PH not backing down over maritime rights

US to 'invoke' defense pact in attack on PH

Marcos vows to defend fishing areas for Pinoys

President Ferdinand Marcos on September 29 said the government will not back down and will continue to defend the country's maritime territory and the rights of Filipino fisherfolk.

This is after he ordered the removal of the floating barrier that China set up in the West Philippine Sea to block local fishermen from entering Pa-

natag (Scarborough) Shoal.

"These are operational issues that I really cannot talk about. But in terms of taking down the barrier, I don't see what else we could do because [it involved] our fishermen," said


Mr. Marcos, speaking to journalists in Siargao.

The President said the Philippines was not looking to provoke anything in the area, but he said his administration will continue to defend the

country's sovereign rights.

"We are not looking for trouble [but]... we will continue to defend the Philippines, the maritime territory of the Philippines, and the

PH allowed to use Canadian satellites vs 'dark' ships

Canadawill help the Philippines find illegal fishing vessels and protect fish stocks.

Canada will give the Philippines free access to stateof-the-art satellites that will allow maritime enforcers to surveil, almost in real time, vessels within the Philippines' exclusive economic zone.

The satellites will allow authorities to detect and track even "dark vessels," or ships that have switched off their location transmitters to avoid detection, said Ottawa's Ambassador David Hartman.

Aside from access to the Canadian satellites, Ottawa also dispatched another Halifax-class frigate to participate for the first time in the joint Philippines-US naval exercise "Sama-Sama" (All Together) from Oct. 2 to Oct. 13 in southern Luzon.

Canada will also be sending an active-duty defense attache to Manila for the first time beginning October as part of its efforts to bolster

the security partnership with the country. "We've seen a rise in behavior in the West Philippine Sea and the South China Sea that we have determined to be worrisome," Hartman said onboard the HMCS Vancouver.

"I think it's very clear how we stand. It's unequivocal. The decision is final and binding," he said, reiterating Canada's support to the arbitral award of the Permanent Court of Arbitration in 2016.

Hartman said they were "looking forward to imminently concluding" negotiations for the Dark Vessel Detection Program, which he said would "dramatically enhance Philippine maritime domain awareness."

appeal to our colleagues in the Senate to give serious attention to this

She also pointed out that "there are a lot of independent actors and performers, or freelancers with unfixed salaries and benefits. Tito Eddie's untimely death underscored the need for a safe working environment for workers in our industry."

Toni Fowler asserts amid cybercrime suit: 'May kalayaan akong ariin ang aking sarili'

Toni Fowler said she is ready to face the criminal case filed against her by the Kapisanan ng Social Media Broadcasters ng Pilipinas Inc. (KSMBPI), and stressed that the group has no right to forbid her from expressing her sexual-

ity through her contents. The social media advocacy group has accused Fowler of violation of Article 201 of the Revised Penal Code in relation Cybercrime Preven-

tion Act of 2012. KSMBPI claimed that Fowler's actions of exhibiting lewd clothes and sex toys, as well as simu-

lating sexual acts with the use of sexually explicit words in her videos pointed to being "patently offensive" under the law.

The actress-vlogger responded to the supposed "lies" peddled by the group, as per a statement released on her Facebook page on Friday, Sept. 29. Fowler pointed out that the music video of her song "MPL" only features sex toys, as opposed to KSMBPI's claim that it shows actual reproductive organs.

"Gaya ng kalayaan ninyong tawagin akong bastos, malaswa, at hindi magandang halimbawa tulad ng aking kanta, may kalayaan din akong ariin ang aking sarili," she said.

(While you have the freedom to call me salacious, obscene and a bad example because of my song, I also have the freedom to own myself.)

"Kasama dito ang pag-aari ko sa aking katawan, sa aking pagkababae, at higit sa lahat ang pag-aari ko sa nais kong gawin, sabihin, kantahin, o sayawin dahil hindi nito binabawasan o inaapakan ang karapatan ng ibang tao," she continued. "Hindi ninyo pagaari ang mga ito."

(This includes owning my body and my femininity, especially what I want to do, say, sing and dance, as long as it does not harm other people. You have no right over

Fowler underscored that she did not force anyone into watching her contents, further noting that having sexual desire and engaging in sexual intercourse are "part of being human."

