Escudero ready to defend self should name appear in Napoles' list

MANILA, Philippines—Senator Francis "Chiz" Escudero on Thursday said he is not worried with the "tell-all" testimony of alleged pork barrel mastermind Janet Lim-Napoles.

"Hindi ako kinakabahan. Hindi ko alam at hindi ko pa nakikita ang affidavit ni Napoles," Escudero said in an interview over Radyo Inquirer 990AM. (I am not worried. I do not know and I have not seen the affidavit of Napoles.) He said he never allocated his Priority Development Asistance Fund (PDAF) or pork barrel to the bogus nongovernment organizations linked to Napoles.

Escudero expressed reservations about the credibility of Napoles saying her testimonies might contradict the earlier statements exposed by the whistle blowers.

"Dapat bang pagkatiwalaan ang lahat ng sasabihin ni Napoles? Paano kung 'di mag match ang testimonya niya sa mga whistleblowers?" he said.

(Should we believe all the statements of Napoles? What if her testimony won't match with the whistleblowers'?)

According to him, the Department of Justice (DOJ) should not screen the statements made in the sworn testimony of Napoles.

Berting Labra

Give him a role, any role and he'll own it



Berting Labra (April 17, 1933 - February 10, 2009), born Roberto Labra, was a Filipino child star and veteran actor equally adept in comedy and drama, in action flicks and musicals.

Labra starred in Apat Na Taga in 1953. He was a child star who shared screen with Fernando Poe, Sr. in several hits, including "Palaboy ng Tadhana," "Sagur," "Kanto Boy," and "Alimudin."

He was only six years old when he made his stage debut. He was discovered by Poe Sr when he was looking for a child actor who could sing for the movie.

Labra also witnessed the murder of his father, Francisco Labra, former bantamweight and featherweight champion of the Orient, in the hands of Japanese soldiers. "He was tortured," Labra told the Inquirer in 2005 interview.

The elder Poe became the 10-year-old's foster father.

Five years after the elder Poe's death, Labra, then a teenage, teamed up with Fernando "Da King" Poe Jr. in the 1965 box-office hit "Lo' Waist Gang," a film that spawned a string of other movies and a lifelong friendship with Da King.

In 1969, Labra and fellow action star The Late Eddie Fernandez were jailed for murder.[1] Labra spent 13 years in Muntinlupa, only to be exonerated by the Supreme Court.

Labra appeared in the 1991 action film "Manong Gang" with actor now Senator ramon 'Bong" revilla Jr Alongside Dina Bonevie as Bong Revilla's Leading Lady, and the late Actors Paquito Diaz and Max Alvarado. Labra's last film, the 2007 comedy "M.O.N.A.Y ni Mr. Shooli," co-starred actor Leo Martinez.

He appeared in supporting roles in soap operas and indie films in the Philippines.

Labra died last February 10, 2009 due to emphysema. He was 75 years old. Labra's remains were buried in the Garden of Memories in Pateros


What Sam Milby looks for in a woman

Filipinos rank first in a global survey on the image of the United States, beating even the Americans when it comes to a favorable view of the United States.

According to the 2013 Global

Attitudes Project of Pew Research Center in Washington, 85 percent of the Filipinos polled said they had a favorable view of the United States.

Following the Filipinos

Ghanaians, both scoring 83 percent, and the Americans, who scored 81 percent.

Among those who had had unfavorable views of America who scored the highest are the Jordanians, 85 percent; the Egyptians, 81 percent; the Palestinians, 79 percent; and the Pakistanis, 72 percent.

Only 13 percent of the Filipinos said they had unfavorable views of the United States.

The Global Attitudes Project "conducts public opinion surveys around the world on a broad array of subjects ranging from people's assessments of their own lives to their views about the current state of the world and important issues of the day," Pew Research said on its website.

The 2013 survey, posted online at www.pewglobal.org/database/ indicator/1/, was conducted in 39 countries and interviewed 37,653 respondents.

Nonpartisan

On its website, Pew Research Center describes itself as a "nonpartisan fact tank that informs the public about the issues, attitudes and trends shaping America

and the world."

Pew says it does not take policy

The center also says the Global Attitudes Project team "regularly consults with survey and policy experts, academic regional and economic experts, activists and policymakers" whose expertise gave tremendous guidance" in shaping

60 countries covered

Since 2002, the Pew Global Attitudes Project has surveyed more than 325,000 people in 60 countries. Other facets of the US image also olled in the study included opinion

regarding confidence in the US president, the spreading of American ideas and customs, American democracy, business, music, movies, television, technological advances, drone strikes and the US president's international policies.

