



Del Rosario was further quoted as saying that Barretto is excited to start working with Richards, who has already co-starred with several other Kapamilya in some movies.





Atayde want passage of adolescent pregnancy prevention bill

MANILA - First district QC Congressman Juan Carlos "Arjo" Atayde — the author of House Bill 7276 known as the Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention Act — is encouraging all his colleagues to get their act together to create immediate policies and finally put a solution to this grave problem.

"We are hoping that this bill on adolescent pregnancy is passed so we can create immediate policies on how we put a solution to this grave problem," Atayde, a member of the House Committee on Youth and Sports Development, said.

The House Committee on Youth and Sports Development, he said, has recently approved a substitute bill that forms a national policy to address adolescent pregnancy as well as social protection for adolescent parents.

Atayde's call for the bill's passage is timely as the Philippines still has one of the highest adolescent birth rates among



ASEAN countries.

Although adolescent pregnancy among those 15-19 years old has gone down to 7.2 percent in 2021 from 14.4 percent in 2013, the number of births by mothers aged 10-14 years have also shown a slight increase (1,903 in 2016 and 2,113 in 2020 according to the Philippine Statistics Authority), according to the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA).

Atayde said the bill provides for the establishment of the Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention Inter-Agency Council that would formulate and implement policies for family-oriented, adolescent-friendly sexual and reproductive health programs.

The Council would also be mandated to develop an evidence-based National Medium-Term Plan for the Prevention of Adolescent Pregnancy.

The plan would serve as the national framework for inter-agency and inter-sectoral collaboration and resource allocation at all levels, to address the various health, cultural socio-economic and institutional determinants of adolescent pregnancy.

The bill is being pushed by The Philippine Legislators' Committee on Population and Development Foundation, Inc, of which Atayde serves as treasurer.

It is built with members of congress and other advocates that aims to formulate public policies requiring legislation on population management and socio-economic development.

Experts, the 32-year-old veteran actor said, will continue to underscore the negative effect of teen pregnancy, particularly its social and economic outcomes for

both adolescent mother and child.

According to a UNFPA study, adolescent mothers are more likely not to finish high school or college and are likely to be unemployed.

The UNFPA also said that the Philippines is estimated to lose P33 billion a year due to adolescent pregnancy, and that foregone income of teenage girls who get pregnant is P83,000 a year.

Despite the decrease from 8.6 percent in year 2017 to 5.4 percent last year (2022) based on the data from the Philippine Statistics Authority, Atayde said that teenage pregnancies remain a serious issue that "sinks the vulnerable deeper into poverty."

He also stressed that teenage pregnancy is not just a problem of an individual person, but it could last for generations.

"We need to open our minds and have immediate action on how we resolve this problem," he said.

Claudine Barretto confessed she has no plans of getting married again, saying she wants to focus on being a mom to her children and that she had already given her wedding vows to her estranged husband, actor Raymart Santiago.

Others, meanwhile, were just happy to see then together again six years since they worked on "Finally Found Someone," their last movie together.



Canada firm that promised bribes to PH officials for police contracts will pay \$10.5M to avoid charges

A Montreal, Quebec forensics firm promised millions of dollars in bribes to Philippine officials, including a cabinet minister and his brother, to try to gain lucrative Philippine National Police contracts, says a statement of facts in a deal the firm struck to avoid prosecution in Canada

The deal between Ultra Electronics Forensic Technology Inc. and federal prosecutors was approved by the Superior Court of Quebec, in a remediation agreement also known as deferred prosecution.

It requires the firm to pay some \$10.5 million, co-operate with investigations, report to prosecutors on the agreement's implementation and abide by an anti-bribery and corruption program over-

seen by an external auditor hired at the firm's expense, reported Global News

Attached to the court's ruling is a statement of facts saying two senior officers at the company were involved in a scheme from 2006 to 2018 to bribe Philippine officials to secure \$17 million in contracts with the Philippines National Police.

The bribes were "earmarked and promised to" public officials and others with "sufficient gravitas to exert some influence" on those involved in the procurement process.

The statement of facts says the Philippine public officials included Ronaldo Puno, who was secretary of the Department of Interior and Local Government from 2006 to 2010.

Although the statement of facts does not include evidence linked to the bribery scheme, it says Puno "was a key figure in securing the budget and ensuring the procurement of" the company's flagship ballistics identification product.

