When the ratings of presidential candidate





Does PH have among the most underweight people?



MANILA - The Philippines is among the top 10 countries in the world that have the largest number of underweight men and women, according to a recent report published in the peer-reviewed medical magazine The Lancet.

The report showed that the number of underweight men and women nearly doubled since 1975.

As of 2014, the Philippines ranked 9th for having 3.6 million underweight men, and ranked 8th with 4.4 million underweight women.

In 1975, the Philippines ranked 11th in both genders with 1.9 million underweight men and 2.5 million underweight

Topping the list of the country with the most underweight population is India with 101.8 million underweight men and 100.5 million underweight women.

In terms of prevalence, or rate of underweight population, the Philippines is at 14.3 percent for women, or 16th in the world. For men, it is 12.3 percent, which is the 40th globally.

Meanwhile, countries with the highest level of obesity for men are China (1st), United States (2nd), and Brazil (3rd). For women, it is China (1st), US (2nd), and India (3rd).

The study took data from 186 countries. It highlighted the rise of underweight persons from 330 million in 1975 to 462 million in 2014. Likewise, that report also showed that global population of obese people has also risen from 105 million in 1975 to 641 million in 2014.

The study used standardized methods to measure bodymass index (BMI). Its lead author is Professor Majid Ezzati of the School of Public Health at the Imperial College London.

"Over the past four decades, we have transitioned from a world in which underweight prevalence was more than double that of obesity, to one in which more people are obese than underweight.... If post-2000 trends continue, not only will the world not meet the global target for halting the increase in obesity, but also severe obesity will surpass underweight in women by 2025," the report stated.



Dressing Matters

We hear it all the time: Don't judge a book by its cover. But, in some cases, clothes can influence self-esteem levels and help determine the impression we make on others . And whether it comes from a great first date or a snazzy suit, self-confidence never goes out of style!

Clothes can have a big impact on how a person feels. (Lady Gaga must have some serious mood swings!). Some research justifies an occasional shopping spree, since a new article of clothing can gear up a person's mood. And feeling blue? A bright red shirt may be the way to go. The color red can increase self-confidence; people wearing red clothing may also be more likely to win physical contests (and to join certain political parties).

Appearance can also play a part in first impressions, especially in professional settings . (No flip flops on the job interview!) One study suggests patients feel more comfortable when doctors wear a semiformal outfit than when they wear jeans. Germany prefers Pinoy nurses Recruiter says it is difficult to fill jobs

MANILA - The Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) said Filipino nurses are still in demand overseas.

DOLE Secretary Rosalinda Baldoz said Germany alone would need 200,000 nurses until 2020

She said German officials "have expressed preference to hire Filipino nurses."

During DOLE's meeting with officials from Germany, the two governments discussed the status of the Triple Win Project under the Philippines-Germany government-togovernment hiring agreement as well as the decision of the Philippine Overseas Employment Administration (POEA) Governing Board to expand the project to include participation of private recruitment agencies. "I have been informed about the World Health Organization's and International Labor Organization's joint Human Resource Development Technical Cooperation Program which the Philippines could tap for possible specialized training on geriatric care because we don't have this in the Philippines due to the absence of nursing homes," Baldoz said.

Baldoz said that under the agreement, Germany has so far accepted 222 Filipino nurses.

NOT EASY

Recruitment and migration expert Emmanuel Geslani said the Philippines won't be able to fill in the 200,000 job openings for nurses in Germany.

"No. If you're looking at 2020, that is only four years from now. Personally, as a recruitment consultant in the business for 35 years, we do not foresee this number to be growing, not even by the number of 10,000 by that time," he said.

Geslani, however, stressed that not only do Filipino nurses lack training on geriatric care, they also lack actual clinical care in general.

Another problem is the difficulty of learning German language, which is also a key requirement for jobseekers there.

"If we go by the number of deployed nurses to Germany since two years ago, ang nade-deploy pa lang natin is less than 300...because of the difficulty in learning and speaking and writing yung German language," he said.

Of the 222 Filipino nurses accepted by Germany, only 128 have been deployed so far, as the rest are still completing their preparatory German language training in the Philippines.

