PCG's no water cannon rule vs China is a 'wise policy' - security experts

MANILA, Philippines — The position of Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) of not using water cannons in retaliation to China is a prudent move, three maritime security experts said.

Commodore Jay Tarriela,

PCG spokesperson for the West Philippine Sea said the humanitarian armed service wants to maintain professionalism in dealing with China Coast Guard despite China's latest use of a water cannon, which damaged a Filipino

"white ship" in Scarborough (Panatag) Shoal.

'Wise policy'

"This seems like wise policy to me," said Ray Powell, director of SeaLight.


Powell, who heads the pro-

gram of Stanford University's Gordian Knot Center for National Security Innovation that tracks Chinese maritime activities in the West Philippine Sea, also stressed that a "direct retaliation" with CCG's actions "would pro-

vide Beijing a pretext to escalate."

"The Philippines doesn't have the maritime capacity to engage in a direct contest of escalation with China," Powell also said.

One netizen defended de Leon: "Ok lang yan close naman sila ni Miles at ganyan talaga humirit mga matatanda."


In April 2023, Ocampo opened up about her battle with papillary thyroid cancer,

Chinese embassy in Manila 'constant liars'— PCG's Tarriela

MANILA, Philippines — According to Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) spokesperson for the West Philippine Sea Commodore Jay Tarriela, the public should just stop paying attention to claims released by the Chinese

"These are constant liars, ginugulo lang nila 'yung public discourse kaya dapat hindi na natin pinagtutuunan ng pansin itong mga ito (they are only messing up with public discourse so we should stop paying them any attention)," Tarriela said.

"Paulit-ulit 'yung mga agreement na 'yan pero wala naman silang mapakitang dokumento (they keep mentioning such agreements, but they can't show any document) that would really support whatever claim that they are doing," he added.

Tarriela made the pronouncement after the Embassy of China claimed that a "new model" in the Ayungin Shoal was allegedly approved by officials in the Department of National Defense (DND) and the National Security Advisor.

Both Defense Sec. Gilberto Teodoro Jr. and National Security Adviser Eduardo Año denied this.

Tarriela noted that Beijing, in its latest claim, is merely trying to justify its recent water cannon attack in Scarborough Shoal by disseminating

"Kung makikita mo, every time nagpapalabas ng ganiyang kasinungalingan 'yung embassy, ito lagi after i-expose ang incidents [sa West Philippine Sea]," Tarriela said in in the same radio interview.

He cited previous claims including the gentleman's agreement between Beijing and former President Rodrigo Duterte, which he noted to have surfaced right after a water cannon incident in the Ayungin

"Ibig sabihin, ginugulo lang lagi ng embassy 'yung public discourse and they are also wanting to influence public opinion to justify 'yung aggressive action na kanilang ginawa sa Bajo de Masinloc," said Tar-

"So nililito lang nila tayo sini-sway lang nila tayo, dini-divide nila ang Filipino people para i-justify na 'yung ginawa nila... 'napagkasunduan naman 'to, so tayo ang nag violate'," he added.



thing else I don't mind, she can do whatever she wants, as long as she's happy and a good person."


Nico then shared what it was like looking after two daughters, as he and Solenn are also parents to infant Maëlys Lionel.

Two Filipino maritime security experts also agreed with the PCG's position.

"We should take the moral high ground on how we fight for our sovereign rights in our EEZ (exclusive economic zone)," said Rommel Jude Ong, a retired Philippine Navy rear admiral and a professor at the Ateneo School of Government.

C h e s t e r
Cabalza, president and founder

of the Manila-based think tank International Development and Security Cooperation, said Manila should not succumb to Beijing's illegal attacks.

"The Philippines should not stoop down to the continuous and damaging gray zone tactics and assault on the Philippines' white ship," Cabalza said.

"We observe the rules of engagement in freedom of navigation by not resorting to violence like aggressive firing of water canons," he also said.

'Lawfare' trumps 'warfare' Cabalza also lauded the government's move to assert its sovereign rights.

Beijing claims sovereignty in almost the entire South China Sea — including most of the West Philippine Sea — despite being effectively invalidated by a July 2016 international tribunal ruling

stemming from a case filed by Manila in 2013.

"By winning the arbitration award, Filipino coast guardians have shown the world our finest qualities

in dealing with warfare," Cabalza said.

"We uphold the rulesbased order through 'lawfare' ... We firmly believe in dialogues and maritime diplomacy," he explained.

PCG's 'transparency initiative' winning

Powell, meanwhile, also noted the PCG's gains in its "transparency initiative," which sought to expose Beijing's activities in the western section of Manila's exclusive economic zone.

