Philippines, U.S. Australia talk Joint Patrols in South China Sea

Australia's Defence Minister Richard Marles made the announcement after talks with Philippine Defence Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr.

MANILA - Australia and the Philip- **INSIDE** pines are exploring the possibility of joint patrols in the disputed South China Sea, where recent "aggressive activities" by the Chinese Coast Guard towards a Philippine vessel saw Beijing's envoy in Manila summoned by Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Jr.

Australian Defence Minister Richard Marles said that he had discussed joint patrolling with Philippine Defence Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr.

"As countries which are commit- in dealted to the global rules-based order, it ing with is natural that we should think about ways in which we can cooperate in this respect," Marles said.

"We did talk today about exploring joint patrols and we will continue that work," he said.

The possibility of the Philippines and Australia holding joint patrols in the South China Sea comes on the heels of similar discussions between Manila and Washington, and amid a backdrop of China's increasingly muscular approach in pressing its extensive territorial claims in the contested sea.



"Your safety and privacy are of utmost importance to us, and we thank you for your cooperation in this matter," it added.

Owned by media conglomerate Viva Communications Inc., Vivamax claims to be the top local streaming platform in the Philippines and is known for its selection of daring titles.

Greenhills, Baclaran, Divisoria, Cartimar tagged by EU as 'counterfeit hubs'

The budget shopper is no stranger to the sprawling alleys of shopping hubs such as Greenhills, Baclaran, Divisoria, and Cartimar — where one can purchase just about anything from affordable clothes and accessories in bulk, a wide array of flowers, to niche items like hobby gear, collectibles, and other curiosities.

With these wares sourced from a variety of places such as China, the European Commission Counterfeit and Piracy Watch List has tagged these places as hubs for counterfeit goods.

The EU Watch List identified these four markets as offering a wide range of counterfeit goods on a retail and wholesale basis. The report said that the most

commonly sold counterfeit goods are shoes, and also alleged that some stalls also run online shops that peddle fakes.

The report mentioned that "no police actions are



taken" when it comes to the Baclaran and Divisoria marketplaces in Parañaque City and the city of Manila,



respectively. Meanwhile, the stalls in Greenhills and Cartimar reportedly sell higher-quality counterfeit

It also mentioned that the National Bureau of Investigation seized EUR1 million (US\$1.078 million) worth of possible counterfeit goods in Greenhills shopping center in April last year, and pledged publicly to curb the sale of counterfeits.

This is the first time the EU Watch List has flagged the Philippine marketplaces since its launch in 2018.

Phl eyes own missile system

THE Philippines will inch closer to achieving its deterrence objectives as it is poised to have its own missile system that will give the country's "anemic" defense capability a much-needed upgrade.

The Philippine Navy (PN) should be receiving this year the first of three batteries of the BrahMos shore-based anti-ship missile system (Sbasms), which will be the primary weapon of the Coastal Defense Regiment (CDR), a newly formed unit of the Philippine Marine Corps.

The regiment is part of the Navy's Defense Capability Program and Active Archipelagic Defense Strategy, which aims to assert the country's sovereignty in its exclusive economic zone (EEZ) and extended continental shelf, and protecting Sea Lines of Communications (SLOCs).

The regiment is expected to be fully functional in 2026.

Defense experts said the BrahMos cruise missile system will provide counter-attack capabilities within the Philippine exclusive economic zone.

The missile batteries are likely to be deployed in Luzon and Palawan, both facing

the South China Sea.

All the land features in the West Philippine Sea that the Philippines considers an integral part of its territory but are being claimed in whole by China are less than 220 kilometers away from its shoreline, including Mischief Reef where China has constructed military installations.

"It will be a major boost to defending the archipelago and maintaining stability in the West Philippine Sea," he said.

Philippine passport up 2 spots in world's most powerful index

it jumped two spots up in the Henley Passport Index's global ranking for the first quarter of 2023.

The Philippines ranked
78th out of 199 countries as
it grants visa-free entry to 67
countries, sharing the spot
with Uganda.

Meanwhile, the countries with the 10 most powerful passports retained their spots in this quarter's ranking. Japan still leads the pack, with visa-free access to 193 countries. This is followed by Singapore and South Korea, whose passports let them enter 192 countries visa-free.