Also covered were the world economy, the European Union and China's image.

The survey also showed 85 percent of Filipinos thought the United States gave their country's interests a "great deal" or "fair amount" of consideration.

Here, the Kenyans scored 79 percent, placing second, followed by the South Africans (73 percent), and the Americans (70 percent).

Leading superpower

On the question, "Will China eventually replace the US as the world's leading superpower?" the Filipinos also ranked first, with 74 percent, answering that China will never outrank the United

The Japanese placed second, scoring 72 percent and the Egyptians came in a distant third with 56 percent.

The Philippines and Japan are locked in territorial disputes with China in the East and South China Seas.

Among the people who believed China would eventually replace the United States as the world's leading superpower, the Chinese scored the highest, 58 percent.

The Spaniards and the British tied for second place with 55 percent, followed by the Canadians and the Australians, also tied at 52 percent.

Influential partner

Ninety percent of the Filipinos thought the United States greatly influenced their country's affairs,

followed by the Kenyans (85 percent), the Brazilians (83 percent), and the South Africans (77 percent).

But the Filipinos ranked only fourth in considering the United States a partner of the Philippines, scoring 81 percent.

The Israelis were the top scorers there, with 90 percent, followed by the Salvadorans (88 percent) and the Senegalese (84 percent).

Abuse of Pinoys shows antiforeign anger in Singapore

SINGAPORE - An abusive campaign by Singaporeans opposing a planned Philippine independence celebration has shone a light on anti-foreigner sentiment in the city-state, home to large numbers of guest workers accused of taking jobs from locals and causing overcrowding.

The Philippines marks its 116th year of independence on June 12 and a group of Filipino residents in Singapore is planning an event on June 8 at a shopping complex along busy Orchard

It became a hotly debated topic after commentators on anonymously-run local websites and Facebook pages heaped racial abuse on Filipinos and attacked the choice of venue, saying it should be held in the Philippine embassy grounds instead of the public Orchard Road area.

Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong, who attended a "Singapore Day" celebration in London on March 29 attended by 9,000 people, condemned the "thuggish behaviour" of people who harassed the organisers of the Philippine event, calling them a "disgrace to Singapore".

Blaming "a few trolls" for the online attacks, he wrote on his Facebook page: "How would we have felt if British netizens had spammed our website, and abused Singaporeans living in Britain?"

A spokeswoman for organisers Pilipino Independence Day Council Singapore (PIDCS) referred to a previous statement which said they were "heartened, grateful, and happy to receive support from Singaporeans."

She declined to comment on whether the event would go ahead as planned on June 8. Police say they have not yet received a permit application for it.

The Philippine embassy in Singapore was moved to post an advisory on its website urging Filipino residents to exercise caution.

Amid need for add'l capacity, PH power sector seen fraught with risks, red tape

MANILA - As the main Philippine island of Luzon narrowly escapes a shortage, investors wanting to capitalize on the growing demand for electricity are rediscovering that regulatory risks and red tape have yet to be banished from the power generation sector.

In recent weeks, the Luzon grid almost got a taste of what it is like living in Mindanao, where power supply is not enough to meet demand. The Department of Energy (DOE) said the situation has normalized, but warned of the constant threat of a shortage should problems besetting the industry remain unresolved.

Former energy secretary Vincent S. Perez said the country would require 12,000 megawatts (MW) of additional capacity through 2030.


"What we will need from now up to 2030 is almost 700 MW of new capacity that needs to come on stream each year," Perez, who is chairman of Merrit Partners, told participants of a forum on the local energy sector.

That volume of power generation is roughly double the country's current capacity. Although the required capacity creates opportunities for developers, the sector is still saddled by a number of risks.

Teodulo San Juan Jr., a partner at the Castillo Laman Tan Pantaleon and Jose law firm, said among the hurdles is the number permits one has to secure to put up a power

"The Philippine regulatory environment is, at the risk of sounding redundant, heavily regulated. Any developer of renewable energy resource or power generator needs at least 15 Philippine regulatory offices to get all the necessary permits in place," he said.

This entails additional costs for investors



for permit fees, and consultants and experts. Also, the required number of regulatory approval takes time, risking delays in power projects.

"I would say that at least one year to get permits in place, that's being very efficient already," San Juan said.

