

Aid Food Thrown or Spoiled

TACLOBAN CITY—Elation turned to horror for typhoon survivors in Barangay Gacao in Palo, Leyte, when maggots crawled out of the food packs that were distributed to them as relief.

Reports of the distribution of rotten food followed two other incidents in the province in which food aid that had gone bad was reported buried.

Barangay Chairman Panchito Cortez said he saw residents converging on the barangay hall waiting for food packs delivered by the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office of Palo.

When they opened the boxes, however, worms as big as grains of rice crawled out of tetra packs and cup noodles. Biscuits were expired, and even the bottled mineral water looked murky, Cortez said.

Cortez said the goods were received by Councilwoman Maria Anna Docena, and included 50 boxes of instant coffee, five sacks of assorted biscuits, cup noodles, instant viand in tetra packs and five boxes

Cortez said he immediately went to the Palo town hall and confronted MSWD officer Rosalina Balderas, who admitted that the goods came from their office.

She said she didn't know the food was already spoiled and infested with worms,

Balderas admitted that truckloads of expired and spoiled food aid were dumped and buried in an open dumpsite in Barangay. San Jose on Feb. 5 and March 6.

Balderas said that biscuits, cupcakes, canned goods, and even rice were declared by their office as being unfit for human

Duterte says no to 2016 presidential bid

DAVAO CITY, Philippines – Amid persistent calls on social network, Mayor Rodrigo Duterte reiterated on Sunday that no one could make him run for president in the 2016 elections.

"I will not run, you can't make me run, I'm not interested," Duterte said during the Sunday television program, "Gikan sa masa, para sa masa."

Running for president would entail some P15 billion to P20 billion to win and, Duterte said, he simply did not have that money and could not see himself owing somebody or some group P20 billion.

"What will I spend? I will rely on somebody to fund my campaign? That will mean P15 billion to P20 billion worth of utang na loob (debt of gratitude), so, what will I say if the one who funds my campaign will ask for a payback?" he asked.

"Besides, all presidents now go to jail after their presidency, so, please, have mercy on me," Duterte said.

Although he admitted being a close friend of both Interior Secretary Manuel "Mar" Roxas and Vice President Jejomar Binay, the mayor said he "is still keeping his cards close to his heart," and would reveal the candidate he would support at the appropriate time.

She started her career in the 1960s as an extra in several films and then later on became one of the artists of Sampaguita Pictures. 

NEW YORK -- A teenage thrill-chaser slipped through a fence, eluded a security guard and climbed to the top of 1 World Trade Center, authorities said Thursday, as concerns swirled about the audacious breach at what is supposed to be one of the world's most secure sites.

Justin Casquejo, 16, of Weehawken, N.J., described by a friend as an adventure-seeker who loves to climb precarious places, spent about two hours early Sunday atop the symbolic and as-yet-unfinished 1,776-foot tower, authorities said. He apparently just wanted bragging rights and perhaps some photos. But the alleged escapade stirred what-ifs about the notion of someone with a more sinister agenda infiltrating the nation's tallest skyscraper. "Obviously, it was shocking and troubling," said Mayor Bill de Blasio, "and I don't know how possibly it could have happened."

Joe Dunne, security chief of the bistate Port Authority that has jurisdiction over the building, said officials "take security and these types of infractions very seriously."

The youth was being held without bail after an arraignment Monday on criminal trespassing. His lawyer, Pamela Griffith, declined to comment.

The boy told police that he simply walked around the construction site and found a way through scaffolding about 4 a.m., according to a court complaint. He squeezed through a one-foot opening in a fence, said Port Authority of New York and New Jersey police spokesman Joe Pentangelo. The authority owns the site.

The court complaint quotes the teen saying he climbed to the sixth floor, rode an elevator to the 88th and then took stairs to the 104th. There, he slid past an inattentive security guard, a private contractor employee who has since been fired, Mr. Pentangelo said. The boy told police, "I went to the rooftop and climbed the ladder all the way to the

antenna," according to the complaint.

WABC-TV reported that he took pictures from atop the building; authorities said they were still trying to determine his motive. He was arrested on site, and his camera and cell phone were seized after authorities obtained a search warrant, Mr. Pentangelo said.

Patrick Flores, 18, a neighbor who grew up with the arrested youth, described him as "a really good kid" who has always been highly interested in adventure. "He was always the one climbing the cliffs, doing something stupid," Mr. Flores said, referring to cliffs on which Weehawken sits, across the Hudson River from Manhattan, with clear views of the World Trade Center and the rest of Manhattan's skyline.

"But that was him; that was his life," Mr. Flores said. "I've seen him fall and hit his head and get up and walk away like it was nothing.'

Mr. Flores said the boy had recently become interested in parkour, an extreme sport that combines elements of martial arts, gymnastics and rock climbing and has become popular through YouTube videos of acrobatic athletes vaulting around public outdoor obstacles such as park benches, guardrails and buildings.

If he was looking for bragging rights, Justin Casquejo couldn't have picked a more appropriate building. Throughout its reconstruction since the Sept. 11 attacks, the building once known as the Freedom Tower has been enmeshed in elaborate security proposals.

