



Enrique Gil is unbothered by the possibility that his current popularity might one day fade.


"It's part of life," he said. "It's part of growing up. Anyway, I don't plan to be an artist forever."

The "Can't Buy Me Love" star is the cover for Vogue Man Philippines.



Philippine president angers China with new laws to demarcate South China Sea territories

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Ir. signed two laws on Friday reaffirming the extent of his country's maritime territories and right to resources, including in the South China Sea, angering China, which claims the hotly disputed waterway almost in its entirety.

China's foreign ministry said it summoned the Philippines ambassador to China to lodge a "stern protest." The ministry condemned the move as an attempt to "solidify the illegal ruling of the South China Sea arbitration case through domestic legislation."

Confrontations between Chinese and Philippine coast guard and naval forces in the disputed sea passage have spiked alarmingly since last year. That has sparked fears that the United States — Manila's longtime treaty ally — may get drawn in a major conflict.

The laws, called the Philippine Maritime Zones act and the Philippine Archipelagic Sea Lanes act, were signed by Marcos in a nationally televised ceremony attended by top military and national security officials. They further cement Manila's rejection of China's claims to virtually the entire sea passage, and stipulate jail terms and stiff fines for violators.

"These signal our resolve to protect our maritime resources, preserve our rich biodiversity and ensure that our waters remain a source of life and livelihood for all Filipinos," Marcos

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Mao Ning said the move "seriously infringes on China's territorial sovereignty and maritime rights and interests in the South China Sea."

'China strongly condemns and firmly opposes it," she said.

In a new national map it released last year the Chinese government demarcated its claim to virtually the entire South China Sea with vague dash lines that drew protests and rejections from rival coastal states and government, including Malaysia, Vietnam, Taiwan, Indonesia and the Philippines.

The maritime zones act demarcates key parts of the Philippine archipelago's territory and outlying waters where it has full sovereignty and sovereign rights under international law and the 1982 U.N. Convention on the Law of the Sea, Philippine officials said.

Those zones include the country's Exclusive Economic Zone, a 200-nautical-mile (370-kilometer) stretch of water, where a coastal state like the Philippines

coastal state's security would not come under threat.

The archipelagic sea lanes act allows the Philippines to designate sea lanes and air routes in the archipelago where foreign ships and aircraft could transit under its regulation and in compliance with international law.

"These legal instruments solidify our territory and enhances our ability to protect our country against any infringement," National Security Adviser Eduar-

Marcos said the laws comply with international law and the UNCLOS, but many of their provisions stand in stark contrast to Beijing's claims in the South China Sea and would likely be rejected and defied by China.

It's unclear how the Philippines could

enforce the laws, which take effect 15 days after their publication in the government's official gazette or in a newspaper, given China's increasingly aggressive actions to push its claims.

Copies of the laws signed by Marcos were not immediately available but a final version of the maritime zones bill stated that "all artificial islands constructed within the Philippine EEZ belong to the Philippine government."

China has transformed seven disputed reefs into what are now missile-protected island bases, including the Mischief Reef, which lies within the Philippines' Exclusive Economic Zone.

The law based the Philippines' maritime rights on UNCLOS, Philippine laws and a 2016 international arbitration ruling that invalidated China's extensive territorial claims based on historical grounds.

China refused to participate in that arbitration, rejected the ruling and continues to defy it. Its massive coast guard, navy, air force and suspected militia fleets have used water cannons, military grade lasers and dangerous sea and air maneuvers to intimidate rival forces it accuses of straying into what Beijing calls its terri-

Washington has repeatedly warned that it's obligated to defend the Philippines, its oldest treaty ally in Asia, if Filipino forces, aircraft or ships come under an armed attack in the disputed waters.



Are More People Starting to Regret Buying Their Electric Cars?

TORONTO — A new survey finds fewer drivers intend to make their next car purchase an electric

Intentions to buy a fully electric, plug-in hybrid or hybrid vehicle in the next two years slightly dipped to 50 per cent this year, compared with 52 per cent in 2023.

Worlwdwide, there is a decline in sales of EV's.

Countries like Japan and Germany — home to some of the largest automotive incumbents have seen not just a slowdown in the growth rate, but an outright decline in EV sales. The drop in Germany was particularly sharp in August, when sales plunged

In the Philippines, a A new study shows that 29 percent of EV owners are considering going back to traditional ICEs.

But whether we like it or not, we must come to the conclusion that electric cars are the present and the future of the automotive industry. The infrastructure, as a matter of fact, has only gotten infinitely better over time. In the



Philippines, we have charging stations along national expressways and malls. . On top of these, some hotels, like Seda in Taguig have one, as well. We can even have one built into our homes for an extra fee.

But as it turns out, a Mobility Consumer Pulse report shows

that even the most loyal EV owner is still worried about charging and is seriously considering going back to internal combustion engines (ICE)

Individuals specified problems like having to go to specific directions just to go to a charging station, which greatly affects their own travel time. 24 percent of the respondents also claimed that they couldn't charge at home and the act of worrying was apparently too stressful for 21 percent of the EV owners surveyed.