World behind PH on sea row

MANILA - There is no backing out for the Philippine government from a petition for arbitration that it filed before a United Nations body to settle a maritime dispute with China, especially since more powerful countries are backing Manila's stand.

Communications Secretary
Herminio Coloma Jr. noted that
the outpouring of international
support for the Philippines'
position on the dispute with
China over maritime territories in
the West Philippine Sea (South
China Sea) further emboldens
the government to pursue its
claims through the International
Tribunal on the Law of the Sea
(Itlos) in The Hague, The Netherlands.

"It is very clear that it is not only the Philippines that believes that the filing of the petition before the Court of Arbitration is justified... Many countries are supporting our stand on the issue," Coloma said.

John Lloyd confirms split with Angelica

MANILA - For the past few months, Kapamilya actor John Lloyd Cruz had been evasive about reports regarding his split with actress Angelica Panganiban.

The 32-year-old Cruz finally broke his silence and confirmed that his relationship with Panganiban has come to an end.

"Single na single," he said when asked to set the record straight about the current status of his love life. "Wala naman pong nagbabago."

Talent manager Ogie Diaz, citing sources close to the two, earlier said in January that the couple decided to part ways. However, he added that Cruz and Panganiban remain friends.

Before, neither Cruz nor Panganiban opened up about the report. During that time, Cruz was also romantically linked to "A Second Chance" co-star Bea Alonzo, whom he denied having a relationship with.

"Kayo ang unang makakaalam," Cruz told reporters when prodded to address reports about him and Alonzo. "Atsaka pag ganun hindi naman dapat iyon nililihim o tinatago."

"Life is too short. You have to make every moment count. Sa edad kong to magtatago pa ba? Sila 'JaDine' nga umaamin, tayo pa ba? Nakakahiya naman kung magde-deny pa tayo," he added.

Last February, several reports claimed to have spotted Cruz and Alonzo, who also broke up with boyfriend Zanjoe Marudo last December, at a resort in Balesin, Quezon.

Cruz has since insisted that he and Alonzo are not a couple. He also said that he does not talk about the rumors with the actress.

"We don't feel the need to talk about it. ...Kasi doon sa mga taong involved doon sa issue, alam nila naman kung ano ang totoo, and madalas sapat na sa amin iyong alam namin ang totoo," he explained.

Meanwhile, Cruz, in the same interview, also talked about working with actress Jennylyn Mercado for the upcoming Star Cinema film, "Just The 3 of Us."

"[She's] very professional, very dedicated, wala akong masabi. Like all the women na nakatrabaho ko in the past, I think importante si Jennylyn Mercado sa industriya natin. Masaya lang ako na nakatrabaho ko siya," he said.

Cruz also hopes that their film will open more doors about possible collaborations between artists from different networks. Mercado is one of the artists of GMA-7.

"Maliit lang itong mundo natin eh. Dapat ma-break ang barriers, dapat mas bumuka pa," he added.

PH more prone to cyber attacks

MANILA - The Philippines is twice more prone to advanced cyber attacks than other countries, according to research done by a cyber security firm.

FireEye Inc., a company that develops cyber security platforms, said that about 30 percent of organizations surveyed in the Philippines were targeted with advanced cyber attacks in the second half of last year. The figure is double the worldwide average of exposure to advanced cyber attacks, which is 15 percent.

FireEye disclosed that three groups of computer hackers or advanced persistent threat (APT) are targeting local organizations.

"The Philippines' cyber security gap is an urgent economic and national security concern.

Organizations here are frequently targeted by advanced attackers. As geopolitical tensions drive rapid militarization in the West Philippine Sea [South China Sea], it is important [that] we acknowledge the first shots in any conflict will be fired in cyberspace," Eric Hoh, FireEye's president for Asia Pacific, said on Tuesday.

"In this new era, nations with weak cyber defenses can expect their infrastructure, services and defensive capabilities to be significantly eroded in armed conflict," he added.

Among those targeted by hackers are the government, business services (including outsource service providers), gaming and hospitality sector, aerospace, defense and shipbuilding business.