"Wala kayong puwang para sabihan at pagbawalan ako. Hindi ninyo lugar ang pagbawalan ang mga babaeng gaya ko-gaya

ng pagbabawal ninyo sa aming kilos, pananamit, pati na rin sa pakikipag-usap," she stated. "Hindi kayo ang karapat-dapat na manguna sa pagpuna lalo na sa mga usaping sexual naming kababaihan dahil unang-una, hindi ito bawal at hindi kayo babae."

(You don't have the right to forbid me and tell me what to do. You're not in the position to forbid women like me-just like how you aim to rule over our actions, the way we dress

and talk. You do not have the right to criticize matters regarding women's sexuality because first of all, such is not prohibited; also, vou are not a woman.)

The "Batang Quiapo" actress also clarified that no one from the music video cast drank alcoholic drinks while filming, and that the liquors they consumed were actually juice. Fowler stressed as well that minors were not involved in doing the sexual scenes in the "MPL" video.

"Gusto kong sabihin sa inyo na matapang kong haharapin ang mga kasong inihain ninyo laban sa akin dahil kahit na ano pa ang itawag ninyo sa akin, taas noo ko itong haharapin at sasabihing ako'y tahimik lang sa umpisa, pero marunong akong lumaban kahit di ninyo ako pilitin," Fowler concluded her statement, making a reference to a line from "MPL."

(I want you to know that I will bravely face the case you filed against me because whatever names you call me, I can proudly say that I'm just quiet at first but I know how to fight even if you do not force me to.)

Senate OKs bill revitalizing dying salt industry

MANILA, Philippines — The Senate has unanimously approved on final reading a bill, which outlines measures aimed at revitalizing the salt industry and boosting production by salt farmers.

In Senate Bill 2243, a Philippine Salt Industry Development Roadmap will be formulated. The roadmap will include programs, projects and interventions for the development and management, research, processing, utilization, modernization, and commercialization of Philippine salt.

A 16-member Philippine Salt Industry Development Council, headed by the Department of Agriculture secretary, will be also established.

Despite having a coastline 11 times larger than Vietnam, the country only produces 100,000 metric tons of salt compared to its Southeast Asian neighbor's 1.1 million MT, according to the Philippine Association of Salt Industry

"This implies the need to revitalize the dying salt industry. We need to meet the growing demand of Filipino households and the additional annual demand for 300,000 metric tons of salt as coconut fertilizer," said Sen. Cynthia Villar, chair of the agriculture committee and principal sponsor of the bill

If passed, the measure will assign the Department of Environment and Natural



Resources and the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources to identify and designate public lands, including portions of municipal waters, as salt production areas.

DENR will transfer public lands suitable for salt production under its administrative jurisdiction to BFAR.

The proposed measure will also lease public land for salt production for a 25-year period, renewable for another 25 years, for use as farms.

The House of Representatives approved its version of the measure in

Last year, a study from Germany's Helmholtz Centre for Environmental Research concluded that up to 95 per cent of the world's ocean plastic was coming from 10 rivers: Eight in Asia and two in Africa. That same year, a report from the group Ocean Conservancy concluded that 60 per cent of the world's ocean plastic pollution could be traced to just five countries: China, Indonesia, the Philippines, Thailand and Vietnam.

General Requirements for All Categories: Any applicant or candidate for an FCT Award must be a 1) Natural-born Filipino or of Filipino descent (either parent is Filipino); 2) a Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada; 3) Of good moral and exemplary character, i.e. has no pending charge involving sexual or child abuse or

B. Specific Requirements for Elementary and **High School Graduates. To qualify:**

1) The applicant should be currently registered in the elementary or secondary school in Ontario, under one of the following categories: The elementary school applicant should have completed the last year of elementary school and be going into high school (Grade 9); The high school applicant should be accepted and going into university or community college or apprenticeship program.

2) The student should have a minimum academic average of 85% (or equivalent) during the last two (2) school years and must be involved in extra-curricular and community activities. 3) The applicant must submit the following documents: For the elementary school graduate - Original copies of final report cards for the last two years. For the high school graduate - A current and original transcript bearing the school's official seal. Also, two (2) original letters of character reference (one from the school, excluding immediate family); two

(2) passport-size photos, and A completed FCT application form.