"Each infringement and provocation by Beijing in the West Philippine Sea will be exposed to the international community to show how they disrupt the regional stability and blatantly violate the Unclos (United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea) and international law," Tarriela said in a post on X (formerly Twitter).



Foundation said.

Ibon Foundation showed that wage gap was computed based on the average daily minimum wage and the average family living wage (FLW) for a family of five in all 17 regions in the country, which is at P1,207.

FLW refers to the amount of family income needed to provide for the cost of living with sufficient allowance for savings and investments for social security. Wage gap is the gap between prevailing minimum wage and FLW.

Ibon Executive Director Sonny Africa said that "family" was used as the unit for living wage due to the scarcity of formal wage work.

"Over 4 of 10 employed are non-wage (including so many self-employed) and [the] majority of wage workers are, in practice, not really even covered by labor laws," said Africa.

The Senate has previously approved a P100 wage hike to all private sector workers, and is now currently awaiting approval from the House of Representatives before it can be sent to President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. for signing.

Ibon, for its part, said earlier that there is enough data to prove that employers can afford to pay the proposed additional P100 daily wage increase.

Wage gap remains huge even with proposed hikes

Africa said that while the proposed wage increases — P100 in the Senate, and P150 in the House — would provide some relief and advantages to workers, a significant wage gap would persist.

"The huge wage gap means that even workers in the most formal sector of the economy with presumably relatively the highest and most stable earnings are still 'working poor,'" Africa said.

"This also points to how economic growth can be made even a little bit more inclusive," he added.

Asked if a P750 across-the-board increase would be more feasible than the current proposed increases, Africa responded that this would effectively split profits between workers and business owners.

"'Feasibility' is more a political rather than an economic question," said Africa.

"A P750 across-the-board (ATB) hike will, in effect, split profits more or less evenly between workers and business owners/capitalists," said Africa.

He explained that the economic basis for a P750 wage increase would be to split enough profits between workers and business owners or capitalists.

"The government can also assert, through its minimum wage laws, that such a hike is economically viable without being inflationary or causing job losses," said Africa.

"But what does 'feasible' mean? What is clear is the matter shouldn't be reduced to what's easily acceptable or simply said as acceptable by business owners or capitalists," he added.

China's military aggression prompt PH, US, Japan, Australia to line up more joint maritime drills



leased on April 30, 2024 by the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) shows the BRP Bagacay being hit by water cannon from Chinese Coast Guard vessels near the Chinese-controlled Scarborough shoal in disputed waters of the South China Sea. The Philippines said the China Coast Guard fired water cannon on April 30 at two of its vessels, causing damage to one of them, during patrol near a reef off the Southeast Asian country.

The Philippines, United States, Japan and Australia have cited the aggressive actions of China in the West Philippine Sea (WPS) as added motivation for them to line up more quadrilateral maritime exercises to assert a rules-based order in the international waters.

This came after Defense Secretaries Gilberto Teodoro (Philippines), Lloyd Austin (US), Ministers Kihara Minoru (Japan) and Richard Marles (Australia) gathered in Hawaii last May 2 for their second ministerial meeting, where they discussed concerns on developments in the Indo-Pacific.

Marles explained that their move to conduct more maritime exercises "is about the assertion of a global rules-based order," a way in which their countries can work together.

Austin also described as "irresponsible behavior" the actions of China, pertaining to its frequent and violent water cannon attacks, which recently injured the crew of the Philippine vessels and damaged their ships.

"They reiterated serious concern over the PRC's (People's Republic of China's) repeated obstruction of Philippine vessels' exercise of high seas freedom of navigation and the disruption of supply lines to Second Thomas Shoal, which constitute dangerous and destabilizing conduct," the readout stated.

Most Filipinos say complicated rules hinder foreign investments: Pulse Asia

Majority of Filipinos believe complicated rules and regulations hinder foreign investments in the Philippines, but removing foreign restrictions as provided by the 1987 Constitution is not seen as a solution.

Respondents also cited corruption in the public sector (46 percent), inadequate transport infrastructure (40 percent) and high cost of electricity (37 percent) as factors that hinder foreign investments in the country.

According to Dr. Ana Marie Tabunda, these answers show that Filipinos are aware of the difficulties foreign investors are facing in the country.

"Ito sinasabi lang nila what could be hindering foreign investments in the country," she said. "Mukhang hindi ho easy for the foreign investors kasi marami hong restrictive rules tayo eh on foreign ownership na nasa Constitution," she added.