"When organizations fall victim to advanced cyber attacks, there can be many negative side effects, including

disrupted operations, financial losses, reputational damage and lawsuits," said Marshall Heilman, vice president and executive director of the Incident Response and Red Team Operations

"In order to build a stronger security posture, it's critical that organizations not only put technology in place to detect and respond to these attacks, but that they also bring together expertise and strong threat intelligence," he added.

In the second semester of 2015, the sectors in Asia Pacific that were mostly exposed to APT attacks were federal governments; entertainment, media and hospitality sectors; manufacturing, energy and utilities; local governments; and services or consulting and financial services.

In April last year, FireEye uncovered a decade-long statesponsored cyber espionage campaign by a China-based group. The operation targeted governments, businesses and journalists. FireEye's analysis of the group's malware yielded clues that the group targeted the Philippines.

In November last year, Singtel Group Enterprise Chief Executive Officer Bill Chang said the banking sector is the most targeted by hackers in the Philippines, given the high financial gain and the inability of some banks to invest in cyber security.

The latest victim of cyber criminals was the Bangladesh Bank, which was robbed of \$81 million. The money was transferred to the Rizal Commercial Banking Corp.

Clear campaign message brought Duterte to the top

Poe has been vague in her promises

MANILA - A political analyst believes Davao City Mayor Rodrigo Duterte is now leading the presidential race, largely due to his clear and consistent campaign chant: change.

Political science professor Dennis Coronacion said Duterte's promises on solving peace and order problems and the formation of a federal government appeal to voters, many of whom are clamoring for change.

Duterte has claimed a solo lead in the March 30 to April 2 Social Weather Station survey and the March 29 to April 3 Pulse Asia survey commissioned by ABS-CBN.

"I think it's going to be about change. If we're going to take into account what's happening to the Duterte campaign, people are clamoring for change and a certain candidate, and that's Duterte, fits well what people are looking for," he said.

Coronacion said voters understand Duterte's simple campaign message, which also shows a "strong and decisive government."

"I think people are beginning to understand the message of Duterte, the leading candidate in the surveys, I think we are beginning to see that more and more Filipinos are yearning for a different leader," he said.

"People are clamoring for a kind of leader who can decide quickly and that's the kind of leadership that Duterte is offering," he added. This, contrary to what he said as a "soft government" portrayed by Senator Grace Poe, who in the latest surveys placed second.

"Maybe it's because of the strength of the message conveyed by Duterte, it resonates with people, the people understand his message very well unlike Grace Poe, although she did well in the presidential debates, but the image that she created so far she's a soft candidate," he said.

He said Poe needs to sharpen her messaging of what "gobyernong may puso [government with a heart]" means, clearly stating her plans in resolving the pressing issues the administration is facing.

"What she can do is to probably take a look at her campaign strategy, she should come up with a clear message as to the content of her campaign, short of saying 'don't be vague,' 'try to clear up what you're trying to tell the voters'," Coronacion said.

"Kasi si Duterte he has been clear, 'In three to six year-time I can solve the problem of crime, perhaps in two years or a year's time I can solve the traffic situation,' so he's been very clear and he even said part of his peace and order solution is federalism, Grace Poe has no such kind of message so at this point she's still vague," he added.

Roxas vows prosperous PH by 2022

DAGUPAN CITY: Liberal Party (LP) standard bearer Manuel "Mar" Roxas 2nd vowed prosperity for Filipinos by the end of his term if he is elected President this May.

Roxas has promised to address unemployment across all sectors, as well as permanent aid for fishermen, making a reference to those harassed by Chinese poachers in coastal waters within what the Philippines considers its Exclusive Economic Zone in the



Vest.

"By 2022, we will have 10 million more jobs in factories, call centers, construction due to tourism [investments]. Ang krimen malulutas sa batas, hindi dahas (Crimes will be solved in accordance with the law, not violence)," Roxas said during the final presidential debate here, clearly taking a dig at Duterte's promise of eradicating crimes in the country within six months.

Feng Shui to solve NAIA-3 Problems?

Has it come down to this? In the wake of the five-hour blackout at Ninoy Aquino International Airport Terminal 3 (NAIA-3), some airport officials are rumored to be exploring supernatural means to get rid of the place's so-called bad luck.

