Customs to open Door to Door Boxes?

MANILA, Philippines - The Bureau of Customs said it may impose tougher measures on balikbayan boxes for fear that these tax-free packages are being used by traders to smuggle goods into the country.

"The existing rules are obsolete and we may have to reassess our coordination and processes with consolidators for stricter and improved compliance," Customs Commissioner Alberto Lina said.



Provide Decent Jobs

But Conditional Cash program defended by the government

PHILIPPINES - The Conditional Cash Transfer (CCT) program is a long-term solution to intergenerational poverty.

National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) Director General Arsenio Balisacan pointed this out yesterday as he defended before the House Committee on Appropriations the continued implementation of CCT, often called the government dole-out program.

Under the proposed 2016 national budget, the CCT program will be allocated P62.67 billion, up from P62.3 billion in 2015, to benefit 4.6 million household beneficiaries, Budget Secretary Florencio "Butch" Abad told the same House panel chaired by Davao Rep. Isidro Ungab.

At the Development Budget Coordinating Committee (DBCC) briefing on the P3.002-trillion national budget for 2016 before the House Committee on Appropriations, Balisacan justified the scaling up of the CCT program or the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) to cover more beneficiaries, including those in high school and beneficiary families.

However, opposition lawmakers Leyte Rep. Ferdinand Martin Romualdez, who heads the House Independent Bloc, and House Senior Deputy Minority Leader and Bayan Muna party-list Neri Colmenares maintained that the Aquino government should instead invest more on providing decent jobs to Filipinos rather than spending billions of pesos for the CCT.

"Let us teach our people how to catch fish and not to continuously depend on government's resources through the CCT. It is the primary duty of the state to ensure that quality and decent jobs are given to Filipinos. The need for livelihood and jobs are the real concerns now and this is a long-term solution to address the widespread poverty," Romualdez, president of the Philippine Constitution Association (Philconsa),

LONG-TERM SOLUTION

But Balisacan said the decision to expand to high school aged children was based on research evidence that older Filipino children have lower school attendance rates than younger ones.

"More generally, contrary to allegations that the CCT program is a dole out, I would like to emphasize that the CCT program is actually meant to provide a long-term solution to poverty.

While, admitting that they still have "a lot of ground to cover in improving our people's welfare," Balisacan said they have started to see greater inroads

50B PRISON NOT NEEDED

MANILA - The Catholic Church's prison ministry is opposing a government plan to build a P50-billion mega prison, stressing that the project is "unnecessary." The CBCP Episcopal Commission on Prison Pastoral Care said there are other more practical solutions to decongest the national penitentiary.

For one, said ECPPC executive secretary Rodolfo Diamante, the project "is not [in] the best interest of the prison community members."

"The ECPPC has long opposed the project on the ground that it is not the solution to the problem of the Bureau of Corrections," Diamante said in a report posted on the CBCP official website.

What is needed, he said, is to improve the existing facilities in seven colonies where inmates of National Bilibid Prisons in Muntinlupa can be transferred.

"Moreover, there is the law on GCTA (Good Conduct Time Allowance) that if applied would dramatically decongest the jails," Diamante said.

The law, approved by President Benigno Aquino III in May 2013, reduces the prison terms of inmates for good behavior.

"So there's really no need to spend P50 billion on what is believed to be a modern Alcatraz," the priest said.

The new prison facility will rise over the next three years in Nueva Ecija that will house convicts from the NBP.

The supposed state-of-the-art facility will be built on a 500-hectare complex within Fort Magsaysay, the country's largest military reservation.

After proposal to lift term limits,

Binay also backs economic Cha-cha



Vice President Jejomar, in his version of the State of the Nation Address (Sona) on Monday, said he supports the proposal to amend the economic provisions of the Constitution.

MANILA - The proposal first floated in the House of Representatives when Speaker Feliciano Belmonte Jr. filed his House Resolution of Both Houses 1, which seeks to add the phrase "unless otherwise provided for by law" in the economic provisions of the Constitution. This means amending the Constitution would only take legislation.

In his Sona delivered at the Cavite State University, Binay said the entry of foreign direct investments (FDI) in the country is hindered by the administration's opposition to the proposal to amend the economic provisions of the Charter.

"Malaking balakid sa pagpasok ng FDI ang pagtutol ng administrasyon na amyendahan ang mga economic provisions ng Saligang-Batas. Ito ang malaking balakid sa pamumuhunan ng mga dayuhang investors," Binay said. (The administration's refusal to amend the economic provisions of the Constitution that prohibits the entry of FDIs from coming in.)

The Vice President said if the economic provisions of the Constitution were amended, the more foreign investments in the country would open up more employment opportunities for Filipinos.

"Kapag na-amyendahan ang economic provisions, mabubuksan ang public utilities na magreresulta naman sa pagpapabilis ng Public Private Partnerships o PPP, at higit na mabuting serbisyo at pasilidad para sa lahat," he said. (Once these economic provisions are amended, public utilities will be opened up and will speed up formation of public-private partnerships and much-improved services and facilities for everyone.)

Binay had also floated the idea of amending the Constitution to lift the term limits of officials and allow them to run for multiple terms. Binay later clarified that his "one to sawa" statement was directed to local officials only.

"Itong term na ito 'di talaga ako naniniwala d'yan. Kailangan one to sawa 'yan, hangga't gusto ng tao. Kaya kung meron amendments sa Constitution, ipapaalis ko yung term limitation. Hangga't maaari, iboto nang iboto," Binay said before local officials of Bacolod City.