Ultimately, plans call for a \$40 million system of barriers and checkpoints around the 16-acre trade center, which includes several towers, the Sept. 11 memorial, a transit hub and other

2 Filipino teachers get life for drug 'mule'

Nearly five years after their arrest, two Filipino teachers in China moonlighting as drug mules for an international drug syndicate who chose them because of their "noble profession" have been meted out life sentences for smuggling heroin into Manila.

In his decision dated March 11, Judge Petronillo Sulla Jr. of the Pasay City Regional Trial Court Branch 110 found Salvador Agunday Alberto and Jane Turalde Vargas guilty of transporting 887.88 grams of heroin in 2009.

"The prosecution having proven the guilt of both accused beyond reasonable doubt of the offense charged in the information, judgment is hereby rendered finding them guilty as charged and they are hereby sentenced to [each] suffer the penalty of life imprisonment," he said.

At the same time, the judge ordered both to pay a fine of P500,000 each for violating the antidrugs act.

"The conviction of the pair hopefully will serve as a warning to others drug mules or those contemplating to [become] drug carriers not to succumb to easy money," NBI Deputy Director Ruel Lasala of the task force for illegal drugs told the Inquirer.

According to the NBI, the two taught in Bicol region until they left for teaching jobs in China in 2004. Both were later granted residency visas.

According to Lasala, drug mules get as much as P1.2 million per delivery, especially to China where they face the death penalty should they get caught. The price of illegal drugs in China is 10 times higher compared to that in other Asian countries.

Journalist-Writer Ace Alvarez Files for Candidacy as Trustee, TCDSB

TORONTO - Print and Broadcast journalist and writer Ace Alvarez says

If given the chance to be elected and be of further service to the Catholic community of Toronto, Alvarez will contribute his Catholic philosophy of education, flowing from a Catholic philosophy of life and instilled in him, having been bred and reared by his family and educated in Catholic schools on the eternal truths within his faith environment.

An active news and public affairs person, Alvarez finds time for community development work, for which he was recognized by the Government of Canada on November 30, 2012 with the prestigious Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal Award for his contributions to works on multiculturalism and diversity in the country.

Since 2000, Alvarez has been (and probably remains to be the only Filipino-Canadian in media) listed for his contribution to Canadian journalism in "Canadian Who's Who" -- the only reference book containing names of distinguished Canadians (listing in which, is by invitation only and based on merit), compiled and published annually by the University of Toronto.

The CNE is the largest annual fair in Canada and the fifth largest in North America, attracting



approximately 1.25 million visitors each year. He was also a member of the CNEA's Marketing Committee during the two terms he served from 2007 to 2009.

Among his other involvements were: 1st VP/Corporate Secretary/Director, Canadian Ethnic Media Association (CEMA) for eight years, until Thursday, September 11, 2008 when he was acclaimed by members as president during their Biennial General Meeting and Elections (after long-time president Ben Viccari stepped down) and stayed in office until October 13, 2009; VP & Director, Philippine Press Club-Ontario (2009-2010), and, Lifetime Member, National Press Club of the Philippines.

Alvarez served as Director & VP for General Public Relations of the premier business organization in Toronto, Philippine Chamber of Commerce-Toronto (PCCT) from 2005 to 2008. His services were again requested for the organization by the more influential members of the PCCT for the 2011-2012 term, this time as the 1st Vice President for Government Relations and Member of the Board. For eleven years from 1997 to 2008, Alvarez served as a member – and later becoming the Vice Chair of the Finance Committee of Holy Cross Parish in the former East York, Ontario.

News Station for Metropolitan Manila"—
both in the AM and FM Radio Broadcast

Alvarez was awarded in 1999 by the Canadian Ethnic Journalists' and Writers' Club for his consistent trenchant editorial writing during award ceremonies aired over Toronto's CFMT Television.

Alvarez serves as resource on ethnocultural media to two Torontobased advertising agencies and has, in the past, been a resource to a high profile multicultural PR company based in Toronto. Likewise, he served as resource to journalism students at one of Toronto's leading communication and media colleges, as well as the Ontario Chapter of the Federal Communications Council — an organization composed of Information/ Media Relations Officers of the various Ministries of the Canadian federal government.

Alvarez completed his Baccalaureate Degree in Journalism (BSJ) and Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) in Manila, Philippines and completed a Post Diploma Program in Human Resources Management at Seneca College in Toronto.

High power bills slows call centre growth



Call centers like the one in the photo operate 24×7 and consume a huge amount of electricity. Member companies of IT and Business Process Association of the Philippines (IT-BPAP) are concerned that the recent sharp increases in the cost of electricity would result in slower growth for the industry.

High power rates dim call center outlook

MANILA - Expensive power could hurt the Philippines' standing as one of the world's major hubs for business process outsourcing (BPO), industry officials say.

"While we understand the reasons for the high power costs in the Philippines, we also believe that something has to be done to bring it down to help the projected growth of the BPO industry," Stellar Philippines Human Resources Vice President Angelito Cruz said.

Cruz and some of his colleagues at the IT and Business Process Association of the Philippines (IT-BPAP) are concerned that the recent sharp increases in the cost of electricity would result in slower growth for the industry.

Cruz also said that the power hike may keep call center companies from providing better wages and incentives to their employees.

Even before the Manila Electric Co. (Meralco) sought to impose a P4.15 per kilowatt-hour increase last December – the steepest rate hike in history – Filipinos were already paying more for their power than most of their Asian counterparts.