"Some airport officials attribute the series of mishaps at NAIA-3 — such as a collapsed ceiling, one death, and a couple of suicide attempts — to the fact that in 2006 a security guard died inside the premises of NAIA-3 after he was thrown off a motorcycle," reports Rudy Santos in The Philippine Star.

Moreover, the report noted that "other superstitious airport officials also pointed out that when NAIA-3 was constructed, a whole community and a chapel across the street were demolished and the 'desecration' now needs to be rectified."

It also worth noting, though, that "a new and bigger church had already been built on the site of the previous one."

As such, the report indicated, "an airport official, who refused to be identified, claimed that he had recommended to NAIA-3 manager Octavio Lina to consult a feng shui expert." The official added that "Lina said he might suggest the idea to Honrado for approval."

The official said that the feng shui expert and other local shamans "could identify what could be wrong with the building's design and even conduct rituals to exorcise the terminal of evil spirits."

PHL must include casinos in dirty money law

The Philippines must make sure casinos are covered by anti-money laundering legislation, the World Bank said on Monday, joining calls for the government to better regulate its gambling industry after stolen millions from Bangladesh found their way to Manila.

to 'close loopholes' - World Bank

A Philippine panel is trying to fathom how \$81 million hacked in February from the New York Federal Reserve account of Bangladesh's central bank wound up with two casinos and a junket operator in the Philippines in one of the biggest cyber heists in history.

The government has since recovered part of the stolen money. "Reforms should be made, for instance, in making sure that casinos are included (in the anti-money laundering law)," World Bank lead economist Rogier van den Brink told reporters in Manila. "... Loopholes must be closed."

The enactment of the anti-money laundering law in 2001 was a good start, van den Brink said, but the Philippines must "keep reforming it so that you are sure these untoward effects will not materialize."

In February 2013, the Philippines was up against a deadline to amend its Anti-Money Laundering Act and get itself off the "grey list" of a global watchdog, and lawmakers were arguing over whether to include casinos under the legislation. They decided not to.

World Bank senior country economist Karl Kendrick Chua also reiterated the bank's recommendation to ease the Philippines' bank secrecy laws to help combat money laundering and identify tax

SAMAL KIDNAPPING AFP vows no let up in ops vs. Abu Sayyaf as ransom deadline nears

The Armed Forces of the Philippines has made adjustments in its operations against the Abu Sayyaf Group, which continues to hold four kidnap victims for ransom following their abduction from a Samal Island resort in late 2015. The military made the announcement on the eve of the bandit group's deadline for the payment f \$21 million for the release of the four hostages. The deadline is on Friday, April 8.

Col. Noel Detoyato, chief of the AFP Public Information Office, said the military was not considering the deadline as it continues its operations against the ASG.

"Nagkaroon ng adjustments dun ng division commanders, na personally sila na ang nago-oversee ng operations ngayon," Detoyato said.

"[As to the] operational details, I am not at liberty to divulge them because of force protection, but rest assured our troops are operating. There is no let up in operations," he added.

The AFP said it would hold the ASG responsible for any harm that would befall the three foreigners and a Filipina the bandits have kept in captivity since September 21, 2015

In November 2015, the ASG demanded \$21 million or P1 billion for each victim.

"I was actually bedridden for one year and five months. Last year, [noong] April lang po ako nakalakad ulit. Actually, yun po ang naging inspiration ko for my fall-winter collection. I wanted to show the people what I have been through. All the pain, the depression, the hatred, the anger, lahat ng iniyak ko gabi-gabi," Sta. Maria said.

Sta. Maria came from a humble background. In order to help his family, he studied to be a nurse, aiming to have a stable career in the medical field.

"[My inspiration is] My mom, my family, basically. Kasi hindi naman po ako sa galing sa mayamang pamilya o mayamang angkan. Nagsimula talaga ako na gusto ko maiahon ang pamilya ko sa kahirapan," he said.

His mom supported their family through a sari-sari store so, he said, being able to support his family has always been his main goal in life. Through it all, he never forgot his passion to create.

"I started teaching. I'm also an author of a nursing review book in the Philippines so nung kumikita na, I sent myself to a fashion school in the Philippines and then I started pursuing my dreams," he said.