C. Qualification Requirements for Post-Secondary Honour Candidates:

3) Documents (Photocopies only) to be submitted: a) Undergraduate program: Bachelor's Diploma with Academic Honours Notation; b) Graduate program: Transcript of Academic Record and Thesis or Dissertation Paper, and 4) Passport-size Photo; 5) Completed FCT Application Form. Academic awards received must not be more than 5 years old, from the date of application.

MANILA, Philippines — President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. expressed his support for expanding the Food Stamp Program (FSP) initiated by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) following a successful launch on Siargao Island, Surigao del Norte.

Speaking at a rice distribution event in Surigao del Norte, Marcos said that the government is planning to extend the program next month.

The FSP, a DSWD flagship program, aims to reduce hunger by improving ac-

DSWD's food stamp program set for expansion

cess to nutritious food for disadvantaged households. It provides cash-based assistance through Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) cards.

Marcos personally led the FSP launch at Teatro Nan Dapa in Dapa, Siargao Island, where he distributed EBT cards, each with P3,000 in food credits, to 50 beneficiaries. "I have to say that it's proceeding smoothly and we will be upscaling it within the next month or so. We are aiming at the next face of this rollout, we

are already looking to 3,000 families to be beneficiaries," Marcos said. Although the FSP is currently in its pilot stage, Marcos said that it is showing promising results and is firmly aligned with its long-term goal, which is to make nutritious food accessible to ordinary citizens, particularly in remote areas.

During the event, the president thanked international sponsors, including the United Nations' World Food Programme, the Asian Development Bank (ADB), and

France's government, for their support. A grant of US\$3 million was secured from the French Development Agency, ADB, and Japan International Cooperation Agency, with plans to assist 300,000 households next year.

Initially, the FSP was launched for 3,000 families in five areas: Tondo, Manila; Dapa, Siargao; San Mariano, Isabela; Garchitorena, Camarines Sur; and Parang, Maguindanao. It was first conducted on July 18 in Tondo, Manila.

"So, hopefully, guys, pag-pray nating lahat na ito na yung start ng friendship nila."



While Maricel Soriano said she would be open to a reunion project with her 1980s on-screen partner William Martinez, the actress said she would also like to work with young talents like Daniel Padilla, Joshua Garcia and Enchong Dee.

"I'm willing to sit down and discuss that," said Maricel when asked if she would be up to working with William, since her contemporary, Sharon Cuneta, will soon be seen in a reunion concert with Gabby Concepcion.

However, Maricel said she would also wish to have the chance to collaborate with Enchong and Daniel, whose names she mentioned after saying, "I want to pick good-looking actors," and Joshua, whom she described as "a really good one."



As part of the cast of the afternoon drama series "Pira-pirasong Paraiso," Maricel is currently working with four young actresses, namely Charlie Dizon, Alexa Ilacad, Loisa Andalio and Elise Joson. She plays Amanda, the guilt-stricken grandmother of the long-lost Paraiso sisters.

"I'm enjoying my time with them because I've never had a daughter," said Maricel, who in real life is mom to sons Marron and Sebastien. "Whenever I see them, I interview them. Nuggets of advice

Maricel also makes sure to share nuggets of advice with her wards. "I keep telling them, don't feel intimidated by me or by any actor you work with," she said.

Charlie, who plays Diana in the series, said she felt so overwhelmed prior to doing her first scene with Maricel that she had to go to the bathroom to cry herself out. "I couldn't release the right emotion. Inay Maricel was so giving."

Alexa said all the actors who were supposed to have scenes with Maricel felt nervous. "I even had clammy hands.

Every taping day, I would ask, 'Will I have scenes with Inay tomorrow?' This was because I knew I had to mentally prepare for them. I knew I had to have enough sleep and rest. Later, I noticed that whenever we would have scenes together, she would keep the atmosphere very light. She would also say, 'We're all equal here,'" said Alexa, who plays Belle in the program.

'Powerful aura'

"I also discovered that we're both very fond of aromatherapy. She also showed me her diamond collection. I told her, 'Inay, if you lose them, I can't be the suspect.' I feel so lucky to have been given the chance to work with her," Alexa said.

Prior to working on their scenes together, Elise said she did her research on Maricel. When the day to work with her finally came, I went to our room and, immediately, I felt this aura from her that made me

feel dumbfounded. It was so powerful," she said.