Naia bus scheme a flop?

MANILA - Out of the 55 public utility buses (PUBs) that were given special permits to extend their routes and pick up commuters from Terminal 3 and 4 of Ninoy Aquino International been turning up daily since the scheme started on July 23, officials noted.

Airport (Naia), only about 10 buses had

David De Castro, spokesman of Manila International Airport Authority (MIAA), said it was also observed during the weeklong trial run that only a handful of passengers—sometimes only 10 per bus—had availed themselves of the

"We also noticed that in the afternoon there are hardly any buses coming to Terminal 3. One possible reason is that they are already stuck on Edsa," De Castro said.

The Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LT-FRB) earlier issued special permits to 55 buses owned by Sevensky Express Liner Corp., Magicline Express Corp., Mayamy Transport Corp. and Naia Metro Link Bus. It allowed them to pick up and unload passengers at two stops on Domestic Road and Circulo de Mundo.

The special permit allowed the PUBs coming from Roxas Boulevard, which pass through Naia Road, to proceed through Domestic

Slow Yolanda rehab bad for Mar

UN criticizes PHL for slow recovery



MANILA – An official of the Caritas Philippines said the government's turtle-paced response to the rehabilitation of Yolanda-hit areas will haunt Liberal Party standard bearer Mar Roxas.

Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines News (CBCP News) quoted Caritas Philippines executive secretary Fr. Edu Gariguez as saying that the "dismal" performance of the government in the rebuilding of homes and relocation of survivors will definitely affect the image of President Aquino's preferred successor.

"This government has nothing to be proud about when it comes to the rehabilitation," Gariguez said. Gariguez said President Aquino must back off from using Roxas' Yolanda credentials if he wants his anointed one to succeed in the 2016 elections.

"They should not use that as part of his (Roxas) credentials because it would be embarrassing on their part," he said.

United Nations special rapporteur on the human rights Chaloka Beyani earlier said many storm survivors in the central region have had to endure relocating to evacuation camps up to three times since the typhoon struck in 2013, and the substandard housing leaves them vulnerable to future typhoons.

"While the government is to be

commended in terms of its immediate responses, its attention to ensuring sustainable durable solutions for IDPs (internally displaced persons) remains inadequate to date," Beyani said in a statement posted on the UN website.

Aside from falling short of safety standards, the wood-and-tin "bunkhouses" also leave women and girls vulnerable to sexual abuse and early pregnancy, Beyani said.

The box-like shanties also rob the storm survivors of their "privacy and dignity" as they struggle to rebuild their lives, he said.

Haiyan, the most powerful storm ever recorded to hit land, wiped out entire communities and left 7,350 dead or missing when it struck the impoverished central islands in November 2013.

Roughly 2,000 families remain in the bunkhouses as well as in palm-thatch temporary homes, said Social Welfare Secretary Corazon Soliman.

The government aims to move 70 percent of the 2,000 into permanent concrete homes by year-end, she said.

President Benigno Aquino has budgeted 160 billion pesos (\$3.6 billion) to rebuild after Haiyan, considered as one of the major tests of his six-year term that will end in June next year.

The Philippines is one of the world's most disaster-prone countries, at risk from earthquakes, volcanic eruptions and an average 20 typhoons yearly.

MANILA - Former real-life couple Dawn Zulueta and Richard Gomez no longer get conscious whenever they have romantic scenes together.

Zulueta said she and Gomez have become good friends through the years.

PNOY using government funds to prop up Roxas

MANILA - A militant group scored Malacañang for allowing Interior Secretary Manula "Mar" Roxas 2nd and other members of the Cabinet who plan to run in next year's polls to use their positions and government funds in their "pseudo campaigns."

"Mar Roxas and Noynoy (President Benigno) Aquino (3rd) are doing the exact same thing that GMA (Gloria Macapagal Arroyo) did in 2004. They are using their position and government resources for early campaigning. That was what happened in Cebu yesterday," Bagong Alyansang Makabayan secretary general Renato Reyes Jr. said in a statement.

Reyes was referring to the officials' visit to Cebu on Monday, accompanied by

other Cabinet officials who are believed to be running in next year's senatorial race.

"It is shameless abuse of public funds or partisan political activity. Why in the world was the MMDA (Metro Manila Development Authority) chairman (Francis Tolentino) even in Cebu if he wasn't running in 2016? None of these officials engaged in early campaigning even have the delicadeza to resign from their appointive positions," Reyes said.

But Presidential Communications Secretary Herminio Coloma Jr. defended the Cabinet officials' presence in Cebu, explaining that being "alter egos" of the President, it is their duty to "touch base" with the people they serve.

Besides Roxas and Tolentino, those

who accompanied Aquino were Justice Secretary Leila de Lima, PhilHealth director Risa Hontiveros and Health Secretary Janet Garin.

"This unapologetic abuse of power is supposedly what PNoy and his party fought against, but now they are guilty of the very same evils they once condemned," stressed the Bayan leader.

Roxas tendered his resignation as DILG Secretary but was reportedly persuaded by the President to extend his stint in the cabinet to complete several unfinished tasks, among which are the modernization of the Philippine National Police and the relocation of informal settlers in Metro Manila.

Bribery is the reason for Door to Door Fee increase

MANILA - A freight forwarder has stepped forward and revealed that there was indeed a "tara" or bribery system they adhered to with the Bureau of Customs for the faster processing of balikbayan boxes in ports.