His desire to be an international designer was jump-started last year when he auditioned and got in as the Philippines' representative at the



Mercedes Benz Asia Fashion Week.

Soon enough, he was on a flight to Los Angeles after his collection was chosen as the finale for one of the LA Fashion Week presentations.

At his first show in America, Sta. Maria couldn't stop crying backstage after he made his final bow.

"Gusto kong maiyak na hindi ko maintindihan. Nung una kong

tungtong dito, kasi this is really my first time in America, and never in my wildest dream na naisip ko na makakarating ako ng America sa pamamagitan pa ng fashion show," he said.

Sta. Maria was also chosen to be one of the designers featured at the Atlanta International Fashion Week.

The designer has a shop in Bulacan and will be opening another one in Quezon City this year.

Filipino-Americans urged to register and vote in US polls

NEW YORK - Of the nearly 3.8 million Filipinos in the US, close to 3.2 million are US citizens, according to the 2014 US census estimate

Community leaders say, based on the latest census, roughly 76% or about 2.8 million Filipino-Americans are potential voters in the 2016 US presidential elections.

But only about half of these eligible Fil-Ams have registered to vote. "We have the number on paper but we need to translate that into actual voting, that's why the primary objective we need to educate our base to just go out and before you can even vote, you need to register," said Harley Barrales of the National Federation of Filipino American Associations' (NaFFAA) The Fil-Am Vote. Stephanie Chrispin of Pilipino American Unity for Progress, Inc. (UniPro) added, "So if you go out and register to vote, you are not speaking just for yourself and your community, but you are speaking for Asian Americans at large, if you don't vote you don't have a voice."

The Fil-Am Vote is part the larger Asian-American electorate which was about 3.9 million in the 2012 presidential elections.

While Latinos are the most talked about voter demographic, Asian-Americans are actually the fastest growing.

Asian-Americans, including Filipino-Americans, helped reelect President Barack Obama in 2012.

In a 2012 exit poll study made by the Asian-American Legal Defense Fund or AALDEF, 77% of Asian-Americans voted for Obama while 21% for GOP nominee Mitt Romney.

While 65% of Fil-Ams who cast their ballots voted for Obama, 32% for Romney. Both Democratic and Republican parties are realizing the potential and are courting the Asian-

American vote.

In May 2014, the Republican National Committee (RNC) appointed Ninio Fetalvo as press secretary for Asian-American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) Media.

Last week, the Clinton campaign named Jason Benjamin Tengco their AAPI Outreach Director for Democratic presidential candidate Hillary Clinton.

Both are Filipino-Americans.

"That means that they're starting to care, starting to notice us, we should build off of that momentum and exercise our right and privilege to vote," said Iris Zalun, Voting Rights Organizer for Asian American Legal Defense and Education Fund (AALDEE)

Registered voter Blase Ferraris said, "Voting matters to me because it gives me a chance to actually make the changes that I wanted to see. It gives me opportunity to make my voice matter." "We are shaping what the country is going to look like, and so in a lot of states, the Asian American vote and the Filipino vote specifically is a swing vote, we determine who gets elected." Said Chrispin.

But because of the low 30% turnout in past elections, the relevance of the Asian-American vote, as well as the Filipino-American vote, have often been ignored.

Organizers of this register and vote campaign said if there is a large enough Fil-Am voter turnout in November, only then can both political parties see the increasingly important Fil-Am vote.

They added that it can only happen if Fil-Ams make themselves heard at the polls come Election Day.

More than 18,000 Pinoys cast votes on third day of overseas polling



More than 18,000 Filipinos abroad have cast their votes on the third day of overseas polling for this year's 2016 national elections, with Hong Kong having the most number of voter turnout, the Department of Foreign Affairs said

A record-breaking 1.376 million Filipino voters have registered overseas, but despite the dismal turnout on the first three days of voting, Foreign Undersecretary Rafael Seguis said the numbers are expected to rise in the coming days.

Overseas Absentee Voting for Filipinos began on April 9.