Spain and Germany ranked third with 190 visa-free destinations. At fourth place are Finland, Italy, Luxembourg, and Austria, allowing entry to 189 countries visa-free; Denmark, Netherlands, and Sweden ranked fifth with 188 visa-free

Dead last is Afghanistan, whose passport grants visa-free access to 27 countries.

more than P1 million as investment. The management of Flex Fuel has already denied the allegations.

Manzano had already previously said that he is not part of Flex Fuel. The TV host-actor also stressed that he is also a victim.

In a statement sent to media offices, Manzano said he also sought an NBI probe into the incident after some investors approached him for help.

He said the corporation also owed him P66 million.

Canada to reduce work experience requirements for caregivers and provide pathways to permanent residence

TORONTO - For decades, caregivers from abroad have played an invaluable role in supporting families in Canada. In recognizing their immense sacrifices, Canada has offered pathways to permanent residence in return.

On behalf of the Honourable Sean Fraser, Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship, members of Parliament Salma Zahid and Rechie Valdez today announced that the amount of work experience in Canada required for a caregiver to qualify for permanent residence is being reduced from 24 months to 12 months. In addition, some spaces under the existing caregiver pathways have been reserved for caregivers who already have work experience in Canada from a previous work permit so that they are able to apply for permanent residence. The change will be effective as of April 30, 2023, and will be retrospective for caregivers who have already applied.

As a result, caregivers and their families will benefit from a faster



path to permanent residence and successful settle-

ment in Canada. By reducing the amount of work experience required in Canada, Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) also intends to improve processing and applications. This update is expected to benefit around 90% of applications currently in processing, an advantage for both the caregivers who are just starting out and those who have been providing care in Canada already.

As we approach the end date of the existing caregiver programs, we will continue to make any necessary changes to show our appreciation to the caregivers who help reduce some of the stress in the lives of Canadian families in need. Work is underway on the future of caregiver programming to plan for what comes next after the pilots conclude in June 2024.

Quick facts

The change will be effective as of April 30, 2023, and will be retrospective for caregivers who have already applied.

The shift in criteria is intended to apply to applicants from both the Home Child Care Provider (HCCP) pilot and the Home Support Worker (HSW) pilot, including those whose applications have already been received by IRCC and prospective applicants for the remainder of the five-year pilots.

Since the launch of the pilots in 2019, nearly 1,600 caregivers and their family members have become permanent residents. In 2022 alone, nearly 1,100 caregivers and their family members became permanent residents through the two pilots.

Immigration accounts for almost all of Canada's labour force growth. Roughly 75% of Canada's population growth comes from immigration, mostly in the economic category. By 2036, immigrants will represent up to 30% of Canada's population, compared with 20.7% in 2011.

Fifty years ago, there were seven workers for every retiree in Canada. Today, that number is closer to three, and if Canada stays on its current trajectory, in the next 10 to 15 years, that ratio will drop to two workers for every retiree.

MANILA — The Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) will not resort to "gray zone tactics" in dealing with intruding Chinese coast guards and militia vessels in the West Philippine Sea.

PCG adviser for maritime security Commodore Jay Tarriela gave the assurance in an interview with "The Chiefs" on One News TV, amid reports on the presence of some 30 Chinese militia vessels and coast guard around Ayungin and Sabina shoals.

"We are still going to base our actions based on international law. We're not going to use gray zone tactics in patrolling the South China Sea. We will not follow their strategy and deviate from international law," Tarriela said.

Unlike other coast guards, which are "white" or civilian entities, the Chinese Coast Guard is authorized under Chinese law to carry out gray zone operations, combining constabulary, civilian, and military or combat roles.

"The actions of the Philippine Coast

Guard, as the maritime law enforcement, are different that from the Navy - that we do not have a military identity. We are still going to maintain that. Our protocols will also be based on the rules-based actions that we are setting as a coast guard organization," he added.

Cases of Chinese intimidation in the West Philippine continue, the latest of which was on Feb. 6 when Chinese coast guard beamed a military-grade laser light on a PCG ship helping deliver provisions to a military outpost in Ayungin Shoal.

The Department of Foreign Affairs has protested the incident.

Despite these incidents, Tarriela clarified that it is still not correct to say that China's aggression in the West Philippine Sea started a few days after President Marcos visited China.

While diplomatic protests seemed to be ineffective, Tarriela said documenting and presenting to the public China's bullying and aggressive actions may be effective in

raising public awareness and attracting attention of the international community.

"We are more engaging the public in telling these incidents and our intention is to expose this bullying behavior of China for us to gain international support, for the world to know that these are the aggressive and bullying behavior of China in the West Philippine Sea," Tarriela said.