Door to Door Consolidators Association of the Philippines chairman Ramon Ungco confirmed the supposed bribery system.

"Kailangan magbigay ka ng tara kasi kung hindi, hindi aasikasuhin ang papeles mo," he said.

According to Ungco, they had to pay corrupt Customs officials around P40,000 to P85,000 for each container that had balikbayan boxes. He said the bribe depended on the size of the shipment.

"Kami naman, lalo na ako, magnenegosyo ako sa Pilipinas alam kong corrupt. Magtatara ako para bumilis lang. 'Yan lang ang hinahabol namin kasi mga balikbayan yan," he said.

Customs also recently increased

taxes for containers from the US from P80,000 to P120,000.

"Okay lang sa akin taasan 'yung tax up to P200,000 puwede kaya lang dapat bawasan niyo 'yung tara niyo," Ungco said.

Top Customs officials were not immediately available for comment as of posting time. The Bureau has come under fire from the public over a plan to do random physical inspections of balikbayan boxes. The plan has since been shelved



Low remittance weakens Peso

MANILA - The Philippine peso, languishing at a five-year low against the dollar, will lose more ground to the greenback in the coming months as remittances from millions of Filipinos overseas slow and foreign investors rotate out of the Manila stock market.

The Philippines is one of the fastestgrowing economy in the region thanks to strong private demand. The peso, unlike many emerging-market currencies in Southeast Asia, has been relatively resilient in the face of volatile capital flows ahead of an eventual rise in U.S. interest rates. While it has weakened more than 2 percent against the greenback so far this year, the decline is less than the falls in the Thai baht, Indonesian rupiah and Malaysian

But the sputtering global economy may have at last dealt a blow to remittances - a major economic engine for the Philippines.

Remittances in the first five months



of 2015 grew on average 5.4 percent, compared with 6 percent a year earlier. That compared with annual increases of 7 percent in the years after the 2008 global financial crisis. Net foreign selling of Philippine stocks has also surged, weighing on

"The current account will get smaller via lower remittances and drive the peso weaker, so the fundamentals are changing," said Sean Yokota, head of Asia Strategy at the Scandinavian bank SEB in Singapore, adding that he expects the peso to lose more than 5 percent of its value against the greenback on a three-month horizon.

If the central bank had not intervened, the peso would have fared worse, said a trader. A central bank gauge showed the peso was the least volatile currency in Southeast Asia as of end-July. The baht, rupiah and ringgit were more than two times more volatile than the peso.

The peso drifted to as low as 45.82 per dollar, the weakest since July 2010. The peso's fall, however, will benefit exports another growth engine - and could help the sector bounce back from a 17.4 percent year-on-year drop in May, its steepest in more than three years.

Voting machines will be delivered on time

MANILA - THE Commission on Elections (Comelec) is confident that all 93,977 Optical Mark Reader (OMR) machines will have been delivered for inspection and testing even if it has yet to sign a contract with technology provider Smartmatic Corp.

Comelec Chairman Andres Bautista on Tuesday said negotiations for the first lot of 23,000 OMRs is ongoing.

"After that we're looking to issue a notice of award. With respect to the (second lot of) 70,977, the contract negotiations for that would not be as difficult as the first because we have already a template," Bautista said. Senior Commissioner Robert Chris-

tian Lim said the machines will be delivered in several phases and the last delivery will be on Jan. 16, 2016. For the 23,000 units, the first five machines will be delivered in September, 200 in October, 6,000 in November, 6,000 in December and the rest in January 2016. "For the 70,977 units, we expect the same proportional delivery," Lim said. He said Smartmatic will be penalized if it fails to meet the delivery deadline.

"We will deduct from their contract the total penalty which is equivalent to onefourth of 1 percent of the contract price for every day of delay," Lim explained.

The Comelec's approved budget contract

for the 23,000 OMR units was P2.5 billion. The contract for the 70,997 OMR machines is P9.7 billion.

Bautista said delivery of the machines should not be delayed so that the commission will have time to test them to ensure that they are in accordance with the required specifications. Also, Comelec field personnel will demonstrate to teachers the use of the machines.

The counting machines will be manufactured in Sho Tzu, China. Some Comelec officials will go to the manufacturing site to inspect the machines, Bautista said.

PH Internet users 'paying more' for slow connection speed – study

MANILA - Internet users in the Philippines are "paying more for less" as the actual speed of their connection has never reached the "advertised speed" by Internet service providers (ISPs), a study showed.

Mary Grace Santos, a research fellow of the LIRNEasia, presented the results of their study during the hearing of the Senate committee on trade on the impact of slow and expensive Internet in the country.

"Based on our study, we tested the basic data plans of the three major ISPs in the Philippines and if you can see here, from 2011, we actually saw deteriorating actual versus advertised speed from 2011 to 2014. That's not the ideal scenario," Santos said.

"In terms of value for money, we also saw that we're actually paying more for

less every year," she said.

"We actually offered the lowest value for money when we tested all these other ISPs during the first quarter of 2014. So that's a position that we don't want to be in because that means Filipino Internet subscribers pay more for less and the actual speed of Internet connection in the country has never reached the advertised speed."