"Our workers have to take time to go to the embassy to vote. For example in the Middle East, Friday is their only nonworking day. But we expect a surge in voters in the final stretch of voting," Seguis said in an interview.

As of 2:30 p.m. Monday, Hong Kong posted the highest voter turnout in Asia-Pacific with 4,851, followed by

Singapore with 2,259. The Americas, which includes the United States, Canada and Latin America, had a total of 107 voters, 1,927 in Europe and 7,159 in Middle East and Africa.

The total number of voters for the four regions is 18,360, Seguis said.

About 10 million Filipinos - about a tenth of the entire population - work or reside abroad.

However, Seguis lamented the Philippine government still had difficulties convincing

Filipinos to register and participate in the polls that was first implemented in 2004.

Political apathy and the residence status of the Filipinos result to low turnout of registration and voting.

Most of the Filipinos also live very far from the embassies and consulates.

To increase awareness among Filipinos of the ongoing absentee voting, various diplomatic missions have turned to the internet through website uploads, blogs, social networking sites, and Filipino community/ organization website uploads, Seguis said.

Seguis said the Department of Foreign Affairs is targeting an 80 percent turnout of Filipino overseas voters.

"Our Filipinos overseas should exercise their right to suffrage," he said. "A big number of votes will have an impact on the number of votes in the Philippines and our overseas Filipino workers are considered gamechangers in the our political and democratic process."

Filipinos overseas have until 5 p.m. Manila time on May 9 to cast their votes.



Carol Banawa reveals story behind her song's inclusion on US series

It's not every day that a Pinoy singer gets their song featured on a TV series, let alone one that airs in the US.

In a recent "Rated K" episode, Carol Banawa shared how her 1997 hit "Bakit 'Di Totohanin" made it to "The Vampire Diaries."

The song was played on the show's 716th episode last April 1 in a scene involving Valerie played by Elizabeth Blackmore and Stefan portrayed by Paul Wesley.

The 35-year-old singer said it was a staff from the show who reached out to her via email last February.

"Yung (subject) ng (email) ay "Bakit 'Di Totohanin' 'Vampire Diaries' Episode 716." So sabi ko, 'Why my song? Why a Tagalog song for a US TV series?' Tapos sumagot siya ang sabi niya kasi nga meron daw scene for that episode na 'yung dalawang characters ay in the Philippines," she said.

She added, "They wanted to make the scene sound and look authentic that's why they decided to use a Tagalog song."

Carol went on to express how "lucky" she is to have been given that chance.

"All I can think of is it's God's work kasi parang out of all the songs kanta ko pa 'yung napili," she said.

"Bakit 'Di Totohanin" was the official theme song of the 2001 film with the same title starring Judy Ann Santos and Piolo Pascual.

Carol now resides in America with her three kids and husband. She is a licensed practical nurse and currently working on becoming a registered nurse.

Asked if she regrets leaving local showbiz, Carol said, "I can live without it, 'yung fame. Ok lang sa'kin kasi ako pa napaka homebody ko kasi talaga eh."

Enrile on PNoy administration's response to crisis:

'My God, they are sleeping!'

MANILA - During the weekly forum at the Senate on Thu, Apr 7, Senator Juan Ponce Enrile called President Noynoy Aquino's administration as a "three-day presidency." He explained that this was because the administration takes three days before they act on even the most pressing matters such as the alleged laundering of US\$81 million stolen funds into the Philippine financial system and the Kidapawan City incident.

"The forum was supposed to focus on the Anti-Money Laundering Council's (AMLC) handling of the money laundering scheme, which is being investigated by the Senate blue ribbon committee," reports Maila Ager on Inquirer.net. Enrile had exclaimed, "My God, they are sleeping! This is a three-day presidency e. Three days sa Mamasapano, three days sa 'Yolanda' three days... three days sila umaksyon, ganun din sa Kidapawan (Three days during Mamasapano, three days during Yolanda... It took them three days before they acted on these matters. It also happened in Kidapawan incident)."

The report noted: "Enrile was referring to the botched Mamasapano operation on January 25 last year that left 44 elite policemen and several others dead, the Supertyphoon Yolanda in November 2013 that hit parts of the country and claimed thousands of lives and the recent violent dispersal of Kidapawan farmers

that left three dead and dozens injured."

