Before he died, the late Senator Enverga strongly condemned Liberal Government's plan to decrease Caregivers program by 72% over two years

Two days after fighting for maintaining immigration levels for caregivers, Filipino-Canadian Senator Enverga passed away on. November 16, 2017.

OTTAWA, November 14, 2017 – On November 14, the Honourable Tobias C. Enverga Jr., Ontario Senator, voiced his shock and grave concern upon hearing the specific details of the Liberal government's 2018 multi-year Immigration Levels Plan.

"Recently, the government announced an overly ambitious plan to increase the number of immigrants coming to Canada in 2018 to 2020. While I had reservations about this plan and what it would mean for Caregivers coming to

Canada, I am outraged and disappointed to learn the specifics of what this will truly mean," said Senator Enverga.

"While every other immigration category increases or maintains its status quo in the target number of permanent

How she got her Break

'We've got it all':

Why malls have chapels



MANILA - On a recent busy evening in one of the Philippines' top malls, shoppers wandered through luxury brand shops while prostitutes sat expectantly at a bar and a priest gave a sermon at a chapel.

The scene may appear an unlikely combination but in the Philippines the Catholic Church has successfully set up shop where millions increasingly spend their leisure time.

As a visit by Pope Francis to the Philippines this week shines a spotlight on the nation's vibrant brand of Catholicism, local Church leaders said he would endorse the mixing of faith with consumerism.

"It was Jesus who went to market places to preach the good news of salvation. We must go where our people are," Father Rufino Sescon, a member of the local organising committee for Francis's visit, told AFP.

"Gone are the days we just have to wait for our people to go to our parish churches."

'God is everywhere'

The 30-year-old Santo Nino de Paz chapel in the financial district of Makati's upmarket Greenbelt mall helped to pioneer mall worshipping in the Philippines.

In the 1980s, when the retail complex was much smaller, the chapel was surrounded only by greenery and a serene lagoon.

But gradually the mall encircled the chapel as it developed and expanded.

Today it offers almost anything a shopper might desire -- including the city's best restaurants, luxury fashion outlets, a fish-feeding pond to amuse the children and a bar well known for its prostitutes.

On any early evening, Father Paul Marquez presides over mass, as brightly dressed women and transvestites sit on chairs within view of the altar at the front of the bar and tout for clients.

Following one recent mass, Marquez said he was happy with his chapel's setting.

"Jesus went to the prostitutes, the tax collectors. He was criticised but we cannot remain an antiseptic church," he said.

Susana, a self-described "sex therapist" who works the bar and other establishments in the mall, said she was comforted by the presence of a place of worship nearby.

"I go there to pray occasionally," Susana, who asked that her surname not be used, told AFP as Marquez's evening mass concluded.

"I pray for good health, for my kids to finish school and that I earn enough to pay my bills," she said, wearing a tight skirt, a low-cut tube top and a jewelled cross on a necklace.

Looking out at the bars near the Greenbelt chapel after mass, lawyer Cherry Bayot said she saw nothing wrong with fulfilling her religious obligations in such an atmosphere.


"God is everywhere and prayer is a very personal act. You can do it anywhere," she said.



Composer of Filipino-descent returns for 'Frozen' sequel

MANILA, Philippines — Walt Disney Animation Studios has recently announced the release of its untitled feature-length follow-up to the hit film "Frozen," slated for November 2019 and to reunite filmmakers Jennifer Lee, Chris Buck and Peter Del Vecho with the Grammy and Oscarwinning songwriting duo Kristen Anderson-Lopez and Robert Lopez.

Award-winning composer of Filipino descent Robert Lopez, who co-composed the Oscar and Grammy award-winning hit "Let It Go" with his wife Kristen Anderson-Lopez, has been tapped again by Disney to compose new songs for the "Frozen" sequel.

An American songwriter, Lopez co-created the hit musicals "The Book of Mormon" and "Avenue Q." He is reportedly the youngest of only 12 individuals who have won all four of the biggest awards in the entertainment world - an Oscar, an Emmy, a Grammy and a Tony Award — in just 10 years.

In 2013, his and his wife's composition "Let It Go" won the Academy Award for Best Original Song. In 2015, "Let It Go" also won the Grammy for Best Song Written for Visual Media.

Besides "Frozen," Lopez also wrote songs for "Finding Nemo," "Winnie the Pooh" and "The Simpsons," among others.

Lopez was born in Manhattan to parents Katherine and Frank Lopez, whose father was Filipino and whose mom was Filipino and Scottish-American. Robert's Filipino dad became director of publications for New York University's Langone Medical Center.

Prior to the much-awaited "Frozen" sequel, Walt Disney Animation Studios has posted previews of the new songs from "Olaf's Frozen Adventure," an all-new featurette that will open in Philippine cinemas as a front to Disney/Pixar's "Coco" on November 22.

The songs are "Ring in the Season" by Kristen Bell, "That Time of Year" by Josh Gad and "When We're Together" by Idina Menzel.

Featuring four new original songs, the 21-minute featurette "Olaf's Frozen Adventure" welcomes the original cast and characters of "Frozen" back to the big screen, including Olaf (voice of Josh Gad), who is on a mission to harness the best holiday traditions for Anna (voice of Kristen Bell), Elsa (voice of Idina Menzel) and Kristoff (voice of Ionathan Groff). The featurette is directed by Emmy-winning filmmakers Kevin Deters and Stevie Wermers-Skelton ("Prep & Landing"), produced by Oscar winner Roy Conli ("Big Hero 6"), with original songs by Elyssa Samsel and Kate Anderson ("Between the Lines").

It is a translation from the Latin vulgate. which was translated from ancient Greek, which was in turn translated from Aramaic, the language spoken by lesus.





Rey Valera recalls rivalry with George Canseco

MANILA, Philippines — The local music industry should be thankful for the fact known among insiders that there was a time when ace songwriter Rey Valera was pitted against the late George Canseco in terms of penning bound-to-be classic love songs. That served as catalyst for the creation of music and lyrics most of us are now familiar with.

For one, that rivalry certainly pushed Rey to come up with a style that somewhat deviated from George's which at the same time gave him his nowacknowledged identity both as songwriter and singer.