"Not even once. The highest average actual speed that was attained by an ISP was only 26.65 percent of the advertised speed," she said. "That means it was always 80 percent lower than the advertised speed and speed performance actually declines for all ISP tested...," she added. Based on the report, she said the Philippines is third to the lowest in terms of average speed and second lowest in the Asia Pacific in terms of

connection speed.

"In terms of average peak connection speed, 20.3 mbps is what was registered for the PH. As you can see, Singapore is leading with 98.5, Hong Kong with 92.6 and South Korea at 79 mbps," she

Santos said Internet connection is also "very expensive" in the Philippines, pointing out that the bandwidth in Manila would range from \$25 to \$45 per mbps or it could go up as \$70 in Cebu compared to only \$5 and \$6 in Hong Kong and Australia, respectively.

She cited two main reasons why the Philippines has been lagging behind other nations in terms of Internet connection: First, the lack of government support for Internet infrastructure and the lack of real competition in the telecommunications industry.

PH says can still hit low end of 2015 **GDP** growth target

MANILA - The Philippines economy can still achieve the lower end of the official 7 to 8 percent growth target this year if the government clears bottlenecks holding up public spending, the economic planning secretary said on Monday.

"The consumption part of the economy is doing well. I hope private investments will do well. I'm hoping that the public spending program had performed better (in the second quarter) than the first quarter. Also expect exports to recover a bit in the second half of the year," Arsenio Balisacan told reporters.

Growth in the first quarter unexpectedly slowed to a six-year low on a quarter-on-quarter basis, largely due to slow public spending.

P6b lost to traffic Rifles defective daily in 15 years

MANILA - Seantor Paolo Benigno Aquino warned that the country could lose up to P6 billion a day by 2030 if the government fails to address heavy traffic in Metro Manila.

At present, losses due to traffic congestion is estimated at P2.4 billion daily, he said, citing a study by the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).

Aquino filed a resolution recently seeking a review of the country's roadmap for transport infrastructure development to come up with better ways to address the worsening traffic conditions in Metro Manila.

"Commuters as well as private vehicle owners suffer the monstrous and extremely costly traffic every day in Metro Manila," Aquino said in his resolution.

"Roadmap for Transport Infrastructure Development for Metro Manila and Surrounding Areas" was approved Sept. 2, 2014 by the National Economic and Development Authority.

MANILA - The Armed Forces of the Philippines has 50,629 pieces of M4 assault rifles in its arsenal but these are defective and could not be used by government soldiers, a military spokesman said.

The rifles valued at P1.9 billion were supplied by the United States-based Remington Outdoor Company but the company still has to replace the defective weapons, according to Col. Noel Detoyato, AFP public affairs chief.

In August last year, the military handed 27,000 pieces of M-4 rifles to the Philippine Army and Marines in ceremonies attended by President Benigno S. Aquino III at Camp Aguinaldo.

After a technical inspection, the military's acceptance committee rejected the rifles due to defective sights and barrel grooves, Detoyato said. He did not say when Remington would replace the





Filipino madam in UK sex probe

Late former PM Edward Heath being investigated

SAN FRANCISCO — A Filipino prostitute, who ran a brothel close to the late Prime Minister's former home in Salisbury, U.K., has emerged as a central figure in the police probe into the late Prime Minister Edward Heath's alleged sexual abuse of children.


Myra Ling-Ling Forde, 67, twice jailed for prostitution, operated as a madam out of home in the Wiltshire town where Heath lived after leaving office.

In the early 1990s she allegedly had charges against her dropped after threatening to expose Heath as a pedophile, according to a report by the Telegraph.

Heath headed the Conservative government between 1970 and 1974 and never married. He died in 2005 at 89.

He is now among the targets of Scotland Yard's "Operation Midland," an investigation into an alleged VIP pedophile ring that operated in the 1970s and 1980s.

Allegations against Heath, including claims that he raped a 12-year-old boy in London in the 1960s, are now being investigated by the Metropolitan Police.



Despite her alleged threats against Heath to avoid prosecution in the early 1990s, Forde was successfully convicted in 1995 of running a brothel full of underage girls, often runaways or wards picked up from the care system.

Forde became a prostitute herself in the early 1990s after falling behind on her mortgage but she denied recruiting children. After getting out of prison, she returned to the trade and was again arrested in 2009 on suspicion of running a brothel.

She pleaded guilty, was sentenced to five years in prison and ordered to pay back £25,000 under the Proceeds of Crime Act. Forde's sister, Mia Pablico, said she did not know where she was now living, but knew what Forde did in Salisbury and said her sister "knew a lot of politicians and celebrities because of it."

"You have to see these little things as the most important things in life. So, time is the most important thing in life. Not money, not career. Time talaga," Albert said.

Her daughter said, "My parents definitely tried to keep us away from the hospital... all those negative experiences that we could have been exposed to. But this time, we've been with her through everything." The singer said she was diagnosed with colorectal cancer early this year and underwent surgery

last month. This is her third bout with the illness after battling cervical and colon cancer in 2003.

She is currently going through chemo therapy.

"I really thought that the last time was the last na. But I do try to keep positive because I feel that it's really the best medicine. I think that if I lend myself to all these fears, I'll slip," she said. Friends and fans got a glimpse of her ongoing battle as she shares part of it on Facebook. While some go through their fight privately, Albert insists to do otherwise.

"I share this journey with people, first of all because I need prayers. I'm not gonna pretend that I don't need help because I do. I feel that if I share my journey with people, there might be other people who are going through the same thing and I'm going to inspire them. Para naman may purpose yung pagkakasakit ko di ba?" she said.