Allegedly, beginning in September 2006 through January 2018, two senior company officers enlisted the help of "commercial agent" Rizalino Espino in Manila to help lock down the police contracts.

Espino's company, Concept Dynamics Enterprises, was to receive commissions on a percentage of any contracts, of which "a substantial portion" was intended as bribes. The statement says Espino enlisted a pair of local businessmen to help with the bribery scheme because of their "close relationship" to Puno and his brother Rodolpho Puno, who was chairman of the Philippines Road Board at the time.

In September 2022, the RCMP announced fraud and bribery charges under the Corruption of Foreign Public Officials Act against the company and four of its executives, Robert Walsh, Philip Timothy Heaney, René Bélanger and Michael McLean.

The cases against the individual executives continue, while the charges against the company are stayed and will be withdrawn if it complies with the remediation agreement.

Christian Bables shared how he usually responds to his bashers.

But he is no stranger to playing LGBTQ roles. In fact, he first played a gay role onscreen in the 2017 MMFF film Die Beautiful.

His most recent film projects include Ten Little Mistresses, Mahal Kita Beksman, and The Panti Sisters.

Last year, the 30-year-old actor admitted in various interviews that he is heterosexual, quashing rumors about his sexuality. Despite this, Christian shared why he will never be afraid to accept gay roles.

"None at all. Never will I have any hesitations portraying these kinds of characters for as long as yung in-o-offer sa akin are living, breathing, full of life characters, tatanggapin at tatanggapin ko yun. Yung kagaya ng mga netizen na nag-bash noon, for me ang attack ko dun, you don't attack them with hate, you educate the person na nagsabi," he told PUSH.

Thankfully, Christian said that gay rumors did not affect his dating life. "Hindi naman. Sa awa ni God, hindi (laughs). 
Sheena Yap Chan launches book 'The Tao of Self-Confidence'

DO NOT TEAR DOWN THE GARDINER. Why not? Traffic will transfer to inner streets

First, they demolished the elevated section between the Don River and Leslie Street known as "Gardiner East" in 2001. It was intended for connection to the cancelled Scarborough Expressway. Now, they plan to remove the rest of the elevated portion to bring it to ground level and widen Lakeshore from 6 lanes to 8. Researchers found that removing the eastern portion would add three minutes to the average commute if the Lake Shore speed limit was 70 km/h. If the speed limit was 60 km/h, drivers would spend an extra six minutes on their commute.

Do you really believe with more cars added on lakeshore, you can drive at 60 or 70 km per hour?

Now, they plan to remove the elevated portion where the Gardiner meets the DVP and repalce it with a signalised intersection. Imagine being there and it's stop and go traffic. It's a presciription for fender benders as the traffic moves and then stops as drivers try to accelerate. Imagine drivers coming from all directions try to avoid that intersection and traffic transfers to Kingston Rd, O'Connor, Danforth, Gerrard, Eastern Avenue from drivers coming from the east; Bayview Avenue, Yonge St., Mt. Pleasant, Bathurst, and Avenue Rd from drivers coming from the north.

What would happen is a traffic like the one at Allen Expressway north exiting to Eglinton. Now, iamgine if Eglinton was also a highway. Put that scenario as a signalized intersection between DVP and Gardiner. How far do you think the backed up traffic will be?

You don't need a traffic expert to know these details. You just need to drive around Toronto to know that if you know that traffic is at a standstill in one area, you will find and alterantive route.

DSWD officer-in-charge Undersecretary Eduardo Punay said the requirements would push 1 million beneficiaries to join programs from the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) and Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA).

Punay said these requirements would help end the culture of dependency on government financial assistance.

"This design for the food stamp program is multi-purpose," he said in Filipino. "The DSWD is evolving. We're not all just about financial assistance. We're becoming developmental. We are making sure that our beneficiaries do not become used to merely receiving financial aid or ayuda, and all they do is take and take."

He cited the case of the 4Ps conditional cash transfer where beneficiaries have become too dependent on government assistance. "Some of our beneficiaries there do not want to leave 4Ps even though they are due for graduation. This is what we want to avoid in the new program," Punay said.

Punay said the idea is to subsidize one meal for the beneficiaries to allow them to use the money for job training and transportation as they look for jobs.