However, when asked about the possible outcomes of removing restrictions on foreign involvement in the economy, the respondents gave both positive and neg-

"The above results indicate that the public is keenly aware of the factors that deter the entry of foreign capital, including those that have nothing to do with the lifting of the restrictive provisions in the Constitution," Pulse Asia said.

Marcos says gov't remains committed to eliminate hunger in PH

MANILA, Philippines — President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. reiterated his administration's goal of eliminating hunger in the Philippines, according to Palace statement.

While Marcos did not refer to any event, a recent Social Weather Stations (SWS) revealed that hunger in the Philippines was at its highest

since May 2021. "When I was asked very early on after taking office, 'What is your

aspiration for the Philippines?' It's very simple, no one goes hungry, no more hungry Filipinos. And that's what we are try-

ing to do," Marcos said. Marcos made a vow of eliminating hunger within his

term back in 2023. According to the SWS, one out of 10 Filipinos have experienced involuntary hunger.

Hunger significantly increased in Metro Manila.

of the year.

KC Libre, 15, is a student at Manuel Roxas high school in Manila, but she is currently studying at home after the school suspended in-person classes last week. "This is the first time that our classes have been suspended because of the hot weather," she said. "We have 47 students in our class. Even with electric fans, it's still hot, and usually there are only two electric fans switched on because ceiling fans in some of the rooms are broken.

"I feel irritated and can't focus when it's hot. The rooms are on the fourth floor, and so especially when I go up and down [the stairs], it's really difficult ... I won't have even started writing yet but I'm already sweating.

"Even in our home it's so hot. We don't have aircon because we are not well-off. I do my school work at night because it's less hot. In the morning, it's as if extreme heat is blowing into you.

"The air coming from the electric fans

is so hot ... The heat inside of the oven ... that's what it feels like."

Philippine weather bureau PAGASA reported that the heat index in 30 areas across the country, including parts of Metro Manila soared to dangerous levels last month.

The heat index, also known as the apparent temperature, factors in both humidity and air temperature to show how hot it actually feels.

The peak heat index was in Dagupan City, Pangasinan, where temperatures skyrocketed to 47°C.

In Metro Manila, temperatures soared


to 42°C at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA) station in Pasay City, and reached 41°C at the Science Garden in Quezon City, showing a high heat index between extreme caution and danger levels.

Temperatures from 42°C to 51°C, considered "dangerous," increase the chances of heat-related issues like cramps or exhaustion. Too much sun exposure can also lead to heat stroke.

To avoid heat-related illnesses, the weather bureau recommended to do the following:

- •Reduce outdoor activities
- Stay hydrated
- •Avoid specific beverages to prevent heat-related illnesses
- •When outdoors, use umbrellas, hats, or wear long sleeves
- •Schedule intense activities for cooler parts of the day

Unusually hot weather in the Philippines was expected to last until mid-May amid the impact of El Niño and the dry season, according to PAGASA.



potential expansion, the issue is not something that is high up on the list, Manny Maceda, CEO and chairman of the board of global management consulting firm Bain & Co., said.

"I would consider it sort of a second order, one of the factors to consider but it's not a top-ofmind," Maceda told visiting Filipino journalists at a recent meeting organized by Global Ties San Francisco as part of the United States' Friends, Partners, Allies program.

The more pressing issues investors look at are ease of doing business, the presence of an

investment ecosystem, the strength of the market, the quality of the supply chain and the available talent, said Maceda, son of the late Senate president Ernesto Mace-

In the case of the Philippines, he said the country remains attractive to US companies because it is one of the fastest growing economies in the region in terms of real economic growth and private consump-

Maceda said the US is already the number one export destination of Philippine products and among the Philippines' top three sources of foreign direct investments. There is also a historical



cultural affinity with the Philippines given Filipinos' English proficiency which helps attract US investors to the country. Frank Levin, former undersecretary for International Trade at the US Department of Commerce and former US ambassador to Singapore, also said the West Philippine Sea issue is not something that would lead to an economic shock for the Philippines. "It's not a convulsion for the nation, or it doesn't collapse the stock market, or (it's not like) people are fleeing. It's bullying so it is a test. But I don't think there's a direct economic cost to the test," Levin told Filipino journalists at a separate meeting.

At the same time, he said, it's not healthy to have such tension persist especially as it might escalate.

Jose Avelino Flores, co-founder of Silicon Valley-based Plug and Play Tech Center, for his part, said the Philippines needs to market itself versus other countries if it wants to attract more investors.

"I think for the last 10 years what was missing in the Philippines was a unique selling proposition," Flores said.

Having a "unique story," Flores said, would encourage investors, particularly venture capitalists to look at Philippine startups.