The singer will be slowing down but she is thankful for the gift of extended time.



Running for Conservative MP in Vancouver-Kingsway, B.C., Francisco Quimpo, during his acclamation in October, 2014, declared: "Kaya natin ito". A senior PC government, in a press release, said of Quimpo: "We are passing the torch to another generation of leadership. With bright dreams, he

came to Canada with no guarantees and left the Philippines when he was in his fourth year of law school, but he worked hard, went back to school, became a qualified paralegal and had become an amazing community

Affectionately called "Jojo", he is "the Filipino-Canadian immigrant feel-good story – where hard work, determination, living within one's means, and dedication to community results in resolve and leadership."

Quimpo got noticed, receiving federal and community recognition, and joining Prime Minister Stephen

Harper in Canada's Trade
mission to Asia in 2012.
He also uses his talent as
a singer and performer, to
help raise money for worthy
causes and for calamity relief. With a genuine
understanding of the Canadian immigrant,
and a strong commitment to community

and family, Jojo is ready to be Vancouverites' representative in Parliament.

Mario Jacinto Rimbao was acclaimed by his riding association as the NDP MP Candidate in Mount Royal. Born in Montreal to Filipino practicing medical technologist and-nurse parents, lives in Brossard with

his wife Roanne, a registered nurse, and their

year-old daughter Alyanne. He was raised

in Cote des Neiges, on Dupuis and later in

NDG, on Fielding in Quebec.
Levy Abad, Jr., a former Toronto resident, immigrated to Canada in 2006. As the NDP candidate in Winnipeg North, Manitoba Abad said "that experience and the desire to help new Canadians is his main reason for seeking election, as he knows the challenges of coming to a new country". At 47 years old, Abad has a wife and 2 kids and is currently on leave from his job as a Multicultural Outreach Officer in the provincial government.

In addition to helping new Canadians, Abad is concerned with old age security, par-



ticularly the federal government's increase of the retirement age from 65 to 67. He said he would like to see the processing fees for Canadian citizenship application lowered.

MANILA - About 70 million Filipinos or nearly 70 percent of the population are still not digitally connected.

This was bared during the DigitalBayanihan milestone update program of Intel Philippines at the Asian Institute of Management.

"While we see an increased adoption of digital devices in Southeast Asia and in the Philippines, there is still a growing gap in digital skills that needs to be addressed in order to fully take advantage of the benefits of the digital age," said Prakash Mallya, Intel Southeast Asia managing director.

"If the 70 million unreached Filipinos can be digitally connected, they can change the landscape of the Philippines," Mallya said.

In Southeast Asia, there are 374 million people who are not yet digitally connected, said Mallya, citing data from Intel.

He said Intel is promoting digital connectivity to provide access and form a more productive Philippine society.

"We introduced DigitalBayanihan to promote digital inclusiveness in the country and empower Filipinos with access to digital skills training and devices," he said.



Launched in September 2015, DigiBayanihan is Intel Philippines' initiative that seeks to promote digital literacy through training, volunteerism and providing access to affordable technology.

For Intel Philippine country manager Calum Chrisholm, the DigiBayanihan is a journey for everyone.

"Every journey has a destination. Our destination is to close the digital divide, i.e., for everyone to be included in the Philippines. That is our shared goal," Chrisholm said.

"DigiBayanihan is all about digital inclusiveness for everybody. All Filipinos should be included in digital literacy. It is also improving their connectivity. Their basic accessibility is an empowerment and development," he added.

Partnering with organizations like Asia Society for Social Improvement and Sustainable Transformation (ASSIST), National Confederation of Cooperatives (NATCCO), Philippine Society of IT Educators (PSITE), and Technical Vocational Schools and Associations of the Philippines (TEVSAPHIL), Intel Philippines seeks to level up the program beyond the basic digital literacy skills.

Yolanda funds as Election money?

Delays in releasing the funds causes suspicion



MANILA - Aan official from the Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines expressed alarm over the possible use of the government's Typhoon Yolanda funds in next year's elections.

NASSA/Caritas Philippines Executive Secretary Edwin Gariguez expressed this view following recent studies supposedly showing the Aquino administration's prolonged delays in releasing the funds under its Comprehensive Rehabilitation and Recovery Plan for Super Typhoon Yolanda. "The problem here is that 2016 is fast approaching," Gariguez said.

"When are they going to release the

funds? Are they waiting to release it until 2016? What is sad is they may be waiting for 2016 before they release the funds. That's not good. They may be waiting for 2016 so they could give away this big money. That should not happen."

Gariguez made his statement even as the Department of Budget and Management said the releases of money for the rehabilitation of the areas devastated by Yolanda were made as urgently as possible, and that former Senator Panfilo Lacson's basis on the slow releases was wrong. The agency said Lacson's allegations on the slow Yolanda releases were untrue and based on incorrect data. Lacson was the head of the Office of the Presidential Assistant for Rehabilitation and Recovery until he resigned in December 2014.

"Lacson's points do not give an accurate picture of the government's efforts to help the Yolanda survivors. Not only that—his claims are based on erroneous information," Budget Secretary Florencio Abad said.

Lacson claimed that the P80-billion requirement for the Comprehensive Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Program was not included in the 2014 budget. Gariguez also cited the lack of transparency on how the funds for Yolanda were used.

A report from the Department of Budget and Management apparently showed that the budget for the Yolanda reconstruction was shared with other rehabilitation efforts for other calamities such as the Bohol earthquake.