"Para maiba ako kay George, the style I adapted is 'in your face.' Heto lang ako sa tabi mo. Hindi malalim ang mga words ko," shared Rey during an early evening chat with the press to promote his upcoming concert with Hajji Alejandro.

Though the words to his songs are categorically far from being shallow, what he's trying to point out is his conscious effort to use words that can easily be understood and are part of everyday Filipino language. Whereas the forte of the revered composer

was grounded on Balagtasan-type of Tagalog poetry, Rey anchored his lyrical writing to what regular modern Pinoy would utter to someone he is romantically affectionate to.

Asked to name the hit compositions that he thinks fall among his favorites, Rey mentioned Malayo Pa Ang Umaga, Kahit Maputi Na Ang Buhok Ko and Maging Sino Ka Man. Just by the titles of these three songs alone, one is led to the idea that he indeed embraced such style.

It is a style that spawned numerous hits, enough to make him, in his jovial tone, crack joke about colleagues billed alongside him who do not have a catalogue as loaded as his.

Throwing a punchline for his dear friend Hajji, he mused, "Tatlo lang ang hit ni Hajji, yung isa anak niya pa ang nagpasikat."

Of course, he meant no harm and was just fooling around with someone dear to him and whom he has successfully worked with professionally for a number

Tipping at Toronto takeout is so confusing

To tip, or not to tip? That is the question I ask myself pretty much every time I pick up lunch from a restaurant to-go.

Conventional wisdom used to hold that tipping was unnecessary on takeout orders. I mean, you're welcome to throw some bucks in the jar if you want to, but it isn't expected, and certainly won't affect your level of service.

Lately, though, it feels like every other restaurant has a tip prompt on its card reader. Most of these machines don't even ask if you'd like to tip - only how much you'd like to tip; 15%, 18%, 20%, more?

When the only way out of that screen is to press "other" and type in a zero, the practice of tipping on takeout starts to feel... a little bit less optional.

So is it? A recent thread on this subject in the Food and Wine Navigator Industry Facebook group has many answers, but they're all different.

Some people say don't even bother, arguing that counter tips go directly into the pockets of business owners anyway - and we all know how Toronto feels about restaurant managers taking their employees'

Others say yes, that cashiers have to tip out the kitchen or other staff from their total sales and need the extra money.

Impact Kitchen co-founder Josh Broun said that most people don't tip on orders that are strictly takeout, though it does happen sometimes.

Like many restaurants, Impact has an automatic tip prompt on its debit/credit machines – but it's important to note that those machines are also used

by customers who dine in and have servers bring food to their tables.

It's second nature for people to tip in the latter scenario, and would be weird not to have a tip prompt when paying for sit down service.

The same can be said for Fresh, which has four locations in Toronto and does a considerable amount of both dine-in and takeout business. "We use the same debit/credit machines for both dine-in and takeaway," says brand manager Tory Aston. Because of this, tip prompts are par for the course. She says that people tip on takeout sometimes, but "it really depends on the person - our regulars tend to tip."

On average, people tip around \$1 for take-out at Fresh but, again, these tips are not expected. They are appreciated, however, on bigger orders.

Take-out customers at the Yonge and Dundas area sushi bar Japango are similarly free from the obligation of tipping, according to staff.

The restaurant's debit machines do prompt for tips, but a server I spoke with says that patrons usually don't tip, "unless it's a big order." In those cases, customers tack on about 10 per cent of their order as a gratuity.

The moral of the story? Cashiers aren't trying to pressure you into dishing out extra cash for them to hand you a bag – they simply don't have separate POS systems for dine in, takeout and delivery.

Tip if you think it's warranted, but don't stress over the decision - and if you're really struggling, err on the side of a small tip. The gesture is never not appreciated.

Toronto declared June as Filipino Heritage Month

Filipino Canadians make history as Councillor Shan's Filipino Heritage **Month Motion passes at** Toronto City Council

First time in Canada that Filipino Heritage Month is passed by any level of government

Toronto – Councillor Neethan Shan congratulated Filipino Canadians after Toronto City Council passed his motion for June to be declared Filipino Heritage Month, and for City Council to ask the province and the federal government to do the

"I congratulate all those individuals and organizations within the Filipino community in Toronto and around Canada that have been working for a long time for this day to happen," said Shan, Councillor for Scarborough-Rouge River, Ward 42.

The initiative sprung from a petition started by Paulina Corpuz, president of both the Filipino Canadian Parents Association in Catholic Education and Philippine Advancement through Arts & Culture.

"As people of colour, in city council, we are underrepresented," said Corpuz.

Shan is the first Tamil Canadian to serve on the city council. He is also a youth worker.

Today marks the first time in Canada that Filipino Heritage Month is passed by any level of government.

In Toronto, the population of the Filipino community numbers over 160,000, while Tagalog is one of the top most spoken languages in the city's neighbourhoods. Tagalog is also the fastest growing language in the country that speaks to the growing numbers of Filipinos calling Canada home.

"Proclaiming June as Filipino Heritage Month will give Filipino Canadians, Torontonians, Ontarians and Canadians of all backgrounds an opportunity to learn, celebrate, enjoy and experience the rich heritage and histories of the Filipino Canadian community," said Shan.

"It will also provide our City with an opportunity to reflect on the many outstanding contributions Filipino Canadians have made in Canada, and in the

Under the 2016 census, 510,425 Canadians reported Tagalog as their mother tongue.

Rule of Law boosts Economy

Sereno urges gov't officials to support, not undermine institutions

MANILA- Chief Justice Maria Lourdes Sereno called on government officials to support, not weaken, institutions to promote democracy and economic growth.



"When it comes to building institutions, all government leaders must ensure that they support, not weaken institutions. Institutions build a

nation, strong institutions enable nations to prosper," Sereno said in her keynote address during the 55th Philippine Economic Society Annual Meeting and Conference held at the Novotel Hotel in Quezon City.

The chief magistrate's words come at the heels of an impeachment complaint filed against her and amid President Rodrigo Duterte's call for her to resign along with him

Sereno said support for the country's rule of law is not only beneficial to the country's democracy but also engenders an environment conducive to economic growth.