But perhaps one of the more troubling reasons for the trend is that the cost of ownership is just too high, it seems, with 34 percent of respondents saying that the maintenance costs can be ab-

Getting into the data, roughly 35 percent of respondents emphasized that public charging infrastructure is still not at an optimal level. Among the other reasons cited for the would-be switch include the driving experience and long-distance traveling. The latter is more of a function of anxiety, worrying if the charge is even enough to cover the distance.

As it stands, the firm's survey has confirmed that 29 percent of its respondents said that they were looking to go back to an ICE vehicle sooner rather than later.

Naig recently made headlines after showbiz insider Ogie Diaz reported on his vlog that the actress-businesswoman was arrested by police over the weekend.





Mel Galeon of FV Foods welcomes Trudeau's holiday sales tax break for Canadians by Anglie Berlin

TORONTO - While there may be some grumblings about the logistics of the HST holdiay from some businesses, you won't hear one from Mel Galeon, owner of FV Foods, the purveyor of Filipino baked goods in Toronto with wholesaling business that serves the rest of Canada.

'That's better for us. We have a chance against the competition who are underground businesses," says Galeon.

'We pay taxes, they don't," he added.

The Liberal's proposed tax break was voted on in the House of Commons on Nov. 28 and was approved with support from the NDP. The legislature voted in favour of the bill on Nov. 28 in the House of Commons. The federal tax break will run from Dec. 14 to Feb. 15. Canada's federal government has approved a two-month tax break, and the Ontario government has plans to match it.

Ontario Finance Minister Peter Bethlenfalvy announced Nov. 27 the province would also remove the provincial sales tax (PST) from the same items the federal government is axing the tax on.

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said he would remove the goods and services tax (GST), or a blended harmonized sales tax (HST), from a short list of items.

Below are some of the items that would have applied on FV Foods items that they are selling.

- Cakes, muffins, pies, pastries, tarts, cookies, doughnuts, brownies and croissants with sweetened filling or coating
- · Pudding, including flavoured gelatine, mousse, flavoured whipped dessert product or any other products similar to pudding Prepared salads, sandwiches, platters of cheese, cold cuts, fruit or
- vegetables and other arrangements of prepared food Food or beverages heated for consumption, beverages dispensed at the place where they are sold and those bought as part of a
- Christmas trees

Universe 2023.

In Ontario, there is already no PST added to children's clothing and some meals.

Called an Act respecting temporary cost of living relief (affordability), it's a temporary change to the Excise Tax Act.

Federal NDP leader Jagmeet Singh previously said he supports the tax break, although he'd prefer it to be permanent on other expenses

such as internet, phone and home heating bills.

While the tax break may save residents money, it also leads to a government budget shortfall. Ontario reported that Ottawa's tax holiday will cost the province \$1 billion. As is, the proposal is expected to cost \$6 billion, but Singh has said he won't support that rebate, unless the handouts include seniors and people with disabilities.

In Ontario, a \$200 rebate is coming for residents in the spring of 2025. It was announced during the fall economic speech, and is for all taxpayers and children who qualify for a Canada Child Benefit.

When it comes to the Working Canadians Rebate — a federal proposal to give \$250 to all working Canadians making less than \$150,000 per year — that item is not yet getting voted on.

Even as the Liberals' "tax holiday" bill moves closer to becoming

law, the deputy prime minister on November 29 lamented what appears to be a lack of support for the proposed \$250 rebate cheaues that were originally part of the federal government's plan.

The \$250 cheques for Canadians who worked and earned up to \$150,000 in the past year were proposed last week alongside the two-month holiday on GST and HST on certain items as a way to ease affordability concerns. The rebate would have rolled out in spring

But on November 27, the cheques were missing from a stand-

alone bill the government put forward for the tax break, with the government citing a lack of support for the measure.

We are in a minority in Parliament, and we sought the support of opposition parties," Freeland told reporters. "Unfortunately, we weren't able to get that support."

Leader Jagmeet Singh said his party would support the rebates if the cheques included more Canadians.

He said he initially thought the cheques would go to any Canadian who earned under the net income cap.

Under the original proposal, Canadians who had worked in 2023 and earned less than \$150,000 in net income would be eligible for the cheques. Singh says he wants to see the rebate include seniors who weren't working, students who weren't working, people on disability who weren't working and others unable to work last year.


Freeland did not say if the cheques will be expanded, noting the government will work with different parties to support working Canadians.

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau did not appear willing Friday to budge on his plan to send a \$250 rebate to "hardworking Canadians," despite pressure from the opposition to give the money to seniors and people who are not able to work. Prime Minister Justin Trudeau criticized the NDP for not supporting the cheques.

"To see the NDP, which was supposedly the party of workers, turn its back on hardworking Canadians and say, no, we shouldn't be delivering this cheque unless we expand it massively, is not recognizing working Canadians for the challenges they're facing," Trudeau said.

He went on to also criticize Conservative Leader Pierre Poilievre for not supporting the cheques, as well as the tax break which the NDP did vote for Thursday night which allowed it to be sent to the Senate.