Earlier, the DSWD said the food stamp program, dubbed "Walang Gutom Program 2027: Food Stamp Program," will aid 1 million households that have been categorized as "food poor" or those who earn less than P8,000 a month and those who cannot afford to eat more than one meal a day.



Beneficiaries will receive P3,000 a month or a total of P36,000 a year worth of government assistance that will be distributed through electronic benefit transfer (EBT) cards provided by the DSWD.

Meanwhile, Albay Rep. Joey Salceda urged the DSWD to integrate its food stamps program with efforts by the Department of Agriculture to buy and market domestic farm produce, saying that "the poorest communities remain the rural poor of this country."

"Food stamps, as envisioned and implemented in other countries, are agricultural programs. They aim to bridge rural surpluses with food-poor urban communities. That way, we address both urban poverty and rural poverty," he said.

"Around 30 percent of farmers are poor. So, if you want to make this program sustainable, you link it with boosting farmer incomes," he added, noting that the administration's economic managers have balked at the program's price tag.

"As it was originally implemented in the United States, where the food stamp program is most prevalent and arguably most successful, you can have a specific amount for general food items, and you can have a special stamp or voucher for surplus produce," he said.

"What the farmers can get for surplus produce are food stamps for the general program. So, you help solve their food insecurity issues. You take out the surplus, helping manage prices. And you provide free surplus food to those who need it. It's a great synergy," he said.

"So, I think the DSWD should really team up with the DA on this program," Salceda said.

He also said the government should consider using revenues from the sweetened beverage tax to fund the food stamp program.

Over 2,000 Filipino women died in childbirth in 2021 — UNFPA PH

MANILA, Philippines—In 2021, a total of 2,478 women died due to childbirth in the Philippines— more than double the 2019 figure of 1,458 women, according to The United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) Philippines.



"That is around 6 to 7 Filipino women dying daily due to child-birth," said Dr. Leila Saiji Joudane, country representative of the UNFPA Philippines in a Mothers' Day statement.

"Women die because sexual and reproductive health services are unavailable, inaccessible, unafford-

able, or of poor quality. Human resources are also scarce. There are not enough trained healthcare workers that provide quality sexual and reproductive health information and services," she went on.

The UNFPA also highlighted the gravity of high reproductive health costs amongst poor Filipinos.


As the United Nations' reproductive healthcare arm, the UNFPA also expressed its support for the Philippines' commitment to universal health coverage and reducing preventable maternal deaths as part of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

"This Mother's Day, let us uphold the right of all people — especially mothers — to reach the highest possible standard of health. Timely health care for pregnant women can make the difference between life and death. No woman should die giving life," Joudane concluded.

Philippines, Israel seek to expand security, economic ties

MANILA, Philippines — President Marcos met with visiting Israeli Foreign Minister Eliyahu Cohen as part of efforts to boost security and economic ties between the two countries.

Cohen's visit aims expanded cooperation between the Philippines



and Israel, particularly in the areas of security and the economy.

It was the first time in 56 years that an Israeli foreign minister visited the Philippines since former foreign minister Abba Eban in March 1967.

Malacañang has yet to provide details on the meeting.

Israel and the Philippines are celebrating the 65th anniversary of bilateral relations this year.

Recently, the Philippine Navy acquired Israeli Shaldag-class patrol boats to boost the military's capability to strengthen the country's defense of its shorelines. Marcos said the patrol vessels would be deployed to the West Philippine Sea to help protect the country's waters and would also be utilized for disaster and humanitarian operations. The Philippines and Israel signed an agreement that will provide opportunities for both countries to share best practices in addressing common challenges related to the environment and preservation of ecosystems. The agreement on Cooperation in the Field of Environmental Protection, with the two countries to share best practices to address the challenges of disaster risk management and promotion and dissemination of environmental technologies, was signed by Foreign Affairs Secretary Enrique Manalo and Foreign Minister Cohen after their bilateral meeting. He said the relationship between the Philippines and Israel predated the founding of the Israeli state. "These ties have deep roots, going back to the time when president Manuel L. Quezon, through his 'Open Door Policy,' provided safe haven for an estimated 1,300 Jewish refugees who were fleeing the Nazi regime," Manalo said.

The secretary highlighted the need to expand cooperation in areas such as defense and security, tourism, trade and investment, agriculture, science and technology and people-to-people ties.

The Philippine side emphasized the importance of promoting peace and stability, as well as confidence-building with key partners in these regions.