"To cut a tree you need a permit; to cut a coconut tree you need a different permit. You will need some kind of confirmation from the National Commission on Indigenous Peoples that you're not building on indigenous lands; if you are in fact building on indigenous land you will need proof of informed and written consent from affected indigenous people," he said.

Wary of delays

A problem that has come back to haunt investors in recent months is the deadlock caused by judicial

During the previous administration, the Supreme Court had warned lower courts not to cause untoward delays that would sabotage potential investments the economy requires. After the change in government, the spotlight has turned on the High Tribunal because of its order stopping Meralco from imposing a record increase in the generation charge.

Eduardo V. Fransisco, BDO Capital &

Investment Corp president, said lenders are wary of delays in the rate adjustments of power developers.

"We also don't like the extensions when you should be getting tariff increases and extensions of contract because that is not in the cash flow," he said, referring to the ongoing impasse at the Supreme Court.

The Court indefinitely extended the temporary restraining order (TRO) it issued on Meralco's P4.15 per kilowatthour rate increase.

The rate hike was primarily brought about by a significant spike in prices of power suppliers at the Wholesale Electricity Spot Market in November and December last year.

No less than Energy Secretary Carlos Jericho Petilla acknowledged that the extension of the TRO may have given consumers a respite.

The consequences of the delay in the resolution of the case however may put off the required expansion of existing power plants at a time when the economy desperately needs additional electricity to sustain the Philippine economy's record expansion.

For this year, the government expects the economy to grow between 6.5-7.5 percent after last year's 7.2 percent expansion.

Possible surge in pre-marital sex cases in Leyte worries UN agency

ALANGALANG, Leyte - A United Nations agency has raised concern on the possible rise in cases of post-Yolanda teenage pregnancy due to the absence of electricity and "lack of diversion among the youth."

To address this concern, the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) has been implementing measures in storm-hit towns of McArthur, Mayorga, Dulag, Tolosa, Tanauan, Palo, Alang-alang, Kananga, Ormoc City, and Tacloban City.

In the case of Alangalang town alone, of the 30 pregnant women this month, two of them are 14 years old. However, both girls are seven months pregnant, which means that they had sex before typhoon Yolanda struck the region, according to UNFPA report.

A UNFP study shows that most teenagers from the 10 assisted areas had their first sexual contact at the age of 14 for male and 15 for female.

"Peer pressure is among the reasons why they had been involved in such activity which is why this should be provided with immediate solution as most of those who engage on it are not aware of its consequence," UNFPA said.

The UNFPA expressed concern on early pre-marital sex and teenage pregnancy since this might trigger maternal and child mortality. Those engaged in unprotected sex with multiple partners might contribute to the spread of sexually transmitted diseases.

Among the intervention of the UNFPA, in partnership with Save the Children and Plan Philippines, is the establishment of Youth Friendly Tents where youths learn how to empower themselves to protect their bodies, manage personal hygiene, and are provided information about responsible adulthood.

Dr. Amador Catacutan, UNFPA's reproductive health coordination specialist, emphasized the need to provide sexual education among youths in the region. He noted that most post-Yolanda health initiatives

are focused on maternal and child health care.

"Local government units, after six months, will have to continue the program, which is why they need support from every LGU to make the program successful." said Catacutan.

Alangalang Mayor Loreto Yu pledged to support the UNFPA initiative, adding that this should reach barangay and school levels.

He added that now that Sangunian Kabataan was already abolished, funds of LGU should go and support a program like this to ensure that youth in their respective areas become more active and responsible citizens.

PH 3rd most dangerous country for journalists

The Philippines has retained its unenviable position among the world's most dangerous countries for journalists.

According to the 2014 Impunity Index, the continued killing of journalists in the Philippines has pinned the country to its third-place ranking behind Iraq and Somalia, a ranking that it has held for four years.

The Philippines retained its ranking despite last year's conviction of a gunman who shot broadcast investigative journalist Gerardo Ortega in 2011, which the Impunity Index

itself described "a welcome development."

Issued on April 16 and published by the New York-based Committee to Protect Journalists (CPJ), the newly updated Impunity Index noted that there are 51 unsolved murders of journalists in the Philippines from 2004 to 2013, giving the country a rating of 0.527 unsolved journalist murders per million inhabitants.

The figure belies the claim made in November, 2013, by the office of President Benigno S. Aquino III that "there is no more impunity" in the Philippines, the Index pointed out.

The country has held the third worst spot on the Index since 2010 after the November 23, 2009 Maguindanao Massacre, in which 58 people, including 32 journalists and media workers, were killed in a single election-related incident in Ampatuan town, Maguindanao province.