Asked if recent developments require the need for assistance from the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) or Philippine Navy in particular, Tarriela stressed the PCG still has the capability to perform its mandate.

He said only an armed attack will prompt the PCG to turn to the AFP or the Philippine Navy for help.

"I believe that's not yet enough for us to call on the Philippine Navy because the PCG, in terms of driving them away, we have capability and we have been doing that for the past years already," he added.



Marcos to DILG, PNP: Dismantle private armies

MANILA — President Marcos described as "shocking" and "purely political" the assassination of Negros Oriental governor Roel Degamo as he ordered authorities to identify "hot spots" and to conduct a crackdown on private armies and illegal firearms.

"It was shocking. I couldn't believe that this would still happen. They (killers) entered his house. When you see the video, you would see that they shot those who were facing them," the President said in Filipino.

"This one is particularly terrifying... This does not belong in our society. This should not be tolerated so we won't let this pass," he added.

Marcos expressed belief that unlike some of the recent attacks against local officials, the killing of Degamo was politically motivated. "This is purely political," he said.

The assassination of Degamo is the latest violent incident targeting local officials.

On Feb. 17, Lanao del Sur Gov. Mamintal Adiong Jr. was injured and four of his aides were killed in an ambush in Maguing town. Two days later, Aparri, Cagayan vice mayor Rommel Alameda and five others died in an ambush in Bagabag, Nueva Vizcaya. On Feb. 22, Mayor Ohto Caumbo Montawal of Datu Montawal, Maguindanao del Sur was wounded in an ambush in Pasay City.

Marcos said he has asked Interior Secretary Benhur Abalos and the Philippine National Police to make an "examination" and determine "hot spots,"

similar to what they are doing during election season. He also emphasized the need to seize illegal firearms and to dismantle private armies.

"The usual thing that should be done is to look for illegal firearms. If there are few illegal firearms, such kinds of crimes would be few. All the private armies should be dismantled," he added.

Marcos said the investigation into Degamo's killing is progressing well.

President Marcos also directed the military and the police to increase their presence across the country.

"So, I've asked our joint – army and the police, I suggest keep your presence known, felt, to prevent lawlessness," Marcos said partly in Filipino.

NPA ambushes soldiers involved in SAR of downed Cessna plane; 2 dead

MANILA - Two soldiers who were buying supplies for the search team involved in search and rescue operations on a crashed Cessna plane in Albay were killed when they were ambushed by suspected New People's Army (NPA) rebels last Feb. 20.

Captain German Franco Roldan, officer in charge of the 9th Infantry Division (91D) public affairs office, identified the victims as Privates John Paul Adalim and Mark June Esico, both assigned at the 31st Infantry Battalion.



The soldiers died on the

spot after sustaining multiple gunshot wounds in the body. Maj. Gen. Adonis Bajao, 91D commander and head of the Joint Task Force Bicolandia, condemned the NPA for their

treacherous attack which led to the death of the two young

Canada opens new application processing centre in Philippines to help boost immigration

Canada is opening a new visa application processing centre within its embassy in the Philippines in an effort to boost immigration.

Minister of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Sean Fraser said the new centre is meant to bolster application processing as Canada tries to meet its planned immigration increases over the next few years. "Canada is set to welcome a record number of newcomers in the years ahead to fuel our economic growth. This will give us an advantage in the global race for talent, and support key sectors and industries," Fraser said.

Ottawa previously announced plans to ramp up immigration levels to address labour shortages and demographic changes that threaten the country's future.

Canada is poised to see 465,000 new

permanent residents in 2023, 485,000 in 2024 and 500,000 in 2025, if its Immigration Levels Plan goals are met. The Prairies stand to benefit the most from economic growth spurred by newcomers, according to a Desjardins report from early February.

You can be wholesome and sexy. You don't have to show more skin to be sexy. You just have to show your confidence," Atayde said.



story."



"I have been and will always be a Kapamilya. I have been with ABS- CBN since 1988, when they were just rebuilding their station from the ground up after years of closure by the then-Philippine government.

"For the first time in all these decades, I don't have a long-term contract with

my station. I know it is a number of things that have caused this. We lost our franchise, the station has way too many stars now and we of the "old guard" have to give way.

"My memory and loyalty are unquestionable. But a girl's gotta work where she can and where she's wanted. See you again hopefully soon, whenever you may need me!"