JR Calanoc, CEO of Dynamico Space and who helps connect Filipino entrepreneurs with Silicon Valley's resources, meanwhile said it's good that the Philippines-US relations are now on hyperdrive so that investors would realize the potential of Philippine startups. That is is amazing," he said, citing its likely effect of bringing global attention to Philippine startups and other companies including graphic and web design platforms being developed in the Philippines.

Eventually, the two characters must choose whether to be together or keep working toward the better future they seek in Singapore.



China's Influence is Everywhere

China's invasion has began

China's invasion of the Philippines was planned years ago, even before they seduced Duterte to be the royal pawn. Our Lady Mediatrix of All Grace prophesied the invasion by China, as pointed out by Ricardo Cardinal Vidal when he was Archbishop of Lipa: "Pray hard, for China's dream is to invade the whole world. The Philippines is one of its favorites." (Inquirer, 13 July 2014)

So, it is not a future invasion. It has been ongoing for years now, but we refuse to see it. We linger in our indifference until it will suddenly hit us in the face one day. The more PBBM delays to quell it, the harder it will be to deal with. We may need the help of the US when we have become helpless.

The invasion is an utter success and is growing rapidly for a simple reason. In our poverty or greed or both, we cannot stop taking bribes. And the Chinese know it. In all the arrests made in the past years, they have been bribing us to the bone. And they are oozing with money.

A bribe of a million pesos is peanuts to them.

They have bribed: 1) the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) into accepting Chinese intel agents; 2) the Commission on Higher Education (CHEd) into turning a blind eye and approving applications of Chinese "students" using questionable documents; 3) the many universities into accepting thousands of Chinese "students" taking English courses when they do not speak English, quintupling tuition income, 4) LGUs into allowing the swarming of Chinese in their territories; 5) law enforcers (with exceptions) into releasing arrested Chinese nationals.

The recent capture by the NCRPO of a Chinese national found with high-powered weapons in a Taguig townhouse is disturbing news. Another Chinese national was arrested for a bribery attempt. Confiscated were weapons of war, such as Chinese ballistic helmets, bullet-proof vests, and a red Chinese flag. There were also a luxury sports car with improvised plates and an electric car, both with no supporting documents. (GMA News, 16

The Armed Forces of the Philippines reports the "swarming" by college students in the province of Cagayan, with 4,600 Chinese "students" enrolled in a private university in Tuguegarao. The anti-Enhanced Defense Cooperation Agreement pro-China Cagayan Governor Manuel Mamba denies the massive influx of Chinese students in Tuguegarao is a security threat. Yet, these "students" will play a role when the invasion ripens.

Rep. Robert Barbers declared that the "creeping invasion has begun," the foreigners having obtained anomalous "Filipino birth certificates, driver's licenses, UMID cards, passports, and even accreditation and auxiliary memberships in the armed services, particularly the Philippine Coast Guard."

Chinese infiltration of the PCG has vast intelligence implications in the conflict with Chinese warships in the West Philippine Sea (WPS).

"The only sure thing right now is that corruption at its worst has eaten us up," Barbers said. "If these Chinese nationals could buy agricultural lands, enroll in our universities on the pretext of exchange student programs (ominously sanctioned by the CHEd), work here without permits, obtain loans from our banks, then leave the country, then we are drafting our epitaph as a nation."

"We have only ourselves to blame. The greed for money and power is killing this country. Unless we move now, we will see ourselves controlled by invaders tomorrow," Barbers added. (Philippine Star, 17 April 2024).

Unwalkable Metro Manila

IT should be a matter of national shame island effect." But this harmful trend that Metro Manila was ranked "least walkable" in a recent survey of 53 cities worldwide. In a walkability study by Australian insurance firm, Compare-The-Market, 53 global locations were compared. Metro Manila was in last place. This should be an important "wake-up" call, because all of us are pedestrians and every journey starts and ends with walking.

In the Philippines, millions of trips every day are entirely by walking. If walking is difficult, uncomfortable or unsafe, it means that a person may not be able to exercise his or her basic rights or meet basic needs, such as finding employment and obtaining food, health care or education, inas are removed, pedestrians have to People prefer to live in places where it is walk longer distances in order to safely easy to walk to jobs, services and markets. cross the road. If a footbridge replaces A country that has poor walkability will be unattractive for tourism or investment.

How did we get to this dismal situation? Unfortunately, the Philippines has not complied with its own regulations on sidewalks and has not invested much in quality pedestrian infrastructure. The general absence of proper sidewalks prevents many of us from walking to our destinations, even to places nearby. On most city streets, sidewalks, where they exist, are not safe for walking, filled with holes and obstructions and impossible for a person using a wheelchair, stroller or on crutches to use. A common obstacle is the electricity or telephone pole sticking out of the middle of the sidewalk. Many sidewalks have been illegally converted into car parking spaces.