In 2009, at least three journalists were gunned down, including freelance photographer Mario Sy, who was shot in front of his wife and daughter following the publication of several photos on drug trafficking.

The most recent fatality was tabloid reporter Robelita "Ruby" Garcia, who was shot inside her home on April 6.

The Index ranks each country on the basis of the number of convictions of journalists' killers relative to the population. "Impunity" refers to the exemption from punishment of those killers.

For this year's edition of the Impunity Index, which calculates the number of unsolved journalist murders as a percentage of a country's population, CPJ examined journalist murders in every nation in the world for the years 2004 through 2013. Cases are considered unsolved when no convictions have been obtained.

Only those nations with five or more unsolved cases are included in the index. This year, 13 countries met the Index criteria, compared with 12 last year.

In February, 2014, the Philippines dropped from 147th to 149th in the 2014 World Press Freedom Index released by the Paris-based Reporters Without Borders (Reporters Sans Frontieres, RSF), with the country described as being in a "difficult situation."

Another organization monitoring global press freedom, Freedom House, gave the Philippines a score of 43 in their 2013 Freedom of the Press Index, qualifying the local press as only "Partly Free."

Westerville, Ohio ethnicization

Fresh produce starting to appear in Ethnic Stores



WESTERVILLE, Ohio - While the church I went to last Easter Sunday is still predominantly white, signs of ethnicity is slowly entering the landscape of Westerville, a suburb of Columbus, Ohio. Two years ago, the only ethnic market we went to looked like it was about to close down. We were looking for pork bung, or intestine. Luckily, we found them, but in the frozen section.

This time, we found a supermarket called Saraga International Grocer that sells ethnic products from a wide variety of products. They also had a wet market inside. While we buy a pigs's head or whole pig already cooked here in Ontario, they had frozen uncooked

pig's head and a full-body lechon that sells by the pound (ABOVE RIGHT).

Some of the items are Spanish products because of the influx of Mexican immigrants. A skid of hominy sits on the floor. Hominy is a food made from kernels of corn which are soaked in an alkali solution of either lime or live.

In the vegetable and fruit section, they sell cactus paddles or nopales, sugar cane and other fresh fruits.

Of course, we did find our Filipino products too like the bagoong, which we were looking for. These sort of products were unheard of just a few years ago in Westerville. I have yet to see an influx of

Chinese products like in Scarborough.

While the ethnic population of Westerville is not that many yet to make grocery shopping crowded on that Saturday that we went, the fact that there is a grocery catering to them points to that direction.

PH presses bid to keep rice import controls

MANILA - The Philippines has renewed its appeal to the World Trade Organization (WTO) to allow Manila to keep its restrictions on rice imports.

During the Council for Trade in Goods meeting in Geneva, Switzerland, last April 9, "the Philippines reiterated its request for a waiver relating to special treatment for rice," the WTO said on its website, referring to the quantitative restriction (QR) being slapped by Manila on the commodity.

According to the WTO, the Philippines "again emphasized that this request is in the context of its food security needs."

In 1995, the WTO allowed the Philippines to impose a 10-year quota system for rice importation. The QR was extended in 2004 and then lapsed in 2012. The Philippines has been requesting the WTO to further extend the QR on rice up to 2017.

During the meeting, the Philippine WTO mission cited that "it had been working on this matter for the past two years with other members, not only in Geneva but also in Manila and other capitals."

So far, China, India, Indonesia and Vietnam have expressed support for the Philippines'

request and have urged other WTO members that might be affected by a QR extension to conclude consultations with Manila, according to the WTO.

As for Australia, Canada, Thailand and the United States, their consultations with the Philippines were still ongoing, the WTO noted.

In a letter to Agriculture Secretary Proceso J. Alcala last December, Justice Secretary Leila M. Lima thumbed down the Department of Agriculture's (DA) position of extending the QR, citing that "among the considerations are the possible legal repercussions of the Philippines being perceived to be in breach of its WTO commitments."

The DA and the National Food Authority (NFA), however, had both insisted that they could still implement the QR while WTO negotiations for its extension were ongoing.

Agriculture Assistant Secretary Romeo S. Recide in March expressed confidence that trading partners would support the Philippines' bid for an extended QR. "We are very positive that we will acquire consensus with interested countries. This will allow us to operate under a new quantitative restriction extension," he had said.

The QR is being seen as a measure that would buy time for local farmers to prepare for free trade under the WTO in light of the government's goal of achieving self-sufficiency in rice production by end-2015.