"We can only ensure protection of the rights of every citizen, including those in the business community, if we have a judiciary that is truly independent and strong," she said.

Despite the ouster attempts against her,

Sereno assured that the judiciary under her helm will continue to ensure that confidence in the justice system will be built up.

"We have worked hard from day one to restore this confidence, and we are relentlessly working on it," she said.

Sereno added that given the proliferation of "fake news" and "alternative facts," there is a need to make the public believe again in public institutions that the judicial reform programs were rooted.

"The Rule of Law carried out by strong justice institutions undergirds economic development. The Rule of Law is not only essential for defending basic political and human rights but is also essential to achieve fair and broad-based economic prosperity," Sereno said.

The chief justice also emphasized the importance of what she called "economy of good words" or "words that build up, rather than tear down."

"Words that elevate the level of discourse in a nation, words that allow people to hope, to look forward to a country that they can be proud of—a country where truth, justice, fairness, and righteousness abound," she said.

"A country where one can hear words of kindness, compassion, empathy for those who have little, but a country also made strong and firm by honesty and integrity."



How powerful is the Philippine passport? Not much, says study

MANILA- For Filipinos dreaming of traveling the world, fulfilling that desire may be a bit difficult with a Philippine passport.

A ranking of passports by international global financial advisory firm Arton Capital shows that the Philippine passport is moderately weak, with its holders having visa-free access to only 61 countries.

The Philippines ranked 66th on the global index and shares the spot with Uganda which has visa-free access to the same number of countries.

This pales in comparison to the Singapore passport which topped the list and has visa-free access to 159 countries and runner-up Germany which has visa-free access to 158 countries

Other Asian countries included in the top 10 were South Korea at the 3rd spot, followed by Japan, and Malaysia at 6th place.

The Afghanistan passport meanwhile was deemed as the weakest passport with visa-free access only to 22 countries

The index ranks the power of passports by assigning a "visa-free score" or the number of countries a passport holder can visit without a visa or with visa on arrival. The index also takes into account the United Nations Human Development Index into account.

Included in the rankings are a total of 199 countries, 193 of which are United Nations member countries and 6 territories namely Taiwan, Macao, Hong Kong, Kosovo, Palestinian Territory and the Vatican.

She also sent reporters documents from the Makati Business Permits Office (BPO) serving the company an apprehension notice for not having a mayor's permit to operate.

According to the Makati BPO apprehension order dated November 9, Angkas was given 3 days to explain why they should continue to operate.

As of posting time, the Angkas mobile application still allows passengers to avail of their service.

With motorcycles rather than cars as the main composition of its fleet, Angkas has been widely used by its passengers to slip through the horrible Metro Manila traffic.

When indie movies win over studio projects

MANILA, Philippines — Whether we like it or not, this is a good year for good indie directors who now manage to overtake mainstream output in the unpredictable box-office.

Director Andrea Sigrid Bernardo made box-office history in Kita Kita by producing an indie film reportedly costing only P11M and earning close to P400M thus upstaging a Sarah Geronimo and John Lloyd Cruz starrer.

Jason Paul Laxamana's 100 Tula Para Kay Stella is another case of a triumphant indie-conceived film.

Because at the outset, you don't really expect an indie film about a campus poet with his juvenile poems to connect with a kilig-oriented Filipino audience. But Jason found a way into the heart of both millennials and non-millennials and literally laughed his way to the bank.

Direk Jason's latest output is Fallback produced by CINEKO Productions and distributed by Star Cinema.

Here, the young director (he is only 30) explores a situation where people explore fallback positions when certain decisions or relationships don't work.

His film was an offshoot of a study of British women with fallback choices when relationships don't work. "Of course, it doesn't apply to Filipino women who were raised in different culture. But what if indeed they have fallback positions hidden in their minds when they are not sure of present partners? This probability will open a can of worms, but I made sure the characters in this movie will not put Filipino mindset in a bad light.

"Having a fallback position is pretty much a very internal thing. We don't discuss it but what if in our minds we do have one such a plan without taking it up with your close friends?"

Jason has lost count of his films starting with Babagwa (The Spider's Lair) and Magkakabaung (The Coffin Maker) and on to The Third Party and beyond. Indeed, he is on his prolific stage as filmmaker as he commutes from one production meeting and on to location shootings and on to hectic post-production schedules.

But his latest films remain focused and are fairly vindicated well in the box-office. "I think it is just a matter of dividing your time well and making sure you have the energy and passion for the projects as they come. I basically like the challenge of new projects. I want to explore new subjects and new possibilities in this career."

Media men notice his penchant for answering criticisms, especially those aired in social media.

"I deal with them better now than

before," he says. "Out of ten criticisms, I answer only two and that is for me a good batting average."

From the way he deals with them, it is obvious he accepts criticism for what they are but only if they make sense. Otherwise, he snaps back and puts the critic on the spot. "Well, life goes on now. I just let my films speak for themselves."

After several projects, he considers himself the "explainer" type of a filmmaker rather than the "motivator" type.

He adds: "I like explaining things rather than motivating actors. It is enough for me that I tell them what I want. It's up to them how they will deliver. I have high respect for actors in that sense. I really trust them all the way."

Rhian Ramos and Tetchie Agbayani are working with Jason for the first time and in the initial location encounters, they didn't know what to expect.

Points out Tetchie: "He is the quiet type but very effective. I like it this way because I hate directors who scream on the set."

Rhian: "On the first shooting days I was restless of course because I have no idea how direk Jason deals with actors. After a take, he is usually quiet, but he doesn't tell you if you did well or not. That's just a clue that he likes good output on the set without having to articulate it all the time. You just have to do your best."

It is obvious this young filmmaker is doing well wearing two hats as writer and director. "It works very well with me. When things don't work, I can easily rewrite on the spot without consulting another person. Of course, it involves more work, but it is very good for your creativity. It is good to have a good vision of how your film will turn out. It is equally challenging when you do the writing yourself."

Duterte warns corrupt officials:

Do not withhold business permits

MANILA—President Rodrigo Duterte warned that he will fire corrupt government officials who withhold business permits for micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs).