Poilievre said in a post on X that Canadians "don't need a temporary two-month tax trick."

'Hindi kami puro bobo dun': Ex-AFP chief rejects Duterte call for military action

A former military chief of staff has spurned former President Rodrigo Duterte's call for the military to "correct" the "fractured governance" of his successor, President Ferdinand Marcos Jr.

Retired Army general Dionisio Santiago, who also served in the Duterte Cabinet as Dangerous Drugs Board chief, said the

country will not benefit if the Armed Forces decides to break the chain of command and follow Duterte.

"Ano mapapala namin? Will it help the country kung madadamay pa kami sa gulo? Kung makikigulo ang military ay patay tayo. Sigurado ba tayo na pag military ang nag-take-over we can run the government better? Wala tayong assurance nun. Masyadong malaking gamble 'yun. Maghintay tayo ng eleksyon," he said in a TeleRadyo Serbisyo interview.

He rejected talk that the military should follow Duterte because he increased the salaries of military and police personnel.

"The military, just like you, we are thinking people. Hindi naman kami irrational na tao. Sinasabi in-increase 'yung

salary. Thank you pero there's a limit sa pag-appreciate namin. In-increase 'yung salary namin pero...papayagin namin kung ano lang gawin 'yung gustong gawin? May limit 'yun."

Santiago said the Philippine military has learned its lesson after its leaders backed previous uprisings such as the 1986 People Power Revolution that ousted President Ferdinand Marcos and the 2001 EDSA Dos revolt that toppled President Joseph Estrada.

"Nadala na rin kami. Nakialam kami, anong nangyari sa bayan natin? May nangyari ba? Ganun din," he said.

He said that while the former president will always have his supporters, active military officers will always follow the constitutional mandate.

"Pinapagulo na lang nila ang bayan. Actually nakakasama sa kanila 'yan, ini-entice mo ang military, nananahimik 'yang mga 'yan. May naka-usap akong isang high ranking military...ang sabi, basta kami sa Constitution."

"Wala kayong magagawa sa military. Kapag sinabing constitu-

tional mandate, ang susundan niyan is the commander in chief...Kung gusto mong sundan ka, mag-presidente ka ulit."

"In the end, what prevails to the military people is the common good, the greater good. Hindi kami pumasok sa serbisyo para mag-serbisyo ng personal interest, individual interest."

He also rejected talk of a loyalty check after Duterte's call, saying the loyalties of officials such as former national police chief Ronald dela Rosa are already known.

"The military is a thinking military, hindi naman kami puro bobo dun."

Rufa Mae Quinto's lawyer says she has warrant of arrest, claims she's a 'victim'

Rufa Mae Quinto's lawyer, Atty. Mary Louise Reyes, confirmed that the actress has a standing warrant of arrest.

According to a report on "24 Oras," Monday, she is facing a case in relation to the issue of Dermacare, the same company involved in the arrest of actress-entrepreneur Neri Naig.

Reyes said that Quinto is charged with 14 counts of violation of Section 8 of the Securities Regulation Code, which states that securities such as shares and investments may not be sold in the Philippines without a registration statement duly filed with and approved by the SEC.

She clarified, however, that Quinto is not facing a large-scale estafa complaint.

"She will face those charges... mag-voluntary surrender siya and magpo-post po kami ng bail for that. She's worried kasi hindi naman totoo 'yung allegations kasi my client po is just a brand ambassador, a model-endorser," Reyes said.

"Ni hindi sa kanya nakapagbayad ng downpayment, tapos 'yung mga tseke po puro tumalbog. Lahat po 'yan hawak naman po namin 'yung ebidensya, ipe-present naming sa

Reyes said Quinto is still considering whether she will file a case.

In September 2023, the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) released an advisory about Dermacare-Beyond Skin Care Solutions, saying that the company was not authorized to solicit investments because they are not registered and have no license to sell securities.

In the same advisory, the commission said that salesmen, brokers, dealers, agents, promoters, influencers, and endorsers of Dermacare may be sued.

into motion the alleged kill order she made on President Marcos.

But the big question is, will a fake assassination attempt be carried out just to trigger such kill order?

"She is not a champion of the masses. She, like her father, has made public that she is willing to kill, kill the President, the First Lady, the Speaker of the House, and others," Valeriano said of Vice President Duterte.

"All she probably needs to do now is stage an assassination attempt on herself, so that her orders to kill the President will be carried out," Valeriano noted, as he raised a rather dreadful and worrisome scenario.

Last month, amid her apparent anger over how the House of Representatives treated her chief-of-staff Zuleika Lopez, Duterte bared in a press conference that she had tapped someone to target President Marcos, Speaker Martin Romualdez, and First Lady Liza Araneta-Marcos in the event that she herself gets

Several ranking House members have called on authorities to investigate Duterte's statements.

However, Valeriano would rather see law enforcers take the Vice President "into custody".

"The time for parliamentary courtesy is over. It is now time for the police to enforce the law and take her into custody for crimes against public order, the Filipino people, and the Constitution," said the member of the Committee on Good Government and Public Accountability.