On the Kidapawan incident, Enrile slammed the President for not acting immediately to prevent the violent dispersal of the farmers. He quipped, "What did they do the first day that there's a gathering like that, that size? Then you ask yourself, what's happening there?"

Enrile added that if he were President, he said he would have "flown immediately to Kidapawan and distributed rice to the farmers." Then, he said, he would have also done a probe to find out "whether that's it was a legitimate rally or just a contrived rally aimed to cause conflict and provoke an encounter."





Canadian fugitive in drug trade arrested

MANILA - Intelligence operatives of the Bureau of Immigration (BI) arrested a Canadian national for drug pushing and other criminal offenses carried out in the United States.

BI Commissioner Ronaldo Geron said Lachlan Scott, 58, was arrested by members of the BI fugitive search unit at his residence in Makati City.

Geron said the agents were armed with a mission order which he issued upon the request of the Canadian and American embassies in Manila.

Scott will be deported to the US to stand trial before a US district court in Minnesota where he was charged with violating the US federal food, drug and cosmetic act; introduction of misbranded drugs into interstate commerce; conspiracy to commit mail and wire fraud and unlawful distribution and dispensing of a controlled substance.

Lawyer Jose Carlitos Licas, who heads the BI's fugitive search unit, said the Canadian will be deported as soon as the bureau has secured the necessary clearances for his deportation.

Licas said the fugitive is now an undocumented alien as a result of the cancellation of his passport by the Canadian

"He will then be included in our blacklist to prevent him from returning to the Philippines after he is deported," Licas said.

The daily noontime TV show Eat, Bulaga! is where one can find the famous trio of Sen. Tito Sotto, Vic Sotto and Joey de Leon (TVJ). But they are also involved in a lot of other preoccupations. And here are what makes up the over 40-year-old TVJ.

Tito or Vicente Sotto III is a musician, front man of the '60s-era combo Tiltdownmen; songwriter of Magkaisa, Balatkayo; music producer of Anthony Castelo, Sharon Cuneta; comedian, TV host in Iskul Bukol, Eat, Bulaga!; sportsman excelling in bowling and golf; and politician. He was formerly vice mayor of Quezon City and is now running for another Senate term.

Vic or Marvic Sotto is Tito's younger brother. He is a singer (Ipagpatawad Mo); musician and songwriter VST& Co. (Ikaw Lang Ang Aking Mahal); TV host (Eat, Bulaga! Who Wants To Be A Millionaire); actor (OK Ka Fairy Ko); Box-office King (Enteng Kabisote); and sportsman who also excels in golf and bowling. Many have tried to also make him a politician but he has every time declined the invitation

Joey took up Architecture in college but instead became a radio disc jockey; writer, he has a weekly column at The Philippine STAR; actor (Starzan); singer (Itaktak Mo); impersonator (Inday Badidoy); TV host (Eat, Bulaga!, The Sharon Cuneta Show); and songwriter (Disco Fever, Ang Boyfriend Kong Baduy).

Tito, Vic and Joey have indeed become so successful in their various undertakings that for a time, it looked like people have forgotten that all that they have become started with the music. It was through music that they got together and it was music that gave them the strength to fly higher with other things.

It was in 1975 when Tito was offered the position of vice president for Artist and Repertoire of Vicor Music Corp. He was well-acquainted with the owners Vic del Rosario and Orly Ilacad from his days with the group Tiltdownmen, which was the local version of the Dave Clark Five. Orly, during that time, also led his own combo The Ramrods.

Vic was then only 16 years old and would often

come to the office to see Tito after school. Joey, who was known as the David Cassidy of radio, was a frequent visitor who enjoyed delighting the secretaries around with his puns. Vic could sing and Del Rosario put him under contract with Vicor. His self-titled solo album was one of Tito's first projects.

The result was so good that an enticing offer came from a major foreign label to put Vic under contract and build him up as a pop idol in Asia. It was not meant to be. Dr. Herminia Sotto, Tito and Vic's mother, put her foot down. Vic was underage and the deal required him to relocate to Indonesia. Still, it was clear that even then Vic already had the makings of a star.