"I will suspend any local government official and especially yung appointed by me. 'Pag nakita ko na pinapahirapan niyo or you allow corruption to thrive in your locality, then I will order the new secretary of the DILG (Eduardo) Año, to investigate, give you about 3 days to explain," Duterte said.

Duterte said corrupt local executives and cabinet members hinder the growth of the economy by delaying the issuance of business permits for MSMEs. "When you go into graft and corruption, they hang on to the papers, documents for their approval at inabot ng minsan 6 months, naghihintay lang ng pera,"

he said. "Okay tayo, we're one of the fastest growing economies but I want to hurry it more."

The President last October signed an executive order creating the Presidential Anti-Corruption Commission in a bid to rid government of corrupt public officials.

Under Executive Order No. 43, the commission shall directly assist the President in investigating and/or hearing administrative cases primarily involving graft and corruption cases against all presidential appointees.

PH Red Cross clears Gordon of corruption allegations



MANILA - The Philippine Red Cross (PRC) denied allegations of Sen. Antonio Trillanes IV that its chairman, Sen. Richard Gordon, funneled part of

his discretionary funds to the agency in

In a statement, PRC Secretary General Oscar Palabyab cleared Gordon of alleged misuse of his Priority Development Assistance Fund (PDAF), as Trillanes had alleged in the plunder case he filed against his Senate colleague before the Office of the Ombudsman.

Palabyab explained that Trillanes was referring to projects that the Red Cross undertook as an implementing agency of the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) in the past, which have been properly accounted for.

"Senator Richard J. Gordon had no participation at all in the

implementation of those projects and the disbursement of the funds the PRC received from the DSWD. Proper liquidation reports were submitted to the DSWD as required, and provided answers and explanations in the course of the liquidation process," Palabyab

The PRC also expressed confidence that Gordon can defend himself from the accusations hurled against him.

"We are confident too that Senator Gordon can very well defend himself and clear his good name as a long time Red Cross volunteer and humanitarian worker who happens to be a Senator of the Republic, who fearlessly pursues his advocacies for good governance and the public good," Palabyab said.

Mall lures worshippers

The mall worshipping phenomenon can largely be traced back to the family of Henry Sy, the country's richest man who made his initial fortune in shopping malls and still dominates the sector.

SM malls are in nearly every major city of the country, and he has created a range of "supermalls" in Manila that are the biggest in the country.

At first, masses were held in the lobbies of Sy's SM malls every Sunday, before opening hours, for the benefit of mall employees and tenants. Gradually, these masses were opened up to outsiders.

Sy's wife, Felicidad, a devout Catholic, worked to set up designated chapels in many SM malls, complete with stone altars and ornate statues.

The Sys' daughter, Teresita Sy-Coson, who is vice-chairwoman of the SM Investment Corp., insisted chapels had not been placed in the malls to attract consumers, but rather to help them.

"It is a convenience service for the family who gets together on Sunday. The masses

provide the spiritual aspect of the modern lifestyle," Sy-Coson said in a statement.

Mall power

However, these places of worship fall short of the status given to a church in the traditional sense.

Father Esteban Lu, chaplain of the SM Megamall chapel, said they were "blessed", not consecrated like an actual church. That way, the mall owners could take the space back and turn it into a shop.

Because of this, the mall chapels can only hold masses and hear confessions. They cannot hold weddings, baptisms or other sacraments, according to Lu.

Despite these limitations, Father Reynaldo Reyes, chaplain of the penthouse chapel on the seventh floor of the new SM Aura shopping mall, said his parish enjoyed huge benefits in hosting a mall chapel.

"The (mall) management pays for everything. The altar, the pews, the maintenance, the janitors, the airconditioning. We can use all the money from our collections here for catechism," Reyes told AFP.

Office worker Charito Montecillo, a regular patron of the chapel, also praised SM management, saying it took pains to make their services attractive.

"It is comfortable. I like the pews and the choir. I like the homilies. They make sure to get good priests," she said.

Retired government employee Editha Ramos, who patronises several mall chapels, said she preferred them to the traditional

"They are air-conditioned and so clean and orderly. Not like the old churches, so hot and so dusty," she said.

Gov't partners with Facebook for high speed broadband

MANILA - The Philippine government said Tuesday it partnered with Facebook, the world's largest social network, to build high-speed internet infrastructure.

The Bases Conversion and Development Authority will construct the Luzon Bypass Corridor, composed of 2 cable landing stations connected by a 250-km cable network corridor, according to a joint statement from the BCDA and the Department of Information and Communications Technology.

Facebook, the "first party" to use the government-built facility, was tasked to build and operate a submarine cable system that will land on Luzon's east and west coasts, the statement said.

The cable system will connect Luzon to internet systems in the US and Asia, it said.

"In exchange for utilizing the bypass infrastructure, Facebook will provide the Philippine government with spectrum equivalent to 2 million Mbps, significantly expanding the capacity available for the government's connectivity programs," it

The Luzon Bypass will be online in 2018, said DICT officer-in-charge Eliseo Rio.

Duterte approves national broadband plan, gov't portal

President Rodrigo Duterte has promised to improve internet connection in the country, which is among the slowest in the world. Last March, he approved the creation of a national broadband plan and government portal.

More than 500 Reds surrender, avail of aid

NPA hardships forcing rebels to join mainstream society



The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) said the rebel returnees had availed of the government's Comprehensive Local Integral Program (CLIP), that also includes livelihood projects.

MANILA, Philippines — More than 500 New People's Army (NPA) rebels have surrendered this year, availing of the financial package offered by the government for them to return to the fold

of law.

The Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) said the rebel returnees had availed of the government's Comprehensive Local Integral Program (CLIP), that also includes livelihood projects.

"NPA rebels who surrendered to the authorities have already reached to 531 since termination of the peace negotiation with the communist organization on Feb.

4," said AFP Public Affairs Office chief Col. Edgard Arevalo.

Five of the NPA returnees came from the Ilocos Region while the rest came from Mindanao and the Visayas.