The good government panel has been holding hearings on the alleged misuse of P612.5 million confidential and intelligence funds (CIFs) under Vice President Duterte.

The committee launched the investigation by virtue of a scathing privilege speech from Valeriano wherein he raised allegations of public funds misuse.

Scandal nearly killed Gary V's career early

To celebrate his 40-year journey as Mr. Pure Energy, Gary Valenciano will hold his two-night concert 'One More Time' on Dec. 20 and 22 at the Smart Araneta Coliseum. Four decades ago, on April 13, 1984, his first major concert 'A-Live' was held at the Big Dome and directed by fellow singer Jet Montelibano of the Music and Magic.

Even when Gary went on tour in the US last October, people were bugging him, "Hey, are you going to have a repeat of your MOA Arena concert?" He gave very tentative answers.

The one that capped it all was Smart Araneta Coliseum, where Gary had his first concert four decades ago. He is set to return to where it all began, ready to deliver an energetic, nostalgic celebration of his storied career.

"Araneta told me, 'You started your career with us,"'Gary said. "Why don't you complete this whole 40-year journey with us, as well.'"

Gary's first major concert, "A-Live," was held at the Big Dome and directed by fellow singer Jet Montelibano of the Music and Magic on April 13, 1984.

Interestingly, that was the time when Gary was in the middle of controversy. Angeli Pangilinan, who would become his wife, was pregnant with the guy who calls himself "the original sin," their firstborn, Paolo Valenciano.

"What happened was hyped up to such a huge controversy," Gary recalled.

"In may ways, it really was. I was only 19 years old at that time, almost 20, I was not married yet and I was about to become an unwed father.

"I'll never forget the late Ricky
Lo. When it came to journalism,
he was the guy you didn't want
to cross paths with. You don't
want to catch him on the wrong
side. So, I remember sitting down
in the press conference two weeks
before my first-ever major concert.

"Ricky looked at me and asked, 'What we want to know is if it is true.' I even teased, 'Yeah, it's true. I have a concert on April 13 (1984), Friday at the Araneta Coliseum.' But Ricky countered that. 'What we want to know is if you were the unwed father that other writers were speculating about."'

G a r y was left with no choice but to honestly answer the auestion.

"We had a meeting prior to the press con-

ference," he further shared. "What do we do? Do we bring Angeli to the States? Does she stay with my family? Does she go to Australia?"

His eldest sister, Diane, butted in and said, "Why don't we ask Gary what he thinks?" Apparently, he could not decide at 19. "I just told them, 'Look, if people come to the concert, then that's a good sign.'

"But if our tickets don't sell and there was nobody who came, then, that was the sign that my career was good while it lasted."

"It was tough, at that time," he recalled.
"The moment before I opened the show at

Araneta — I opened from the bleachers and there was a ramp that went down attached to the stage."

"Before I went up onstage, we had a short prayer. I had no relationship with the Lord yet at that time. My sister, Gina, entered the dressing room crying. I asked her why was she crying? She told us, 'We're sold out.'"

"That was when I started to feel nervous. There were people out there. So, people who watched me then, were probably thinking and had this mindset, 'Who is this Gary Valenciano who was so controversial?' But people came.

"So, I went up the bleachers and I couldn't hear the audience at all. The National Anthem was played and the opening song started. Ironically, it called Brand New Day. My two guests Sharon Cuneta and Zsa Zsa Padilla already came out.

"They performed with me. That was it. If I tell you the story again today, my hair stands. I guess that was the sign. I told them, I guess we have to stay. It was a good thing I did."

From that time on, there was no stopping Gary V from conquering the music world. Even

sic charts. He entered TV and had his career performing on "ASAP" every Sunday for the past two decades.

He was never out of the music scene. He became synonymous with musical excellence and high-energy performances over the last four decades.

His wife, Angeli, remains the wind beneath his wings all the 40 years they are together. She never left his side.

Last year, Gary marked his 100th solo show at the Music Museum with

his wildly successful sold-out, 10-night concert series, "Gary V: Back at the Museum." From an initial run of four shows in August 2023, it was extended twice, underscoring Gary's enduring popularity and the impact of his music and performances.

He also received multiple standing ovations from jam-packed audiences during his US-Canada tour. Gary's original announcement for "Pure Energy: One Last Time" initially led many to assume that he would officially retire from performing.

However, he has since clarified that while he's stepping back from headlining solo shows in large venues like arenas and domes, his

passion for music and performing remains as strong as ever.

Gary's career has been marked by passion, resilience and a strong connection with his audience — qualities that have only deepened through personal health battles. That unbelievably includes a 45-year struggle with Type 1 diabetes, hepatitis, tuberculosis, arthroscopic surgeries on his right knee, a heart bypass surgery, kidney cancer, dengue fever, COVID-19, pneumonia and an angioplasty this 2024.

But despite such medical challenges, Gary's commitment to his craft is as strong as ever, as is his desire to uplift and inspire through his music.



Canada orders shutdown of TikTok's Canadian business, app access to continue

TORONTO - I can still see my friend Jun Alapan in Tiktok in Canada.