"This is another cause for concern. Why do they have to mix up the funds for the rehabilitation efforts of different calamities? This is a clear disregard of basic accounting principles. Again, this clearly shows the government's super inefficiency," Gariguez said.

The priest also raised alarm over the indebtedness incurred by the government as the "financial requirements of the rehabilitation have become the government's pretext in accessing loan obligations with multilateral financial institutions."

So far, the government has incurred a total of P126.2 billion i9n debts.

"These are the issues that we wanted President Aquino to clarify during his last State of the Nation Address. Unfortunately, this did not happen," Gariguez said.

US vows to keep China Sea open

WASHINGTON will not tolerate any navigation restrictions in the South China Sea, US Secretary of State John Kerry said Thursday at a regional security meeting dominated by tensions over Beijing's island building.

"Let me be clear: The United States will not accept restrictions on freedom of navigation and overflight, or other lawful uses of the sea. These are intrinsic rights that we all share," he said according to a transcript of his remarks.

Kerry made his comments at a security meeting hosted by the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) in Kuala Lumpur.

China has sparked alarm by expanding tiny reefs and constructing military posts, steps viewed by some of its neighbors as violating a regional pledge against provocative actions in the area.

The long simmering dispute has flared at the Malaysia meet, attended by members of the 10-nation regional grouping as well as more than a dozen others including China, Japan, South Korea and the US.

The US and Southeast Asian nations have called for Beijing to halt both reclamation in the South China Sea and construction on reefs, something Beijing has staunchly resisted.

"I have urged all claimants to make a joint commitment to halt further land reclamation and construction of new facilities or militarization on disputed features," Kerry told delegates, arguing such a step would "lower tensions".

ASEAN members were at loggerheads Thursday over how hard to press China on its contentious efforts to assert control over the South China Sea, with the issue threatening to fray regional unity.

Diplomatic sources said the Philippines and Vietnam in particular were pushing for stronger language on Chinese land reclamation, which could help shore up Beijing's disputed territorial claims.

But there was pushback from traditional China allies among the ASFAN

"China's friends are taking a hard stance," said one diplomat familiar with the drafting.

The diplomat did not specify which countries were taking a hard line, but Cambodia, Laos and Myanmar traditionally ally with China within ASEAN.



Tommy Abuel, Carmi Martin and Jaya. The series airs weeknights.





Frugal defense is all PHL can afford

MANILA - The Philippines can only afford a "frugal" military upgrade, defense officials said, even though maritime tensions with China are growing.

Despite a proposed 25 percent rise in next year's defense budget, the government must still divide resources between external defense and internal threats like insurgencies and natural disasters, Defense Secretary Voltaire Gazmin and other security officials added.

Since President Benigno Aquino took office in mid-2010, the Philippines has acquired two former US coast guard cutters, three landing craft from Australia and South Korea and seven surplus UH-1H helicopters.

"The goal of updating and modernizing our armed forces is a long and painstaking process," Gazmin told a ceremony for the commissioning of 10 more newlyacquired air force helicopters.

"That means we have to be frugal and acquire reliable platforms at very reasonable costs... as allowed by our meager financial resources."

The modest upgrade has been prompted partly by China's moves to stake its claim to most of the South China Sea.

These include building new islands in the Spratly archipelago and taking effective control of Scarborough Shoal after a standoff with the Philippine Navy.

Philippine Air Force chief Lieutenant-General Jeffrey Delgado said the 10 new helicopters will be used to address internal security problems.

The military expects more aircraft deliveries this year including possibly the first two of 12 FA-50 fighter jets earlier ordered from a South Korean supplier, Delgado told reporters.

Delgado said the FA-50S were mere "transition aircraft" toward more advanced more advanced fighters jets which the Philippines cannot now

"Our spot checks from several warehouses show how misconstrued the rules may have become. People are sending in used clothing, home appliances and items of the same kind that can well be used for commercial purposes," he said.

Lina recounted that some items inside these balikbayan boxes could be considered as smuggled goods due to non-compliance with the Philippine Tariff and Customs Code.

However, it should always be noted that these packages have limitations, such as contents not exceeding \$500 in value, Lina said. "Canned goods, grocery items and other household effects must not exceed a dozen a kind, while apparel whether used or new must not exceed three yards per cut," Lina said.

He added that one consignment per sender during a one-month period is allowed. These packages should also not contain any banned or regulated firearms and ammunition, prohibited drugs, pornographic material and gambling material. "Home appliances are not allowed unless these are consigned to returning Filipino residents and overseas contract workers. We will seize these prohibited shipments and revoke registrations of forwarders or consolidators if we find any violations," Lina said.

He further said examination of the shipments is allowed and if a receiver finds any items missing from the packages, he may report this to the proper authorities.

The President ordered the customs bureau to stop the random physical

inspection of balikbayan boxes and instead implement a 100 percent x-ray and K-9 inspection of the cargos. The bureau will only conduct physical inspection of boxes in cases of derogatory findings. However, this will be done in the presence of a representative of Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA) or a designated officer of an OFW organization.

Aquino's decision was reached after a meeting with Finance Secretary Cesar Purisima and Customs chief Alberto Lina in Malacañang in the wake of public outcry against the rigid inspection of the OFW boxes.

Several lawmakers, OFWs and their families, and other concerned sectors have criticized the administration for bullying the modern-day heroes instead of focusing on the crackdown on bigtime smugglers.