When Angelica Panganiban intends to return to acting

Angelica Panganiban admitted she is not yet ready to be in full swing once again when it comes to her showbiz career.

In her most recent vlog, Panganiban expressed that she might feel more at ease with the idea around September, when her daughter Amila Sabine or Bean celebrates her first birthday.



Kelvin Miranda wishes and aspires to portray and pursue varied roles and stories, as he expressed in a previous interview with this paper. His web designer-gamer-cosplay geek character named Norman is another answer to that. Now streaming on Netflix, the film Missed Connections sees Kelvin's Norman as someone who falls in love with a "grocery girl" and is loved by another "grocery girl," also known as "gingerhead." It's in stark contrast to his Ralph, a friend and admirer of the human clone Hope, in the Afternoon Prime series, Unica Hija, which concluded last March.

"Yung pagkatao niya is very awkward (He has a very awkward personality) and he is an NBSB (no girlfriend since birth)," described Kelvin of Norman."

With the show touching on the "Love-in-the-time-of-socialmedia-apps" idea, Kelvin said he acknowledged the uses of social media platforms and face-to-face as formal and valid ways for people to meet up and get to know each other.

pino Canadians have decided to run for the much-needed leadership post in Canada's premier city. These two courageous kababayans are Jose Baking and William Reodica. Both Pinoy candidates are from Scarborough, Toronto, Ontario.

Jose Baking filed his interest on April 14, 2023, while William Reodica registered on May 4, 2023, for the Toronto By-election on June 26, 2023, to replace the resigned Toronto Mayor, John Tory. In the alphabetical listing, J. Baking is 9th in the list of 76 nominees while W. Reodica is listed as candidate # 59 in the roll.

Affectionately called "Joey" by his family and friends, Jose Baking is the publisher and editor of Little Manila Confidential, a Filipino-centred monthly newspaper based in Toronto. He is a noted veteran photographer covering community events and social functions for many years. From

Quezon City, Philippines, Joey studied Communication Arts at the University of Santo Tomas and was a former office clerk at Ogilvy, a creative agency network in Toronto before operating his locally circulated broadsheet. He is a Member of the Board of Directors of the Philippine Press Club-Ontario(PPCO).

William "Willie" Reodica is active in the Filipino Canadian social, political, and business communities in the Greater Toronto Area. An officer of the Knights of Rizal-Canada Region, Willie is the father of the late Jeffry Reodica who was fatally shot by a Toronto police officer in 2006. A successful Ontario real estate salesperson, mortgage agent & realtor he is a Co-Founder and senior officer of the Filipino Canadian Real Estate Association (FILCREA). A graduate of Business Marketing from the Polytechnic University of the Philippines (PUP), Reodica is the Founder and current President of the PUP Alumni Foundation of Canada. For 15 years he served as a volunteer Eucharist Minister at St. Rose Lima Parish and Scarborough Grace Hospital. Recipient

of numerness he received recent recognition from Filipino Centre To-

one of the "10 Outstanding Fil-Can Seniors" in Ontario.

Politically, according to The Local, a Toronto-based general interest online magazine covering urban health and social issues, J. Baking "placed 9th out of ten candidates in the 2006 municipal election for the then-Ward 4 in Scarborough". On one hand, W. Slater Young apologizes for sexist remark

Former "Pinoy Big Brother" housemate Slater Young was in hot water recently after he shared his two cents on men "fantasizing" about women.

He was quick to issue an apology after his remarks went viral.

He felt ashamed saying such things and understands the backlash that resulted.

"I finally realized: 'Oh my god, yeah, I really made a mistake because I'm giving it power to say it's okay. And me saying it's normal kind of normalizes it and makes it okay - which the last thing in my mind and my heart would be - to objectify women," Slater reiterated.

It all started with a letter sender asking Slater and his wife Kryz Uy advice via their podcast, asking if it's okay for her boyfriend to be part of an online group chat where photos of women are being sent and discussed.

> Slater said: "It's normal. It's just a fact of life that there are

many other women more attractive than you or just as attractive as you. Yung mga groups na nagse-send ng mga photos of girls and like, fantasizing over it, it's normal."

"We have a lot of chat groups with friends, not necessarily dedicated to that. From time to time, usually comes from dalawa or tatlong tao na mahilig mag-send nang ganyan. May mga comment-comment pa. Siyempre ikaw, as part of that group and as a guy, sakyan mo lang. Wala naman. Hindi mo naman gusto talaga."