Canada on November 6 ordered Chinese-owned TikTok's business in the country to be dissolved, citing national-security risks, but added the government was not blocking Canadians' access to the short-video app or their ability to create content.

"The government is taking action to address the specific national security risks related to ByteDance Ltd's operations in Canada through the establishment of TikTok Technology Canada Inc," Innovation Minister Francois-Philippe Champagne said in a statement.

Ottawa last year began reviewing TikTok's plan to invest and expand its business in Canada. ByteDance is TikTok's Chinese parent company.



Under Canadian law, the government can assess potential risks to national security from foreign investments, such as the TikTok proposal. The law prevents the government from revealing the details of such investments.

"The decision was

based on the information and evidence collected over the course of the review and on the advice of Canada's security and intelligence community and other government partners," Champagne added.

TikTok said it will challenge the order in court.

"Shutting down TikTok's Canadian offices and destroying hundreds of well-paying local jobs is not in anyone's best interest, and today's shutdown

order will do just that," a TikTok spokesperson said in a statement.

Canada has banned the TikTok app from government-issued devices, saying it presents an unacceptable level of risk to privacy and security.

TikTok and ByteDance sued in U.S. federal court in May, seeking to block a law signed by President Joe Biden.

The law, signed by Biden on April 24, gives ByteDance until Jan. 19 to sell TikTok or face a ban. The White House has said it wants to see Chinese-based ownership ended on national-security grounds but not a ban on TikTok.


"Let's leave it at that. I just clarified that because I don't want people, like, assuming," she added.

'Hello, Love, Again' Review: Sequel to Beloved Filipino Romance Reunites Two Ex-Lovers in Post-COVID Calgary

When Hello, Love, Goodbye (HLG) was released into theaters in 2019, it became an unparalleled box-office success, becoming high-Philippine est-grossing film of all time. HLG, with Kathryn Bernardo and Alden Richards made director Cathy Garcia-Sampana as the modern day director for commercial romance films. (It was surpassed by the time-traveling romance "Rewind" earlier this year.)

Set in Hong Kong, Hello, Love, Goodbye captured the hearts of Filipinos locally and abroad in its depictions of the struggles of overseas Filipino workers (OFWs) Joy (Bernardo) and Ethan (Richards) and the per-

sistent tensions between fulfilling familial responsibilities and chasing personal aspirations.

Part of the appeal of the original film's ambiguous ending was the promise of a possibility.

I was hoping they would shoot in Toronto. I know the last shot in Hello Love Goodbye showed Bernardo going to Vancouver. However, I remember that Vancouver was the point of entry when I immigrated to Canada.

What made people want to watch this is the hope that they would end up together. Of course, as all Filipino movies with two people in a relationship, you know that they will end up together. We just want to see how they get back. A Filipino romantic movie is like a Disney movie in the 70's and 80's. A that time, Disney movies always end up "Happily ever after." And Filipino movies will never shy way from that formula unless you want to lose money.

After 5 years, how will they complete the story was the question in everyone's mind. They compress the 5 years from HongKong to Calgary, including the pandemic into their love story. And their economic situations have been reversed.

Primarily set in 2024, "Hello, Love, Again" Joy is now a successful caretaker living in Calgary. In between studying to become a nurse, and debating a move to the United States, she helps secure domestic cash jobs for other members of the Filipino community who attempt to transition from tem-



mixed with drama showing a portrait of the different problems confronting foreign workers.

There are scenes dedicated to discussing the pathways to become a permanent resident in Canada, how to work under the table even on a tourist visa, how to get permanent status.

It did not shy away from showing the

courier in an unfamiliar city, being accidentally pricked by a syringe while cleaning the trash. Doing these lowly jobs puts a strain in any relationship. Ethan become disappointed with Canada and Joy's determination to survive her and build a better life are both reasonable responses to their environment. There are big differences between the HLG and Hello, Love, Again. Hello, Love, Goodbye showed a beautiful portrait of Hong Kong's vibrant life and community that doesn't shy away from being an equally damning portrait of the suffering and political underbelly that often subjects our OFWs to abuse. It also showed the pedestrian bridge where Filipinos converge. If this was shot in Toronto, they could have shot it at Earl bales Park on a summer weekend. You can walk the whole park and you can probably count in your hands who are not Filipino in that park.

However, I still feel that Hello Love Again resorts to melodrama that was not as obvious with Hello Love Goodbye. But the acting is top-notch. Bernardo is convincing as she shifts between assured yet cold present-day Marie and the emotionally vulnerable Joy, while Richards relies on his eyes to express his emotions.

Joross Gamboa and Jennica Garcia provide good comic relief in an otherwise dramatic film.

However, despite the return to form of a stereotype Filipino movie of melodrama, it is still worth watching it.

There's the uncomfortable scenes of Joy and Ethan arguing about the kind of cash jobs they are willing to take in Canada during the COVID-19 pandemic. When pride is on the line, painful words are exchanged. The difference in their goals become a flash-point for argument.