Lt. Col. Eugenio Julio Osias IV, commander of the Army's 81st Infantry Battalion based in Ilocos Sur, said P444,000 in cash were handed out by the provincial government to the five NPA rebels surrenderees.

Government forces also recovered 578 high powered-firearms from the slain and arrested rebels.

"It is apparent that hardships inside the NPA organization are now taking its toll on its members, leading them to cross the line to join mainstream society," AFP chief Gen. Rey Leonardo Guerrero said.

Guerrero said the AFP welcomes the rebel surrenderees, adding that they will all receive financial assistance and livelihood projects through the government's integration program.

Peso extends gains tax reform bill approved

The Philippine peso extended a winning streak after the Senate approved the

administration's tax reform proposal.

The Senate approved its version of the Tax Reform for Acceleration and Inclusion Act (TRAIN) on third and final reading.

"The passage of the tax reform is definitely an upside for the peso," Union Bank of the Philippines chief economist Ruben Carlo Asuncion said.

Despite the downward pressure from US Federal Reserve chair nominee Jerome Powell's comment that points to a likely interest rate hike this month, the peso managed to get firmer against the greenback, he said.

Sen. Enverga 'embodied the Canadian dream':

ex-PM, colleagues remember country's first Filipino-Canadian Senator

Ontario Senator Tobias Enverga's sudden death in Colombia shocked and saddened colleagues who remember him as warm, funny, and dedicated to his community.

"The guy never stopped." Conservative Senator David Tkachuk was still processing the news Friday morning that colleague Tobias Enverga wasn't going to be in the Red Chamber when the Senate reconvened on Nov. 21.

Sen. Tkachuk (Saskatchewan) described the news that fellow Conservative Senator Enverga had died suddenly Thursday morning in Medellin, Colombia, while attending the interparliamentary group ParlAmericas' annual plenary assembly as a member of the Canadian delegation, as "unfortunate, surprising, shocking."

Appointed to the Senate in 2012 by Stephen Harper, Sen. Enverga—also known as Jun—was 61 years old. He is survived by his wife Rosemer, who was in Colombia with him when he died, and three daughters.

"We're going to miss him," said Conservative Senator Pierre-Hugues Boisvenu (La Salle, Que.). "I will always remember his voice, because he had this loud voice. And when he speaks at Question Period or in the caucus, he was very dynamic, he was very engaging in his mission as a Senator."

The nearly six years Sen. Boisvenu spent as Sen. Enverga's seatmate were "long and short at the same time, because we never know what each day will bring to us. Six years, when you've lost a friend like that, it's a very short time because you would like to have them for life."

Described as warm and funny by those who knew him, Conservative Senator Claude Carignan (Mille Isles, Que.) also said Sen. Enverga was "very authentic."

Conservative Senator Victor Oh (Mississauga, Ont.), said in a statement Thursday he was "deeply saddened" by Sen. Enverga's death.

"While being away from our families in

Ottawa, the two of us spent many days together inside and outside of the Chamber," he said. "I will forever cherish the memories we shared and the joy and laughter he brought to my life."

Representing Ontario, Sen. Enverga "embodied the Canadian dream, the first Filipino-Canadian to be appointed to the Senate of Canada, he worked tirelessly for his community & our nation," Mr. Harper said in a tweet.

Those who knew him all pointed to Sen. Enverga's

engagement with his community, proudly wearing the mantle of the first Filipino-Canadian to serve in the Senate.

Prior to being appointed to the Senate, Sen. Enverga also made history as the first Filipino-Canadian to be elected to public office in the city of Toronto when he joined the Toronto Catholic District School Board in 2010. He was also the first visible minority to be elected to the board.

"But it was in his advocacy for the Filipino community that he truly left his mark," Conservative leader Andrew Scheer (Regina-Qu'Appelle, Sask.) said in a statement Thursday. "The founder of the Philippine Canadian Charitable Foundation, Sen. Enverga received several awards from both Canada and the Philippines as a result of his charitable work."

This included the Lingkod sa Kapwa Pilipino presidential award, given to him in 2008 by then-president of the Philippines Gloria Macapagal Arroyo.

Lita Leano, the executive secretary of the charitable foundation he founded, PCCF, said in a statement that Sen. Enverga "was an extraordinary example of a man with a strong sense of involvement and service to others."

In a statement Thursday, Senate Speaker George Furey (Newfoundland and Labrador) said that of Sen. Enverga's numerous contributions, he would "be most remembered as a fierce advocate for persons with disabilities and a tireless champion for multiculturalism."

One of Sen. Enverga's daughters has Down syndrome. In February 2016, Sen. Enverga introduced a public bill to designate October as Latin American Heritage Month.

"Coming to Canada as an immigrant, I am one of many in this Chamber who has been fortunate to be welcomed here to contribute to our society. There are few countries in the world that are as open and accepting as Canada to immigrants seeking to make a new life for themselves," Sen. Enverga said in the Senate on Nov. 7 as he moved third reading of Bill S-218. "The Canadian policy of multiculturalism is a great success when it comes to allowing for and celebrating the various cultural backgrounds and languages we have."

Nobody won the war in Marawi - Duterte

Killing many terrorists does not promote peace

MANILA – Despite the government troops' victory over Islamic State-inspired terrorists in Marawi City, President Rodrigo Duterte on Sunday said nobody really won the war in the predominantly Muslim city.

"Nobody won that war, not the government. We were able to kill many... [but] it does not promote peace in this world," Duterte said in his speech during the Association of Southeast Asian Nations Business and Investment Summit.

The five-month long siege in Marawi ended

last October 23, leaving over 1,000 people dead, mostly terrorists, and hundreds of thousands displaced. It also left the city, considered one of the centers of Islamic faith in Mindanao, in ruins. The President said both sides "got nothing" from the siege, which erupted on May 23 as local terrorist groups Maute and Abu Sayyaf sought to establish an Islamic State stronghold in the region. The threat of terrorism has also drawn Duterte closer to Manila's nontraditional allies, such as China and Russia,

even as the United States continued to provide valuable support for the Philippine military in dealing with terrorism.

Duterte said the government will do its best to bring back Marawi City to its original state, with billions of pesos set to be allotted for rehabilitation efforts.