\$500M investments seen relocating from China

MANILA, Philippines—A number of foreign manufacturers are looking at investing about \$500 million and employing up to 3,000 workers in the Philippines in line with moves to relocate operations from China, which has become a less attractive production base, according to the Philippine Exporters Confederation Inc. (PhilExport).

PhilExport quoted Foreign Buyers Association of the Philippines (Fobap) president Robert M. Young as saying that two potential investors from France would visit the country this month, on top of several companies from Canada, China and the United States that would visit in May.

"These people are financially capable, they are ready, they mean business, they are serious,"

Young said, adding that these medium-sized firms produce apparel, garments, housewares, shoes and toys.

According to Young, these investors were pulling out of China because of the labor unrest in the mainland that has resulted in a shallower labor pool as well as more expensive capital costs.

The Philippines has beaten its Asean neighbors as an alternative investment site to China mainly because of the quality labor force available here, he said.

"They went to other Asean countries but they do not like it there. [Since] they used to be buying from Manila, they know that Filipinos are really good in skill, quality control and workmanship," Young said.

Fobap plans to increasingly source goods from these soon-to-be-established factories as the group's members wanted to prioritize procurement from local sources.

"Right now, we are running out of suppliers because in the past five years, they closed shops one by one. If they will come back, our own business will also flourish together with the Philippine economy," Young said.

If you ever wondered, what is more to achieve for the good doctor, he quoted CS Lewis, "You are never too old to set another goal or to dream a new dream."


And with that, we can only wait what he will set out to achieve next.

ASEAN harmonizes consumer protection

The 10 members of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN 10) have harmonized almost all of their consumer protection laws signaling their readiness to protect over 600 million consumers as the region is moving closer towards a single market by 2015.

Trade and Industry Undersecretary Victorio Mario Dimagiba told reporters at the 9th Meeting of the ASEAN Committee for Consumer Protection (ACCP) held yesterday in Makati City that ASEAN members in general have over 90 percent harmonized their consumer protection laws.

The ACCP meeting, is composed of delegates from ASEAN member countries

namely, Brunei, Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam and the Philippines. The meeting will continue discussions on the ACCP's initiatives to ensure measures that will assist consumers in coping with the effects of the Asean Economic Community 2015.

"We are ready for 2015 and we are on track with our schedule," Dimagiba said noting the ACCP is now moving beyond its advocacy works into implementation of the 2015 work plan. The remaining sectors that need to be harmonized are on the areas of services.

According to Dimagiba, Cambodia is the latest to adopt a consumer protection law.

While the 10-member countries have harmonized more than 90 percent of their consumer protection rules and processes, Dimagiba said there are other ASEAN countries that are way advanced in terms of consumer protection.

These countries include the Philippines, Malaysia, Singapore and even Vietnam.

There has been no overall consumer protection being planned for the region, but Dimagiba stressed that consumer protection is very basic, "You will be surprised we have many similarities and we have harmonized positions already."

The only kink, he said, is the cross border mechanism for products purchased from one border to another.

The ACCP also seeks to build the ASEAN consumer website called aseanconsumer.org to provide a portal of information and advisories for Asean members and consumers.

ACCP also seeks to come up with ASEAN leaflet to contain the list of national focal points for consumer complaints in each member. This aims to inform consumers in ASEAN of government agencies that they may visit or coordinate with in filing complaints and seeking redress.

In the Philippines, the ASEAN leaflets are displayed in airports and leading hotels in the country. (BCM)

She added. "Ay, nakakaloka! Grabe, ang hirap nung character ko, ang hirap maging mistress!" Still, Maja welcomes the challenge.



Filipinos second shortest in Asia



MANILA, Philippines—If Southeast Asians stood in a straight file, Filipinos would be at the second spot, in a line according to

According to a study that the Association of Southeast Asian Nations DNA conducted, Filipinos are the second shortest race in the region.

Indonesians are the only people who are shorter than Filipinos in Southeast Asia.

Based on the study, Filipino males and Vietnamese males have an average height of 162 centimeters, 2 cm shorter than the average Southeast Asian height of 164 cm. and 2 cm taller than the Indonesian males.

On the distaff side, Filipino females have an average height of 150 cm. a humble 3 cm. advantage over Indonesian females but also 3 cm shorter than the Southeast Asian average.