In 2012, rates charged by the Manila Electric Co. were the ninth most expensive out of 44 distributors in Asia, a study by the International Energy Consultants revealed.

Data from the Japan External Trade Organization also showed that among 37 cities in Asia and Oceania in the same year, Manila had the third highest rates, with Filipinos paying three times more than power consumers in Beijing or Seoul.

While the Contact Center Association of the Philippines (CCAP) says the higher power rates will not affect employees' salaries, call center workers are worried nonetheless.

Gerald Louise Galfo, 25, said that he is worried that his salary as a call center agent would be affected by the power hike.

"Yes, it really worries me. My salary might

He also said the power rate hike would be an extra financial burden, considering the P22,000 he earns every month is just enough to pay the rent and cover his transportation, food, water and electricity bills.

be affected," he said.

Joy Zartiga, a single mom with five kids and a call center agent earning P27,000 a month, on the other hand, is more concerned with the higher cost of living the power rates will bring.

"I don't think the power hike will directly result in a pay downgrade for me, but it will have severe economic impact [on things] like [transport] fares, the cost of fuel, and the increased cost of goods and services," she said.

She also worried that higher costs mean lower profits for call centers, which could hurt prospects for salary increases.

But CCAP Research Manager Cesar Tolentino said Filipino call center agents need not worry as none of its more than 80 call center company members plan to cut back on

"No, it will not affect the employees' salaries. It will just affect the operating costs but it will always depend on the consumption level. I think the most significant implication will just be higher electricity costs," he told Manila Bulletin.

Tolentino also said they will not be severely affected by the power rate hike over the long term.

He added that they have already created programs to reduce power consumption and that promote better energy management and conservation.

CCAP members, for example, have invested in power-saving devices such as LED screens instead of overhead projectors and LED lights instead of fluorescent lights.

"[W]e also improved the layout of office spaces to minimize pockets of hot air that are difficult for air conditioning units to cover," he said.

The increasing power costs, Tolentino said, is a natural eventuality and thus unavoidable. This, however, he said, highlights the need for consumers to be more responsible.

"We make our employees aware of it so they can help in reducing power consumption. We encourage them to stop wasting and to conserve," he said.

He also said that they encourage everyone in their companies to minimize the use of elevators.

Most of the BPO companies, he also said, have enrolled in Meralco's Peak/Off-Peak (POP) program.

This Meralco program, formerly known as "Time of Use (TOU), gives discount rates during off peak hours (9 p.m. to 8 a.m. for Monday to Saturday and 8 p.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday).

He also said that CCAP is drafting a project which seeks to include government intervention in reducing electricity costs.

Aside from programs such as Meralco's POP program, they recommended to the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) to ask Meralco to "improve its mix of sourcing power and purchase from Wholesale Electricity Spot Market (WESM) and National Power Corporation (NPC) during non-peak hours."

Government intervention, their study showed, can reduce electricity cost by at least \$0.07/kilowatt hour (kWh).

With energy saving programs and government intervention, BPO companies can save up to \$14.8 million (P592 million) a month, he said.

Why don't you protest China incursions?

MANILA, Philippines—Defense Secretary Voltaire Gazmin on Saturday twitted activists for their silence on the country's territorial dispute with China, while they loudly protest the Philippines' new defense cooperation agreement with the United States.

"Our problem is we keep on complaining [about] the Enhanced Defense Cooperation (with the US). Why don't we complain when the Chinese [used] water [cannons] on us? Why? Nasaan ang pagka-Pilipino natin (Where is our Filipino spirit)? We demonstrate against those who are helping us but we don't demonstrate against those who are bullying us," Gazmin said in Filipino.

"This fight [for territory], it's not only the leaders who are involved. It's all the Filipinos. It's the problem of the Filipinos. This is not just a problem of President Aquino. It is a problem of Juan, a problem of Pedro," Gazmin told reporters on the sidelines of the 117th anniversary of the Philippine Army at Fort Bonifacio.

Gazmin said the Department of Foreign Affairs was the government agency tasked with answering questions about the country's moves to address the dispute with China over the Ayungin Shoal in the Spratlys.

But he could not help but wonder out loud why some Filipino activists were protesting the Philippines' Enhanced Defense Cooperation with the US but were quiet when it came to the maritime row with China.

The Philippines will file a memorial, or a written pleading, on the West Philippine Sea territorial dispute with China before the United Nations Arbitral Tribunal on March 30.

China has refused to participate in the arbitration proceeding, insisting the dispute should be resolved bilaterally with the

Philippines.

Last month, Chinese coast guard ships blocked a Filipino vessel on its way to Ayungin Shoal to deliver food supplies to the Marines stationed there.

The Marines are on a rusty naval hospital ship that was grounded on the shoal in 1999 to mark the Philippines' territory.

The Agreement on Enhanced Defense Cooperation (formerly known as the Framework Agreement for Increased Rotational Presence) being hammered out by the Philippines and the US is widely seen as a deterrent to China's increasing aggression in connection with its territorial claims in the South China Sea.

The working draft of the new security deal would allow for an increased US military presence in the country and access to the Philippines' military bases. Philippine authorities, on the other hand, would have access to US facilities set up inside the local military bases.

Gazmin said the Philippines and the US were working on the final details of the agreement.

US President Barack Obama is scheduled to visit the Philippines in April.

More babies being born in health centers – survey

MANILA, Philippines - Six in 10 childbirths took place in a health facility in 2013, an improvement from previous years, the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) reported recently.