Kryz reacted to the issue, saying, "It really happens. It's reality. But that doesn't make it okay."



Where do we go from here: Jodi, Joshua and Gabbi on ABS-CBN-GMA 7 collab

Sometimes, there are events in our lives that need to happen no matter how painful because it's going to redirect us to something more beautiful."

Thus said actress Jodi Sta. Maria, referring to the controversial

nonrenewal of broadcast network ABS-CBN's franchise in 2020 that

eventually led to a groundbreaking collaboration with rival channel GMA 7: The romantic drama series "Unbreak My Heart."

The series, currently streaming on the Viu app and airing on the Kapuso network, also features Joshua Garcia, Richard Yap and Gabbi Garcia.

"ABS-CBN was hit with a double whammy at the time. A few months into the pandemic, it was announced that our franchise would not be renewed. What happened was that nadapa ka na nga, nasubsob ka pa nang sobra. I believe most of us thought, 'Where do we go from here?' 'How do we move forward?' It's hard to refer to it as a 'blessing in disguise.' If you will try to look back, you will realize that there were things that you couldn't find any logical explanation for," Jodi told Inquirer Entertainment in a recent interview to promote the

series that was shot on location in Switzerland and Italy.

"If ABS-CBN was still on free TV, I don't think this partnership with GMA 7 would be possible at all. There will still be that rivalry. I also don't think

the partnership with other streaming platforms would happen. I'm just so thankful that I'm part of this redirection," the actress pointed out.

'No more competition'

"Today, there's no more competition. Everyone is considered an ally. We are doing this for the audience and for the people working in this industry. This

was the best thing that came out of a painful past experience," Jodi declared.

Meanwhile, Gabbi Garcia, the

Kapuso network's main figurehead in the landmark project, agreed with Jodi and said: "I also didn't think it was a 'blessing in disguise' because a lot of people got displaced as a result of what happened. I'm friends with a lot of people in ABS-CBN. Nobody wanted that to happen.

"I'm just so grateful that, at least, something good came out of it. Let's pray that more doors will open for everybody. I also

hope that there will be more partnerships because, after all, we're all in one industry," Gabbi pointed out.

In December 2022, executives of both networks began discussions for the collaboration. ABS-CBN's production unit, Dreamscape Entertainment, was tasked to develop the show. In February 2023, the cast and crew flew to Europe to shoot the series.

In "Unbreak My Heart," romance blossoms between a young man (Joshua) and a woman (Jodi), who is incidentally searching for her estranged daughter in Europe. After their relationship fails, a twist of fate

> brings him and her daughter together.

Asked what viewers can expect from the series, Joshua, who plays the lonely and troubled Renz, said:

"This features different stories of love. It is also about how a number of characters try to 'unbreak' their hearts, meaning heal from previous experiences. You can learn a lot from the series, depending on which perspective you hold. It tells the struggles of OFWs (overseas Filipino workers) in Europe, as well. It also shows the undying love of a parent, a partner and a friend."

Not the typical boy-meets-girl

For Gabbi, "Unbreak My Heart" is not the typical boymeets-girl story. "A lot of twists are going to happen. As one of the actors, I get to read the script first. I tell you, every time there's a fresh one, we always look forward to reading it. There's always something new and exciting in terms of character development of all the leads in the series. This definitely

offers a different flavor to the audience. They should watch out for the

crazy love story that happens among our characters, as well as with Papa Chen (Richard)."

An interesting promotional teaser for the program described it as such: "Destiny finds its way to show you a love that's beyond ordinary." When asked whether or not she believes in the idea of destiny, Gabbi replied: "My character, Alex, doesn't believe in destiny but, as Gabbi, I do. My mom would always tell me when I was younger, 'Kung para sa 'yo, para sa 'yo.' That's destiny for me. I would always get frustrated when I was a kid, especially when my contemporaries in the industry—those I see doing VTRs with me—are already professional actors. She

would always say to me: Your time will come."

Destiny

Josh agreed with Gabbi and said: "Everything that's happening in our lives is part of a bigger story. This will all lead to what is meant for us in the future."