Cambodia, 163 cm. for males and 152 cm. for females, and Vietnam, 162 cm. for males and 152 cm. for females, are the other two Southeast Asian nations who might must need their tippy-toes to reach the average Southeast Asian height. Singaporeans are the tallest among Southeast Asians, towering over their neighbors with an average height of 171 cm. for males and 160 cm. for females.

Thais are nearly identical to Singaporeans with Thai males standing at a good 170 cm. and Thai females at 159 cm.

Malaysians round up the Southeast Asians with their males standing above the average Southeast Asian height at 165 cm. for males with the females right on the average feminine height of 153 cm.

Jose Vargas' documentary to screen in 10 US cities

NEW YORK - Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist and filmmaker Jose Antonio Vargas' documentary about his life and journey as

an undocumented immigrant in America is now gaining momentum.

After a preview screening and panel discussion at the Museum of the Moving Image in New York last week, "Documented" will be screening in 10 US cities before its TV premiere on CNN this

The former

Washington Post reporter said the documentary is about humanizing the issue of the 11 million or so undocumented immigrants in the US. It's a story of a Filipino family's struggle after being separated by the broken US immigration system.

"We're premiering here in New York for a week, then we're going to be in LA, we're going



to Phoenix, San Diego, Chicago, Denver, and hopefully the Filipino communities in those areas, you know, really show up. As you know, the film, a third of it is in Tagalog," Vargas said.

While the "Documented" US tour is in full swing, the US immigration overhaul has been stalled in Congress. President Obama, whom Vargas often refers to as the "Deporter-in-Chief," has promised to pass a comprehensive immigration reform in 2014.

But Vargas believes that promise may not happen at all this year. "It would be intellectually dishonest for me to say that President Obama is the only person to blame. You know, at the end of the day you have a dysfunctional Congress that doesn't want to do anything," Vargas said.

New York City Council Speaker Melissa Mark-Viverito said that on a state level, there may be some other ways to provide the undocumented some forms of relief while immigration reform is stalled.

Mark-Viverito said, "Because of that lack of movement and commitment to get something done at the federal level, we're seeing states and we're seeing municipalities take it upon themselves to see what they can do. We're seeing states pass the Dream Act — local State

On a personal level, after being separated from his mother for over 20 years, Vargas had only one big birthday wish this year.

"To have a green card and to have any kind

of card you know," Vargas said. "But there's one wish: That I get to see my mom and I'm trying everything I can to make that a reality before the year is over."

Pinoy Texas church claim to drive away evil spirits

PEARLAND, Texas - Reports of exorcism and deliverance are nothing new in the Philippines. But kababayans have brought this Filipino practice to a city in Texas, hoping to save one soul at a time. An amateur video taken three years ago by members of the International Victory Christian Church of Texas. The Filipino-led church claims that the footage was an actual deliverance of a woman who only wished to be identified as Cheryl, which was said to be possessed by an evil spirit.

Cheryl, who admits she had a troubled past, sought the help of the Filipino church leaders after she said she started hearing a voice that seemed to order her to hurt herself.

The church hired a psychiatrist to see her. They said the psychiatrist concluded that Chervl did not suffer from any mental illness. The church leaders decided that the only way Cheryl would get healed is through deliverance. "Gaya ng sabi niya sa Luke 10:19 'I have given you authority to tread down all serpents,"Wennie Liga of International Victory Christian Church of Texas said.

The church leaders said they began their ministry delivering people from evil spirits back in the Quezon City, Philippines in 1999.

When some members moved to the United States in 2002, they formed a deliverance group in New Orleans, and eventually in Texas in 2006. To date, they claim to have delivered about a 100 people from evil spirits free of charge. Besides delivering people from evil spirits, church leaders said they also drive out evil spirits from homes. In one house, they conducted a house cleansing ritual to rid the house of dark elements.

"The 11-year-old and 9-year-old kids were also infested with sickness and also the voice of Satan himself is telling them to get a knife and kill your mom," Liga said. "So this is very, very infested with evil spirits — most especially the room and everything. The smell of death was so strong inside the house."

The Filipino church leaders said they now have close to 90 members in Texas and hope to continue their ministry and touch and heal more people with their faith and conviction to defeat what's evil in this world.

went fishing."

In a remarkable act of military doggedness, the Philippines has since 1999 stationed a tiny number of marines on a former US Navy boat that was deliberately grounded on a group of islets and reefs called Second Thomas Shoal.

The 100-metre (328-foot) BRP Sierra Madre, built during World War II then acquired by the Philippines in the 1970s, is now little more than a rusted hull and incapable of sailing.