A day after stopping the Bureau of Customs (BOC) plan, Malacañang assured that there was "no politics" behind President Aquino's decision, dispelling allegations that the Chief Executive changed his mind on the issue supposedly for fear of a backlash on the administration candidates in the 2016 elections.

In August 2014, Senator Bam Aquino filed a bill seeking to update the current minimal volume of declaration of goods in the customs for consignments, balikbakan boxes and other low-value and low-risk packages.

In his bill, Sen. Bam wants the de minimis level to increase to P10,000 by amending Sec. 709 of the Tariff and Customs Code.

No one from the city police could explain how the suspects, who were held at the Marawi City jail, disappeared from their cell and ended up dead with gunshots to the head.

The slain rape suspects, Jabbar Macacua, Elias Pimping, Salman Udag and Jalil Sani, had all admitted their involvement in the brutal gang rape and murder of the Maranaw girl on Aug. 14.

They were arrested a day after the incident and were immediately detained at the city jail.

The suspects were reportedly spirited out of the city jail by a group, to be taken to Bayang town in the first district of Lanao del Sur, hometown of Vice Gov. Haroun Al-Rashid Lucman of the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao.

The rape victim was related by blood to Lucman, according to local officials.

The four suspects also confessed to burning the victim's cadaver after the rape.

against poverty with faster growth, more jobs, and greater investments in social services.

CCT FOR VOTE BUYING?

But Colmenares warned that as May, 2016, national elections near, the CCT will likely be used by the Aquino administration for vote buying.

"The CCT had always been questionable because it is essentially legalized vote buying because it is a means to influence voters and not a means to alleviate poverty," he said.

"The budget should instead be used for creating jobs and implementing genuine land reform. This would benefit the poor more than the hundreds of billions spent for CCT," he pointed out.

Colmenares said the doleout program, which has been implemented since the time of former President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo, failed to address the vicious cycle of poverty.

DSWD Secretary Corazon Soliman had assured that they have put in place measures that will ensure that rightful beneficiaries receive assistance under the 4Ps.

Colmenares' fellow Makabayan bloc lawmakers – Gabriela partylist Rep. Luz Ilagan and Kabataan partylist Rep. Terry Ridon renewed calls to scrap the CCT program.

"It has not addressed poverty at all. It should be scrapped. The additional danger is that it will be an election instrument," Ilagan said.

"The CCT should be scrapped altogether. By losing a third to unintended persons, it should already be a clear sign that the CCT is ineffective in poverty alleviation," Ridon said.

Youth group Anakbayan opposes CCT program and assailed massive cuts in the budget of state universities and colleges.

The group said that the budget cut was evident in the case of the University of the Philippines (UP).

The funds for CCT and PPP, Crisostomo said, come from hardearned money from taxpayers who subsidize the still-idle beneficiaries of the CCT.

ADVERSE STUDIES

Worse, studies conducted by the Oxford University in England pointed to instances when local officials, particularly in Eastern Visayas, took control of the ATM cards of beneficiaries and made a cut on the P1,400 monthly subsidies.

For its part, the World Bank (WB) noted fund leakages that account for 19 percent of the total budget.

Their findings are close to the estimate of a former chief of the National Anti-Poverty Commission (NAPC) who said 40 percent of the beneficiaries "were not dirt-poor" and should be deleted by Soliman.

Last March, the House Committee on Poverty Alleviation approved a bill seeking to institutionalize the CCT program to reduce poverty and promote human capital development in the country.



As the Disney song goes, it's "a tale as old as time"

Instead of Beauty taming the Beast, however, a not-so-ordinary nanny called Yaya Dub enchants a handsome heartthrob named Alden Richards in this modern retelling of a classic fairy tale.

For good measure, a cruel stepmother/fairy godmother joins the melee: Lola Nidora, or comedian Wally Bayola in drag.

The unlikely duo dubbed "AlDub's" budding romance has posted through-the-roof ratings for the 36-year-old noontime variety show "Eat Bulaga," aired by GMA 7.

Called "kalyeserye" or street series, the "AlDub" romance is a certified hit.

It is not uncommon for Makati employees (some working in this newspaper) to delay their lunch break to 1:30 p.m. in order to catch AlDub in the program's "Juan for All, All for Juan" segment

Some would wait until the wee hours when the segment is uploaded to the show's official Facebook account.

Anna Leah Sarabia, anthropologist and media critic, pointed out that the kalyeserye mines tried-and-tested tropes used in fairy tales and

"AlDub the 'uncouple' never meets and communicates only through television—through cute antics like the pabebe wave. It's a 'Cinderella' story that's fake and true-life at the same

On- and off-camera, Richards and Yaya Dub have yet to meet and only get to interact onscreen—specifically, split-screen, during their segment on the noontime show.

Sarabia added: "This kind of hide-and-seek courtship is not new."

"Eat Bulaga" director Poochie Rivera shared a theory with the Inquirer: "AIDub clicked because lots of Filipinos can relate with their predicament. People who have partners who work abroad often communicate and pursue their relationship online, through Skype or Facetime."

The struggles of overseas Filipino workers have somehow seeped into popular culture in the guise of supposedly harmless entertainment.

Did Alden Richards meet Maine Mendoza at Candy Fair before?

Chiz: Party not always a big factor in poll victory

MANILA – Independent senator Francis "Chiz" Escudero said the machinery that a political party can give does not necessarily guarantee a candidate's victory in the polls.