The annual Santa Claus parade takes over Toronto but future events in doubt by Angle Berlin

TORONTO: The Philippine Heritage band joined the Toronto Santa Claus Parade. Thousands of people lined the street to see the iconic floats, marching bands and Santa Claus himself. But while the festive spirit shines bright, the parade has faced some challenges with funding.

This may be the last year the Philippine Heritage band will be marchin at the Santa Claus Parade as questions about the budget of the aprade itself is in question.

The holiday spirit officially arrived in Toronto Sunday with the 120th Santa Claus parade taking over the downtown core as thousands turned out to see the iconic floats, marching bands and of course Santa Claus himself. But has the beloved tradition marched through the city streets for the last time?

Toronto's Santa Claus parade is believed to be one of the largest parade productions in North America and the oldest Santa Claus parade in the world, running uninterrupted since 1905.



But ahead of this year's edition of the parade, organizers indicated the event's future might be in doubt due to growing inflationary and operational costs.

'We've been very honest in the last week about our funding shortfall and how difficult it is. We're a year-round endeavour to plan and organize and ultimately pay for this parade as a not-forprofit," said parade CEO Clay Charters.

Charters said last weekend



that corporate sponsors have traditionally provided the bulk of funding for the parade in previous years. However, due to corporate budget constraints and the growing costs associated with the operation and production of the event, they needed to raise \$250,000 to fill the current deficit. As of Sunday, they were more than 55 per cent towards their goal with more than \$136,000 raised through a gofundme campaign.

Mayor Olivia Chow says the city has committed money through its Special Events Stabilization Initiative (SESI) fund to keep the event going, calling the parade an essential part of Toronto's history.

"If you think about even just the kind of magic and the economic benefits because people are going into the coffee shop, shopping and all of that.. so we hope that both from private donors and the federal government coming in, right now the city is in for \$100,000, the province is in, we just need the feds to step up."

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau pledged his support last week, calling it a great tradition that they "want to keep it going for years to come." However, the specifics of the federal government's support have yet to be revealed.

This year's parade featured 18 marching bands and 26 floats and with over 700,000 spectators in attendance, organizers are optimistic that the parade will be able to continue next

What if Canada copy Australia's under-16 Socmed ban?

TORONTO: Last year, I asked 13-year old Nathalie of Toronto if the facebook page Natz Memoir is hers or her

"Both of us," she says. "We run it." Good for her that she can have a social media page in Canada.

In Australia, a legislation approved by parliament on November 28, orders social media firms to take 'reasonable steps' to prevent young teens from having accounts. Social media giants hit out at a landmark Australian law banning them from signing up under-16s, describing it as a rush job littered with "many unanswered questions."

The UN children's charity UNICEF Australia warned the law was no "silver bullet" against online harm and could push kids into "covert and unregulated" spaces online.

It is due to come into effect after a year.

Prime Minister Anthony Albanese said the age limit
may not be implemented perfectly — much like existing restrictions
on alcohol — but it was "the right

on alcohol — but it was "the right thing to do." The crackdown on sites like Facebook, Instagram and X would

Facebook, Instagram and X would lead to "better outcomes and less harm for young Australians," he said, speaking to reporters.

 ${\rm 'Traumatic'}$

Tech companies said that despite the law's perceived shortcomings, they would engage with the government in shaping how it could be implemented in the next 12 months.

The legislation offers almost no details on how the rules will be enforced — prompting concern among ex-

perts that it will be largely symbolic.

Members of the public appeared doubtful.

"I don't think it will actually change a lot

"I don't think it will actually change a lot because I don't see that there's really a strong way to police it," 41-year-old Emily Beall said in Melbourne.

A Snapchat spokesperson had raised "serious concerns" about the law and that "many unanswered questions" remained about how it would work.

But the company said it would engage closely with the government to develop an approach balancing "privacy, safety and practicality."

UNICEF Australia policy chief Katie Maskiell said young people need to be protected online but also included in the digital world. "This ban risks pushing children into increasingly covert and unregulated online spaces as well as preventing them from accessing aspects of the online world essential to their wellbeing," she said.

Leo Puglisi, a 17-year-old online journalist based in Melbourne, was critical of the legislation.

He founded streaming channel 6 News, which provides hourly news bulletins on national and international issues, in 2019 at the age of 11.

Global Attention

"We've been built up by having 13 to 15-year-olds see 6 News online and then join the team," Puglisi said in a statement. "We have said that this ban seriously risks restricting creativity from our young people, no matter what passion or future career they want to explore," he added. Exemptions will likely be granted to some companies, such as WhatsApp and YouTube, which teenagers may need to use for recreation, school work or other reasons. The legislation will be closely monitored by other countries, with many weighing whether to implement similar hans

Lawmakers from Spain to Florida have proposed social media bans for young teens, although none of the measures have been implemented yet.

China has restricted access for minors since 2021, with under-14s not allowed to spend more than 40 minutes a day on Douyin, the Chinese version of TikTok.







'Hello, Love, Again' crosses P1-billion mark

The Kathryn Bernardo and Alden Richards starrer "Hello, Love, Again" has cemented its place in Philippine cinema history after it crossed the P1-billion mark at the global box office and became the first Filipino movie to



reach the milestone.