But it has thwarted Chinese efforts to occupy all of the area, which is believed to contain huge deposits of oil and gas.

The Philippines grounded the boat at the tiny shoal in response to China's military occupying Mischief Reef, about 40 kilometres miles away, in 1995.

Both are within the Philippines' internationally recognised exclusive economic zone, and roughly 1,100 kilometres from the nearest major Chinese landmass.

But China claims nearly all of the South China Sea, even waters close to the coasts of the Philippines, Vietnam, Brunei and Malaysia. Taiwan has a similarly large claim to China.

The competing claims have made the sea, which is also home to some of the world's busiest shipping lanes, a potential trigger for major military conflict.

Dozens of Vietnamese soldiers died in losing battles in 1974 and 1988 with Chinese forces for control of the Paracel islands in the sea's north.

China increases pressure

China had largely tolerated the Philippines' plucky effort to hold on to Second Thomas Shoal in the Spratlys archipelago to the south, but last year began increasing pressure to end what it termed an "illegal occupation"

In May the Philippines said a Chinese warship had begun "provocatively" circling the Sierra Madre, and lodged a formal protest.

Since then, the Philippine military has reported a near constant presence of Chinese vessels encircling the marines.

However China had always allowed the Philippine vessels to sail up to the reef and deliver new supplies to the marines, who generally do tours of duty lasting between three to six months.

This changed last month when vessels marked "China Coast Guard" blocked two civilian resupply boats, forcing Pelotera and his men to cast their fishing lines into the sea.

The marines said they were relieved a few days later to see a tiny twin-propeller Philippine military plane fly low and drop sacks of food near the boat.

Some of the marines jumped into the water and swam out to collect the bags. They filmed the joyous moment and the military this week released that footage, as well as clips of the initial blockade, to AFP.

"We were happy when the plane dropped the supplies... we were good for another few weeks," a heavily bearded and deeply tanned Pelotera said.

"But we were also worried because we knew the Chinese ships were still around." The Philippine military sent another civilian vessel last weekend with a fresh batch of marines to rotate with Pelotera's crew, plus many months' worth of food.

Vessels marked with "China Coast Guard" again tried to form a blockade, which was witnessed by AFP reporters flying above in a Philippine military plane.

But after a dramatic stand-off lasting two hours, the smaller Philippine boat outmanoeuvred the Chinese ships and sailed into the shallow waters of the shoal.

"Some of the troops jumped 40 feet (12 metres) from the top of the deck to the sea in celebration," Pelotera said.

"It meant we could now go home to our families, have a haircut and showers."

The Chinese government reacted with fury to the defeat, with the mood in Beijing souring further when the Philippines also appealed to the United Nations for it to rule that China's claims to most of the sea were invalid.

China has refused to take part in any UN arbitration, saying it will only negotiate directly with rival claimants but at the same time insisting it will never concede any territory.

"The Philippines must bear all consequences for its provocations," Chinese foreign ministry spokesman Hong Lei said.

For Pelotera, 30, confronting China at sea was more daunting than other missions fighting deadly jungle battles against Islamic militants in the southern Philippines.

"Both missions are dangerous. But here, we are against a bigger enemy. And we are protecting our sovereignty, not just fighting a small group of rebels... here we are always in danger."

"I'm fortunate to have made the fourth version," said Urbano, who is seeking the endorsement of the Department of Education and the National Commission for Culture and the Arts. He would like his "Ibong Adarna: The Pinoy Adventure" to tour schools and universities around the country before the year ends.

hard-earned money," Urbano told the Inquirer. "I hope that, for students, it would feel like watching (the Hollywood adventure movie) 'Indiana Jones."

Urbano said he made sure that today's Filipino youth could relate to the script. "It's very Pinoy, featuring a sultan instead of a king, the

aswang, the nuno sa punso and the Haribon, or Philippine eagle, among others," he explained. Urbano said finding the perfect backdrop for the film was a major hurdle. "It is set before the Spanish occupation. We needed a location that hadn't been seen in any other period movie. We found just that in San Pablo, Laguna. We used the area surrounding one of the Seven Lakes as the sultan's kingdom."

"Ibong Adarna" is Urbano's answer to a clamor that he perceives for unique and sensible film projects. "Sadly, industry people nowadays think only of making money. I see the movies being produced today and end up asking, is this all that we can come up with?"

He is confident of his movie's chances against mainstream local productions. "People just need to know there's such a film," he said.