It was also around this time that the comedy trio of Tito, Vic and Joey (who had become close friends with the brothers) was taking shape. They were cast in the

gag show OK Lang where they would from time to time do parodies of current hits. This later became a regular part of the show Discorama, that Joey was hosting and to which he invited Tito and Vic. Joey titled the segment Tough Hits. And when something is that popular, can recording be far behind?

Tito, Vic and Joey were soon recording what would be the first in a series of 10 Tough Hits albums. Intellectual property rights was not yet strictly enforced in those days and no foreign hit song was spared by the wacky trio. Nobody knew it then, but Tough Hits was the birth of three of local showbiz's most successful comedians who would dominate films and TV in the years to come.

Alongside Tough Hits came VST&Co. It was just meant to be a Bee Gees rip-off. Back then, music producers were quick to jump on popular trends. This was what Vicor did when Danny Subido's Flippers had a massive hit with Pangako. They formed a band led by Tito and Vic called Blue Jeans which had a hit with the song Paniwalaan. So they had VST&Co with Vic again singing lead.

That rip-off became a classic dance album that remains unequalled to this day. The studio band made up of the Sotto brothers, Val and Maru also joined in, session musicians and plain friends produced the enduring hits, Awitin Mo At Isasayaw Ko, Disco Fever, Kiss Kiss, Etcetera, Rock Baby Rock, May I Have This Dance, Step No Step Yes and many others, including the ballads Ikaw Lang Ang Aking Mahal and Ipagpatawad Mo.

Now successful men in their 60s who are at the peaks of their careers, Tito, Vic and Joey work solely for pleasure. They have not had a hit song in a while but I will not discount the possibility that they might come up with one or two one of these days. Besides, who needs one when some of their classics have become omnipresent again on TV, commercials, the Net, everywhere. Their Ipagpatawad Mo, Ikaw Lang Ang Aking Mahal and Paniwalaan are the songs in those popular AlDub commercials for McDonald's.



Bongbong tops survey for VP amid attacks by rival bets

SEN. FERDINAND "Bongbong" Marcos Jr. appears to have so far escaped unhurt the sustained bashing he has been getting front and center for refusing to apologize for the martial law excesses of his father's martial law regime, topping the latest Pulse Asia voter preference survey of vice presidential candidates.

The survey showed Marcos got a nationwide rating of 27 percent, with solid support coming from Metro Manila, Luzon outside Metro Manila, Classes ABC and D, results of the latest Pulse Asia survey conducted from April 5 to 10 showed.

In the one and only vice presidential debate sponsored by the Commission on Elections and TV5 on April 10, Marcos was skewered by his rival on issues of his father's human rights record, corruption and the alleged stolen billions of dollars.

President Aquino himself has been leading the Bongbong Marcos bashing, devoting his speech on the 30th anniversary of the Edsa People Power Revolution in February to the excesses of the Ferdinand Marcos dictatorship after the New York Times said that Filipinos, disillusioned by the Aquino administration's ineptness, were yearning for the Philippines' "golden age" under martial law rule.

Duterte, Marcos


Explaining Marcos' surge in the survey, Edmund Tayao, a political science professor at the University of Santo Tomas, noted a similarity between Marcos and Davao City Mayor Rodrigo Duterte, who is seeking the presidency.

Duterte and Marcos leading the polls shows the voters' preference for "strong men and decisive leadership," said Richard Javad Heydarian, political science professor at De La Salle Liniversity

There was little change in the ratings of the vice presidential candidates compared to the last Pulse survey conducted from March 29 to April 3. Marcos was down by a point, Escudero was up by one point while Robredo's rating was unchanged.

"Albeit small, there are still movements in the ratings. This remains a three-way race," Tayao said.


Most recently, Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines (CBCP) slammed Duterte for hsi dirty mouth.


Meanwhile, our favorite Queen of All Media returned to the Philippines last month from her threeweek vacation in Hawaii.


The things Andre admires about Barbie




And guess who was by Mark's side all the while? Rumored girlfriend Wynwin Marquez was it. According to those who were there during the nights of the wake, she was always in


Toni's pregnancy is not a surprise