The preliminary results of the 2013 National Demographic and Health Survey (NDHS) of the PSA showed there has been some improvement in delivery care with an increase in



facility-based deliveries and in births delivered by health professionals.

"Among all births in the five years preceding the 2013 NDHS, 60 percent were delivered in a health facility. This is higher than the figure reported in the 2008 NDHS, which is 44 percent," the PSA said.

It added that the percentage of births delivered by a health professional increased to 73 percent in 2013 from 62 percent in 2008.

The percentage of births delivered in a health facility varied across regions in the country as it was recorded at 76 percent in Metro Manila and 12 percent in the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao.

Of the country's 17 regions, eight posted remarkable increase in the percentage of facility-based deliveries.

These are Eastern Visayas, SOCCSKSARGEN (South Cotabato - Cotabato - Sultan Kudarat - Sarangani -General Santos City), Central Visayas, Ilocos, Caraga, Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR), Cagayan Valley, and Bicol.

Meanwhile, only three regions showed a significant increase in the percentage of childbirths with skilled attendants such as Eastern Visayas (67 percent in 2013 from 43 percent in 2008), SOCCSKSARGEN (56 percent in 2013 from 36 percent in 2008) and CAR (85 percent in 2013 from 67 percent in 2008).

The results also

show that antenatal care has improved over the past two decades.


The percentage of those with antenatal care from a health professional climbed to 95 percent in 2013 from 88 percent in 2003 and 83 percent in 1993.

Moreover, the percentage of women with four or more antenatal care visits for the most recent live birth rose to 84 percent in 2013 from 70 percent in 2003 and 52 percent in 1993.

While improvements have been noted, the PSA said more still has to be done.

"There is still a need to further improve and strengthen the implementation of the National Safe Motherhood Program by the Department of Health in order to achieve the Millennium Development Goal (MDG) target by 2015 at 100 percent," the agency said.

Adopted by countries in 2000, the MDGs need to be achieved by 2015 to respond to the world's main development challenges.


Chuchay's is worth dropping by if you go to Ohio

They also have Turo-Turo sisig. The above items were all ready to cook or ready to eat frozen or refrigerated items.

However, the biggest thrill is being able

to buy beer at the Chuchay's. It's real beer, not the non-alcoholic kind that you seen in groceries here in Toronto. I was able to buy San Miguel Cerveza Negra. I bought a few cases for my brother in law Hermie.

Of course, what Filipino store will not have hot, freshly-made meals in the store.

Group charged with traffic of Pinays for sex

CEBU - Two Filipinos and a Singaporean national organized a syndicate that recruited Filipinas to work as prostitutes in bars in Singapore, government officials alleged.

Singaporean Richard Low allegedly stayed in Cebu City from May to June 2012 and recruited Filipinas to work as "performing artists" or "entertainers" in the Ramesses Pub in Singapore.

Maribel Villanueva, acting immigration officer and chief collecting officer at the Mactan airport, and Elmer Mata Ottara, identified as a resident of Barangay Looc, Mandaue City, allegedly assisted Low.

The Department of Justice (DOJ) on Friday filed a string of criminal cases in court against Low, Villanueva and Ottara for allegedly recruiting 10 Filipinas to work as prostitutes in Singapore.

Prosecutor General Claro Arellano approved the indictment of the trio for violating Republic Act 2012, as amended by RA 10364, or the Expanded Trafficking in Persons Act of 2012.

"After evaluating the evidence, we find probable cause against Low, Ottara and Villanueva, individually and collectively, for trafficking in persons," read the 27-page resolution penned by Assistant State Prosecutors Juan Pedro Navera and Irwin Maraya.

The Inter-Agency Council Against Trafficking (Iacat) had acted on the letter-request from the International Justice Mission (IJM), which detailed the "sorry plight" of Filipinas who worked as "entertainers" in the Ramesses Bar in Changi Village.

Another 15 Pinays also worked as entertainers, allegedly in the Joudin Bar, also in Singapore.

An assessment by the IJM showed that the women are victims of human trafficking.

Janet Arceo, Iacat international and tourism section officer, and National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) agents Czar Eric Nuqui and David Golla went to Singapore and coordinated with the Singapore police, the Philippine Consulate and the Philippine Overseas Office to rescue the trafficked persons.

Before they arrived in Singapore, the Iacat officials received information that Low, who owned Ramesses Pub, was arrested by the Singaporean police for the murder of a customer inside his bar.

When the Iacat team arrived in

Singapore on January 18, 2013, they team concluded that the Filipinas were indeed victims of a human trafficking ring operating in the Philippines and Singapore.

The team then advised the women to leave their dormitory and proceed to the Philippine Consulate, where their sworn statements were taken.

Skipped

On January 19, 2013, the Singaporean police assisted them in transferring from their dormitory to the Philippine Embassy.

The women told the Iacat team that they had all departed from Mactan airport from May to December 2012. They said Ottara recruited and assisted them in securing travel documents. Low, the bar owner, and the women skipped rigid immigration procedures and easily boarded their flight for Singapore despite the absence of work permits. Villanueva, the Mactan airport immigration officer, allegedly assisted them. She allegedly received P20,000 for each passenger that she assisted.

In Singapore, the women were required to work in Ramesses.