Ten days after it opened in theaters, ABS-CBN Films announced that the romantic drama film had earned P1.06 billion at the worldwide box office, as of November 23.

"Thank you for the love, and we love you a billion more," read the caption to the announcement posted on the Instagram accounts of Star Cinema and GMA Pictures.

The sequel has been breaking records at the box office since its release. On Nov. 13, it earned the biggest first-day ticket sales of P85 million and achieved the highest single-day gross of P131 million last Nov. 16.

It also broke its way into the US Top 10 box office at No. 8 and has become the highest-grossing Filipino movie of all time as of Nov. 22, dethroning the 2023 Metro

Manila Film Festival (MMFF) entry, "Rewind," starring Dingdong Dantes and Marian Rivera, which earned P924 million in its theatrical run.

"Hello, Love, Again" is the continuation of the 2019 blockbuster hit "Hello, Love, Goodbye." Directed by Cathy Garcia-Sampana, the sequel picks up Joy's (Bernardo) and Ethan's (Richards) story five years after the events of the first film.

"Hello, Love, Again" also served as the closing film this year's Asian World Film Festival. In the same festival, Bernardo bagged the Snow Leopard Rising Star Award.

Miss Universe PH defends Chelsea Manalo from 'unfair' comments

The Miss Universe Philippines organization (MUPH) has come to the defense of its reigning queen Chelsea Manalo amid attacks on her made by Adam Genato, a Filipino content creator.

"[MUPH] condemns the recent video commentary of Mr. Adam Genato regarding [Manalo]. His comments are unfair, insensitive, hurtful, and dismissive of her accomplishments. We do not tolerate bullying and irresponsible vlogging, especially from an accredited MUPH media partner whom we have welcomed to our events," the organization posted last November 22.

The statement stems from a video commentary Genato uploaded on his platform, criticizing Manalo and her Miss Universe performance. She advanced to the Top 30 of the 73rd Miss Universe pageant in Mexico City last Nov. 16, and was later proclaimed Miss Universe Asia.

"Kung si Ahtisa Manalo ang pinadala natin dito sa Mexico, or even si Christi McGarry, Diyos ko, siguro Lord, buong tatlong linggo nitong mula Oct. 29 to Nov. 18, siguro hindi na tayo matutulog. Gano'n kaingay iyong dalawang iyon," Genato said.

"Kasi tignan mo, sino ang pinanalo nila? Si Dennmark, 'di ba Barbie-looking? Eh sino ba ang closest Barbie-looking natin ngayon dito noong nakaraang MUPH? 'Di ba si Ahtisa?" he added.

Ahtisa was second runner-up to Manalo in the 2024 Miss Universe Philippines pageant, who then competed in the first Miss Cosmo contest where she finished in the Top 10. McGarry was fourth runner-up in the national competition.

The MUPH said: "For too long, we have allowed such behavior to be tolerated because bashers and haters

have been an accepted part of social media. But in reality, we still have a choice to normalize it or speak up against it."

"We believe that content creators, bloggers, and vloggers, should be guided by respect, responsibility, and decency. In particular, we believe pageant vloggers

should exercise greater care in expressing opinions about our delegates, and refrain from making demeaning statements," it added. "Making potentially or intentionally controversial statements for clout and engagement, but at the expense of delegates, is detestable."

McGarry also took to social media to share her thoughts.

"[L]et's please not continue to talk about the 'would've' and 'could've's - it's not what my page is for! [praying hands emoji] Look forward. Miss Universe is granted by destiny. Chelsea is my sis, and my history-making queen, and she should be yours too! [Philippine flag emoji] [red heart emoji]" she said.

A member of Manalo's team, celebrity photographer Seven Barretto, was the first to call out Genato, saying the

latter invalidated her merits.

Genato has already issued an apology to Manalo and her team in an emotional outburst released on his platform.

Nadia Montenegro healing after 'near-death' experience

Nadia Montenegro is on the road to recovery after

a "near-death experience" during a recent procedure due to her Wolff-Parkinson-White (WPW) Syndrome, which she said she was diagnosed with when she was 17.

Montenegro updated her followers about her condi-

tion in a video on her Facebook page last November 23, reiterating that she just needs to heal after her procedure. "I just want everyone to know, I'm back home. I just need to heal a little," she began.

Montenegro then shared that she had a heart ablation procedure, which restores one's heartbeat by making a small cut in the groin before inserting catheters in the veins or arteries. This would then lead to freezing cells or using small burns to create scars on the heart.

The procedure came after her blood pressure went down, which led to her being rushed to the St. Luke's Medical Center in Bonifacio Global City in Taguig.

"Ablation procedure po ang ginawa sa puso ko. I'm healing medyo bruised up lang po," she said. "Ang procedure po na ginawa ay hindi po stent, hindi rin po ako na angioplasty, hindi rin po ako na-open heart surgery dahil sobra po ang aking nerve. Kinailangan pong i-cut 'vun."