"We will rebuild Marawi. I said we collected so much taxes," he said.

"I was informed by my revenue officials that there's enough to start, to lay the foundation of the city again."

DOTr: Sumitomo, Mitsubishi back as MRT3 maintenance providers starting 2018

Japan and the Philippines are signing a government-to-government agreement that will pave the way for Sumitomo Corp. and technical partner Mitsubishi Heavy Industries to take over the maintenance works for the Metro Rail Transit Line 3 (MRT3)

The signing will take place before the end of the year, the Department of Transportation (DOTr) said on Wednesday.

"High-level discussions with the Government of Japan are ongoing to pave the way for DOTr's direct engagement of Sumitomo Corporation and its technical partner Mitsubishi Heavy Industries, under a government-to-government (G2G) Official Development Assistance (ODA)

platform," the department said.

The three-year contract will include the rehabilitation and restoration of the mass rail transit system to its original performance standards.

"Sumitomo and Mitsubishi Heavy, as the original MRT3 maintenance contractor, has 'designed, built, and maintained' the train line its first 12 years," the DOTr said.

"DOTr is pushing to have the maintenance and rehabilitation service provider in place by early Q2 2018," Transportation Assistant Secretary for Rails Timothy John Batan told GMA News Online.

"The main reason for this is the time needed to do a technical review of the system to find out the works that need to be done to restore the system after years of under-investment in preventive maintenance and renewal works," he said.

Batan noted rehabilitation priorities have yet to be determined during the technical

review, which would commence right after the G2G agreement is signed.

The DOTr terminated the contract with Busan Universal Rail Inc. (BURI) last November 6 for its supposed "failures" in the last 22 months as the MRT3 maintenance contractor.

"BURI failed to perform its maintenance obligations, both due to its inability to meet the performance indicators in the contract (e.g. number of trains running) and its failure to procure spare parts," the department said.

The company supposedly did not overhaul the train cars in line with a schedule BURI itself proposed, the DOTr noted, saying only two out of the 43 train coaches were actually overhauled.


"These failures led to the many passenger unloading and train removal incidents during the 22 months that BURI was maintaining MRT-3," it claimed.

Duterte eyes acquisition of 23 attack helicopters

MANILA – President Rodrigo Duterte said his government is eyeing the acquisition of 23 new attack helicopters to boost the capability of the military.

Duterte said acquiring new air assets would help the Philippines deal with terrorism and rebellion.

"Meron tayong acquisition na 23 attack helicopters. 'Yun supisyente (sufficient) na 'yon for a --- 'yung mga rebellion-rebellion lang," Duterte said in a speech in front of wounded soldiers at the Army General Hospital in Taguig City.

The President said he would ask military officials to scout for the new helicopters and other military equipment. He also reiterated his vow not to purchase secondhand hardware.

"I am ordering new ones para pangpalit doon sa inyo. Alam ko nagrereklamo kayo sa barrel pati vault. Baka in the next few months... I am in a hurry, nagmamadali ako. May papuntahin akong mga opisyal ng militar doon sa ibang lugar para magnegotiate kaagad," he said.

"Kung mahirapan tayong maghingi, nakakahiya naman palagi sige hingi, magutang tayo, payable in 25 years ng soft loan ng armas." The President has been repeatedly expressing his desire to leave a "strong military" after his 6-year presidency, especially in the wake of the Marawi siege, which tested Filipino troops in urban warfare.

"I will build a strong military, dahandahan. Talagang strong na strong. At after five years, four years from now, 'yun na lang naiwan sa termino ko, baka modern na tayo," he said.

"Pero mag-aral kayo ng bagong doctrine, how to fight in the urban areas. 'Yan ang bago ngayon."

Duterte visited the Army General Hospital to confer on 26 soldiers the Order of Lapu-Lapu. Twenty of the soldiers were wounded during the Marawi siege while the rest were wounded in clashes with rebels from the New People's Army and Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters.

Established by Duterte in April, the Order of Lapu-Lapu is an award given to officials and personnel of government as well as private individuals "in recognition of their invaluable or extraordinary service in relation to a campaign or advocacy of the President."

Christmas pkgs stolen from family's front step

A character lurking around houses and stealing presents is a familiar plot line from Dr. Seuss' How the Grinch Stole Christmas.

It's also reality for one family who lives in the northwest corner of Regina.

Candace Schwindt calls herself a Cindy Lou Who sympathizer. Her packages were filched from her front step on Monday less than two hours after they were dropped off by a United Parcel Service (UPS) courier.

"I felt very violated because someone was trespassing on our property and taking something, even though it wasn't officially mine yet," Schwindt said.

The gifts were for her niece, nephew and two sons. She asked him where they were and they realized neither of them knew, so they reviewed the footage. The Schwindt family has a doorbell camera that caught it all on tape. "It was a man that we did not know who first took the top two parcels and put them in his car and then went back and grabbed the third parcel."

Schwindt was initially in contact with UPS before she contacted the companies. All three are going to send her new packages because they were covered by insurance, she said

Furthermore, Schwindt has a renewed appreciation for her doorbell. "We're pretty glad that we have the technology in our house to be able to definitely say this is what happened," she said.

"I don't know that the shippers would have been as open to sending us parcels a second time if we had not had video evidence."

"UPS drivers are trained to leave packages

out of sight," said Nirali Raval, spokesperson for UPS Canada, in an emailed statement.

Super Tekla

"If an area is deemed high risk for theft, drivers will be notified to not release packages unless signatures are obtained."

The spokesperson also said that if a customer would like a signature at the time of the delivery they are responsible for telling the "supplier that you want your package shipped using a UPS Signature Required service." "Signature Required service must be selected by the shipper when they prepare your shipment."

Schwindt has filed a report with the Regina police. A spokesperson for the Regina Police Service says they are unaware of any other similar thefts this holiday season.

In Toronto, the thefts are more common.

'It's not uncommon'

Toronto police said package thefts are reported all across the city, with a slight increase this time of year.

It's a topic buzzed-about on local Facebook groups, too.

During the holiday season, packages and Christmas cards with money and gift cards inside them are "very accessible to thieves on porches and unlocked mailboxes," wrote Toronto police's Division 55 crime

prevention officer Const. Jonathan Morrice in a public Facebook post on Dec. 5.