Jay Tarriela, the Philippine Coast Guard's spokesperson on South China Sea issues, said that talks with the United States have advanced beyond the infancy stage and that the likelihood of carrying out joint patrols was high.

Tarriela did not provide details on the scale or timing of the proposed patrols, which come after the Pentagon said last month the US and the Philippines had "agreed to restart joint maritime patrols in the South China Sea".

"There is already a clear path of possibility since the Defense Department of the United States has also supported the joint patrol with the Philippine Navy and the US Navy so there is a certainty for this particular joint patrols to happen between the coast guard of both countries," Tarriela said.

Rommel Jude Ong, former vice commander of the Philippine Navy said the idea of a Philippine and US coastguard deployment in the South China Sea instead of the navy will "mitigate any miscalculation and prevent China from finding an excuse to escalate tension" in the waterway.

Earlier last month, Manila accused China's coastguard of aiming a "military-grade laser" at one of its coastguard vessels that was supporting a resupply mission for troops on an atoll in the South



China Sea.

Manila blasted what it said was China's "aggressive activities" in the South China Sea, and President Marcos Jr summoned the Chinese ambassador to express his "serious concern" over the harassment of the Philippine Coast Guard vessel. The incident prompted expressions of concern from other countries, including Japan, Australia

and the US.

China has refuted the Philippine account of the incident, which it said did not reflect the truth. China's foreign ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin said last week that his country's coastguard had acted in a "professional and restrained" manner towards the Philippine ship.

Last month a Philippine Coast Guard aircraft flew over

the South China Sea as part of efforts to boost its presence in contested waters and protect what it says is its maritime territory.

In a statement, the Philippine Coast Guard said it saw a Chinese coastguard vessel and dozens of what it suspected were boats manned by Chinese militia around the Second Thomas and Sabina Shoals,

both of which are inside the Philippines' 200-mile (321km) exclusive economic zone.

The Philippine Coast Guard ordered the suspected Chinese militia to leave, telling them "they were not authorised to loiter nor swarm these shoals", according to the statement.

China's embassy in Manila did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

Pay with onions at Japan Centre

MANILA - With prices soaring to record-highs during the recent holidays, onions have quite literally become as good as cash.

Customers flocked to the Panay Avenue branch of Japan Home Centre in Quezon City as it held its "Pay with Sibuyas" campaign for one day only on Saturday, February 4. The retail store accepted all kinds of elusive

(and expensive) onions as payment for select in-store items.

Customers can swap one onion in exchange for their chosen product. A maximum of three items per purchase was allowed per customer.

Japan Home Centre said that all collected onions are given back to the community pantry, which provides free food for those in need.

Over the past months, the price of onions in the market have skyrocketed, which climbed to as high as P700 per kilo in December 2022. Such prices were in stark contrast to the average price of onions worldwide at the time, which was only around \$1.54 per kilo, or around P84.87.

The onion crisis has since sparked debate on the country's messy importation strategy and lack of proper cold storage infrastructure, which have only further burdened farmers and those on the margins.

Encoding errors plague national ID; PSA to do updating

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) will conduct a massive updating of the Philippine Identification System (PhilSys) to correct erroneous data encoded.

Baby Jean Alid, PSA registration officer, admitted that there were

erroneous data collected with the registration of PhilSys.

"There were a lot (of errors) with the massive registration. So maybe this year, in May or the second semester, we will conduct an updating operation," Alid said in a mix of Filipino and English.

"We will open many centers for this," she added.

She also said there are reports of people cutting the QR code and pasting it to another ID.

As of Jan. 27, 2023, there are 76.2 million Filipinos registered to Phil-Sys, with 29.9 million IDs already delivered via the Philippine Postal Office and 18.4 million given a digital copy of the ID.

Naga City's unsung delicacy, kinalas, is a traditional Filipino dish of noodles, spices, pork or beef brains, and scraped meat from pork or beef head. It looks somewhat similar to beef mami – a noodle dish that most Filipinos are familiar with – the addition of a thick and dark brown sauce on top of the noodles, described by Taste Atlas as "a shrimpy, garlicky brown gravy consisting of dried shrimps, vinegar, garlic, shallots, soy sauce, and fish sauce."

Kinalas is from the old Bicol

word "kalas," which means "fall off the bone" – a reference to how the noodle dish is traditionally made. "Kinalas is often garnished with spring onions, fried garlic, or chili peppers, but some people like to add a hard-boiled egg on top. The dish is always served hot," Taste Atlas added. The dish is usually paired with puto, turon, chicharon, or banana cue.