They were also required to have sex with customers upon payment of a bar fine of \$20 (Singaporean) to pay off what they owed Low for their transportation and other papers, amounting to P100,000 each.

Instructions

Leah (real name withheld), in her affidavit, said that a friend had convinced her that Ottara could bring her to Singapore as an entertainer in a pub.

They met Ottara in Cebu City and the latter told Leah to wait for a video call from Low. When Low called up, he told Leah that he liked her and wanted her to work for him. Low then allegedly told Leah that he would send a plane ticket and instructed her to wait for further instructions. She was also asked to bring documents showing her marriage to a Japanese national, so she could easily pass through immigration in Singapore.

Ottara later informed Leah that Low sent her a plane ticket and that she could leave for Singapore on November 30, 2012. She was asked to pay P2,170 for travel taxes and terminal fees.

Job description

Ottara briefed Leah that she would sing, dance and serve customers as an entertainer.

She was told that she would earn \$700 (Singaporean) a month.

She was never made to sign any employment contract, Leah later told the authorities, and did not receive any salary. She said she met 13 other Filipinas who also worked in the same club.

Ottara also reminded Leah that she

owed Low P11,500 for the plane ticket; P7,500 as show money; P2,170 for travel and terminal fees, and P3,000 for her travel documents.

When she arrived in Singapore, Low and his companion fetched her at the airport and they proceeded to Ramesses Pub.

She was told to change her clothes and immediately start working.

As a performer, Leah said, she did serve drinks to customers. But she also went out with them to have sex for \$300.

Another complainant, Janet (not her real name), said that Ottara convinced her to work in Singapore as an entertainer for P60,000 monthly.

'Assistance'

Janet made several attempts to go to Singapore, but was kept from flying out after she failed to provide immigration officers with valid documents of her business there.

Janet and two other recruits were finally able to board for Singapore after Villanueva, an immigration officer at the Mactan airport, allegedly assisted them on October 8, 2012.

In the Ramesses Pub, Janet said, Low instructed her to convince customers to buy ladies' drinks.

She was also told to perform "lascivious acts" to entice customers to buy more drinks. She went out and had sex with customers for a bar fine ranging from \$200 to \$400.

Half of the bar fine paid by the customers went to Low. Leah said she had sex with customers six times since she started working in the pub.

Eight other complainants also executed their affidavits corroborating the statements of Leah and Janet.

No bail

Villanueva, in her counter-affidavit, denied the charges, saying she complied with the airport rules and regulations of the Bureau of Immigration.

Of the 10 complainants, Villanueva said, six mentioned her name in their affidavits without detailing exactly what she did to allow them to skip rigid immigration procedures.

While she could no longer remember



Singapore frowns at Filipino Labor



Singapore construction workers

SINGAPORE - Another Singaporean chose to vent his frustration online over the plan of Singapore's People's Action Party (PAP) government to recruit some 200 Filipino construction workers a month.

Calling Filipino construction workers as the "latest cheap labor fad", the anonymous poster over at therealsingapore.com said while Filipino workers are better educated, speak English better than workers from China, Bangladesh and India, they are also "widely known to demand a lot more than others."

"It will only be a matter of time (when) more of them will start demanding for Permanent Residency in Singapore and make Tagalog an official language of Singapore," the anonymous poster said.

Branding Filipino workers as "hardworking, hungry and cheap", the Singaporean who used the alias "Cheated Singaporean" blamed the PAP for setting up training centers in the Philippines without making the same effort to open training centers in Singapore "then choose to complain blindly that no Singaporeans want to be a construction worker."

Cheated Singaporean believes the PAP turned its eyes on "docile" Filipinos after the recent Chinese drivers' strikes and a riot in Little India. But he or she warned Filipinos of Singapore's exploitative employment culture. Cheated Singaporean wrote that an unskilled Filipino construction worker will earnP23,000 in exchange for a hard, modest life.

"They may or may not get to earn more in Singapore, but their life is definitely going to be very much tougher than they already are in Philippines," Cheated Singaporean said.

The anonymous poster also noted that the fact that Filipinos are getting S-pass and E-pass will make other nationalities jealous and the long-term envy will create an imbalance in mindsets and lead to an increase in crime rate and cause trouble in the long

run.S-pass and E-pass are both work permits in Singapore. Usually, mid-level skilled foreigners are given S-pass while professionals with experience and skills get the E-pass.

Still, Cheated Singaporean said Filipino construction workers are going to sense the seriousness of income inequality and the lack of disrespect as felt by Indian workers.

The open letter turned personal when Cheated Singaporean asserted that with the influx of more Filipino workers in the island-state, their enclaves "will go beyond Lucky Plaza and Orchard Road.

"Singaporeans has (sic) already become estranged from the influx of foreigners and the further intake of these Filipino workers would make good reasons why more Singaporeans are getting bitter."

Cheated Singaporean claimed that having Filipino construction workers in their country benefits only those in the construction industry and the PAP which stands to gain \$750 a month per worker hired.

"Singaporeans will not only not gain a single cent from their presence, their public transport will be more crowded than ever," the anonymous Singaporean added.

Atty. Marc Titus Cebreros, Chief of the Human Rights Information and Communication Division, belied that Singapore and other countries do not gain anything from OFWs.

"Our OFWs contribute to the economic growth of Singapore and other receiving countries, as they are highly skilled and valued by their employers," Cebreros told Manila Bulletin Online.