"Ang nangyari lang po noong Friday ay tinakbo ko ang aking sarili... ang aking BP po ay bumaba na ng 60/49 kaya hindi po naging maganda. Ako po ay inilipat ng SL [St. Luke's] QC muna and then nilipat sa SL (St. Luke's) BGC," she added.

At some point after the surgery, the screen veteran went through a "near-death experience" which was witnessed by her family. "Ako po ay nasa kwarto na and may nangyari pong isang emergency na ang sabi po ay ako'y nawala nang apat na minuto, nangitim nalang po ako, nawala ang aking heartbeat," she said.

"Hindi ko po alam kung ano ang nangyari, basta paggising ko ay andoon po ang aking nanay at ang aking mga anak at nakita po nila 'yung nangyari," she added.

Montenegro then revealed that she recovered from WPW Syndrome, but still needs to undergo "breathing exercises" to help regulate her heartbeat.

"Ako'y masaya na nalampasan ko 'to dahil po sa inyong mga dasal at dahil sa napakafaithful nating Diyos. And marami pa po akong gagawin sa buhay... I'll be back soon. I'll be working soon. Papalakas lang po.

Maraming salamat po sa inyong lahat, God bless us all and ingatan ang health," she said.

The actress' heart procedure was first disclosed by her daughter Ynna Asistio on Facebook. In her post, she expressed her fears after "almost losing" the actress.

A spaghetti and 'gulaman' Christmas

'Christmas dinners are now more filling, but nothing lavish or grand . . . It's not the essence of Christmas for me,' says chef/ TV host JR Royol

Growing up, chef JR Royol's Christmas family dinners looked like any other dinner.

There was no feast to partake of—no ham, gueso de bola, or leche flan. A Noche Buena spread? He didn't even realize back then that the occasion called for special holiday recipes. They made do with whatever they had, bought whatever they could afford, and gave thanks that they had anything on the table at all.

"I came from a humble background. Payak. We didn't have the means to celebrate it the way others did. I wasn't conditioned that there were certain standards. There was no custom of us serving certain dishes. For us, it was just about going to church, reflecting on the things

"And that was pretty much how I understood Christmas," Royol told Lifestyle at a recent gathering for the upcoming 25th year celebration of the GMA 7 morning show "Unang Hirit." where he's a resident host and chef. It also didn't help that his family led a life that could be loosely described as nomadic.

Royol was born to an Igorot mother and Bicolano father in Benguet, where his early years were spent. But in 1989, when he was 5, their house burned down, forcing the family to relocate to Batangas. Some time after, they found themselves in Oriental Mindoro, and then in Las Piñas, and much later, in La Union.

While his cultural heritage and exposure to such places in the Philippines would eventually lay the foundation for his culinary career, his family's constantly changing zip codes didn't allow for a defined holiday food tradition to take root.

Of the childhood Christmases he could remember, there were only two or three instances, he related, when they had anything remotely close to traditional holiday **Innocent days**

In Mansalay, Oriental Mindoro—one of the many places Royol once called home—they had Filipino-style

spaghetti, served with a fair bit of ground meat; sweetened and reddened by dollops of banana ketchup. And for a spark of sweetness, they had gulaman—freshly made from agar seaweeds gathered from the nearby waters.

"This I will never forget because we did the picking ourselves. We lived some 50 feet from the aplaya, the shore. And during low

tide, there we would find seaweeds. We would leave them under the sun for days. Once they're hard and dry, we boil them and turn them into gulaman," he said. "We didn't have the money so we had to turn to our surroundings."

The variety of seaweeds he used, he recalled, were pale green in color and had stiff branchlets. And looking back, it dawned on him—and this may be a bit of a stretch, he laughed-that the seaweeds actually looked like leaves of a Christmas tree.

"If you ask me what my idea of a Christmas delicacy is, that's what comes to mind," he said. "And that already made me very happy."

But a lot of things have changed since those innocent seaweed-hunting days.

In 2013, Royol won the first Philippine edition of the reality cooking competition "MasterChef." With the title, he gradually built up his resumé, landing jobs and eventually taking top positions at restaurants



tainable Gastronomy, in Laguna. On television he hosts the GTV cooking show "Farm to Table," which has him sourcing locally produced ingredients from different farms and rural communities. In "Unang Hirit," which he said gave his craft a bigger exposure, he features

sound of Tomahawk steaks being seared fills his home.

Still, he prefers to keep things simple as much as possible. Three dishes are more than enough to make his family of four happy and keep their bellies full. Anything more than that is a chore. Perhaps it's the carefree former rock singer in him doing the talking, but no dinner, Royol said, is worth ruining your day over.

"Don't make it too complicated. Don't stress yourself out. Cook with the resources you have, with the skills you have. But just make sure you do it from the heart,"


But more than the workload, the idea of excesses makes Royol a bit wary, uneasy even, perhaps because he feels like it goes against the meaning of Christmas that he has always known.

"Christmas dinners are now more filling, but nothing lavish or grand. It feels off to me... It's not the essence of Christmas for me," he pointed out, adding that he hopes to introduce Christmas to his young son as a time of giving, and more importantly, a time for family.