"When we got to talk some more, I realized that she's actually very caring and motherly. I want to be like her someday—she has this very powerful aura, but when you get to know her, you'll discover that she's really sweet," stressed Elise, who plays Hillary.

Loisa recalled feeling confused the first time she had to rehearse with Maricel. Why do we Filipinos celebrate Christmas for four months?

"Some may think it's silly, but we do it anyway. It's unique and heartwarming, and it ultimately brings us joy."

The mainly Catholic country is known as the only one that celebrates Christmas for an extended period.

Mariah Carey, the singer behind the holiday hit All I Want for Christmas is You, acknowledged it in a recent post on X, formerly known as Twitter.

"I'll allow it for my Filipino lambs, though," she wrote in response to news that her Christmas song received 316,000 streams on Spotify last Friday.

Families typically start by putting up Christmas lights, and gradually build up the decorations closer to December 25.

People selling handmade parols or ornamental lanterns swell in numbers on the streets, and carolers start going door to door as early as November.

There have been many suggestions as to why this is the case. Filipinos' penchant for Christmas is rooted in Catholicism and the many religious traditions the country practises during the season

Christmas has become a crucial occasion for Filipinos who

work overseas, which the government said number about 1.8 million in a 2021 census.

Many of these migrant work-



ers, including a significant portion from the UAE, would use their annual leave over Christmas to reunite with their families.

This grand homecoming could offer an explanation for the months-long anticipation of the holiday, said Filipino sociologist Clifford Sorita in a 2018 report by NPR.

He said the "ber" months provide a "psychological time clock" for Filipinos, who are expecting a busy Christmas calendar with family and friends.

Sprott SAYS the extended festivities "allow us to fully immerse in the spirit of Christmas, which is all about being grateful, being kind, getting together with friends and family and end-

ing the year on a positive note".

Belle Briones, also a Dubai resident, says: "Good things happen during Christmas, so if we can have it for longer, why not?"

Briones says the community aspect of the celebration is most notable. The Christmas season creates a "warm and cheerful atmosphere at home, but also within neighbourhoods".

For some Filipinos abroad, the "ber" months are a poignant reminder of the distance they have to travel to provide a good life for their families at home.

Those who cannot travel over the holidays make it up by increasing their remittances.

According to data from Hubpay, a money transfer application, remittances to the Philippines increase to about 40 per cent during the fourth quarter and peak in December.

Sprott says she grew up "loving

the feeling" of the months-long countdown to Christmas, and being able to open gifts only after the clock hits midnight on December 25.

"I want to continue this practice even as I grow older," she says, adding that it comforts her knowing she is still part of a family tradition despite being thousands of kilometres away.

le E.A.T. management is regretful and apologetic to those who were offended by the said utterance. Rest assured that we are one with MTRCB in advocating a responsible viewing experience for the public."

Note that the MTRCB is already reviewing the incident following complaints from viewers.

the motion of reconsideration filed by ABS-CBN and GMA to appeal its 12-day suspension.

Chiu briefly addressed the regulatory board's ruling during a brand launch on Thursday, Sept. 28, when asked to give her two-cents on the current state of the Kapamilya noontime show.

"We're just very grateful na ang daming sumusuporta sa 'It's Showtime' at 'yun po ang mahalaga (We're just very grateful that many people support 'It's Showtime' as that's what's most important)," she said.

Hours after the government agency denied the noontime show's appeal, ABS-CBN confirmed that it's "currently exploring all [their] remedies and options" as the MTRCB's "imposed suspension is not yet final and executory."



TikTok user @rolyn_jay already posted an apology video as he admitted that he received P7,000 while P1,000 went to the person who recruited him to do a video attacking Maggie and Tim.

rights of our fishermen to fish in the areas where they have been fishing for hundreds of years," he said.

Once the barrier was removed, Filipino fishermen reeled in 164 tons of fish on their first day, he said.

"That is what our fishermen are missing. So it is not possible to put up such a barrier and it is clear that it is within the Philippines' territory," the President added.

Invoking US Defense Pact

Meanwhile, officials of the Biden administration have told lawmakers in the US House of Representatives that Washington is ready to back the Philippines in case its assets, including those of the Philippine Coast Guard, are attacked in the South China Sea.