Cebreros also defended OFWs from being branded as demanding.

"That's a bizarre, irrational and racist statement," Cebreros said, adding that the opinions of Cheated Singaporean do not reflect Singapore's reputation as a fair and educated society.

However, some comments online agreed with Cheated Singaporean with one saying how they will "pressure the PAP government not to accept Filipinos who are not Malays

and will upset the racial quota.

"Time to kick out more foreigners."

Some even labeled overseas laborers as
"foreign trash" and noted how Orchard Road,
the famous shopping district in Singapore,
will be named Pinoy Road in the future and
that PAP would mean Pinoy Action Party.

Earlier, another Singaporean complained about noisy Filipino maids in Singapore's buses and proposed for a private bus for them.

Fil-Can invents body heat flashlight

A Filipino-Canadian teenager, Ann Makosinski, describes herself as an average student who likes science and fiction writer F. Sionil José. She is also working on making the world a better place.

The 16-year-old is the inventor of a flashlight powered solely by body heat—absolutely no batteries are needed to make it work.

She says her project was inspired by a friend from Mindanao whose family could not afford to pay for electricity.

Without light at night, her friend could not study properly. She failed an entire school year because she could not read her lessons.

"I have not told her about my flashlight because it is not ready for use yet. It needs to be brighter and much cheaper to make," the Canada-based Makosinski says in an e-mail interview with the Inquirer. "I want to give her and many other kids something that is useful and lasting. If it's only half good, nobody will use it."

The flashlight, however, was good enough for her to win the 2013 Google Science Fair in the 15-16 years old category.

Makosinski's story has been shared several times in the social media and has caught the interest of several people, including American TV host Jimmy Fallon.

He was so impressed by her that when she guested in his "Tonight Show" recently, he said, "I'm going to work for her one day."

Makosinski uses a thermoelectric device called "Peltier tiles" to power her flashlight. Peltier tiles produce electricity when one side is heated and the other side is cooled.

Her flashlight can be heated with the palm of the hand and is cooled by the surrounding air through the hollow tunnel of the device.

"You need 3 to 5 degrees Celsius temperature difference for the flashlight to work," she says. "It is ideal for cold temperatures because the larger the temperature differential, the greater the light produced."

She says several companies have voiced interest in her flashlight. But she is adamant that until her flashlight achieves higher brightness at a lower cost, she will not agree to produce it for the public.

New Tacloban in the pipeline —Romualdez

TACLOBAN Mayor Alfred Romualdez (PHOTO) presented to the public the city government's vision for a new city that was "resilient, vibrant and liveable."



Speaking to about 2,000 stakeholders from the business sector, the academe, people's organizations and other national and international relief groups, Romualdez said the city is focused on "bringing people to a safer area, with planned urban expansion."

"We're working on a plan for a new Tacloban in the northern part," the mayor said, giving a ballpark estimate of P3 billion for the project.

"What is important is we have presented it to the public and we have given direction to the donors on where they are going to come in," Romauldez told reporters in an

interviev

He said he hoped the new community in the north would be built by 2016, the end of his term. Romualdez said the plan will also be presented to the various government agencies.

"At the end of the day, what will be followed is the Comprehensive Land Use Plan," the mayor said, adding that the project would be incorporated into the national government's rehabilitation plan.

"Even in the beginning, this is what the donors were asking. This is just a mechanism, but what we have now are areas being approved," the mayor said.

He emphasized the important role that the national government had to play to get Tacloban back on its feet. "The built-in responsibility of the national government is to build the airport, highways, the port, national offices and others," he said.

Ma. Adelaida Cea of the United Nations Human Settlements Program, who helped present the strategic framework of the plan, said the city could bounce back given its potential and opportunities.

The short-term plan focuses on construction, trading and diversification of agriculture. The mediumterm plan calls for industrial development, tourism, business process outsourcing, and economic infrastructure development.

The construction of at least 7,000 houses in the north would serve as a catalyst, Cea said, generating about P300 million to P500 million in wages, and would spur ancillary industries/

With Tacloban as the center of the region with a population that swelled from 217,000 to 1.2 million in the daytime, the city had many opportunities, Cea said.

"The opportunities are still here, we just have to harness them," she said.

But Romualdez reminded everyone that the city was still in "emergency mode" as long as not everyone was back in their homes.

The government has secured a 86 hectares lot ready for shelter needs and plans to acquire 30 to 50 hectares more, he said.

For its shelter projects, the city is targeting about 10,000 permanent housing units (now with total donor housing commitments of 6,661).

For the more immediate needs, the plan calls for 2,248 temporary shelters for survivors who were still living in tents and evacuation centers, 39,798 units for on-site repair and reconstruction, and 4,800 temporary shelters living in makeshift houses in Anibong and Sagkahan.

The mayor also highlighted areas in health care where donors come come in to help, including the upgrading of the Suhi Health Center to an infirmary (P1.2 million); construction of New District Health and Birthing Center at Abucay (P 7 million); and V&G District Health Center (P700,000).

UN sets rehab review

The head of the United Nations
Development Program will meet with
President Benigno Aquino III next week to
discuss recovery efforts in areas battered by
super typhoon Yolanda. The forthcoming
visit of UNDP administrator Helen Clark
was announced days after the Commission
on Audit acknowledged the "chaos" in the
government's initial handling of foreign
and local aid for the calamity victims.