Escudero admitted that he and Sen. Grace Poe are aware that launching a bid for a national position can be hard without the backing of a political party.

"Kaya siguro mas mahabang panahon ang kailangan namin para magisip dahil wala kaming pera, makinarya, at partido," he said. Escudero, however, said history also shows that money and political machinery do not always translate to a victory.

"Si Pangulong Cory [Aquino] walang partido nang nanalo siya at ang kakampi niya sa laban nung mga panahon na iyon ay 12 kongresista lang yata," he said. "Si Pangulong [Fidel] Ramos, ang kapatid lang niya sa Senado, pamangin niya sa Kongreso, at si Speaker Jose de Venecia ang kakampi niya. Si [Joseph] Estrada, mga 14 kongresista. Si Pangulong [Benigno] Aquino, 21 ang miyembro ng LP (Liberal Party) noon. Of course, not counted si Pangulong [Gloria] Arroyo dahil incumbent siya nung tumkabo."

Escudero added: "Ang eleksyon sa pangulo, pangalawang pangulo at senador, [diyan] natin tunay nakikita ang demokrasya...sapagkat ayon sa maraming pagsasaliksik, iyung negosyante at pulitiko ang sumusunod sa tao, hindi yung tao ang sumusunod sa negosyante at pulitiko."

Escudero also clarified that Poe will decide on her own whether to run or not. He said he will support whatever the neophyte senator's decision is.

Poe is currently the most favored possible presidential candidate in 2016, based on surveys. Her huge potential to win has attracted the Liberal Party (LP) and Nationalist People's Coalition (NPC).

LP's standard bearer, Mar Roxas, is still wooing Poe to become his running-mate. The NPC, on the other hand, has said it is prepared to provide its machinery to Poe and Escudero, should they decide to run together.

Poe has not yet decided whether she will run in 2016. It also remains uncertain whether she will accept Roxas' offer or run with Escudero, her closest political ally.

70% Filipinos not connected digitally

MANILA - About 70 million Filipinos or nearly 70 percent of the population are still not digitally connected.

This was bared during the DigitalBayanihan milestone update program of Intel Philippines at the Asian Institute of Management.

"While we see an increased adoption of digital devices in Southeast Asia and in the Philippines, there is still a growing gap in digital skills that needs to be addressed in order to fully take advantage of the benefits of the digital age," said Prakash Mallya, Intel Southeast Asia managing director.

"If the 70 million unreached Filipinos can be digitally connected, they can change the landscape of the Philippines," Mallya said.

In Southeast Asia, there are 374 million people who are not yet digitally connected, said Mallya, citing data from Intel.

He said Intel is promoting digital connectivity to provide access and form a more productive Philippine society.

"We introduced DigitalBayanihan to promote digital inclusiveness in the country and empower Filipinos with access to digital skills training and devices," he said.

Launched in September 2015,

DigiBayanihan is Intel Philippines' initiative that seeks to promote digital literacy through training, volunteerism and providing access to affordable technology.

"We at Intel acknowledge the role of education and connectivity in empowering developing countries throughout the world. With Southeast Asia being a relatively young but strong region in terms of digital adoption, introducing programs that help promote and sustain digital literacy will help increase productivity and lay the foundation for a stronger digital economy," said Mallya

afford.

Defence department spokesman Peter Paul Galvez said communist and Muslim insurgencies remained a priority despite the new watchfulness on Philippine borders.

"We are first focusing on internal security and in the succeeding horizons, we will go towards external defense," he said, criticizing China's reclamation work.

"They should stop their island-building. That steps up the pace of militarization," Galvez said.

The Philippines has been among the most vocal in challenging China's sea claims, which also overlap those of Brunei, Malaysia, Taiwan and Vietnam.

US ambassador Philip Goldberg said the United States, the Philippines' closest defense ally, was ready to provide surplus military equipment and budgeted \$50 million in foreign military aid to the Philippines last year.

House Bill 4828, which a Senate committee is now deliberating on, seeks to add more requirements: certificates of good moral character, and proof of gainful trade, business, employment and other lawful sources of income.

This means jobless foreigners, and those convicted of crimes, would not be able to marry Filipinos if the bill becomes law.

However, because the bill focuses on male foreigners, certain government offices are not in favor of it.

"We believe the additional requirements... would propagate old gender stereotypes and is thus highly discriminatory and contrary to the equal protection clause of the Constitution," said Nolibelyn Macabagdal, a project officer at the Department of Social Welfare and Development, during a committee hearing on the bill on Monday.

The Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) also does not agree with the bill.

"We feel that it runs contrary to the provision of the Magna Carta which grants equal rights for women and men to enter into marriage," said the PCW's Rebecca Baylosis.

The House of Representatives approved its version of the bill in 2014, with proponents saying it would protect Filipino women against exploitation by foreigners and being trafficked and prostituted, among others.

Senator Pia Cayetano, chairperson of the committee on youth, women, and family relations, is also not keen on approving the Senate bill in its current form.

Aside from having gender equality issues, she said the bill discriminates against foreigners.

"There's a human right question that we have to resolve," Cayetano told reporters after Monday's hearing.

"The intention is very good. It's just that, how do you do it in such a way that it's fair?"

Cayetano has called for the convening of a technical working group to refine the bill.


Ex-minister vows to fight Iglesia's Sanggunian 'all the way'