Appearing before the congressional hearing of the US House of Representatives, US Defense Department's Deputy Assistant Secretary Lindsey Ford said Washington will certainly invoke its Mutual Defense Treaty with Manila in the event of armed attacks against Philippine assets is amid China's continued aggression in the disputed waters, including the incidents of laser pointing and water cannon attacks against Philippine personnel.

"The [Defense] department has been incredibly clear when it comes to our treaty commitments to the Philippines," Ford told members of the House of Representatives sub-committee on Indo-Pacific of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs chaired by Rep. Yong Kim of California.

"We have said repeatedly and will continue to say that we stand by those commitments," Ford said.

Ford's assurance came as Kim raised others' criticisms of the US commitment to the Philippines.

"Is the US prepared to back up its Mutual Defense Treaty with military force? And what message would it send to other countries in the region if the US doesn't respond forcefully enough to an event that triggers that treaty?" Kim asked Ford.

To prove Washington's commitment, Ford cited the "credibility" of its military partnership with Manila, which she said is "a bedrock part" of the US security in the Indo-Pacific and globally.

Apart from securing a foothold in the Philippines through the nine Enhanced Defense Cooperation Agreement (EDCA) sites across the country, Ford said Washington is also helping an American company operating in Subic operate a shipyard it sees as a "critical strategic infrastructure."

"The fact that US companies are cooperating and helping to build jobs and make sure that that strategic area stays in friendly hands, I think, is incredibly important," Ford said.

US Coast Guard Pacific Area Commander Vice Admiral Andrew Tiongson said the agency is responding to its Philippine counterpart's requests.

His remark came as Kentucky Rep. Andy Barr raised the Philippine Coast Guard's concern about the lack of available assets to defend itself.

"[With] the Philippine Coast Guard, we have our largest security sector assistance program with them. In fact, when you talk about assets, we, through the inter-agency partnerships, built an entire training center to help them with operations as well as maintenance of the vessels that they do have," Tiongson told US lawmakers.

"We have helped them grow their coast guard from 5,000 to their goal of about 35,000. They're still working on that, but they're well into that right now. And we have assigned a maritime adviser to them to help along that growth projection," he added.

The State Department's Assistant Secretary for Multilateral Affairs Jung Pak also said the State Department is coordinating with allied countries in the region to address the PCG's concern.

"Part of the State Department's goals there is to make sure that we're consulting frequently and in-depth to talk about exactly what the Philippines needs," Pak said.

In other developments:

- House Deputy Minority leader France Castro on Friday denounced the Chinese Foreign Ministry for accusing the Philippines of intruding in Scarborough Shoal "without their permission," saying it was China that was intruding on Filipino territory. Castro emphasized that China should recognize the reality that other countries exist in Asia and have their own territories. "China should wake up from its delusion and face reality. The Philippines has every right to protect its territorial integrity and ensure the welfare of its people. China has no right to dictate our actions within our own territory," she added.
- A group of fishermen asked the government for equipment and security so that they can assist the government in documenting the aggressive behavior of the Chinese in the West Philippine Sea. The group, Bigkis ng Mangingisda Federation held meetings with key government agencies to offer their help in documenting the movement of Chinese vessels in the waters of Bajo de Masinloc and other areas where China conducts illegal activities

Ricky Davao on Jackie Lou Blanco's regret over separation:

'We just have to move on'

After actress Jackie Lou Blanco admitted that she had regrets over their separation, Ricky Davao stressed that the split was "never part of the plan" and that all they could do is to "move on and continue living."

It can be recalled that the actress admitted in an earlier "Fast Talk" interview that she wished she did not part ways with Davao. "It happened 23 years ago, and we just have to move on... Itong nangyaring ito, wala sa plano ito," Davao spoke of the split. "You have to accept, move on and continue living. Be positive. "Davao then briefly talked about his current relationship with his non-showbiz girlfriend, saying that his children with Blanco have been very supportive of their father. "They're very happy for me. Syempre, you know, kailangan maging happy ka naman. They respect that and they're happy for me," the actor said. "The following day, I got a long letter saying sorry and she admitted that she's different, that she's part of the LGBT," he continued. "Of course, natanggap ko naman agad (I accepted her right away) because I love her and I respect [her]—so whatever makes her happy."

Aside from Rikki Mae, Davao and Blanco have two more children, namely Arabella and Kenneth. Blanco earlier disclosed that she and Davao currently live near each other, and that their children just go back and forth to their parents' houses.