The UNDP said Clark will travel to Tacloban City to see first-hand the ongoing recovery activities in the areas devastated by typhoon Yolanda. Clark will also meet with Asian Development Bank president Takehiko Nakao during her three-day visit to the Philippines.


She is expected to sign an agreement with Japan on "increased support to Yolanda recovery work."

On Feb. 16, marking the 100th day after the super typhoon struck, the UNDP issued a report saying the needs in the typhoon-hit areas remained "enormous."

The UNDP has a three-year support program for the Visayas region, which revolves around three major pillars: governance; livelihood; and disaster risk reduction and sustainable environment.

Amid criticism of the government's handling of cash and non-cash donations for Yolanda survivors, presidential spokesman Edwin Lacierda said the Foreign Aid Transparency Hub Version 2.0 will be launched on April 25.

He said the new website will signal a shift from transparency to accountability and will include where the donations actually went.

Many insiders have been swearing that the possible acquisition of GMA Network by PLDT-led group of Manny V. Panglinan (MVP) is already a done deal. But more observers are questioning why until now there is still no announcement about the transaction. It turns out that the possibility of a buyout of the Kapuso network by MVP would never materialize.

According to well-placed sources, MVP's camp has finally decided to give up on buying GMA-7. That is because the popular businessman has already gotten fed up with the long and tedious negotiations. It also did not help that GMA-7 president Atty. Felipe Gozon remains elusive as to the prospects of him giving up his majority stake in the Kapuso

MVP's Interest On GMA-7

It can be recalled that talks about the possible buyout of the network by MVP started in 2012, when the latter's camp or people from TV5 started shouting out the news about the big possibility of TV5 taking over GMA-7. Initial speculations emerged that before the end of 2012, the deal would be

In 2013, talks about that possibility did not wane. Some sources even swore that before the end of 2013, the deal would finally take place. But again, that did not happen. All that GMA-7 has been admitting is that some of its executives are really sitting down in negotiations with MVP's camp.

But they don't confirm or deny speculations that GMA-7 would be sold. Atty. Gozon was once even quoted as saying that the network is not for sale, but if a buyer would come to acquire it for Php 500 billion, he would really sign up immediately.

San Miguel Corp Comes In

However, there is a new angle to this story. Some sources claim that GMA-7 does not have the intention to give in to MVP's offer because it is currently negotiating with two other possible buyers, which reportedly are offering much higher bids compared to MVP's bid.

There are even reports that a buyout by tycoon Ramon Ang is already a done deal. Mr. Ang is the president and CEO of San Miguel Corporation and Philippine Airlines. Sources said that the acquisition is still in process but the two camps have already reached an agreement. They even advised observers to watch out in the coming days because GMA-7 is set to make an official statement about this deal.

In a previous interview, the actress talked about playing Patrice, her ever cheerful character has become a fan favorite.


In this week's episode, it was revealed that she has become a radio show host who's somehow connected to one of the show's lead character, Robin Scherbatsky.







24 cocaine bars found in Davao

DAVAO CITY, Philippines—Mayor Rodrigo Duterte said the discovery of cocaine bars in a container van at a container yard in Tibungco District here indicated that the country must



be the new transshipment point of drugs in neighboring countries in Asia.

"From all indications, it seems

that the Philippines has become a transshipment point for drugs," Duterte said, as members of the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) in the region were investigating the origin and destination of the shipment.

Duterte said authorities had recovered only 24 of the 65 bars of cocaine at the container yard. He called on the container yard workers to return the items.

"Just surrender them to the authorities, and we will take them with no questions asked, you will not be held liable," Duterte said.

Joel Pernito, chief of the Criminal Investigation and Detection Group, said authorities had been tipped off about the cocaine shipment in a container van at the banana firm Sumifru container yard, and that authorities would conduct follow-up operations in the coming days.

The cocaine bars were taped onto the ceiling of the 12-meter container van, which had been at the container yard for some time. The contraband was discovered by Sumifru workers who inspected the van just as they were about to load it with bananas.

But some 40 cocaine bars were already removed from its taped slots on the ceiling of the container van when the authorities arrived at the Sumifru container yard.

A cocaine bar would sell as much as P6 million in the drug market, according to Tulfo.

Later on, Duterte said another 23 cocaine bars were turned over by the Sumifru workers. The container van was refrigerated and customized for loading with perishables, like bananas.

Duterte said his administration would cooperate with authorities in other countries in the campaign against illegal drugs.

In 2009, 16 kilograms of cocaine worth about P16 million was discovered in a refrigerated van at the Maersk container yard here. The discovery led to the filing of charges against six employees of Maersk.

the complainants, Villanueva said, she requires every traveler to accomplish BI's Board Control Questionnaires. She denied knowing Ottara or Low, and said she has been careful about her work at the immigration office.

Ottara failed to submit a counteraffidavit. But in the resolution, government prosecutors gave weight to the affidavits of the complainants.

"All the complainants categorically identified Richard Low, the owner of Ramesses Pub in Singapore, where they were subjected to inhuman conditions of prostitution, sexual exploitation and debt bondage," the prosecutors said.

The prosecutors recommended no bail.



Too much protein could lead to early death



Could too much protein put you on the path toward an early grave?

For middle-aged people who consume lots of meat, milk and cheese, the answer could be a resounding yes, according to a new study published in the journal Cell Metabolism.

