of Napoles but all officials involved up to the present Aquino government," Reyes (PHOTO) said.