Urbano, also a writer, popularized the character Mr. Shooli of the comedy series "Mongolian Barbecue." Conde directed the classics "Genghis Khan" (1950) and the "Juan Tamad" series (1947-1963).

Pressed to explain more, Maja only said one really has to swallow her pride to end the fight. "Dapat iisa talaga sa inyo," Maja said.



international donors scaled back financial support because the Philippine economy is doing well. The assumption is that a booming economy will create more opportunities for the poor. She says that's not yet true for the Philippines.

TERESITA SILVA, CHILDHOPE ASIA FOUNDER: The benefits of economic growth in the Philippines is not yet reaching the poorest of the poor. Street children are very much part of the poorest of the poor. They live on the streets, many of them are abandoned, some of them have families but they are dysfunctional families or urban poor.

Everyday, Childhope Asia teaches lessons on sanitation, reproductive health, and their rights as a child.

The organization provides temporary spaces where street children can feel safe

and learn without fear of discrimination.

But now the group is forced to scale

CHIPS GUEVARRA, CHILDHOPE ASIA BOARD MEMBER: As you know we have a street education program as you can see here at the back, but... We used to take care of 1,200 street kids. But because we've had to reduce our street educators, we have to pay them salary for them to be sustainable. We had to reduce it down so now we're down to about 600, down to half that number.

Jude dreams of finishing college and helping Child Hope Asia.

JUDE NATIVIDAD, CHILDHOPE ASIA SCHOLAR: Almost ten years na po ako sa Child Hope. Gustong gusto ko po tumulong sa Child Hope. Bilang pagtanaw ng utang na loob sa Child Hope, kasi hinding hindi ko po makakalimutan ang Child Hope. (I've been in Childhope for almost ten years. I really want to help Childhope. I want to give back after what they've given me, I will never forget Childhope.)

Childhope Asia is looking for ways to raise awareness for educating street children. But with limited resources, the NGO is struggling to stay afloat. For children like Jude, the future depends on how much longer Childhope Asia can remain financially viable.

'The reason why I have this sort of success is I am not choosy (with co-workers)," he states.


The other reason for his success is that he says what he means. When Derek issues a statement, it is for real -- no pluses and

Erap delivers as HK lifts sanctions

HONG Kong lifted the diplomatic sanctions it imposed on the Philippines



President incumbent Manila Mayor Joseph Estrada met with Chief Executive

after former

Leung Chun-ying to offer official apologies for the incident, officials from both sides announced.

"It was a very fruitful and successful resolution of the case," Estrada said in a telephone interview with the ABS-CBN television network via phone from Hong Kong. "Our relations with Hong Kong are now normal and I pledged on our side that all Hong Kong tourists will be protected under my watch."

The breakthrough came after a deal was struck on the four demands of victims and their families on an official apology, compensation, sanctions against responsible individuals and tourist safety measures.

"The resolution of the incident enables the normalization of the bilateral relations between Hong Kong and the Philippines," Leung told reporters after the deal was struck.

Cabinet Secretary Rene Almendras, who was also present in the meeting with Leung, thanked the victims and relatives for accepting the terms of the apology.

"I am most grateful to the people of Hong Kong, especially the family members and the victims... that have now spoken out in favour of the final resolution," Almendras said. "From here on end, we believe that it is time for us to heal the relationship."

"The four demands made by the victims and their families on apology, compensation, sanctions against responsible officials and individuals, and tourist safety measures will be resolved and settled," said a joint statement released by the Hong Kong government.

"The Philippine Government expresses its most sorrowful regret and profound sympathy, and extends its most sincere condolences for the pain and suffering of the victims and their families.





NBI raid rescues 3 Russians, 3 Ukrainians, 13 Pinays from sex den in Pasay

MANILA - Three Russian, three Ukrainian, and 13 Filipino women were rescued by authorities during a raid Tuesday night of a sex den fronting as a disco club in Pasay City.

A report from the National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) said the raid at the Starwood VIP Lounge was conducted by its Anti-Trafficking Division with the participation of a team from the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD).

The raiding team also hauled all the employees of the bar for further questioning. The NBI did not say, however, if the club owner-operator was among the arrested.

The agency said this was the first time it encountered foreigners working as sex workers in the country.

Based on interviews made by the DSWD representatives, a customer is charged P1,500 for a naked lap-dance and up to P10,000 for a VIP room with a guest relations officer (GRO).

It was learned that the club was barred from operating in Makati City some time ago but transferred its operation to Pasay.

Authorities were also looking at the passports and visas of the rescued foreigners.