U.S. and Italian researchers tracked thousands of adults for nearly two decades and found that those who ate a diet high in animal proteins during middle age were four times more likely to die of cancer than contemporaries with low-protein diets -- a risk factor comparable to smoking. They also were several times more likely to die of diabetes, and nearly twice as likely to die in general.

"The great majority of Americans could reduce their protein intake," said one of the study's co-authors, Valter Longo, a University of Southern California gerontology professor and director of the school's Longevity Institute. "The best change would be to lower the daily intake of all proteins, but especially animal-derived

That advice comes with a caveat.

Even as researchers warned of the health risks of high-protein diets in middle age, they said eating more protein actually could be a smart move for people over 65. "At older ages, it may be important to avoid a low-protein diet to allow the maintenance of healthy weight and protection from frailty," another co-author, USC gerontology professor Eileen Crimmins, said in a release detailing the findings.

Exactly how much protein belongs in the average diet has proven a topic of perpetual debate, one complicated by popular diets such as Atkins and Paleo, which rely heavily on animal-based proteins to help people shed weight. While such diets might succeed in that short-term goal, Longo said they could be leading to worse health down the road.

Part of the confusion, he argues, is that researchers too often have treated adulthood as a single period of life, rather than closely examining the many ways in which our bodies change as we grow older. In studying data about protein intake over

many years, he says the picture becomes clearer: What's good for you at one age might be harmful at another.

In the study published Tuesday, researchers defined a "high-protein" diet as one in which at least 20 percent of calories came from protein; a "low-protein" diet was defined as less than 10 percent. They found that even moderate amounts of protein consumption among middle-aged people had detrimental effects over time, a result that held true across ethnic, educational and health backgrounds.

Longo said many middle-aged Americans, along with an increasing number of people around the world, are eating twice and sometimes three times as much protein as they need, with too much of that coming from animals rather than plant-based foods such as nuts, seeds and beans.

He said adults in middle age would be better off adhering to the recommendation of several top health agencies to consume about 0.8 grams of protein per kilogram of body weight each day -- roughly 55 grams for a 150-pound person, or the equivalent of an 8-ounce piece of meat or several cups of dry beans.

Ideally, Longo said, Americans would start following the example of the inhabitants in the small, southern Italian town of Molochilo, home to one of the highest rates of centenarians in the world. Their secret: For much of their lives, a large number of villagers maintained a lowprotein, plant-based diet. In their older years, many ended up moving in with their children and eating higher-protein diets more common today. Whether on purpose or by happenstance, they seem to have hit on the ideal recipe for a

"There is no harm," Longo said, "in eating the way our grandparents used to eat."



Philippines, Indonesia fight Human Trafficking

MANILA, Philippines - The Philippines and Indonesia have agreed to intensify efforts to crack down on human trafficking, the Bureau of Immigration (BI) said.

Immigration Commissioner Siegfred Mison said a delegation from Indonesia visited the country and met with him.

He said they agreed to strengthen cooperation to address the serious plight of refugees and asylum seekers of other nationalities entering their borders.

The visiting group was composed of officials and members of the "Desk of People Smuggling, Refugee and Asylum Seeker of the Coordinating Ministry of Political, Legal and Security Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia."

During the meeting, Mison cited the need for stronger cooperation and tighter measures since detecting human trafficking victims is rather difficult, considering millions of people come and go through the ports each year.

Authorities from Indonesia noted that most victims of human trafficking are Filipinos desperately seeking jobs abroad using tourist visas falsified by syndicates.

In many cases, women and children fall prey to human trafficking and end up prostituted in other countries, a problem intended to be eliminated by Republic Act No. 9208 (Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act 2003) and RA 10364 or the Expanded Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act.

The police rescued at least 11 people reportedly victims of illegal recruitment and human trafficking in Zamboanga City on Saturday.

The victims were mostly from Palawan and Mapun Island who were rescued by the police in a house in Barangay Putik after they were seen by roving village watchmen.

Regional police spokesman Chief Inspector Ariel Huesca said village council members immediately reported to the police that led the rescue of the victims.

Police said the victims will be turned over to the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) to process their transport back home.

by a foreign country such as a tourist or working visa, are allowed to leave," Mison said in reaction to mounting complaints.

Various sectors, travel agencies and Filipino travelers criticized guidelines which allow immigration officials to "offload" hundreds of passengers every

"But offloading, which is most often misinterpreted by many people to mean, the power of the Immigration Bureau to bar anyone from leaving the country is not an official government policy," Mison said. Mison said the guidelines were established by the bureau and the Inter-Agency Council against Trafficking and approved by the Department of Justice.

The said Guidelines were formulated by a technical working group pursuant to RA 9208 or the Anti Trafficking in Persons Act of 2003 and is in effect since January 2012.

"We don't offload people just because we want to. It's a bitter pill that we have to swallow because we want to protect our fellow Filipinos." Mison said.

"Under our BI (Courtesy-Accountability-Responsibility-Efficiency-Service) Program, we want our countrymen to understand that there is no reason to fear us, in fact they can ask us for advise on how to legitimize their travel and we will be happy to help." he added.

Under the guidelines, travelers are categorized according to purpose, whether tourist, OFWs, immigrants, etc. Requirements to be asked from travelers are also based on their respective purposes.