Our cities and towns have become unbearably hot because trees and greenery were replaced by concrete and asphalt, enhancing what we call the "urban heat

can be reversed. With trees providing a canopy over a road, ambient temperatures can be lower by 5 to 10 degrees Celsius. A sidewalk shaded by trees can be walkable even at midday. We can shape our urban environments so that they remain walkable amid climate

Oftentimes, poor walkability is the result of prioritizing the movement of cars over the movement of people. A common example is the removal of ground-level pedestrian crossings so that there is no need for vehicles to stop for people. When pedestrian crossa ground-level pedestrian crossing, the impact is also negative for people on foot — they have to climb stairs and walk much further. Those unable to climb stairs then face an insurmountable barrier. Footbridges are often dark and unprotected at night, exposing pedestrians to greater risk of getting mugged or assaulted.

And then, there is the bad behavior of most drivers who fail to stop for pedestrians, even at "zebra-striped" crosswalks. When walking is unsafe or unattractive, it also discourages use of public transport, because walking to a jeepney or bus stop or train station is often needed. Accordingly, poor quality or missing sidewalks compel many to rely on private motor vehicles which, in turn, exacerbates traffic and pollution and contributes to poor public health

If the government is serious about according highest priority to pedestrians and cyclists in the hierarchy of road users, as it has declared in the Philippine Development Plan 2023-2028, here are specific recommendations for making the Philippines a more walkable place within the next three years:

- Spend more for active transport and accessibility. An executive order should be issued requiring national and local agencies to allocate at least 10 percent of their annual road/bridge infrastructure spending for the rectification and expansion of pedestrian and cycling infrastructure and to ensure compliance with all accessibility laws.
- Restore the No Contact Apprehension Policy (NCAP) and focus on violations that endanger pedestrians. Pedestrians felt much safer when NCAP was operational. Positionina cameras at pedestrian crossings will change driver behavior at pedestrian crosswalks. Speeding and "red-light beating" at intersections will also be reduced once NCAP is working.
- Install raised crossings in front of every school. A raised crossing will make a street so much safer for all kinds of road users. There should be no road where students on foot are endangered by fast-moving motor vehicles. A raised crossing installed on all roads fronting schools will ensure that vehicles slow down for pedestri-
- Implement the mandatory 20 kilometers per hour (kph) speed limit for crowded streets required by Republic Act (RA) 4136. RA 4136 (The Land

Transportation and Traffic Code) requires that the maximum speed limit should be 20 kph "through crowded streets, approaching intersections at 'blind corners,' passing school zones, passing other vehicles which are stationary, or for similar dangerous circumstances" [Section 35(b), Article



- 1, Chapter IV of RA 4136]. "Crowded streets" are any busy road with many popular destinations frequented by large numbers of people. Enforcing this law will save thousands of lives annually.
- Restore sidewalks illegally converted into parking spaces. An executive order should instruct every national agency and local government to restore sidewalks illegally converted into parking spaces and to penalize parties responsible for such violations.
- Encourage every barangay to have at least one car-free "people's street." If every barangay could have a carfree "people's street," it would not only offer a safe, pollution-free active transport corridor, it would also provide much needed public space in every community that could serve as a public park for exercise, play and community gatherings. Shade trees

could be planted to make the entire neighborhood cooler.

 Enable citizens to report anti-pedestrian violations to authorities using mobile phones. The government should create a mobile phone app whereby violations of any law related to pedestrian welfare can be reported by

> any citizen to relevant authorities with pictures and location information attached.

- Plant more trees and greenery along every sidewalk. Every LGU should launch a sidewalk tree-planting program to provide ample shade and water retention on every street. Of course, the tree species should be carefully
- selected, favoring Indigenous species, trees with good shade, and those that will not damage sidewalk surfaces over time.
- Remove footbridges and restore atgrade pedestrian crossings. Replacing footbridges with ground-level pedestrian crossings will make our streets safer, more inclusive and people-friendly. The demolition of footbridges (what many progressive cities worldwide have done in recent times) would be a clear signal that the government prioritizes pedestrians and persons with disability over cars.

Enrique Penalosa once said "High quality public pedestrian space is evidence of a true democracy at work." By any reasonable standard of walkability, the Philippines is failing — and it is affecting every aspect of our lives. In the list of infrastructure priorities, walkability needs to be at the very top.