While Jodi claimed to believe in destiny, too, she offered this interesting thought to mull over. "I have been thinking about the idea for days now. Has

> everything really been written for you and you're just walking the story of vour life, or do we have some sort of freedom to control the narrative of our

stories? If you're going to ask me now, my answer would be, I believe that even before we were conceived in the minds of our parents, there has already been something that's laid out for us.

"But we cannot negate the fact that we have to be responsible also for the choices we make in life. Yes, maybe life has destined you to be a writer, for example, but if you don't act on the opportunities given to you or if you don't take care of the gifts meant for you, then how will this materialize? For me, it's 50-50. Yes, you're destined for something, but you also have to do something to achieve it," she explained.

"First of all, there is only one Sarah Geronimo. There can only be one. It would be an honor, of course, to do a duet with her. I look up to her," she emphasized.



'Here Lies Love' Imelda musical slammed by Broadway union

NEW YORK — "Here Dies Love of Live Music," notes one comment on social media reacting to the latest hurdle faced by the Broadway-bound musical "Here Lies Love."

The musical has already been provoking strong sentiments due to its subject matter, the life story of Imelda Marcos. (Read about it here.)

Now it has angered the industry's musicians union because it will not be using a band or orchestra for its production.

The musical is staged in a dance club setting with its cast singing to recorded music. The producers say this staging device is, "part of the karaoke genre inherent to the musical."

"Here Lies Love" features all Filipino American actors leading the cast, with Arielle Jacobs as Imelda Marcos, Jose Llana as Ferdinand Marcos and Conrad Ricamora as Ninoy Aquino.

Local 802 of the American Federation of Musicians says its contract with the Broadway League, the trade organization representing Broadway producers, guarantees the use of a minimum number of musicians for musicals in certain theaters, specifically 19 for the Broadway Theatre.

The union's president Tino Gagliardi has said, "A show with no live music ... is absolutely an existential threat to Broadway ... by using just pre-recorded tracks, it not only cheapens the art, it's putting jobs and livelihoods at risk."

Explainer

A statement from the producers, which include Tony Award winning costume designer Clint Ramos and Pulitzer Prize winner Jose Antonio Vargas, said, "Since 'Here Lies Love' was first conceived 17 years ago, every production has been performed to pre-recorded track; this is part of the karaoke genre inherent to the musical and the production concept. The music for 'Here Lies Love' was inspired by the phenomena of 'track acts' which allowed club audiences to keep dancing, much like this production aims to do."

Tony Award winner Lea Salonga and Grammy Award winner Fil-Am singer H.E.R. (Gabriella Wilson) are part of the producing

The show's producers have been negotiating with the union to have the show declared a "special situation" to allow for the pre-recorded tracks instead of live instrumentalists. In a statement, the producers said, "We will continue to work in good faith with the union to move through the steps of the contractual process."

Social media

In the show's social media accounts, it has posted a lengthier explanation of its staging conceit, that composer David Byrne intentionally employed performance styles that are conceptually aligned and because of the show's subject matter. Disco track acts and karaoke, which both use vocalists singing along to pre-recorded, synthetic tracks.

"Disco Track Acts, popular in the 1970s and '80s disco scenes, were disco singers who popped into dance clubs unannounced, handed the DJ a cassette tape of a song, and sang live to it on a temporary platform as the crowd

"Karaoke, or sing-along, is deeply rooted in Filipino Culture—and the diasporic Asian culture at large. In the Philippines, karaoke is ubiquitous, crossing class, generational, and economic lines. Almost every Philippine home has a karaoke

"While visiting the Philippines to conduct research, Byrne realized that not only was Karaoke inescapable, it was also prevalent in Imelda Marcos' political strat-

"The slickness and artificiality of the music relates directly to the synthetic seduction of political figures... [the musical's] every moment is informed by the concept of dance club Track Acts and Karaoke."

The posts go on to say that "Here Lies Love" is "not a traditional Broadway musical" and denounces "artistic gate-keepers."

Reactions in the comments support and oppose the situation. One comment reads, "If it is not a traditional musical, it should not be in a traditional musical theater."

Another states, "As a Filipino musician and scholar, I already find the subject matter of this show deplorable, but to disregard live musicians? Musical theatre is about the liveness of performance."

One comment states, "The criticism is all from people who haven't seen the show. There is nothing for live musicians to play. Do you go to Fatboy Slim and DJs performing at dance clubs and lament they don't have live musicians?"