"We're not chummy-chummy," the actress said of her friendship with Davao. "[We have] not-so-long conversations but we do [talk]."



Why newbie singer had to turn down role in Vilma-Boyet reunion film

Being part of a movie starring Vilma Santos and Christopher de Leon would have been a career-booster for a show biz newcomer like Lizzie Aguinaldo. That's why she couldn't help but feel that she missed out on a big opportunity after turning down a role to focus on her studies.

"Nakakapanghinayang because it would have been a big deal for me. I'm just starting out and being offered a project like that was really humbling. It's just sad that I wouldn't fit with my schedule in school. Even if I'm already pursuing a career in music, I still have to prioritize my studies," she said in an interview for her sophomore single, "Lato-lato" (Star Music).

But if it was any consolation, she said, she was able to meet Vilma and Christopher at a media event for their reunion film, "When I Met You in

Tokyo." "I was just so starstruck because they're veteran stars and are well-respected in the industry. But they were

super nice to me," related Lizzie, who's currently in Grade 9.

Instead of focusing on the what-ifs, however, Lizzie decided that she was going to stay positive and believe that other doors will open for her, sooner or later. "Of course, I still want to be able to try acting. I want to have new, different experiences. I want to be a flexible and versatile artist—the kind who can do anything," she said.

For now, expanding her catalog as a singer is the main goal. After her debut single, the romantic ballad "Baka Pwede Na," Lizzie opted for a more upbeat and danceable follow-up. Like the repeated sounds and clacking of the popular lato-lato toy, the track is about a confused girl who keeps going back to the person who causes her nothing but pain.

'Change of style'

"I wanted a change of style... something more fun. I'm comfortable doing ballads and upbeat songs. I would also love to try out other genres, like rock," Lizzie said about the song, which was composed by filmmaker-songwriter Joven Tan.

"I have been writing my own songs, too. And it's nice that people are getting curious about my music since releasing my first single."

Some of Lizzie's favorite artists and influences include Taylor Swift, Moira dela Torre and Sarah Geronimo. She also dreams of collaborating with SB19 and her show biz crush, Kyle Echarri.

"What SB19 is doing is so impressive. They get to go around the world and spread their music. They're incredible performers ... And I feel they just have this aura and presence when they go up onstage. Stell is my bias. But I feel like Justin is a bias wrecker," she related. "Kyle, on other hand, has a special charm. Bigla akong kinilig."

Lizzie has been making the rounds of television variety shows, including "ASAP," to get a better feel of being on a live stage. "I used to have stage fright. But the more I perform, the more I get used to the situation. Performing in such television shows was just a dream. Now, it's coming true little by little," she said.

Dominic Ochoa denies Rico Yan had relationship with Sabrina M

Dominic Ochoa stood up for his close friend, the late actor Rico Yan, months after former sexy star Sabrina M claimed that they were in a romantic relationship prior to the heartthrob's death in March 2002.

Speaking for the first time since Sabrina M made the revelation in July, Ochoa told the entertainment press for the movie "Fruitcake" that it was highly unlikely that Yan had had a liaison with the then sex siren given the

close dates of Yan's breakup with girlfriend Claudine Barretto and his death.

"Do the math na lang," Ochoa said in a Inquirer Bandera report. "May lakad kami dapat ng March 5 (2002) nina Rico at Marvin [Agustin] eh. Sabi ni Rico hindi siya makakasama kasi anniversary nila ni Claudine [Barretto], ise-celebrate nila. But it turned out, maghihiwalay pala sila, then March 29 namatay na, so saan papasok 'yung [relasyon nila ni Sabrina]?"

(Just do the math... Rico, Marvin Agustin, and I had plans to go out on March 5. Rico told us he wouldn't make it because it was his anniversary with Claudine Barretto at the time, that they would celebrate it. But it turned out that they broke up. Then he died in March 29. How will his "relationship" with Sabrina enter the picture?)

Yan, Agustin and Ochoa were then part of the popular matinee trio called "Whattamen," which was also the title of their sitcom on ABS-CBN. They were also good friends in real life.

Ochoa further said that while Sabrina M may have crossed paths with Yan at some point in their career, nothing ever blossomed between them.