Const. Morrice offered the following tips:

- Ask your courier company not to leave your package on your porch. They can take it back to their main office.
- Tell a neighbour you are having a package delivered, to watch out for it and hold it until you get home.
- Be alert if you see a courier truck on your street. Thieves follow them and steal packages within minutes of them being delivered.
- Get a strong, secure lock for your mailbox. Limit the amount of cash/gift cards you send in the mail. There are many e-transfers/online options available.
- If you send money/gift cards, follow up with the recipient, because they may not even know it was stolen.

Various delivery companies, from Canada Post to UPS, have options where you can have items delivered to one of their offices instead of your home. It's a bit less convenient, but it's safer than having something dropped off on a front porch.

Canada Post, for example, offers FlexDelivery, a free service where you can have packages delivered to your local post office instead of your home.

Solenn Heussaff speaks the truth about love teams + other stories

Kapuso actress Solenn Heussaff has something to say about love teams in a recent post on her blog.

Saying that while she herself has never been part of a love team Solenn shed some light on the reality of what is it like to be in one, after speaking to some celebrity friends.

"They're super grateful for all the work that a successful love team can bring in. But what the

She ended her post by urging fans to support love teams on screen without losing respect for them as separate individuals off-screen.



Objects versus experiences: which make the better gift?

Many people assume that a physical possession will create more happiness than something like a trip, concert, or outdoor adventure

To celebrate her 50th birthday this past summer, Laura Clancy and her husband, Matt, splurged on a trip to Italy. Mr. Clancy managed to get the two a spot at Osteria Francescana, a 12-table, triple-Michelin-starrated restaurant in Modena.

No material object could have topped it. This Christmas, many people assume that a physical possession will create more happiness than something like a trip, concert or outdoor adventure, since objects last longer. However, presents that come in boxes with bows may pale in comparison to "experiential" gifts – and science supports that.

Thomas Gilovich is a professor of psychology at Cornell University who has studied extensively how people feel about spending money on objects versus experiential purchases. His research concludes that happiness comes from experiences, not things.

Experiences are more resistant to adaptation than objects, he says, referring to a term used in psychology to indicate the decreased effect of a stimulus after extended exposure.

And adaptation is the enemy of happiness. We get used to our things, but we remember experiences long after they've happened.

Since they're so often shared, experiential purchases bring people together, literally and figuratively.

People's desire for memorable experiences has given rise to a whole new industry, companies that offer experience and adventures.

When John Ferrie's father, Jock, turned 89, he took Jock shopping for a slick pair of runners then out for tacos (his dad's request). Over dinner, Jock revealed what he really

wanted for his birthday: the chance for them to go ziplining together.

Mr. Ferrie booked a package with Ziptrek Ecotours in Whistler that consisted of 10 zips, one of them more than two kilometres long with riders reaching speeds of about 100 kilometres an hour.

"It was such a touching day," Mr. Ferrie adds. "We had this really great bonding day, just the two of us. It was really something special. He still talks about it as the best day of his life."



De Lima wants restos, fast-food chains to provide calorie count in menus

PHILIPPINES - A bill that requires restaurants and fast-food chains to display calorie-content and nutritional information in their menu to help curb obesity and improper diet among Filipinos was filed at the Senate, earlier this week

"Nutrient content information provided at the time of food selection in food service establishments would enable consumers to make more informed and healthier food choices, promote health awareness and proper dieting, and assist consumers who are monitoring their diets or dealing with chronic diseases, such as cardiovascular disease and diabetes," Senator Leila de Lima said in a statement released, Friday.

Under Senate Bill 1621 or the "Nutritional Information Disclosure Act of 2017," food providers will be mandated "to display calorie content information on the menus of away-from-home foods."

Besides restaurants, food served in "salad bars, buffet lines, cafeteria lines or similar selfservice facilities" should also display calorie-content



information "clearly and conspicuously" on menu boards.

"The health conscious have to guess at the nutritional content of meals taken in restaurants. On the other hand, those who are less aware of the need for proper dieting are left unaware of the nutritional values that they intake," De Lima said.

Under the proposed measure, operations of non-compliant food establishments will be suspended, while business owners will be fined P300,000 for the first violation, and P600,000 for the second violation.

Duterte threaten to arrest Left's 'legal fronts'

MANILA - President Rodrigo Duterte slammed the Left, threatening to arrest members of its "legal fronts" as its peace talks with the government collapsed.

"We will treat you as a criminal, period. We will arrest everybody connected and ang maa leaal fronts nila."

Duterte has been lashing out at leftleaning groups, saying in a speech on Tuesday that they "are in cahoots, in conspiracy with the armed NPAs (New People's Army)."

The President issued the threat following the collapse of peace negotiations between the government and the National Democratic of the Philippines (NDFP).

Prior to the termination of talks, Duterte announced he would soon have the NPA declared as a terrorist group. The communist party's armed wing has long been under the United States' list of terrorist organizations.

Duterte, a former student of Communist Party of the Philippines founding chairman Jose Maria Sison, had sought to end the nearly 50-year communist insurgency early in his term. Government officials and NDFP negotiators had 4 rounds of talks in Europe, where Sison is based, before Duterte suspended the negotiations in May.

The talks were stalled following armed clashes between government troops and communist guerrillas.

Roque defends shoot-tokill order vs armed rebels

MANILA - Presidential Spokesman Harry Roquedefended President Duterte's shootto-kill order against armed communist rebels following the collapse of peace negotiations between the government and the National Democratic Front of the Philippines (NDFP).

Duterte orders cops, soldiers to shoot armed NPA rebels

Roque said the President's order was very clear that government forces will only shoot armed members of the communist underground.

"Ano naman ang bago diyan? E di ba krimen ang rebellion? Atsaka meron tayong batas na umiiral pag meron labanan, yan po ang international humanitarian law...Kapag meron digmaan, lahat ng kasapi sa digmaan ay pupwedeng barilin. Alangan naman sambahin natin ang armadong NPA at sabihin 'Mahal ka namin' samantalang siya'y in the process na nag-aalsa at gumagamit ng dahas para mapatalsik ang ating gobyerno," Roque told radio DZMM.