Hotsilog is considered a traditional breakfast choice and a childhood favorite, featuring garlic fried rice, fried egg, and bright-red, Filipino-style hotdogs. The hotdogs are "usually slightly cut on the sides," and then boiled, then fried in oil. According to Taste Atlas, the popular silog is accompanied by banana ketchup, atchara (pickled shredded papaya), and tomato slices on the side.

If you check Taste Atlas' website, two more Filipino dishes were put on the chopping block – one is balut, the polarizing Filipino delicacy and street food favorite. "It is a duck egg that has been hard-boiled, fertilized, and incubated. Traditionally, the cooked embryo is consumed straight from the shell," Taste Atlas wrote. The dish, which is

also a pulutan fave, "can be seasoned with chili, garlic, vinegar, salt, lemon juice, and ground pepper."

The second dish is sweet-style Filipino Spaghetti, an iteration of Italy's pasta that Italians may frown upon. A common birth-day staple, Filipino spaghetti is sweet, made with ground meat, hot dogs, banana ketchup, and sugar, usually topped with grated cheese.

"It is believed that the dish was invented by Filipino mothers who noticed that their children love sugar, so they put a spin on the classic spaghetti dishes. Today, this inexpensive meal is known as the one that unites families," Taste Atlas added.

Recently, bibingka was named the 16th Best Cake in the World. In December 2021, bibingka snagged the 65th spot on Taste Atlas' 100 Best Dishes in the World list at 4.4 stars, alongside lugaw, kesong puti, and lechon.

Taste Atlas is an online gastronomic database that promotes the local culinary culture of countries all over the world. The website contains over 10,000 specialty dishes, drinks, recommended restaurants, and local ingredients for anyone to check out before an international trip.


Megastar on being snubbed

(This is the first surprise of the OGs in the United States of America. To our fellow Filipinos, friends, and families over America, see you soon, East and West Coast.")


Shortly after the announcement was made, many fans of the girl group were all over the moon about their comeback.



A 'pandemic' dream come true for the Divine Divas

Precious Paula Nicole, Brigiding and Viñas DeLuxe are having their first-ever headline show Divine Divas: The Ultimate Drag Experience this Feb. 10 at New Frontier Theater. It's a dream come true for these drag queens who began their joint act, "Divine Divas," online to help themselves get through the pandemic.

"This is the product of our dream during the pandemic. Finally, (it's) a real stage," Precious, the first-ever Drag Race Philippines winner, recently said of her first major concert with fellow queens Viñas and Brigiding.

The trio continues to be buoyed by the popularity of Drag Race Philippines Season 1, where Precious was crowned "first drag superstar," while Brigiding and Viñas landed on sixth and seventh places, respectively. The show raised awareness on the country's thriving drag community. But pre-Drag Race, they've been long-time friends brought together by the art of drag.

Precious was first to enter the drag scene 12 years ago. "Before I became a drag queen, I was a stuntman, a double for Thor," joked Precious before turning serious, "I worked as a professional dancer since I was 16." She got into drag because "ang ganda lang din tingnan na napapakita mo ang feminine and masculine side, still as a performer." While it was very hard starting out, Precious said that once you score regular gigs, there's really a life doing

Brigiding, who got drawn to performing and being in front of audiences while doing ad-promo work at ABS-CBN, met Precious in 2013 when she came to O Bar, known as home to the most popular drag acts. "From there, we became close," Brigiding, a communication arts grad, recalled.

On the other hand, Viñas met Brigiding after the latter commented on her social media post about a makeup tutorial. "So, chinat ko siya and nagkamabutihan kami ng loob. Nagka-landian ng konti," Viñas, also a CommArts grad, laughingly shared. "When we went to O Bar, (Brigiding) introduced me as a suitor so entrance would be free of charge hahaha." That visit made Viñas realize she also wanted to explore the drag world.

Over the pandemic, their friendship was sealed for life. Due to income loss with bars being closed, they started staging Facebook Live shows. The name Divine Divas originated from fans of their virtual hangout, first dubbed Divine Bar, from the gay lingo of "di ba?," a favorite expression. They didn't expect it would grow big and last this long. All they wanted was to entertain themselves during a tough period and at the same time, earn.

Precious revealed, "In all fairness po, there were times when we would earn more there than (in) bars... Most of our viewers were new fans of drag. They found us entertaining, especially OFWs and people from the provinces who couldn't come to Manila."