"Marami namang naggi-guest sa show namin, hindi lang siya (Sabrina M) pero walang ganu'n. Nag-usap nga kami nina Tita at Bobby na patahimikin na, kaya nagbigay ng statement then tapos na," he said, referring to Yan's mother Teresita Castro-Yan, and brother, former TV host Bobby Yan.

(There were a blot of people who guested in our show, not just her. But nothing like that ever happened. I talked to Tita and Bobby if they could put the issue to rest. This is why they gave a statement to put an end to this.)

Sabrina M, whose real name is Maricaren Pallasigue,

made headlines last July after saying that she had been romantically involved with Yan for "two years" before his death in March 2002. She claimed that their relationship started when Yan and Barretto already broke up, and that they both opted to keep their relationship private to protect their respective careers.

Barretto, however, contested Sabrina M's claims and had even tapped lawyer Ferdinand Topacio to threaten the sexy actress with legal action if she would not apologize and retract her statements.

But Sabrina M chose to stand her ground and even appeared to be in fighting form as well when she posed for a picture with several lawyers from the Knowledge Advocate of Volunteer Lawyers days later.

The issue was eventually put to rest after Yan's mother made an appeal to the public for the parties to stop making speculations about the late actor's life as he had been dead for 21 years.


During the lengthy fake fight, Ivana "attempted" to settle the "conflict." The situation escalated, leaving Mona worried.

Bea Alonzo had 'unreasonable demands, expectations' during '1521' filming, producer says

A representative of the "1521" producer addressed claims of Bea Alonzo's disappointing experiences during the film shooting, and stressed that they have fulfilled what was stated in their contract with the actress.

a statement sent to INQUIRER. ln film producer Francis Ho's rep refuted and made clarifications on each of the claims by Alonzo's staff.

The rep asserted that Ho paid for Alonzo and her team's hotel accommodation during filming. However,

actress brought with her additional staff "which is not in the signed contract, so hindi sinagot ng producer ang (so the producer did not pay for the) additional room."

The rep further noted that the movie actors stayed at high-end hotels in Palawan, hence their rooms included showers and even swimming pools.

Alonzo also allegedly did not show up during the fitting schedule for her film costume, then later "wanted to redesign the costume according to her style."

"She refused to have [her costume] fixed by the production-design-contracted tailor. So she ended up paying for the repair herself since she refused the services of the production tailor," the rep said.

The producer's camp further belied claims that the talents and dancers were not compensated; that there were no transportation services for them; and that their snacks and drinks were provided by the actress. As per the former's statement, there were instances when Alonzo offered to buy food for the talents but that it's not true that she was the only one providing those.

"All talents were paid. We have payroll receipts from all talents," the rep stressed. "Dancers volunteered their services (free talents) because they believed in the mission of '1521.' They offered their services for free. There was no promise of compensation or picture taking with Bea."

The rep also responded to several other claims by Alonzo's staff and clarified that the producer had rented and bought filming equipment himself; that the air-conditioned tent at the filming was delayed only for the first three days of shooting; that the film director Michael Barder suffered an injury because of an accident during break time and not during the filming; and that real bolos were only used for still photos and not during fight scenes.

"Everything that the producer agreed to in contract with Bea, he fulfilled," the producer's camp stated. "Bea had unreasonable demands and expectations not stated in the contract that the producer did not accommodate because it was not agreed upon and/or they were unreasonable."

They also noted that Alonzo's "1521" costar, Hollywood actor Danny Trejo, had no complaints regarding the film production and has remained "good friends" with pro-



ippines' capacity to combat illegal, unregulated and unreported fishing, as well as protect its marine environments, he said."We are prepared, pending the conclusion of the implementing agreement, to deploy the system in the coming weeks," Hartman

Canada's Dark Vessel Detection Program is part of its 2022 Indo-Pacific Strategy aimed at helping developing countries, like the Philippines, find illegal fishing vessels and protect fish stocks.

Canada has been actively bolstering its security partnerships and increasing its naval presence in the region as part of its Indo-Pacific strategy-which described China as an "increasingly disruptive global power."

In September alone, three Royal Canadian Navy ships visited the country—the HMCS Ottawa, the supply ship MV Asterix and the HMCS Vancouver, which will join Exercise Sama-Sama.

"The Vancouver's participation in Sama-Sama is to promote regional security cooperation, maintain and strengthen maritime partnerships and enhance maritime interoperability," the ship's skipper, Cmdr. Meghan Coates, said in the same briefing.