"Hindi po lahat ng tao ay babarilin. Siyempre yung mga kasapi lamang sa nagaganap na rebelyon sa ating bayan,' he added.

He said there has been no letup in the communist rebels' attacks on soldiers and civilians, which prompted the cancellation of peace negotiations.

Solon asks SC to nullify 5-year driver's license

MANILA - A lawmaker filed with the Supreme Court (SC) a second petition that seeks to stop the implementation of the P836-million Land Transportation Office (LTO) 5-year driver's license cards project.

Lawmaker Aniceto Bertiz of ACTS
OFW Party-list alleged that the project is
unconstitutional because it was publicly
bidded out despite the absence of legally
appropriated funds under the national
budget. Bertiz cited that under the
Constitution, "[n]o money shall be paid

out of the Treasury except in pursuance of an appropriation made by law."

"There is no existing or continuing appropriations for purposes of the expenditure for the Procurement of Drivers' License Cards With Five Year Validity CY (Calendar Year) 2017 since Congress has not enacted a law authorizing the expenditure in the form of an existing or continuing appropriation," the petition read.

The project was awarded on March 31,

2017 to the joint venture of Dermalog with Nextix and CFP with a bid amount of P829.668 million.

The lawmaker also alleged that the public bidding was "rigged and manipulated." On May 26, 2017, a similar petition was filed before the High Court by the Anti-Trapo Movement of the Philippines, Inc., which alleged the contract was awarded to the joint venture "in clear violation of existing procurement laws."

New terror leaders emerging after Marawi war

Rewards being given for capture of leaders



Marawi City is left with destroyed and damaged buildings and houses after 100 days of intense fighting between government troops and ISIS-Maute gunmen.

MARAWI CITY - New terror leaders have begun to emerge one month after fighting between government forces and Islamic State-inspired extremists here ended, a military official said.

These include Malaysian Amin Baco alias Abu Akmad, whom authorities said could succeed Abu Sayyaf leader Isnilon Hapilon and Maute group leader Omar Maute, who were both killed in the 5-month long conflict.

However, Baco's condition is unclear. Troops are matching DNA samples from bodies retrieved from Marawi with those taken from the suspect's relatives, said Col. Romeo Brawner, deputy commander of Joint Task Force Ranao.

Aside from Baco, 4 other Filipinos are emerging as terror leaders, the military said.

"Sila yung mga leaders sa sususnod na grupo ng terorista that is why kailangan ng information galing sa mamamayan," Brawner said.

(They are the emerging terrorist leaders, that is why we ended information from the people.)

Owayda Benito Marohomsar, alias Abu Dar, has a reward of P3 million and was last seen a week ago in the suburbs of Balindong and Piagapo in Lanao del Sur.

Intelligence sources said Abu Dar left the main battle area during the early parts of the siege to guard the huge sums of gold and money that they looted.

"Sa aming reports sya ang isa sa mga recruiters ngayon sa paligid ng Lanao del Sur," said Brawner.

(Based on our reports, he is the one recruiting in Lanao del Sur.)

Also on the most wanted list is Ali

of the financiers of the Maute group and is continuing to support Abu Dar and other terror groups.

Another suspect, Zacaria Romato, alias

Amintao, alias White Lawaan, who also has

P3-million reward. He is believed to be one

Another suspect, Zacaria Romato, alias Zacariah, is the uncle of the Maute brothers who has his own men that joined forces with the extremist group during the Marawi siege. He carries a P2-million bounty.

A P1-million reward was put up against Najib Calimba Pundog, a foreign-trained terrorist and one of the closest allies of Omar Maute.

Sources said he was the one responsible for taking over the V150 Special Forces tank that was burned during the height of the war. He was also said to be active in recruiting youth and child warriors.

Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao Assemblyman Zia Alonto Adiong proposed arming the Baranggay Peacekeeping Action Team of each municipality to help law enforcers.

The military's Task Force Ranao advised the public to report information on the terror suspects to the following hotlines: 0945-318-5006 and 0929-495-4906.

Presidential Spokesman Harry Roque, in his breifing in Marawi, said charges have already been filed against 37 Maute members who have been arrested.

He said a special panel of investigators was created by the Department of Justice to investigate the Maute group's offenses.

"Some cases being investigated include killing, kidnapping for ransom, cruel and inhumane treatment, including cases of beheadings and recruitment of children as combatants," Roque said.

DOH chief says 'it is now all systems go' for distribution of contraceptives

MANILA, Philippines — The Roman Catholic-majority Philippines will reallow the use of contraceptive implants after certifying 51 drugs and devices safe and not the cause of abortions, the health department announced on Thursday.

Congress passed a law allowing contraceptive devices in 2012 but the Supreme Court imposed a restraining order in 2015 after bishops said some drugs and devices caused abortions.


Abortion, divorce and same-sex union are not allowed in the Philippines and some lawmakers oppose artificial methods of family planning. Pills and condoms are sold freely.


"With the Food and Drug Administration's issuance of an advisory declaring all of the 51 contraceptive products ... cannot cause abortion, it is



residents being admitted, the Caregivers category is the sole group to actually decrease over the duration of this plan,' the Senator continued

"More troubling than this fact is the statistics that accompany it. In 2018, the government's target number for Caregivers is 17,000. This number decreases to 14,000 in 2019. By 2020, this number will plummet to a mere 5,000. To put this into context, under this plan, the number of Caregivers coming to Canada will decrease by more than 72% in just two years. I will continue to fight for Caregivers and highlight their importance here in Canada," the Senator concluded.

The 2018 multi-year Immigration Levels Plan was announced by the Liberal government on November 1, 2017. The Economic category will see a total increase



of 7,300 permanent residents over two years, as every other Economic category will see their numbers boosted during this period. This increase for the Economic class exists after accounting for the decrease of 12,000 Caregivers over this same two year period.

Except for Caregivers, every other category within the Economic; Family; Refugees and Protected Persons; and Humanitarian and Other categories will see their numbers increase or, in one case, maintain its base level.