This led to another career opportunity, the drag reality competition Drag Race Philippines, which aired mid-2022 on HBO GO. As fans of RuPaul's Drag Race, it was on their bucket list to join one long before the Philippine edition happened.

"Sinumpa talaga namin na dapat tayong tatlo makapasok (we promised each other that all three of us should make it to the first season)," Brigiding said.

Initially, it was only Viñas and Brigiding who were interested in joining. "I told (Precious), 'Sige, 'wag ka mag-audition and me and Brigiding will tour, and we will leave you behind.' So sumali siya. Siya pa ang nanalo! It was a success because after Drag Race, we were able to tour Cebu and other provinces," Viñas said.

Nevertheless, Drag Race Philippines was where their friendship was tested. "There were misunderstandings and mixed signals na parang siempre nilagay kayo dun para ilabas yung mga good side and best side, best and worst personality traits that before we knew it, we were already hurting each other without even intending to or meaning to," admitted Brigiding. "We brought that with us even after the show. But when we realized that what happened there doesn't define who we are or who we should become after the show, our connection with each other was restored and our bond

even became tighter."

Precious agreed, "Drag Race was really one of those things that tested us. We lost trust in each other. We lost focus on the fact that before we became contestants, we were friends because there was just one crown, one prize and everyone of us wanted to win. By doing that and thinking kailangan kong manalo, may nabibitawan kaming salita na 'di namin alam na masakit pala sa kanya or sa akin... But we were able to solve that afterwards."

Before the show aired, they also felt the pressure of winning over the public. By the third episode, they were no longer begging people to watch the reality series. They became a hit that shows outside would be packed, with tickets selling out in a minute that at first they thought something was wrong in the ticketing system. What made them happier was that the majority of their audiences were new fans of drag.

From online shows and clubs, they're now taking on bigger venues like the New Frontier Theater. They will also star in an ABS-CBN/iWant series, Drag You & Me. Viñas has recorded songs under Tarsier Records,

while Divine Divas will debut an original song in tonight's show.

Viñas said, "It's very very hard to be a drag queen but once mabuo siya, it's very fulfilling. Once you hear people's applause, ang sarap ulitin."

(It's) mentally, physically and financially (challenging)

because it's not cheap. Yung mga ginagamit para lang maging ganito ka ganda ay talagang magastos but worth it yung love and support of the people, even through tips, we really appreciate it."

Any advice to aspiring drag queens, especially those wanting to join Drag Race Philippines Season 2?

"Wag na," Precious joked. "Marami na kami," Brigiding quipped.

Wag niyo masyadong galingan para may career pa kami, Viñas jokingly added.

But on a more serious note, they offered encouraging words being drag queens supporting drag queens.

Brigiding said, "It's your time to shine. Enjoy!"

Precious said, "Sabi nga ni RuPaul, it's the beginning of the rest of your life. Don't forget why you're there in the competition. Always do the best of the best of the best.'

Aljon said he and Jayda made an effort to get to know each other better when they first learned that they would be working

together for the project.

"We started texting each other," shared Aljon. "Inalam ko yung hobbies niya and vice-versa." During tapings, they were "very collaborative" and they helped each other out in every scene.

"Halimbawa may scene na madaling araw, tapos lowbat ako, papahawak lang ako sa kamay niya. My love language is physical. So every time there's someone who would hold my hand, I feel that energy. I get recharged. We also talked about our strengths and weaknesses and some strategies (on how to get on with the scenes)," he added.

According to Aljon, every time Jayda also needs help, he will motivate his love-team partner. "I really appreciate that from her because she is willing to work with me. There is that trust and of course, this is her acting debut and launching project, pinagkakatiwalaan niya ako and I'm very thankful for that."

"I really trust him and trust is the

foundation of our working relationship," concurred Jayda. "Our approach is to really develop our friendship before we started this project. I also felt that he is committed to this project and we are both working towards one goal."

Jayda just laughed and said that they have this "system" of letting each other know if they got home safe after taping. "I was just worried. Kasi di ko po alam kung nakauwi po siya."

Besides Aljon's "sweet gesture" on Valentine's, Jayda added that what makes her kilig over Aljon was when he was there during her "darkest and lowest" moments. "For me, it just showed that this person cares about me and it's a mutual thing that we care about each other. That's very special for me and I think it's the little things that matter to me."