"We are honored by the opportunity to participate in this complex multilateral exercise, highlighting collaboration between like-minded partners, training and real-world environments," she said.

Naval exercises

The bilateral drill aims to further strengthen international defense cooperation and advance a rulesbased international order while enhancing the Philippine Navy's warfare capabilities, the Armed

Forces of the Philippines said last week.Japan and the United Kingdom will also send ships to Sama-Sama, while Australia and France will send their teams for subject matter exchanges on naval warfare and disaster response. Indonesia and New Zealand will be joining as observers.

Hartman said Canada's participation in Sama-Sama was "doing in deeds what we said we would do in words."

PNP backs harsher road rage penalties

MANILA, Philippines — The Philippine National Police (PNP) has expressed support for a proposal for stiffer penalties for people involved in road rage incidents.



Enacting a law that will impose severe sanctions will deter hot-headed motorists from hurting other vehicle users, according to PNP spokesman Col. Jean Fajardo.

"Enacting laws, particularly addressing road rage, will be supported by your national police," Fajardo told reporters.

Sen. JV Ejercito said enacting a law against road rage may be a deterrent for such type of abuse.

The police have so far documented several road rage cases, the latest of which involved dismissed policeman

Wilfredo Gonzales, who threatened a cyclist with a handgun during a traffic altercation in Quezon City last Aug. 8.

A similar incident occurred in Valenzuela City last Aug. 19, where a Toyota Fortuner driver wielded a handgun when he approached a taxi driver.

The PNP Firearms and Explosives Office has revoked the firearms license of the unnamed motorist.

The motorist must surrender his firearm, a .9 mm caliber handgun, to the police.

If he refuses to comply, Fajardo said the driver could face charges for violation of Republic Act 10591, or the Comprehensive Law on Firearms and Ammunition.

Filipinos spreadingPro-China News

Instead of concentrating on the aggressive actions of China, they are diverting it to Vietnam

MANILA, Philippines — The Chinese government could be involved in a disinformation campaign downplaying the aggression of Chinese vessels in the West Philippine Sea, the Philippine Coast Guard told senators.

Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) spokesperson Jay Tarriela said during a Senate joint inquiry that the "information operation" the PCG has observed regarding the WPS "will not be happening unless it's supported by a state actor."

Tarriela shared this in response to a question by Sen. Risa Hontiveros on whether the PCG, based on its intelligence operations, has found evidence that those spreading disinformation are part of a Chinese state-sponsored campaign.

The spokesperson said that the PCG has only obtained information through the journalists who notify them of possible disinformation campaigns on the WPS through the emails they

know... receive emails trying to divert the attention of Filipinos. Instead of concentrating on the aggressive actions of China, they are diverting it to Vietnam," Tarriela added.

"For the PCG that's the only information we have," the PCG spokesperson added.

To recall, Tarriela warned Filipinos in August against online peddlers of disinformation on the WPS. He described these sources of disinformation as "mouthpieces of the Chinese government" and believed they were causing confusion among Filipinos about the situation at the WPS.

Before that, Tarriela said that all those who make excuses for China's aggressive behavior in the tense waterways are "unpatriotic" and "traitor" to the country.

Tarriela's fiery statement was referring to the incident when Chinese vessels fired water cannons at Philippine vessels on their way to a resupply mission in Ayungin (Second Thomas) Shoal last August 5.

During the Senate's joint inquiry, Hontiveros stressed in her opening statement that the P10 million intelligence funds given to the PCG every year since 2009 are "too little" given that the PCG defends the country against a much larger nation.

Currently, a significant portion of the PCG's intelligence work relies on humint or human intelligence, Hontiveros said.

However, given the magnitude and scope of the Coast Guard's role in maritime governance, it is necessary to augment this with sigint or signals intelligence, the senator added.

"If there are civilian agencies whose mandate doesn't involve responding to our national security issues but still receive confidential and intel funds, why isn't the Coast Guard receiving more? Shouldn't they be given a larger share of confidential and intel funds? Isn't this common sense?" Hontiveros said in Filipino.

Senate President Juan Miguel Zubiri recently vowed to augment the confidential and intelligence funds of the PCG and the Philippine Navy to provide them "full logistical and operational support" in fending off maritime aggression.
